SEPTEMBER 7, 1937

Regular meeting at the City Hall, September 7, 1937, 7 p. m.

Present—Mayor Jacques, Commissioners Anderson, McGinley, Patrick and Tierney.

Moved by Commissioner Tierney, supported by Commissioner Anderson, and adopted, that the petition for the installation of curbing on Fisher street between Seventh and Hill streets be referred to the department of public works for investigation and report.
