2. When by the provision of any law, the city charter, any city ordinance, any resolution or order of the city commission, or any city department or officer, any advertisement or notice of any matter, other than such as is of a transient nature, is required to be published in any public newspaper, by or on behalf of the city, the city commission, or any city department or officer, the city clerk shall procure, authenticate by his signature thereon, file and index in the record of publications and posting, the affidavit of the publication of the same made by the printer of the newspaper in which the same was published, or by the foreman or clerk of such printer, specifying the time or times when and in what newspaper the same was published and the qualification of the affiant to make such affidavit.

3. When, by provision of any law, the city charter, any city ordinance, any resolution or order of the city commission, or any city department or officer, any advertisement or notice of any matter, other than such as is of a transient nature, is required to be posted by or on behalf of the city, the city commission, or any city department or officer, the city clerk shall procure, authenticate by his endorsement thereon, file and index in the record of publications and posting the affidavit of the posting of the same, made by the person posting such advertisement, or notice, or by some person having personal knowledge, of the facts specifying the time or times and places where such notice or advertisement was posted, and the qualifications of the affiant to make such

The city clerk shall provide and keep in his office a public record book for the filing therein and transcription of all notices of the publication and posting of notices and advertisements, the same to be known as the "record of publications and postings;" in which book he shall file and accurately file and index proper affidavits of the publisher and of the posting of all notices and advertisements, other than those of a transient nature, made by or on behalf of the city, the city commission, or any city department or officer.

2. When by the provision of any law, the city charter, any city ordinance, any resolution or order of the city commission, or any city department or officer, any advertisement or notice of any matter, other than such as is of a transient nature, is required to be published in any public newspaper, by or on behalf of the city, the city commission, or any city department or officer, the city clerk shall procure, authenticate by his signature thereon, file and index in the record of publications and postings, the affidavit of the publisher of the same made by the printer of the newspaper in which the same was published, or by the former clerk of such printer, specifying the time or times when and in what newspaper the same was published and the qualification of the affiant to make such affidavit.

3. When, by provision of any law, the city charter, any city ordinance, any resolution or order of the city commission, or any city department or officer, any advertisement or notice of any matter, other than such as is of a transient nature, is required to be posted by or on behalf of the city, the city commission, or any city department or officer, the city clerk shall procure, authenticate by his endorsement thereon, file and index in the record of publications and postings the affidavit of the posting of the same, made by the person posting such advertisement, or notice, or by some person having personal knowledge of the facts respecting the time or times when and places where such notice or advertisement was posted, and the qualification of the affiant to make such
