JANUARY 2, 1942

A special meeting of the City Commission was duly called and held at the City Hall, on Friday, January 2, 1942, at 4 o'clock p. m.

Present—Mayor Biegler, Commissioners Anderson, McGinley, Patrick and Tierney.

Moved by Commissioner McGinley, supported by Commissioner Anderson, and adopted, that Mr. L. G. Kaufman be informed that the City of Marquette is prepared to enter into a contract to furnish electric current to Granot Loma at a rate of 2c per KWH and \$150 monthly minimum with no credits if minimum is not used each month, and that the mayor and city clerk be and they hereby are authorized to enter into such a contract on behalf of the city of Marquette.

Moved by Commissioner Patrick, supported by Commissioner Anderson, and adopted, that the city of Marquette enter into negotiations with the James Pendill Estate for the purchase of property south and west of Presque Isle Park property and the Shiras Pool.

Yeas — Mayor Biegler, Commis-

sioners Anderson, McGinley, Patrick and Tierney.

Moved by Commissioner Anderson, supported by Mayor Biegler, and adopted, that the requirements for employment by the city must be that the person shall at least have his first citizenship papers and that in the future none but citizens be given employment by the city.





JANUARY 5, 1942

Regular meeting at the City Hall, January 5, 1942, 7 p. m.

Present — Mayor Biegler, Commissioners Anderson, McGinley, Patrick and Tierney.




Present—Mayor Biegler, Commissioners Anderson, McGinley, Patrick and Tierney.


Moved by Commissioner Patrick, supported by Commissioner Ander-

son, and adopted, that the purchasing agent be authorized to purchase 10,000 gallons of T3-Tar from the Barrett company.



JANUARY 12, 1942

Regular meeting at the City Hall, January 12, 1942, 7 p. m.

Present — Mayor Biegler, Commissioners Anderson, McGinley, Patrick and Tierney.

Moved by Commissioner Anderson, supported by Commissioner Patrick, and adopted, that the request of the J. H. Green Company for permission to remove scrap iron from the city dump grounds be referred to the department of public health and safety with power to act.

Yeas — Mayor Biegler, Commissioners Anderson, McGinley, Patrick and Tierney.

Moved by Commissioner McGinley, supported by Commissioner Patrick, that the City enter into an agreement with L. G. Kaufman, if acceptable to him, providing for settlement of accounts between the parties for the period from Nov. 1 1937 to Dec. 31, 1941, inclusive, as to which period no written agreement is on file, and providing for a new schedule of rates effective Jan. 1, 1942, along the lines of suggested form of agreement presented by Commissioner McGinley, which provides, in general (1) that the charge for electric current furnished for the period from Nov. 1, 1937 to Dec. 31, 1941 shall be computed at the rate of \$150.00 per month, and (2) that charges for current furnished after Dec. 31, 1941, shall be under the terms of acceptance outlined in letter from L. G. Kaufman to Mayor Louis W. Biegler dated Dec. 1, 1941.

Yeas — Commissioners McGinley and Patrick.

Nays—Mayor Biegler, Commissioners Anderson and Tierney.

The Mayor thereupon declared that the resolution was not adopted.

Moved by Commissioner Tierney, supported by Commissioner Anderson, that the following resolution be adopted:

Resolved, that the city clerk be and she is hereby instructed to notify Mr. Kaufman that the City of Marquette is willing to contract with him for his needs of electric current at Loma Farms for a period of two years from and after January 1, 1942, only on the basis

of the resolution covering that subject matter which was adopted at the meeting of the City Commission held on January 2, 1942.

The foregoing resolution was adopted by the following vote:

ANNUAL APPROPRIATION BILL AND TAX LEVY FOR YEAR 1942

Whereas, on April 13, 1942, this Commission made and adopted estimates of all the expenditures which will be required to be made from the several funds of the city during the current year, and for the payment of interest and indebtedness to fall due during the year, for departments, objects and purposes therein specified; and also fixed the date of April 27, 1942, for public hearing upon said estimates; and

Whereas, said estimates and notices of said meeting, and the purpose thereof, have been published in the Daily Mining Journal, a newspaper published in the city, for at least one week before said meeting;

Resolved, that the several sums and amounts of money estimated and determined upon in the said estimates are hereby determined to be required for the respective objects and purposes specified in said estimates, to defray the expenditures and liabilities of the corporation for the current fiscal year; and

Resolved, that there is hereby appropriated for the present fiscal year out of the money in and to come into the city treasury, not otherwise appropriated or belonging to any other general or special fund, the following sums and amounts for the several departments and particular objects and purposes respectively specified in said estimates and the above determination, viz:

For the DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC AFFAIRS: the amount of said sums, to-wit, forty-three thousand three hundred eighty dollars (\$43,380.00);

For the DEPARTMENT OF ACCOUNTS AND FINANCES: the amount of said sums, to-wit, eight thousand two hundred dollars (\$8,200.00);

For the DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS: the amount of said sums, to-wit, ninety thousand seven hundred twenty dollars (\$90,720.00);




