Sec. 2. Upon the occurrence of a vacancy in the office of Justice of the Peace the clerk shall in writing notify the city commission thereof at the next session, and a vacancy shall be filled by election at the next election to be held in the city. If one is to be held more than fifteen days and within thirty days after such notification, but if no election is to be held within such period the commission shall forthwith call a special election for the filling of such vacancy, to be held not less than fifteen days nor more than twenty days after such notification. No primary election shall be necessary for the filling of such vacancy. Nomination to fill a vacancy in such office shall be by petition in the same manner, as near as may be, for the placing of the names of candidates for city offices upon the ballots for primary elections, except that such petitions may be filed with the clerk on or before five days prior to such election. The commission may provide that such elections to fill vacancy shall be conducted according to a majority preferential system of voting, in which case the commission shall prescribe the rules for the conduct of such elections and the determination of the result thereof.

Sec. 3. The number of Justices of the Peace in and for the city of Marquette is hereby limited to two such Justices of the Peace on and after the fourth day of July one thousand nine hundred and seventeen, and one such Justice of the Peace on and after the fourth day of July one thousand nine hundred and nineteen, and, except to fill vacancies in such office, no successors in office of any of the present Justices of the Peace of the city shall be elected, except as provided in section one of this chapter.

Sec. 4. From and after the fourth day of July one thousand nine hundred and nineteen, the Justice of the Peace of the city shall have original jurisdiction of and hear, try and determine according to law all civil actions wherein the debt or damages do not exceed the sum of one hundred dollars; and concurrent jurisdiction in all civil actions, wherein the debt or damages do not exceed five hundred dollars, except those prohibited by section seven

Sec. 6. The court of any justice of the peace serving on a salary basis may be referred to in all process, pleadings and proceedings therein as the municipal court of the City of Marquette and such justice may be referred to in such process, pleadings and proceedings as the municipal judge, or judge of the municipal court

The commission may provide a room for the holding of the sessions of said municipal court and may fix the time when and place where sessions of said court shall be held, may appoint and employ a clerk or other clerical assistance for said court, and may direct that suits and prosecutions instituted by the city or any of the police force be brought before such court.
