Regular meeting at the City Hall, May 1, 1944, 7 p. m.

Regular meeting at the City Hall, May 15, 1944, 7 p. m.

Present—Mayor Beckman, Commissioners McGinley, Patrick and Schneider.

WHEREAS, at this late date it is appropriate that we select a name which will at least in some slight measure show our appreciation of the true historical importance of that highway and its builders;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED AND ORDERED, that hereafter the portion of said highway located within the city limits of the city of Marquette shall be designated at "Pioneer Road," and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED AND ORDERED, that all persons in the employ of the city who have in their official custody books, records and maps indicating said road as Dump Road change such designation to "Pioneer Road" and that it be so entered on all books, records and maps hereafter made and in all communications addressed to the persons who reside immediately adjacent to said road.

Commissioner Patrick seconded the foregoing resolution. A vote was taken on the adoption of said resolution, which resulted as follows:

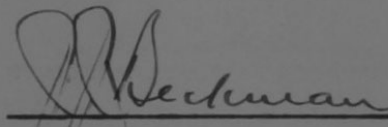

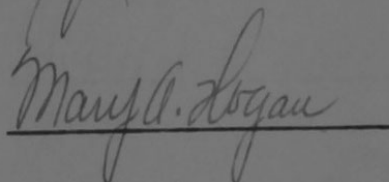

Nays—Commissioners McGinley and Schneider.

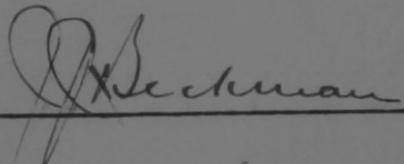
