John Dexter, sureties, Nicholas Erickson and Patrick Deary, Frank Johnson " Henry Hallam and John M. Sotomora Jr. The following protest of C. E. Killier, and fifteen others was presented:

Marquette Mich. August 17th 1903
To the Honorable Mayor and Common Council of the City of Marquette:

Gentlemen - We, the undersigned owners of property assessed for paving with brick of Washington street from Front street to Third street do hereby protest against the confirmation of the special assessment for said improvement and ask your honorable body to reconsider your former action relative to the paving of said street. At the time the petition for said paving was signed we were led to believe that the cost would be not to exceed \$1.00 or \$1.25 per lineal foot frontage, and we do not believe that said paving would benefit the abutting property equal to the amount assessed. With very little labor, this street could be repaired and put in condition for many years service, and we therefore insist that our petition be granted. And your petitioners will ever pray, etc.

Clark Secretary, of said Marquette City and Presque Isle Railway Company, each being duly sworn, depose and say that they have examined the improvement of track, rolling stock, machinery and buildings of the said Marquette City and Presque Isle Railway Company, made and added to the property of said Company, since the passage of said ordinance of January 19th, nineteen hundred and three; that these deponents have also examined the statement of expenditures of said Company in the purchase and making of said improvements to said track, rolling stock, machinery and buildings so expended, and say that the amount is in excess of the sum of twenty-five thousand (\$25,000) dollars as shown by the books of account of the said Marquette City and Presque Isle Railway Company.
