Sec. 1. No persons shall follow the occupation of hawker of peddler in the city of Marquette, or within the harbor limits of said city, without a city license so to do. The term and words hawker of peddler, as used in this ordinance, shall be construed to mean and include any person who shall be engaged in the business of going about from place to place selling or offering for sale at retail or soliciting orders by sample for the sale at retail of any goods, wares or merchandise, and who shall in the pursuance of said business travel from house to house in said city, or who shall engage in said business upon any street, highway, sidewalk or other public place in said city.

Sec. 2. Any person desiring to be licensed as a hawker and peddler shall file with the city clerk his application therefor, in writing, upon a form to be furnished by the city clerk, and completely filled out and signed and verified by or on behalf of the applicant, and setting forth: (1) The name, age, residence and post office address of the applicant; (2) The place or places of residence or business of the applicant and nature of the business engaged in by him during the year next preceeding the time of such application; (3) The nature of the business for which a license is desired and the term thereof; (4) Whether the applicant travels from place to place within this state in the business of hawking and peddling; and if so, the nature and particulars of such business, and whether the applicant has a state treasurer's license as a hawker and peddler, and the number, date and term thereof. If the nature of the business of such applicant requires the license of the state treasurer such applicant shall exhibit such license to the city clerk.

The city clerk shall forthwith submit any such application to

to Hawkers and Peddlers, adopted March 2, 1922, be and the same are hereby amended to read as follows:

Sec. 1. No person shall follow the occupation of Hawker or Peddler in the City of Marquette, or within the harbor limits of said city, without a city license as to be. The term and words Hawker or Peddler, as used in this ordinance, shall be construed to mean and include any person who shall be engaged in the business of going about from place to place selling or offering for sale at retail or soliciting orders by sample for the sale at retail of any goods, wares or merchandise, and who shall in the business of said business travel from house to house in said city, or who shall engage in said business upon any street, highway, sidewalk or other public place in said city.

Sec. 2. Any person desiring to be licensed as a Hawker and Peddler shall file with the city clerk his application therefor, in writing, upon a form to be furnished by the city clerk, and containing the following information: (1) The name, age, residence and post-office address of the applicant; (2) The place or places of residence or business of the applicant and nature of the business engaged in by him during the year next preceding the time of such application; (3) The nature of the business for which a license is desired and the law thereof; (4) Whether the applicant travels from place to place within this state in the business of hawking and peddling and if so, the nature and particulars of such business, and whether the applicant has a state treasurer's license as a hawker and peddler, and the number, date and law thereof. If the nature of the business of such applicant requires the license of the state treasurer such applicant shall exhibit such license to the city clerk.

the mayor and if the mayor shall be satisfied, or upon investigation shall become satisfied that the granting of such license is not likely to result in the perpetration of fraud upon the inhabitants of the city, he shall endorse on such application his consent to the issuance of such license and file such application with the city clerk; whereupon, and upon payment to the city clerk of the requisite license fee therefor the city clerk shall issue to such applicant a city license as a hawker and peddler for the term for which the fee therefor is paid, not exceeding one year.

No such license shall be issued without such consent of the mayor and any such license shall be subject to be summarily suspended in effect, or revoked by the mayor, in case he shall become convinced that the licensee has violated any ordinance of the city, or has imposed upon, swindled or perpetrated fraud upon any of the inhabitants of or sojourners in the city.

Section 3. The following fees, respectively, shall be charged and collected for licenses issued hereunder, viz:

(a) For hawking and peddling from any hand cart, stand or other place or while travelling on foot, two dollars per day, but not to exceed thirty dollars for one year;

(b) For hawking and peddling with any motor vehicle or vehicle drawn by one or more animals, three dollars per day, but not to exceed fifty dollars for one year;

(c) For hawking and peddling only pop-corn, peanuts, ice cream confectionery or refreshments; one-half the fees above specified.

Section 7. This ordinance shall not apply to the selling or offering for sale of newspapers, periodicals, books, flowers, fresh meats, fresh fish, animals, wood, hay, milk, cream, butter, eggs, maple syrup, maple sugar, berries, fruit, vegetables, and other farm and garden produce.

the mayor and if the mayor shall be satisfied, or upon investigation shall be satisfied that the granting of such license is not likely to result in the perpetration of fraud upon the inhabitants of the city, he shall enforce or cause enforcement to be made to the issuance of such license and the said application with the city clerk; whereupon, and upon payment to the city clerk of the requisite license fee therefor, the city clerk shall issue to such applicant a city license as a hawk and peddler for the year for which the fee therefor is paid, not exceeding one year.

No such license shall be issued without the consent of the mayor and any such license shall be subject to be summarily suspended or revoked by the mayor, in case he shall become convinced that the licensee has violated any ordinance of the city or has imposed upon, abused or perpetrated fraud upon any of the inhabitants of or sojourners in the city.

Section 5. The following fee, respectively, shall be charged and collected for licenses issued hereunder, to-wit:

- (a) For hawking and peddling from any hand cart, stand or other place or while traveling on foot, ten dollars per day, but not to exceed thirty dollars for one year;
- (b) For hawking and peddling with any motor vehicle or vehicle drawn by one or more animals, three dollars per day, but not to exceed fifty dollars for one year;
- (c) For hawking and peddling only peddler, peddler, for street commissionary or peddler, one-half the fees above specified.

Section 7. This ordinance shall not apply to the selling or offering for sale of newspapers, periodicals, books, flowers, fresh meats, fresh fish, animals, food, hay, milk, cream, butter, eggs, maple syrup, maple sugar, berries, fruit, vegetables, and other farm and garden produce.



