Regular meeting at the City Hall  
January 2, 1935, 7 p. m.





Be it resolved, that, effective this date, there shall be at any one time not to exceed twenty-five (25) licenses authorized to sell beer and/or wine by the glass within the city limits, and no further applications for permission to sell spirituous liquor by the glass shall be approved by the commission unless from applicants who are authorized by the commission to sell beer and/or wine by the glass under the provisions of this resolution; provided, however, that exception may be made in any given case where, in the opinion of the commission, the situation is extraordinary or because of other attendant circumstances the best interests of the city would thus be served.
