A regular meeting of the commission of the city of Marquette was held in the Municipal Court Room of the City Hall on Monday, January 7th, 1918, at 7:30 o'clock p.m. Mayor F.H. Begole presiding.

Present-Commissioners Pearce, Sherman, Sink and Werner.

The city clerk's report of fees collected by him for the week ending January 5th, amount \$1.00 was presented, read and ordered filed.

Moved by Commissioner Pearce, supported by Commissioner Sherman, and adopted, that the following members of the Commission, respectively are hereby designated to have supervision of the following departments, viz:

Public Health and Safety-Fred H. Begole.

Public Works - Edwin J. Sink.

Accounts and Finances - Ernest L. Pearce.

Light and Power - James E. Sherman.

Water - Jacob P. Werner.

Moved by Commissioner Pearce, supported by Commissioner Werner, and adopted, that the Commission do now proceed to elect one of the commissioners to act a mayor pro. tem.

The city engineer submitted profile and plat and diagram with estimate of the cost attached for "The Adams Street improvement No.2."

On motion of Dommissioner Pearce, supported by Commissioner Sink, the following resolution was adopted:

Whereas, Pursuant to the direction of the commission the city engineer has prepared and submitted profile, plat and diagram and estimate of the cost of "The Adams Street Sewer Improvement No. 2," (being sewer No.) viz:

The construction in Adams street of a six inch vitrified tile sewer with Y's and one lamphole, from the manhole in the present sewer in Genesee street to a point 162 feet north of the north side of Genesee street.

Resolved, That said profile, plat and diagram and estimate of cost

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of said proposed improvement are hereby approved and ordered placed on file with the city clerk: and

Resolved, That the commission hereby determines to make such improvement upon the route, location and grades and of the dimensions mentioned in said plat and diagram; and that the total cost of said improvement, estimated to be the sum of \$190.19, shall be defrayed by special assessment according to benefit upon the respective lots, premises and parcels of land liable to special assessment in the special assessment district comprising the lands to be assessed for said improvement as heretofore mentioned, described and designated by the commission: and

Resolved, That the assessor prepare and submit a special assessment roll for the purposes aforesaid, assessing therein the said sum of \$190.19, and

Resolved, That notice be given by publication for at least four weeks in the Marquette Chronicle, a daily newspaper of this city, of the intention of the commission to construct said improvement and to defray the cost thereof by special assessment upon the private property benefitted thereby and that the diagram, plat and estimate of the cost of said improvement may be found at the office of the city clerk for examination and that the commission will meet on Monday, February 11th, 1918, at 7:30 o'clock p.m. at the Municipal Court Room in the city hall and consider any suggestions that may be made by parties interested with respect to such improvement and the assessment roll therefor.

Beginning at the northeast corner of Lot 16 of Penny & Vaughan's Addition to the City of Marquette; running thence west on the south line of Jackson street to the northwest corner of said Lot 16; thence across Adams street to the northeast corner of Lot 19 of Caroline Burt's Addition No. 1 to the City of Marquette; thence west on the north line of said Lot 19 to the northwest corner of said lot; thence south to the southwest corner of Lot 22 of said Caroline Burt's Addition No. 1 on Genesee street; thence east on the north line of Genesee street to the southeast corner of the south 100 feet of the west 34 feet of Lot 17 of said Penny & Vaughan's Addition; thence north parallel with Adams street 100 feet; thence east at right angles to Adams street 32 feet to the southeast corner of said lot 1, of Penny & Vaughan's Addition; thence north to the place of beginning.

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Resolved, That the clerk cause notice to be published two weeks at least in the Marquette Chronicle, a public newspaper of the city, of the filing of said assessment roll with the city clerk, and appointing Monday, the 11th day of February, 1918, at 7:30 o'clock p.m. when the commission and assessor will meet to review said assessment.

The Light & Power Department reports that pursuant to Resolution adopted December 22nd, 1917, engineer T.W. Orbison has been requested to appear here and make us his recommendation and estimate of cost of new water power and electric generating plant at foot of city fall on Dead River.

Whereupon Mr. Orbison outlined to the commission the plan of improvement he favored, and recommended that the city build a new power plant on Dead River at a point 1400 feet below the present power plant. He requested that he be given thirty days in which to prepare plans and estimates of cost for the improvement, which request was granted.
