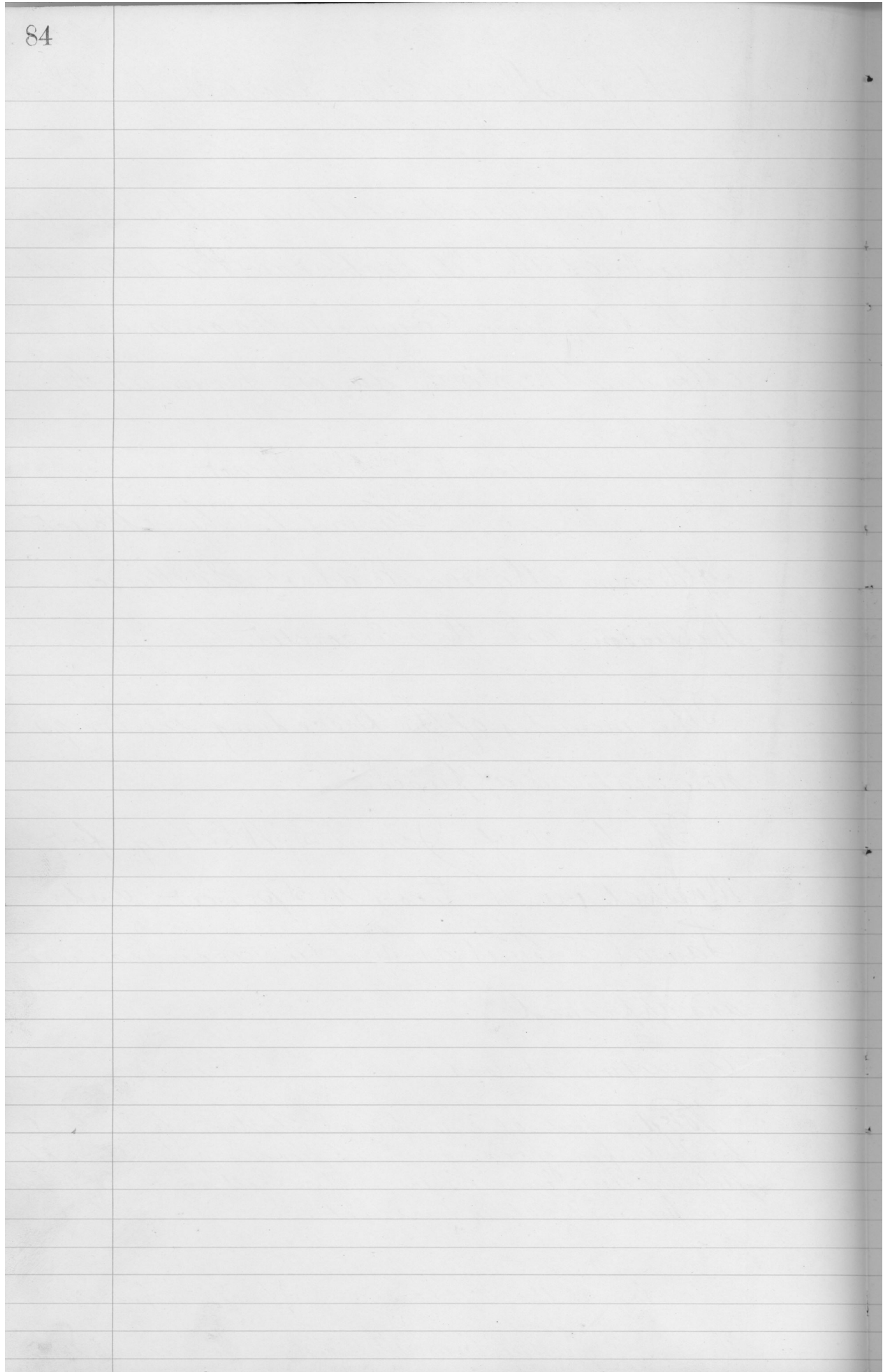
The minutes of the preceding meetings were read and approved.

Thereupon the Board adjourned

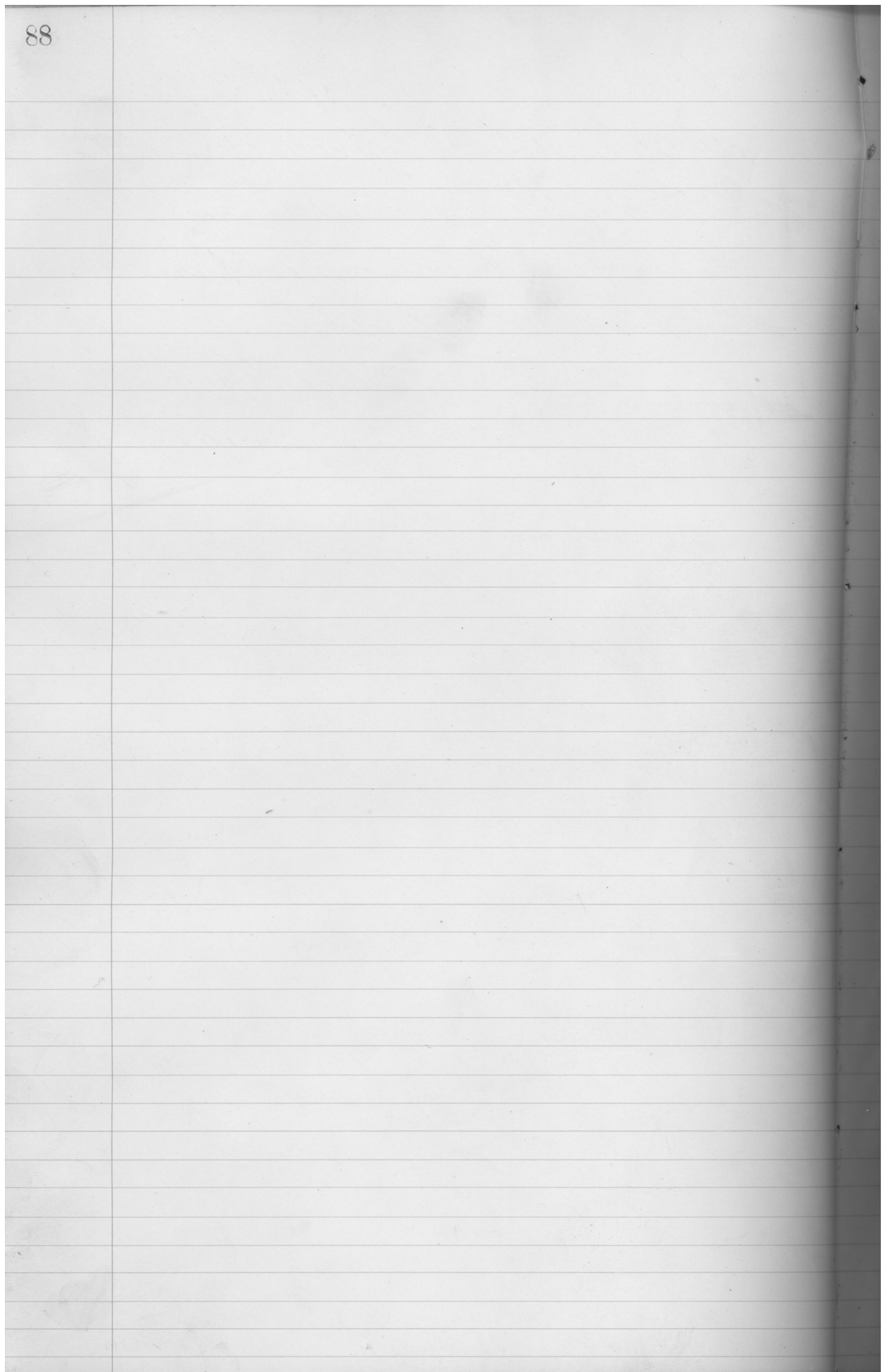

on file.

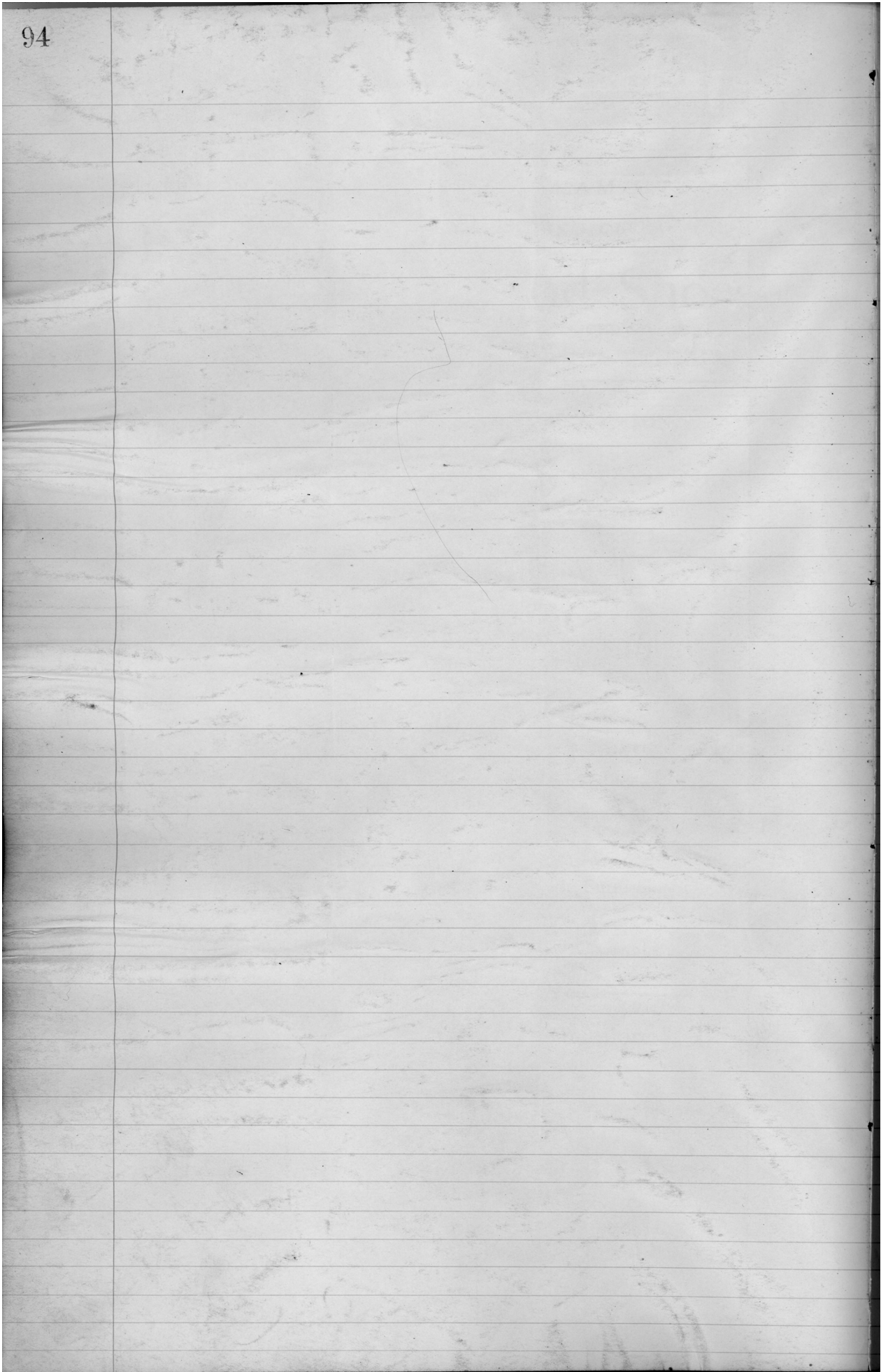
On motion of the Mayor, Sidney Adams was chosen

Commissioners occasioned by the resignation of Hiram A. Burt.

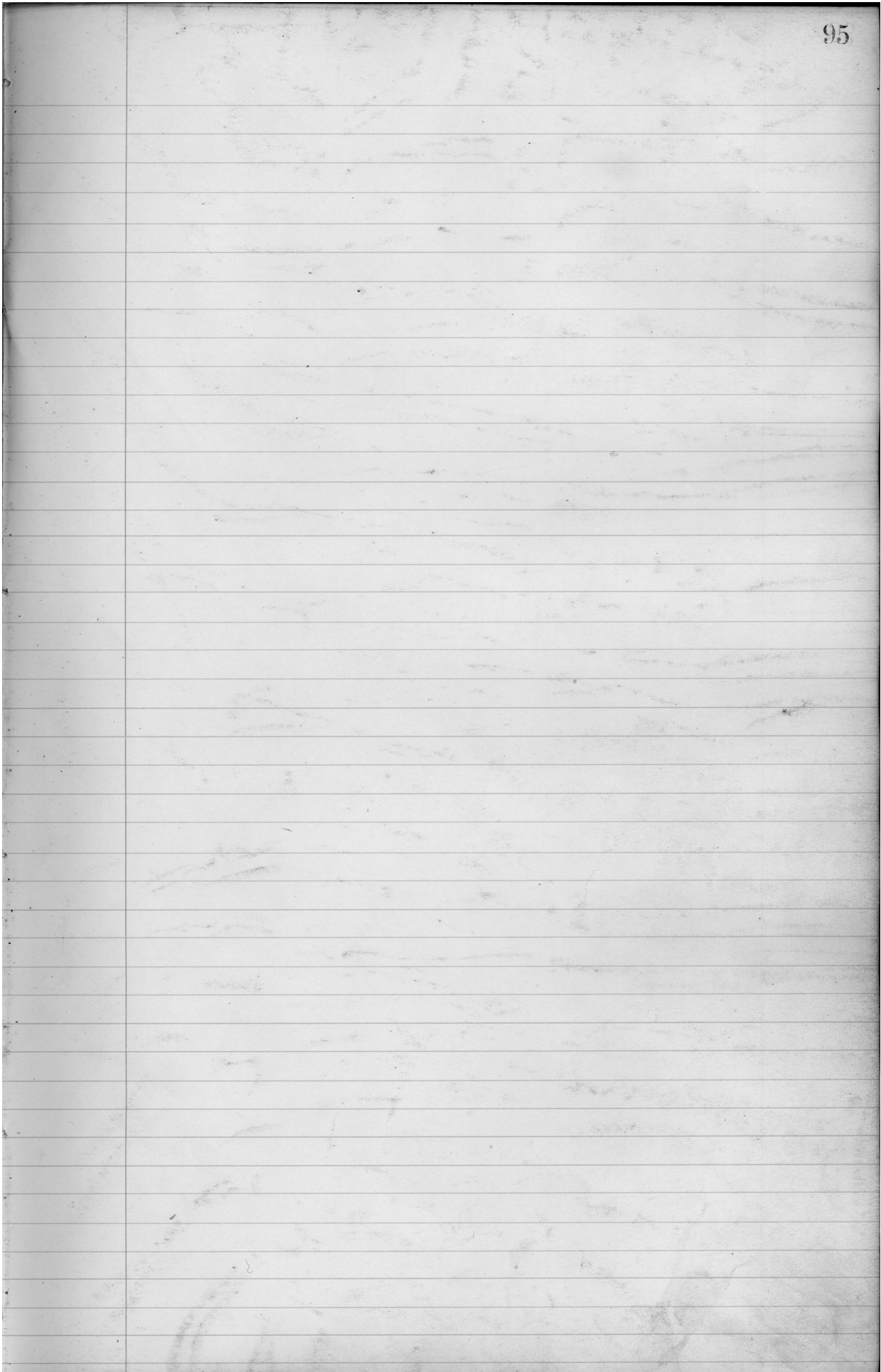
On motion Edward S. Hardy was appointed Harbor
Master.

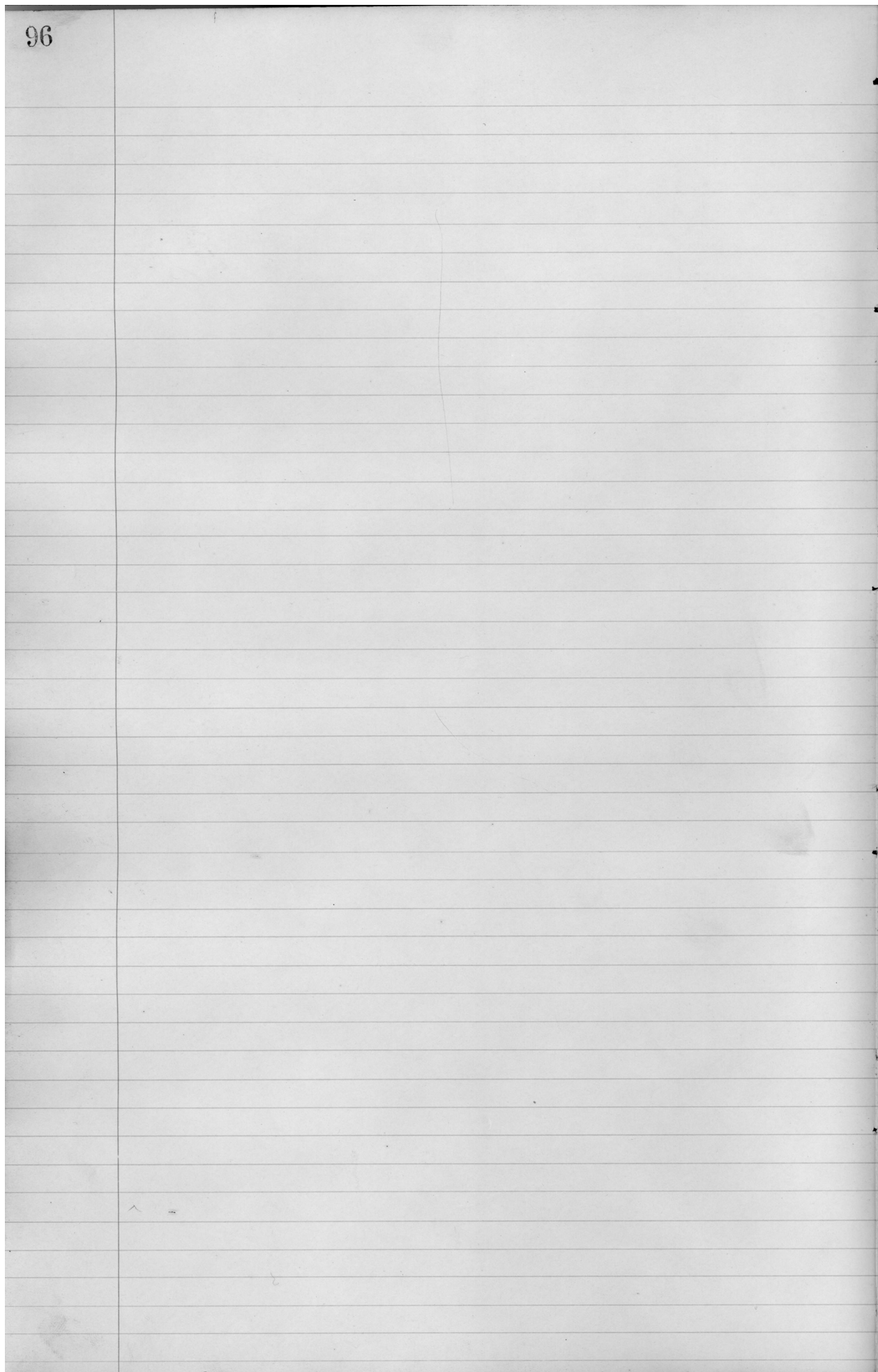

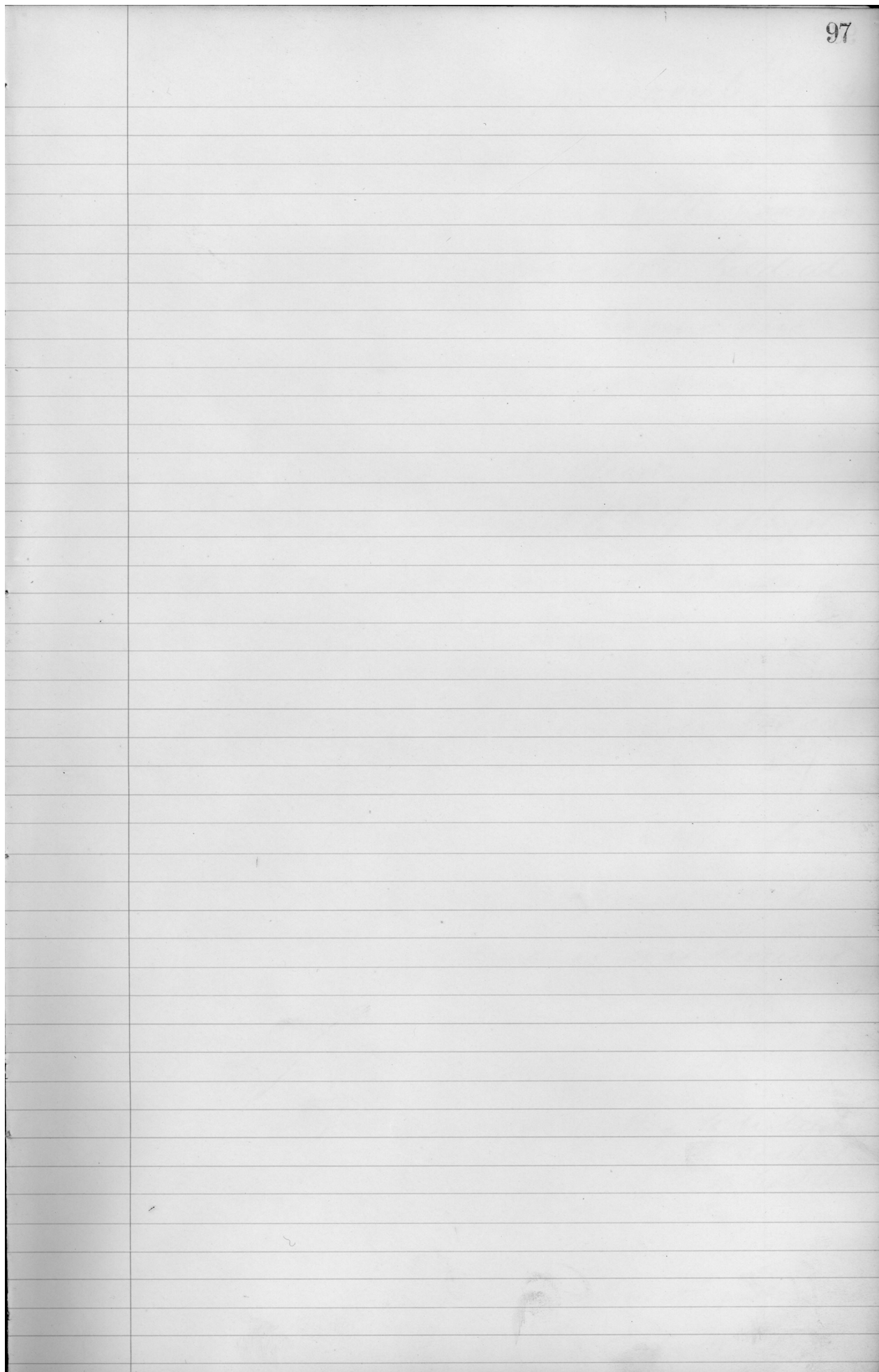

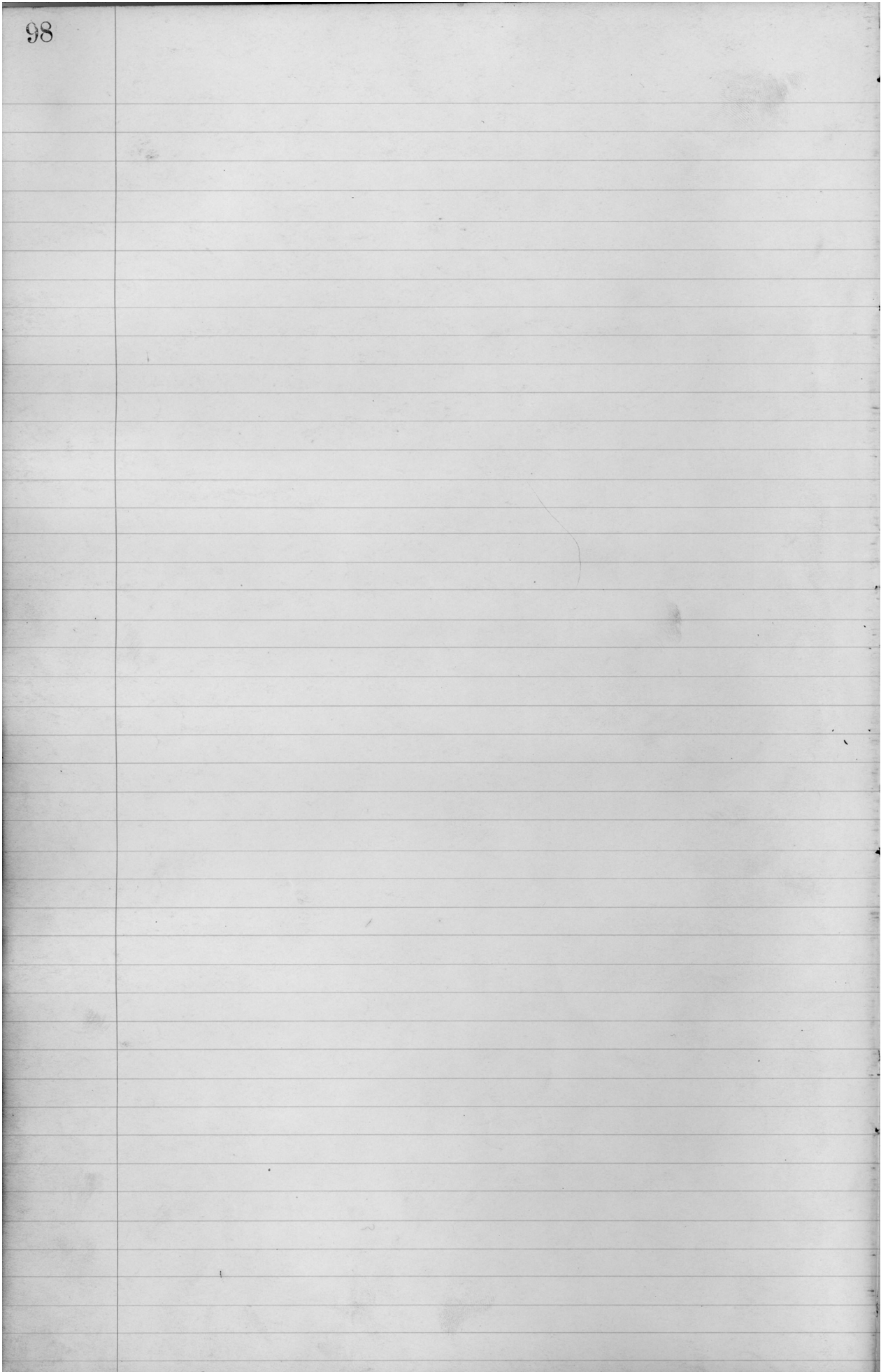

At a regular meeting of the Common Council of the City of Marquette held at the Common Council Rooms on Monday Evening May 5th 1873.

Present His Honor

Samuel P. Eh, Mayor.

Aldermen A. Field, Cook, Klidhart, Harlow, Frasset, Brittell and the Recorder. The meeting was called to order by the Mayor.

The roll was called and the reading of the minutes of the preceding meeting was dispensed with.

The petition of John G. O'Raffe for permission to occupy the front room now used as a library room ~~was received~~ and to be occupied as a Justice of the Peace's office was received and referred to the Committee on Police, Claims and Grievances.

The petition of Dominick Derugs praying for the privilege of erecting and occupying a wooden stand or stall for the purpose of selling pea-nuts, candies, apples etc said stand to be erected beneath the stairway leading to the offices above the store of John Crowley corner of Front and Superior Streets, was received and referred to the Committee on Streets, Highways and Bridges.

Bill of Peter White for Insurance \$15⁰⁰ was presented and referred to the Committee on Police, Claims and Grievances.

It being the regular meeting for the election of certain of the City officers - on motion the Council proceeded to choose by ballot a City Attorney, with result as follows

James E. Dalliba received 3 votes
John L. Cochran " 5 " and John L. Cochran was declared elected City Attorney for the ensuing year.

The Council then proceeded to elect City Marshal by ballot with result as follows

Thomas B. Rundle received 5 votes
James S. Whiting received 3 votes and Thomas B. Rundle was declared elected City Marshal for the ensuing year.

On motion of the Mayor Edward S. Hardy was appointed Harbor Master for the ensuing year.

On motion the rules were suspended and the Board proceeded to the choice of the following officers to wit
 Three members of the Board of Health
 One Street Commissioner
 One Park and Cemetery Commissioner
 One Pound Master

When the following persons were unanimously elected
 For members of the Board of Health. Morgan L. Harst
 Health officer. Terrence Moore, Francis M. Moore
 For Street Commissioner Matthew McConnell
 For Park & Cemetery Commissioner Peter White
 For Pound Master Thomas R. Prindle

On motion of Alderman Fraser seconded by Alderman Cook the City Attorney is requested to ascertain in regard to the Director of the Port - the law ^{respecting} the division of funds for the support of the City and County port and report at the next regular meeting

On motion of Alderman Fraser seconded by Alderman Cook the Committee on Streets, Highways and Bridges were instructed to bring in a report to the next meeting of the Council relative to building a new bridge across the Carp River.

The Mayor then announced the following as the standing committees for the year ensuing
