Regular meeting at the City Hall, May 5, 1947, 7:00 o'clock p. m.

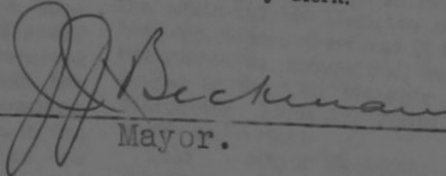

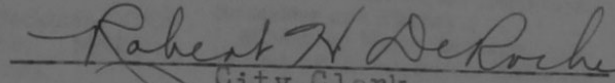

MAY 12, 1947

Regular meeting at the City Hall, May 12, 1947, 7:00 o'clock p. m.

Present—Mayor Beckman, Commissioners Bruce, McGinley, Schneider and Tierney.

Moved by Mayor Beckman, supported by Commissioner Tierney and adopted that request received from the Oscar Falk Post 146, the American Legion, Menominee, Michigan, for a contribution in the form of an appreciation ad, be placed on file.
