

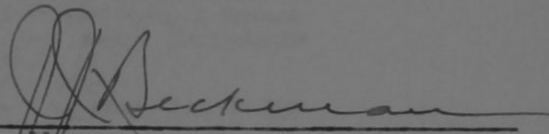

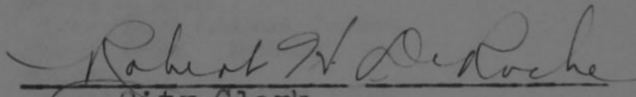

JANUARY 13, 1947

Regular meeting at the City Hall,
January 13, 1947, 7:00 o'clock p.m.

Present—Mayor Beckman, Commissioners Bruce, McGinley, Schneider and Tierney.

Moved by Commissioner Schneider, supported by Commissioner Bruce and adopted, that the proposal of J. H. Green Company for the dismantling of the Quarry Plant and Rock Unloading Elevator as set forth in his Alternate Proposal No. 1 of December 30, 1946, as modified by his letter of January 6, 1947, be and the same is hereby accepted, and be it further resolved that the Mayor and City Clerk are hereby directed to execute the contract covering said work, as prepared by the City Attorney and heretofore submitted to this Commission.

Moved by Mayor Beckman, supported by Commissioner McGinley, that the following resolution be and the same is hereby adopted:

Whereas, It is the sense of this Commission that a proper utilization of the resources, advantages and attractions of the City of Marquette calls for a detailed study of such resources, advantages and at-

tractions to the end that the same may be developed in such an orderly and constructive manner as will best contribute to the health and welfare of the present and future inhabitants of the city; and

Whereas, It is also the sense of this Commission that a preliminary and indispensable step in such development is a detailed study of such resources, advantages and attractions and the formulation of a long range plan for their development; and

Whereas, It is further the sense of this Commission that a representative group of citizens of Marquette be selected by this Commission to aid it in formulating such a plan and putting the same into operation;

Now, therefore, be it resolved and ordered:

1. That a group of seven citizens of Marquette be selected by this Commission, to be known as the Marquette Planning Board, who shall represent, insofar as is possible, different professions or occupations;

2. That the term of each member shall be three years, except that the term of one of the members first appointed shall be for one year and three for two years; that the members shall serve without compensation and may be removed at any time in the discretion of the Commission; that the removal of any member from the City of Marquette shall automatically vacate his membership;

3. That it shall be the function and duty of the planning board to make a master plan for the physical development of the city, including any areas outside of its boundaries which, in the planning board's judgment, bear relation to the planning of the city; that such plans, with the accompanying maps, plats, charts and descriptive matter, shall show the planning board's recommendations for the development of said territory including, among other things, the general location, character and extent of streets, viaducts, bridges, waterways, waterfronts, boulevards, parkways, playgrounds and open spaces, the general location of pub-

lic buildings and other public property and the general location and extent of public utilities and terminals, whether publicly or privately owned or operated, for water, light, sanitation, transportation, communication, power and other purposes; also the removal, relocation, widening, narrowing, vacating, abandonment, change of use or extension of any of the foregoing ways, grounds, open spaces, buildings, property, utilities or terminals; also the general location, character, layout and extent of community centers and neighborhood units, the general character and layout of the replanning and redevelopment of blighted areas, as well as a zoning plan for the control of the height, area, bulk, location and use of buildings and premises.

4. That the City Manager make available to the planning board such technical skill as the city may have in its employ, at such times as will not interfere with the discharge of their regular duties; that the planning board may accept, for and in behalf of the city, gifts to enable it to carry out any of its functions hereunder that it may, subject to approval of the City Commission, first had and obtained, appoint such employees as it may deem necessary for its work also, subject to the same limitations, contract with city planners, engineers, architects and other consultants for such services as it may require; that duly authorized expenditures of the planning board shall be approved for payment by the Public Affairs Department, and that no expenditures recommended by the planning board shall exceed the amounts approved therefor by the City Commission.

5. That the planning board shall hold at least one regular meeting each month; that it shall adopt rules for the transaction of its business and that it shall keep a record of its resolutions, transactions, findings and determinations, which record shall be a public record; that it shall report at least semi-annually to the City Commission the progress of its work hereunder, together with such recommendations as it may from time to time be in a position to make as a result of its studies.
