Regular meeting at the City Hall, September 11, 1934, 7 p. m.

Moved by Mayor Jacques, supported by Commissioner Anderson, that the following resolution be adopted:

WHEREAS, there may now be in and may hereafter from time to time come into the hands of John C. Wilson, Treasurer of the City of Marquette, of Marquette County, Michigan, certain public moneys belonging to said City; and,

WHEREAS, under the Laws of Michigan this Board is required to provide by Resolution for the deposit of all public moneys, including tax moneys coming into the hands of said treasurer, in one or more banks or trust companies, hereinafter called banking institutions, to be designated in such Resolution and in such a manner as may be herein provided:

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Union National Bank of Marquette, \$200,000.00; The First National Bank & Trust Company of Marquette, \$200,000.00; The Marquette County Savings Bank of Marquette, \$200,000.00, be, and they are hereby designated as depositories in which the Treasurer of the City of Marquette shall deposit all public moneys including tax moneys, coming into the hands of such Treasurer, to amounts not exceeding the amounts set opposite the names of said Banking Institutions, respectively.





Regular meeting at the City Hall, October 9, 1934, 7 p. m.

Present—Mayor Jacques, Commissioners McCormick, McGinley and Tierney.

Fees reported collected by city clerk, \$3.75.

Moved by Commissioner Tierney, supported by Commissioner McCormick, and adopted, that the application of Joseph Fine for Class "C" Restaurant contract of license be approved.

Yeas — Mayor Jacques, Commissioners McCormick, McGinley and Tierney.

Moved by Commissioner McCormick, supported by Commissioner Tierney, that the following resolution be adopted:

WHEREAS, plans have been prepared and filed with the city clerk by the State Highway Department for the improvement of certain streets within the corporate limits of this municipality and said plans appear to be in proper form and satisfactory to this body,

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, That the said plans and specifications be and the same are hereby approved and the consent of this municipal body is hereby given for the making of said improvement in accordance therewith.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That this municipality shall cause all water lines, sanitary or storm sewers, house connections, gas mains, electrical conduits, or other underground work, either public or private, within the limits of the right of way throughout the length of said improvement, to be inspected and repaired, and, where necessary, to be put into first class condition at once, and that said municipality shall cause all additional or new underground work within aforesaid area (except such as provided for on pavement plans) to be properly installed at the earliest opportunity.

All backfilling of trenches, abandoned structures, etc., within the limits of the proposed construction area shall be done with bank run sand or its equivalent, placed in horizontal layers not to exceed 6 inches in depth, and thoroly tamped or flooded to produce maximum settlement.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED,

That the State Highway Department shall be reimbursed for all future repairs to the pavement included in this project made necessary on account of faulty material or workmanship in such underground work or the repair of the same or the installation of additional underground work by this municipality, on bill rendered by the State Highway Department when such repairs to the pavement will have been completed.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That this municipality will be at no time hereafter, without the written consent and approval of the State Highway Department, attach any further construction to the improvement so made by the State Highway Department; nor will it erect, install, or permit to be erected or installed, any traffic guide, signal, sign, or other device to control traffic, or for advertising purposes, except in conformity to the Rules and Regulations of the Michigan State Highway Department for uniform traffic control.





weight tax to thirty-five cents per

reasons:

The future development of the  
Upper Peninsula of Michigan, both  
from the industrial and resort point  
of view, depends to a large extent  
upon the paving at the earliest possi-  
ble moment of all trunk line high-  
ways throughout the Peninsula, so  
as to afford easy access to and from  
the Peninsula at all seasons of the  
year. Furthermore, the plowing of  
our highways is now considered by  
our citizens as one of the normal  
functions of our Highway Depart-  
ments. Revenue for those purposes  
has already been seriously impaired  
by the adoption of the Fifteen Mill  
Amendment, and we feel that the  
adoption of the proposed amend-  
ment would mean the curtailing of  
the winter plowing of highways and  
a necessary slowing up in the exten-  
sion of our paved Trunk Line High-  
ways. While this Commission is  
deeply sensible of the burden of tax-  
ation and has done its utmost to les-  
sen that burden wherever reasonably  
possible, it cannot but feel that it  
would be a mistake either to limit  
our State program of highway ex-  
pansion or the winter plowing of  
highways.
