AMENDING STREET

RAILWAY FRANCHISE

The Council then took up the subject of amending the street railway franchise ordinances and the amending ordinance submitted by Alderman Shea on Dec. 18<sup>th</sup> was read.

On motion of Alderman Jacobs, section ten in said amending ordinance was amended so as to provide for three cent fares for children over five years and not over twelve years of age, and for the furnishing of ten tickets for twenty-five cents for children of such age.

years, all changes in the franchise to apply only to the nine year extension, and omitting the provisions of section twenty of the amending ordinance. Carried
