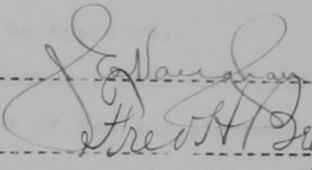
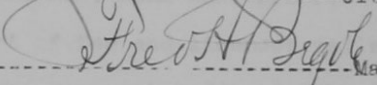

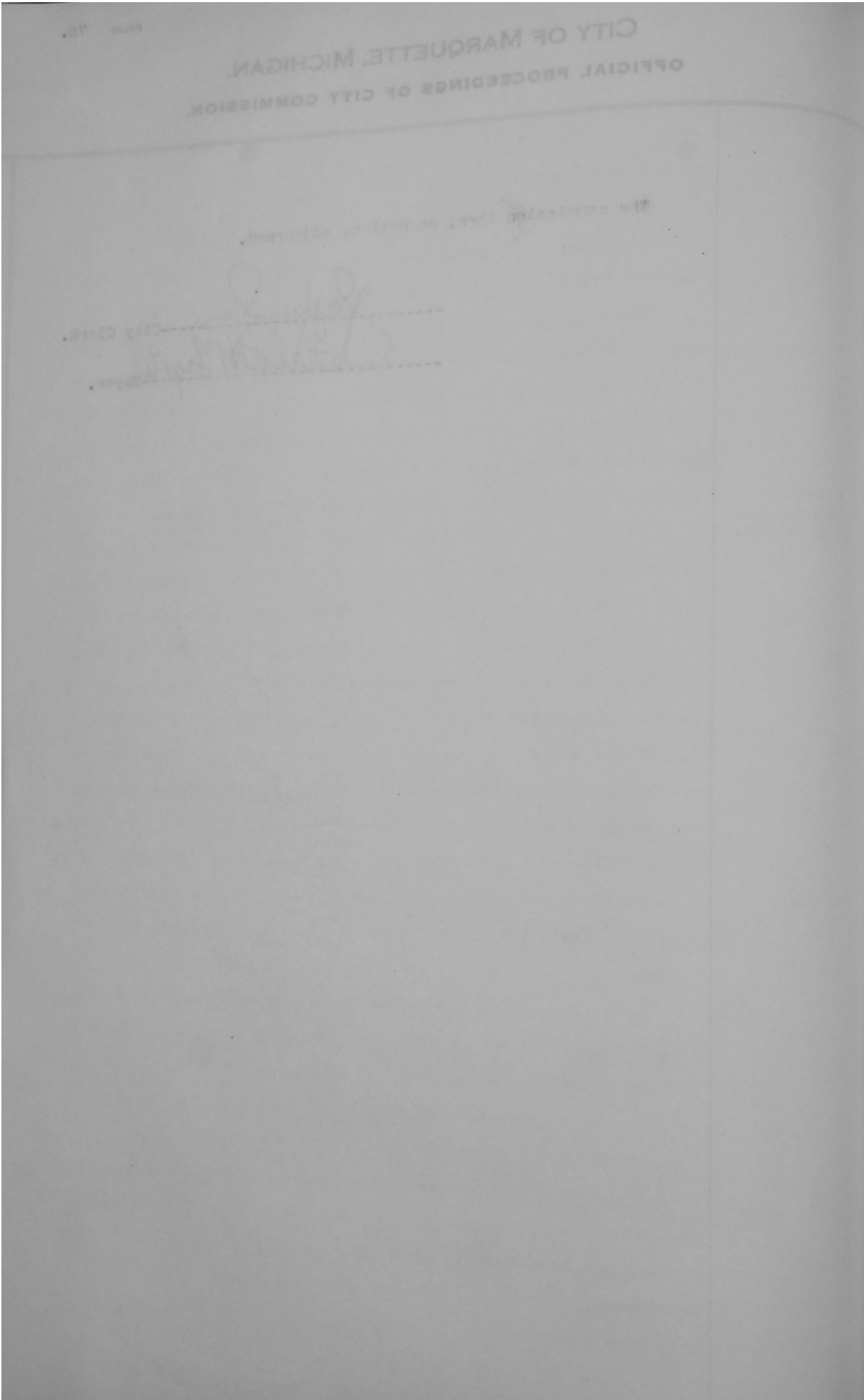

Upon the occurrence of a vacancy in the office of justice of the peace the clerk shall in writing notify the city commission thereof at its next session, and such vacancy shall be filled by election at the next election to be held in the city, if one is to be held more than fifteen days after such notification, but if no election is to be held within such period the commission shall forthwith call a special election for the filling of such vacancy, to be held not less than fifteen days nor more than twenty days after such notification. No primary election shall be necessary for the filling of such vacancy. Nominations to fill a vacancy in such office shall be by petition in the same manner, as near as may be, for the placing of the names of candidates for city offices upon the ballots for primary elections, except that such petitions may be filed with the clerk on or before five days prior to such election. The commission may provide that such elections to fill vacancy shall be conducted according to a majority preferential system of voting, in which case the commission shall prescribe the rules for the conduct of such elections and the determination of the result thereof.

Sec. 3. The number of justices of the peace in and for the City of Marquette is hereby limited to two such justices of the peace on and after the fourth day of July one thousand nine hundred and seventeen, and one such justice of the peace on and after the fourth day of July one thousand nine hundred and nineteen, and, except to fill vacancies in such office, no successors in office of any of the present justices of the peace of the city shall be elect-

The commission may provide that such elections to fill vacancy shall be conducted according to a majority or plurality system of voting, in which case the commission shall prescribe the rules for the conduct of such elections and the determination of the results thereof.

Sec. 3. The number of Justices of the Peace in and for the City of Marquette is hereby fixed to be four Justices of the Peace on and after the fourth day of July next and also hereafter and hereafter, and each Justice of the Peace on and after the fourth day of July next shall hold office for the term of six years, except to fill vacancies in such office, no person shall be elected.

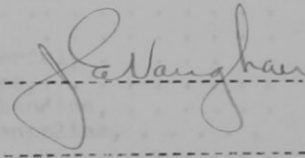

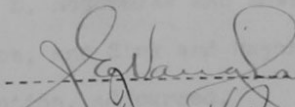
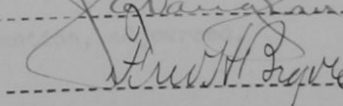

No statute or principle would warrant the exaction of a receipt in full of all demands of the city against the county, as a prerequisite to the payment of an acknowledged indebtedness of the county to the city. The county may or may not be legally liable to the city because of the many improper returns of delinquent taxes and failures to order the re-assessment of rejected taxes; but the amounts involved may be so large as to warrant the attempt to establish the county's liability therefor in some appropriate proceeding.

Section 1. Sec. 2. Upon the occurrence of a vacancy in the office of justice of the peace the clerk shall in writing notify the city commission thereof at its next session, and such vacancy shall be filled by election at the next election to be held in the city, if one is to be held more than fifteen days and within thirty days after such notification, but if no election is to be held within such period the commission shall forthwith call a special election for the filling of such vacancy, to be held not less than fifteen days nor more than twenty days after such notification. No primary election shall be necessary for the filling of such vacancy. Nominations to fill a vacancy in such office shall be by petition in the same manner, as near as may be, for the placing of the names of candidates for city offices upon the ballots for primary elections, except that such petitions may be filed with the clerk on or before five days prior to such election. The commission may provide that such elections to fill vacancy shall be conducted according to a majority preferential system of voting, in which case the commission shall prescribe the rules for the conduct of such elections and the determination of the result thereof.

Sec. 3. The number of justices of the peace in and for the city of Marquette is hereby limited to two such justices of the peace on and after the fourth day of July one thousand nine hundred and seventeen, and one such justice of the peace on and after the fourth day of July one thousand nine hundred and nineteen, and, except to fill vacancies in such office, no successors in office of any of the present justices of the peace of the city shall be elected, except as provided in section one of this chapter.

Sec. 4. From and after the fourth day of July one thousand nine hundred and nineteen, the justice of the peace of the city shall have original jurisdiction of and hear, try and determine according to law all civil actions wherein the debt or damages do not exceed the sum of One hundred dollars; and concurrent jurisdiction in all civil actions, wherein the debt or damages do not exceed five hundred dollars, except those prohibited by section seven
