ACCEPTANCE OF OHIO, CRESCENT STS. SEWERS. RETAIN 10%. The committee on streets and sewers recommended the acceptance of the Ohio street and Crescent street sewers, subject to the retention by the city of 10 per cent on contract price until streets are put in acceptable condition; which report was on motion adopted.

The grading of Altamont street, from south line of MS Millan street to Garden street, and Sixth street from Garden street to the south line of Fisher street, the full width thereof according to the grade heretofore established therefor, and make a macadam roadway sixteen feet in width in the center of said portions of Altamont and Sixth streets; and

Resolved, That the controller is hereby directed to establish and define a local assessment district embracing all the lots and parcels of real estate deemed to be benefitted by said improvement and an assessment roll, as provided by the charter of the city, assessing thereon the estimated cost of said improvement and submit the same to the council.

The grading of Mesnard street from Adams street to Altamont street, the full width thereof according to the grade heretofore established therefor, and make a macadam roadway thirty feet in width in the center of said portion of Mesnard street; and

Resolved, That the controller is hereby directed to establish and define a local assessment district embracing all the lots and parcels of real estate deemed to be benefited by said improvement and an assessment roll as provided by the charter of the city, assessing thereon the estimated cost of said improvement and submit the same to the council.

The controller presented the special assessment rolls for grading and macadamizing Mesnard and Adams streets and for grading M. S. Millan street.
