or other public places of the city, for which he shall be paid the prices fixed in his contract, not exceeding the sums permitted by this ordinance. The committee on parks, cemeteries, streets and sewers reported that they had employed Thomas R. Hasley as sanitary engineer in reference to improving the sewer system north of Ridge street, and submitted the following report of said engineer:

To the Hon. Committee on Parks, Cemeteries, Streets and Sewers.

Gentlemen:—In conjunction with Mr. Chas. Cummings, city engineer, I have made an examination of that portion of the city of Marquette lying north of Ridge street with a view of determining the most economical and practical method of relieving the so-called trunk sewer, which empties into the lake at Grace Furnace dock. This sewer, as is well known, gives forcible demonstration of the fact that you are attempting to have it perform more service than nature or the original designers ever intended that it should do, for I find that you have kept adding catch-basins to it from time to time until it reached a point that a reasonable rain storm would cause it to overflow. This sewer was evidently intended to carry the sanitary wastes only and for such service it is nearly the proper size, the right location and the best outlet. The only apparent fault I find with it from a sanitary point of view is that it is not deep enough to accommodate the houses in the lower part of the Third ward, but I understand that the original construction was quite difficult on account of rock cutting in the trench, and at the time it was built it was no doubt considered low enough to fulfill all future requirements. As there has been considerable money spent this sewer, and as it is now in good serviceable condition and capable of working up to its full capacity, I would not recommend that any changes be made in it. As a further reason for not recommending any change in it I will state that to enlarge or lower it would be costly construction and the money so spent could be used to better advantage in another direction. Besides, if you were to carry out the idea that I have heard suggested, viz: replacing it with a large sewer three feet or more in diameter and carry the storm water you would tend to complicate matters in case Marquette should ever become so thickly populated as to cause fears of contamination of the lake water, for in that case it would be preferable to run the storm water to some other outlet and treat the sanitary wastes only, in which case a sewer three feet or more in diameter would be not only useless but a public menace because there would not be sufficient depth of flow to keep it clean so that it would become simply a longitudinal cesspool. For sanitary purposes that trunk sewer is so near the right size now that it is best to leave it alone and simply take the excess of storm water to another outlet. I find that this excess of storm water is coming from

Third and Fourth streets and their tributaries, that you have continued to conduct this water to the sewers in those respective streets which in turn empty into the trunk sewer until the said trunk sewer showed decisive evidence of surcharge. The balance of the storm water is carried along the streets and in the gutters, and its velocity becomes so great that there is considerable wash along the gutters in the lower parts of both Third and Fourth streets, finally disappearing on private property. This water is perhaps not serious, as the grade of the streets is so great that it runs off quickly from about the upper two-thirds of Third and Fourth streets, but I would recommend that provision be made to carry it underground beginning at Crescent street by constructing a 12-inch sewer along Third street from Crescent to Park, also a 12-inch sewer along Fourth street from Crescent to Park, thence east along Park street to Third, thence connecting these two 12-inch sewers or storm laterals into a 15-inch pipe, thence lay a 15-inch pipe along Third street to Specular street. At Specular street which is the point where the present sanitary sewer turns to the east I would recommend the construction of a specially designed manhole through which the present sanitary sewer would run, the internal arrangement of this manhole being such that as soon as the sanitary sewer was carrying as much as it should, the surplus would be diverted to the storm sewer. To accommodate this extra run of water into the storm sewer at this point it should be increased from a 15-inch to a 20-inch pipe from Specular street in a northerly direction along Third street. This arrangement would practically allow all sanitary wastes to be carried to the present outlet for by the time that the sanitary sewer would overflow into the storm sewer all the offensive wastes would be carried down the trunk sewer leaving nothing but the rain water collected at the upper end of Third and Fourth streets to enter the storm sewer. This can be adjusted to a nicety so that there would never be any further fear of the present trunk sewer giving any trouble and the storm water which would enter it would be about sufficient to keep it properly flushed.

Now about the outlet and also the sewerage and drainage of North Marquette. I will say that the volume of sanitary wastes which will come from that district for a great many years (judging from present knowledge of its rate of growth) will not be sufficient to warrant the expense of separation of the sanitary sewage from storm water, but at the same time

that district needs both sewerage and drainage. In order then to cover as much territory as possible at the one operation I will recommend that the storm water from the district which I have been referring to as Third and Fourth streets and the relief of the present trunk sewer be carried northerly along Presque Isle avenue. This can best be done by extending the aforesaid twenty-inch pipe northerly along Third street and Third street produced, for a block north of Fair avenue, thence west along extension of Waldo street to Presque Isle avenue, thence north along Presque Isle avenue to Hawley street thence east on Hawley street to the lake which is at the point of discharge of the effluent water from the furnace. This 20-inch pipe to be increased in size along Presque Isle avenue and which size I would have to give a little more consideration but as it looks to me now it would be well to make the portion along Hawley street 30-inch or 36-inch to provide for the future possible paving of those streets lying west of Presque Isle avenue. I notice considerable swamps along the northerly one-half mile of this route and I would suggest that this land could be drained either by laying sub-soil drains under or in the same trench as the main sewer or else openings could be left at intervals to admit of this water into the sewer direct.

The outlet would be far removed from sources of water supply but in any case the percentage of sewage would be so small that it would not be worthy of any serious consideration.

This plan would fill all the requirements with the exception of providing sewerage facilities for that portion of the city which I mentioned as the lower part of the Third ward. This applies to all that territory down on the flat but the elevation of this ground is so close to the level of the lake that it would be cheaper to make special provision for this territory than to try to alter the elevation of the present trunk sewer to accommodate it.

 in substance, that the equalization made, in June last, under
 section 6 of the "Act to provide for a State Board of Equalization,"
 does not deprive the board of supervisors of the power, or
 relieves it of the duty imposed by section 34 of the tax law, to
 equalize the assessment rolls of the several cities and townships
 at the October session of said board; and

Whereas, The state board of equalization has recently raised
 the valuation of Marquette County \$23,500,000, principally on
 account of the recent official appraisement of the mines in
 this county, known as the "Finlay" appraisement; whereby
 under the present equalization as between the cities and town-
 ships of this county, great injustice will be done to the cities and
 townships in which no mines are located, unless there be a
 proper equalization by the board of supervisors at its Octo-
 ber session; and

Whereas, The board of state tax commissioners, has
 given notice of the review and correction of the assessments
 of the mines of the county, on the assessment rolls of the cities
 and townships in which the same are located, presumably for
 the purpose of raising such assessments on said rolls to make
 the same more nearly accord with said Finlay appraisement;
 it is hereby

Resolved, That the board of supervisors of the County of
 Marquette is hereby respectfully requested, at its October ses-
 sion, 1911, to make a careful, thorough and just equalization of
 the taxable property in the various cities and townships of
 the county, to the end that each city and township shall bear
 its just and proper share of the state and county taxes, accor-
 ding to the relative cash value of the property assessable therein,
 and be it further

Resolved, That the recorder is hereby instructed to

forward a certified copy of this preamble and resolution to the board of supervisors of the county of Marquette.
