TELEPHONE
RATES.

The committee on licenses and trade regulations submitted the following:

To, the Mayor and Common Council:

Your committee have investigated the charges made by certain individuals that the Michigan State Telephone Company was discriminating in its rates to subscribers in this city. Your committee found that the rates charged by the telephone company at the time this question came up were as follows:

	Business.	Residence.
One party line, per year	\$36	\$24
Two party line, per year	30	18
Four party line, per year	24	15
Extension sets, per year	6	6

We were informed by Mr. Baker, the manager of the telephone company, that it had been decided to discontinue the four party service and have no more than two parties on any one line. This could not be accomplished at once as the contracts had some time to run, but the telephone company would take no new subscribers at the four party rate. This change led those who applied for telephone service at the four party rate to feel that they were being discriminated against, as they knew others who were then enjoying the same.

Mr. Baker states that after July 1st all the four party contracts will have expired and that after that date there will be only individual and two party lines in service.

It was also alleged that the banks and some of the other commercial institutions were enjoying a lower rate than others

TELEPHONE RATES getting the same service. Upon examining the telephone books, which were thrown open to us by Mr. Baker, we were unable to discover any such discrimination. The banks and other commercial institutions were paying the regular business rates as heretofore mentioned.

The telephone company further states that their books may be inspected by any committee of the common council or by an auditor appointed by said council.

TESTS OF WATER AND ICE.

On motion of Alderman Jopling, supported by Alderman Asis, the following resolution was unanimously adopted:

NORTHERN STATE NORMAL SCHOOL.

Whereas, Dr. T. M. Koon, member of the state board of health, informed your honorable body that in his opinion the present typhoid epidemic was caused by an infection of the city water supply, and

Whereas, It requires considerable time to send samples of water to Lansing for testing, and

Whereas, We are informed that the laboratory of the Northern State Normal School is now equipped to make such tests, therefore be it

Resolved, That the health committee of this honorable body, together with the health officer, be instructed to negotiate with the authorities of the Northern State Normal School for a daily testing of the water supply of the city for an indefinite period sufficiently long to make sure whether there is a possibility of its being contaminated and that the said committee and health officer be authorized to make such tests with said authorities as will assure such tests being made. And be it further

Resolved, That in view of the fact that there is a possibility that the infection may have been from ice, that ice from each of the several companies supplying ice to the citizens of Marquette be tested and that a test also be made of the water from the inner bay so that it may be determined if it is contaminated and that the health officer and the said committee take such other steps as may be necessary to trace the infection to its source.

WATER USED FOR WASHING UTENSILS, CANS AND BOTTLES AND WATER FROM SPRINGS TESTED.

On motion of Alderman Schauer, supported by Alderman Jopling, the following resolution was unanimously adopted:

Resolved, That the health officer, is hereby empowered and directed to cause samples of the water used for washing utensils, cans and bottles at each dairy and any other place in or near the city from which milk is delivered in the city, to be collected and tested weekly, and also that samples of water from the different springs in and around the city which is sold

and delivered in the city be tested weekly, until further action of the Common Council.

Honorable Mayor and Common Council:

Gentlemen In order to insure the successful operation of the Presque Isle avenue sewer, as now planned, it will be necessary to provide automatic flushing supplied intermittently. To this end the most economical means will be the use of sufficient flow from the Fourth street district and the installation of a flush tank at a point between Kematite street and Fair Avenue. To supply the flush tank it will be necessary to tap the manhole at Specular street with an eight-inch pipe to be laid as a storm sewer, outside of the road bed and curbing on the west side of Presque Isle avenue. This will admit the connection of catch basins to prevent further damage to Kematite and Third streets.

To furnish additional flow through the Fourth street sewer and to dilute the raw sewage, it is desirable to take in the surface water from the cemetery that is now troublesome in the neighborhood of Crescent and Lee streets.

To provide catch basins for storm water at the street intersections on Presque Isle avenue (at Specular and Kematite streets) it would be necessary in any case, to lay a certain amount of storm sewer, which would be an item of street improvement, to be paid by the city. As now planned, it will terminate at the proposed flush tank, beyond which the expense will be borne by the new sewer district. Items to be provided are two catch basins at Specular street, two at Kematite street and approximately 500 feet of eight-inch sewer from the manhole in Specular street to the proposed flush tank. The problem has

to get a working flow, without increasing the size of pipe beyond actual requirements. With a flush tank as proposed and a ten-inch main sewer, a solution can be reached.

A further consideration is likelihood of the city's adding catch basins in Presque Isle avenue north of Waldo street. In such case it is desirable to increase the size of pipe to twelve inches and is incumbent on the city to pay the increase in cost about \$500.

"For City Charter revision? No." was three hundred and seven (307).
