June 6, 1931.

A special meeting of the city commission of the city of Marquette, was duly called and held at the city hall on Saturday, June 6, 1931, at 4 o'clock p. m. Commissioner George D. McCormick, mayor pro tem, presiding.

Present — Commissioners Carlson, McCormick and Tierney.

The Clerk presented the request in writing made June 6, 1931, signed by two members of the commission for a special meeting of the commission to be held at 4 o'clock p. m., June 6, 1931, for the purpose of accepting dedication deed of vacated portions of Maple street from Mrs. Ellen J. Clark. The clerk also produced proof of service of notice of such meeting on all the members of the commission, except Commissioner Eldredge, who is absent from the city.

On motion of Commissioner Carlson, supported by Commissioner Tierney, the following resolution was adopted:

Whereas, In pursuance of an ordinance of the City of Marquette, Michigan, adopted on March 16, 1931, vacating, upon the terms and conditions therein set forth, a certain portion of Maple street, Ellen J. Clark has executed and delivered a quit-claim deed, dated May 29, 1931, to said City of Marquette, and its successors conveying a right of way over a certain piece or parcel of land situate and being in said city, to be used for the purpose of widening and relocating a portion of Maple street, and not otherwise, which said parcel of land is described as follows:

All that part of Block Two (2) of

Harlow's Addition No. 2 to the village of Marquette (now City of Marquette) according to the recorded plat thereof on file in the office of the Register of Deeds in and for Marquette County, Michigan, described as follows:

Beginning at the northeast corner of said Block 2; thence Southerly along the Westerly line of Third street forty-one and five-tenths (41.5) feet to a point; thence northwesterly parallel with the existing Southerly line of Maple street and at all times forty (40) feet distant Southerly therefrom, measured at right angles to said Southerly line of Maple street a distance of ninety-two (92) feet to a point; thence Northwesterly in a straight line to a point in the Southerly line of Maple street, which point is three hundred fifty-two (352) feet measured along said line from the Northeast corner of said Block 2; thence three hundred fifty-two (352) feet Southeasterly along the Southerly line of Maple street to the place of beginning, and,

Whereas, Said deed has been approved as to form by the city attorney of said city;


