furnished is hereafter found to be
dangerous to life or property be-
cause of its failure to conform to
said code, and the owner of such
premises shall have neglected or re-
fused to remedy such situation with-
in ten days after notice from the
superintendent of light and power,
the said superintendent shall cause
to be disconnected the service wire
leading to such premises and no cur-
rent shall thereafter be furnished
to such premises until the wiring
therein has in all respects been
made to conform to the provisions
of said code.
