PARK AND
CEMETERY COM.
MITTEE REPORT
ON PURCHASE OF
LAND FOR PARK
PURPOSES.

On motion of Alderman Aisiz, said report was received and ordered placed on file.

The Committee on Parks and Cemeteries reported as follows: To the Common Council:

Your Committee on Parks and Cemeteries respectfully calls attention to the desirability of obtaining for park purposes the land adjoining Presque Isle Park, on the west and connecting the park with the main land. These premises are so situated that in private hands they might in future, by the maintenance thereon of objectionable business and amusement enterprises, become a great detriment to and materially impair the value of our fine natural park.

The land mentioned contains over forty six acres and can easily be made one of the most attractive portions of the park, affording facilities for bathing, boating, etc., as no part of the park proper can furnish. Along the north and south sides of the parcel are the only sand beaches accessible from the park, Presque Isle Park having no such sand beaches where the people may get to the water.

The plans of the Park Commission for several years past have been based to some extent upon the likelihood that the City would some time get the land in question,

and on which now stand the pavilion, the park keeper's cottage and nearly all of the deer park.

The property is owned by Mr. Frank J. Jennison, of this city, who offers it to the city for \$22,000, at which price we recommend its purchase. We have procured, and submit herewith, Mr. Jennison's warranty deed of the property to the city for your acceptance if you concur in the recommendations of this committee.

The common council has heretofore approved the proposed purchase for park purposes of the property on the east side of Frank street, between the south line of Fisher street and the railroad property, which is also the property of Mr. Jennison, he having acquired title thereto in pursuance of a contract for its purchase made by him with the owners in June last. His price for the same is \$10,000, the same sum ^{which} ^{was} ^{understand} was paid for it some years ago, by the late William Ward, from whose heirs Mr. Jennison has bought the property. We have heretofore recommended the purchase of this property and also submit herewith for your acceptance Mr. Jennison's warranty deed of the property to the city for the sum of \$10,000.
