JUNE 4, 1945

A special meeting of the City Commission was duly called and held at the City Hall, on Monday, June 4, 1945, at 4:00 o'clock p. m., for the purpose of meeting with the Shiras Institute Board relative to the proposed hospital site, and for the conduct of any other business which may come before the meeting.

Present—Mayor Beckman, Commissioners Bruce, McGinley and Schneider.

Moved by Commissioner Schneider, supported by Commissioner McGinley, and adopted, that the request of John R. Myers for permission to demolish a building at 244 Fisher street, be referred to the department of public health and safety, with power to act.

Yeas — Mayor Beckman, Commissioners Bruce, McGinley and Schneider.

Moved by Commissioner Bruce, supported by Commissioner McGinley, and adopted, that the mayor and city clerk be and they are hereby authorized to enter into an agreement with the United States Public Health Service for ambulance service.

Yeas — Mayor Beckman, Commissioners Bruce, McGinley and Schneider.

Commissioner Bruce offered the following resolution and moved its adoption

## RESOLVED

1. That that portion of Park Cemetery hereinafter more particularly described be and the same is hereby perpetually dedicated and set aside as a burial place for persons of the Jewish Faith and no person who is not of that faith shall at any time be interred therein.

2. The portion of Park Cemetery so set aside as aforesaid for the burial of persons of the Jewish Faith is more particularly described as follows:

Beginning at the northeast corner of Park cemetery which is 1332.5 feet north and 653 feet east of the southwest corner of section 14, Town 48 North of Range 25 West; thence south along the east line of Park Cemetery 360 feet; thence west 205 feet; thence north

360 feet to the north line of Park Cemetery; thence east along the north line of Park Cemetery 205 feet to the place of beginning, containing approximately 1.7 acres.

3. Persons of the Jewish Faith who are residents of the City of Marquette shall meet and select a committee of five persons to act as representatives of that faith and the names of the persons so selected shall be certified to the City Commission. Hereafter in the month of June of each year said list shall be renewed and submitted to the City Commission. Said committee shall be the official contact group of the persons of the Jewish Faith and, in case of dispute as to the right of any person to be interred in the portion of said cemetery described as aforesaid, the decision of said committee shall be final and binding.

4. Lots in said portion of said cemetery shall be charged for by the city on the same basis as they are charged for in the remaining portion of said cemetery, and except as above otherwise provided, said portion of said cemetery shall be kept, maintained and beautified by the City of Marquette in the same manner that it keeps, maintains and beautifies the remainder of said cemetery: Provided that nothing of a permanent nature shall be erected therein against the objection of said committee.

Commissioner Schneider supported the foregoing resolution.

A vote was thereupon taken on the adoption of the said resolution which resulted as follows:

Yeas — Mayor Beckman, Commissioners Bruce, McGinley and Schneider.

Nays—None.

The mayor thereupon declared said resolution adopted.

Moved by Commissioner Schneider, supported by Commissioner Bruce, and adopted, that the city accepts the option tendered to it by the Shiras Institute, dated June 4, 1945, and that the mayor and city clerk be and they are hereby authorized to execute same in behalf of the city.

Moved by Commissioner Bruce, supported by Commissioner McGinley, and adopted, that the mayor and city clerk be and they are hereby authorized and directed to enter into a Sale Agreement with the United States of America, whereby the city undertakes and agrees to sell and convey to the United States of America, for a consideration of \$1.00, the following described piece or parcel of land.

Beginning at a point 1652 feet north of the SW corner of the SE corner of the SE ¼ of the SW ¼ of Sec. 26, T 48 N, R 25 W, running thence east 900 feet to a point 1000 feet south and 415 feet west of the center of said Section 26, thence North 55 degrees 30 feet east a distance of 690 feet more or less to a point on the west right of way line of Highway US 41 opposite the center line station 56-00, thence northwesterly along said right of way line a distance of 1755 feet more or less to the intersection of the north line of Lot 41 of John and William Burt's Addition with the west right of way line of said Highway US 41, thence west along the south line of the alley platted between Furnace and Sandstone streets 165 feet, thence south 330 feet thence south 31 degrees 30 feet west 580 feet, thence west 375 feet to the southeast line of Division street, thence southwesterly along said southeast line of Division street 150 feet, thence south along the west line of the SE ¼ of the NW ¼ of said Section 26, 25 feet to the northwest corner of the NE ¼ of the SW ¼ of said Section 26, thence continuing south along the west line of the said NE ¼ of the SW ¼ 1000 feet more or less to the point of beginning, containing 40 acres more or less.
