Now, Therefore, Be It Resolved, that the mayor and city clerk be and they are hereby authorized and directed to execute such a deed for and in behalf of the city.

(1) That consent, permission and authority is hereby granted to the said Lee Duer to establish, maintain and operate over and upon the public ways of the City of Marquette an exclusive motorbus transportation service, insofar as the charter of the City of Marquette will permit, for a period of five years from the date hereof, for the transportation of passengers and their baggage;

(2) Service shall be maintained over the routes, on the schedule and at the rates set forth in the proposal submitted by the said Lee Duer and now on file with the City Clerk. Such routes, schedules and rates shall not be changed or altered except with the consent and permission of the City Commission. In the event the said Lee Duer desires to make a change in routes, schedules or rates, he shall make an application to the City Commission for leave so to do. He shall set forth therein the reason for desiring to make such change or changes. The granting of such a request shall rest in the sound discretion of the Commission. In the event the city desires an extension of such service or a change in rates, notice thereof shall be served upon the said Lee Duer of a time and place of hearing, at which time the practicability of such a change in service or the reasonableness of such a change in rates shall be considered. If, after such a hearing, the City Commission is of the opinion that such an extension of service is practicable, or change of rates reasonable, the same shall be promptly put into effect. The said Lee Duer shall not, however, be required to maintain or extend service over any route or routes shown by an actual traffic check extending over a period of thirty days to be unprofitable or impracticable, or to put into effect any reduction of rates which will yield

him less than a reasonable return on his investment;

(3) The operating equipment used in such service shall be at all times maintained by the said Lee Duer in a safe, sanitary and sightly condition;

(4) Public liability and property damage insurance, satisfactory to the City Commission in amount and as to the insurers, shall be at all times maintained by the said Lee Duer and the policy or policies providing same shall be deposited with the city auditor.
