

NORMAL SCHOOL

Whereas, It is provided in said act that part of the appropriation therein made for said normal school shall not become available unless there be donated by the citizens of Marquette for the equipment of the school, the sum of five thousand dollars; and

Whereas, The establishment of said normal school in this city will be of benefit to all the citizens and property of the city, and it is proper that such donation be made by the city corporation in behalf of and for all the persons interested in the city; and

Whereas, It is deemed necessary by the Common Council to borrow money to the amount of five thousand dollars to be donated by the city pursuant to Sec. 15 of Chap. 7 of the City Charter, to aid in the construction of said normal school and that the Common Council be authorized so to do by vote of the electors; therefore be it

Resolved, That for said purpose, and when authorized by vote of the electors hereinafter provided for, there be raised by the issue of bonds upon the faith and credit of the city of Marquette the sum of five thousand dollars upon the best terms obtainable; and be it further

Resolved, That a special election is hereby appointed and called to be held in the several wards of the city on Monday, the 5th day of June 1899, from the hour of 7 o'clock A.M. to the hour of 5 o'clock P.M. at which election there shall be submitted to the legal voters of the city the question of authorizing the Common Council to donate the sum of \$5,000, to aid in the construction of the Northern Michigan Normal School at Marquette; and for that purpose to borrow money and issue therefor bonds, upon the faith and credit of the city of Marquette, to the amount of five thousand dollars; and be it further

Resolved, That the form of the ballots to be used at such election shall be as follows:

"Shall the Common Council of the city of Marquette be authorized to donate the sum of \$5,000 to aid in the construction of the Northern Michigan Normal School at Marquette and to issue bonds of said city to the amount of five thousand dollars to raise money therefor?"	}	YES <input type="checkbox"/>
