



May 8, 1934, 7 p. m.

On motion of Commissioner Anderson, supported by Commissioner McGinley, the following resolution was adopted:

Whereas, it has been the policy of the City Commission, since 1932, to withhold the amount of unpaid taxes as represented by taxes and accounts receivable in the Library Fund, and the City Commission finding that this method seriously handicapped the library in carrying on its ordinary functions and, as the Library Fund is accounted for on the city books in its entirety and the cash belonging to it and all the other city funds is commingled, therefore

Be it resolved, that the entire amount of library tax levy be available for disposition by the Library Board, regardless whether the full amount of taxes is collected, and that moneys now shown as taxes or accounts receivable, by reason of tax delinquency, in the Library Fund for 1932 and 1933 be made available

On motion of Commissioner McCormick, supported by Mayor Jacques, and adopted, the Department of Light and Power was instructed to install a light on the southeast corner of the Champion street warehouse.
