Regular meeting at the City Hall, May 13, 1946, 7 p.m.






MAY 18, 1946



MAY 20, 1946

Regular meeting at the City Hall, May 20, 1946, 7 p. m. Commissioner Lee McGinley, mayor pro tem, presiding.
