Present—Mayor Beckman, Commissioners Bruce, Olson, Schneider and Tierney.

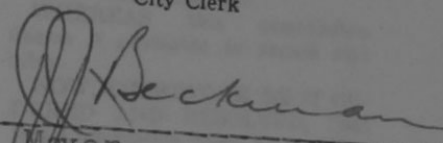
Moved by Commissioner Bruce, supported by Commissioner Schneider and adopted, that the Mayor and City Clerk be authorized to

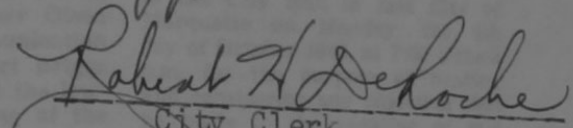

SEPTEMBER 7, 1948

Regular meeting at the City Hall, September 7, 1948, 4:30 o'clock p.m.

Present—Mayor Beckman, Commissioners Bruce, Olson, and Schneider.

Moved by Commissioner Bruce, supported by Commissioner Schneider and adopted, that petition presented by Raymond Dupras and five others to have Blemhuber Avenue graded for one block, running west from Altmont Street, and sewer and water installed in that same block, be referred to the City Manager for study and report.

Regular meeting at the City Hall, September 27, 1948, 7:00 o'clock p. m.

Present—Mayor Beckman, Commissioners Bruce, Olson, Schneider and Tierney.

Moved by Commissioner Tierney, supported by Commissioner Schneider and adopted that petition of Koski Brothers Company requesting that Fair Avenue between Pine street and Lake Shore Boulevard be cleared, graded and surfaced, be referred to the City Manager for study and report.

OFFICIAL PROCEEDINGS OF THE CITY COMMISSION.

DECEMBER 3, 1948

A special meeting of the City Commission was duly called and held at the city hall December 3, 1948, 11 o'clock a. m.

Present—Mayor Beckman, Commissioners Bruce, Brumm, and Schneider.

A statement signed by Mayor Beckman, Commissioners Schneider and Bruce was read by the clerk. Thereupon it was moved by Commissioner Bruce, supported by Commissioner Schneider and adopted, that said statement be entered at large in the records of this commission. Said statement follows:

At the meeting of the City Commission held Monday, November 29th, Commissioner L. W. Bruce suggested that all of the facts in connection with the pipe contract with Mr. Gurn S. Webb "be taken out of the record and published." We submit herewith the factual story which is verified by records in the office of the City Auditor.

Bids were received by the city on May 13, 1946, for a quantity of cast iron water pipe, valves, fittings and hydrants. Mr. Webb (for the McWane Cast Iron Pipe Company) made a total bid of \$8,120.47, which was accepted by the city and order placed on May 16, 1946. The bid of Mr. Webb was a firm bid (not subject to change in price) except for coverage on any increase in freight rates.

In a letter to the city purchasing

agent, dated July 31, 1946, Mr. Webb advised that there had been cost advances in items of pipe manufacture since the time of placing the order for the pipe and gave the commission the option of cancelling the order or approving it on the basis of an escalator clause. Mr. Webb stated, "should there be further advances before delivery, this would be to your account," and "will be based on the market at the time." To cancel the order would have meant losing a valuable three-month priority in the sequence of manufacturer's orders. It was anticipated that pipe would be delivered by October 1, 1946, as stated in Mr. Webb's letter dated July 31, 1946. The city commission, on written assurance by Mr. Webb of being billed at the market price at time of shipment and in the hope of being able to lay some much needed water mains in 1946, elected to allow the order to remain with him. The city, however, had a legal right to insist upon delivery at the firm price bid of \$8,120.47.

On or about January 13, 1947, Invoice No. 1979, dated January 13, 1947, from Mr. Webb for one car of pipe and fittings, was submitted to the city. This represented a partial billing on the contract. The original bid prices and the prices at which the city was invoiced were as follows:

The matter of the January 13 invoice was called to the attention

of the city commission by the city manager, who asked for instructions as to payment of the invoice. In view of the fact that the invoice submitted by Mr. Webb was 30.5 per cent above his original bid and

the unit price on 8-inch pipe was approximately 34 per cent above the original bid, the city commission felt that it should proceed with due care and caution, and at an informal meeting of the city commission, the city manager was instructed to proceed to Chicago on that and other matters and while there ascertain the actual market price in order that we might determine if an adjustment was in order. These instructions were acquiesced in by all members of the then city commission. The city manager complied with these instructions and contacted leaders in the pipe manufacturing business. Advice received from leading cast iron pipe manufacturers, including the McWane Cast Iron Pipe company, represented by Mr. Webb, was that there had been an advance in prices of only 20 per cent, rather than 30.5 per cent (or 34 per cent) as invoiced by Mr. Webb. The city commission were fully advised of these facts.

At about this time (latter part of January) word was received that the first car of pipe on the order had arrived in Marquette. It was stated that the car was shipped sight draft, bill of lading attached, and we were advised we could not unload the car without payment in advance, although the order was placed on a basis of $\frac{1}{2}$ of 1 per cent discount in 10 days or 30 days net.

After some negotiations with Tom Webb (son of Gurn S. Webb) the bill of lading was given to the city manager and the car of pipe delivered to the city for unloading at the waterworks pumping station.

Then, acting on instructions of the entire city commission, Mr. Webb was advised by telegraph on January 29, 1947, as follows:

Your invoice dated 13 January 1947 for shipment of 8 inch and 6 inch McWane precast cast iron pipe terms one-half of one per cent ten days dash 30 days net is 30 per cent higher than your original bid. Advised that trade increase on pipe since last May is 20 per cent. City commission directs

that invoice be corrected to conform with trade increase before acceptance. Car of pipe in Marquette. Advise.

Following the receipt of the quoted telegram Mr. Webb agreed by telegram as follows:

(Note: Mr. Webb's explanation at Monday night's meeting was that his son had misinterpreted his instructions and this was the reason for the overcharge.)

On February 1, 1947, Mr. Webb called the city manager by phone from St. Petersburg, Florida, requesting certain information be forwarded him as shown by the following letter —

Dear Mr. Webb:

In accordance with your telephone request this morning there is enclosed herewith copies pertaining to the purchase of cast iron pipe and fittings which were ordered from you in May and July 1946.

1. Copy of original bid dated May 10, 1946
2. Copy of purchase order for cast iron pipe as per your bid of May 13, 1946
3. Copy of purchase order dated July 10, 1946 for 6 inch cast iron water pipe.

The car of 6 inch and 8 inch pipe was unloaded yesterday. In order that the city may pay for this car of pipe and fittings in accordance with the terms of 30 days net purchase of same, it is desired that the proper invoice be submitted promptly.

Another invoice from Mr. Webb was received for the pipe and fit-

tings. The city commission approved all prices on the invoice except that of \$2.93 per foot for 10 inch pipe. The price on the 10 inch pipe was compromised at \$2.76 per foot. The final result was that the city paid very little, if any, in excess of the market price.

With reference to the other questions raised by Mr. Webb, we submit the following information:

Regarding street signs Mr. Webb's contention was that if we had wanted bids on wood signs we should have so specified. He said, "I could have quoted on wood signs if that was what you wanted." The following is a transcript of the specifications as issued at the time bids were solicited on street signs:

"May be of metal or of black gum wood with embossed letters of dimensions as follows: height of letters 3 1-2 inches minimum, width of letter members 3-4 inch approximately; total height of each sign member, 5 inch approximately. (It is not the intention of these approximate letter dimensions to eliminate any well designed sign with varying letter dimensions). Color: white on black, or black on yellow, to be selected when order is placed — names of streets to be furnished when order is placed. Length of signs to be varied in accordance with length of the names of streets in order to avoid compressing letters.

"It is the intention of these specifications to provide a durable legible sign which may be adopted as standard in the city of Marquette. The sign to be used will be selected with special consideration of these qualities with general attractiveness and economy of maintenance."

The bid on metal signs of Lyle Signs, Inc., (represented by Mr. Webb) was \$202.90 higher than the bids of the Municipal Purchasing Service on their standard raised letter wood signs. The order was placed with the latter company.

2. Regarding the purchase of copper pipe for water main services.

The city normally uses galvanized iron pipe for water service. Galvanized pipe has been an unusually difficult item to procure for the

past several months. The city has purchased galvanized pipe from local dealers, from dealers in Ishpeming and Negaunee, or wherever it might be available. However, in this particular instance we were unable to purchase galvanized pipe except at black market prices. Two outside firms suggested they could furnish copper pipe in the sizes and quantities needed by the city for installation of water services. Quotations were then solicited from these two firms and the order was placed with the Traverse City Iron Works.

3. Purchase of pipe, fittings and valves for the Diesel unit No. 4 now in process of installation. Mr. Webb's statement was that he did not get an opportunity to bid. The facts in this case are as follows:

Bids were first solicited to be received October 14. Due to the inability of one of the bidders to submit their bid on that date, the time was extended to October 18. On this date, Mr. Brumm stated that Mr. Webb had complained to him on Sunday, October 17, that he had not been notified the city was receiving bids for this material. The city commission then decided to extend the time for receiving bids to October 21. Mr. Webb was then mailed a copy of the bill of materials and specifications. Bids were opened October 21 and no bid was received from Mr. Webb nor did he request in the meantime any extension of time beyond October 21.

The following statement from Mr. G. E. Ackerman, consulting engineer for the city on the Diesel project, sets forth the reasons for adopting the procedure for receiving bids:

"Due to the necessity of extreme haste in the installation of Diesel Unit No. 4, it seemed best not to waste the time required for advertising for bids on the pipe, pipe fittings and valves for this unit, but to ask reputable manufacturers and dealers in such materials as quickly as possible, after the bill of materials was ready, to make proposals to the city of Marquette.

"On October 5 final information was received from the Nordberg Manufacturing company regarding

the sizes and dimensions of the auxiliaries for Diesel unit No. 4, which enabled us to draw up a tentative bill of material for the piping, pipe fittings and valves necessary for placing the generating unit into operation.

"On October 6 bills of material together with instructions to prospective bidders were mailed to four major manufacturers and suppliers.

"Of the four major companies requested to bid, one was unable to do so and only one of the others made a complete bid and specified delivery in time so that the work of installing the Diesel unit would not be delayed. In view of the critical power situation, it was imperative that these emergency measures be adopted to expedite in every way possible the purchase of this material.

"It would have been a serious mistake to place this order with any other than one of the larger, responsible companies able to make shipment of all of the required items in a very short time."

The bids were opened at the time set, October 21, and the only complete bid was that of the Crane company in the amount of \$3,036.30. Delivery dates specified by the Crane company were satisfactory. A special meeting of the city commission was held October 22, 1948, and the bid of the Crane company accepted. Shipment of the

greater part of the material has been made, with the balance due very soon.

We believe that the procedure followed in this matter was in the very best interests of the city.

Commissioner Brumm has not been requested to sign this statement, nor was he asked to participate in its preparation, as he did not take office until October 18. Commissioner Tierney has been away from the city for several weeks and was not available to sign the statement.

DECEMBER 28, 1948

Adjourned meeting of the City Commission held at the City Hall, December 28, 1948, 1:00 o'clock p. m.

Present— Mayor Beckman, Commissioners Bruce, Brumm and Schneider.

Moved by Commissioner Bruce, supported by Commissioner Schneider that the following resolution be and the same is hereby adopted:

WHEREAS proposed plans, specifications and form of contract for the construction of improvements and extensions to the municipal electric light and power plant and distribution system in and for the City of Marquette, Michigan have heretofore been prepared by Holland, Ackerman, and Holland, Engineers, and filed with the City Clerk on September 15, 1948; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to resolutions of the Commissioners adopted by the City of Marquette, Michigan at meetings held on September 1, 1948, September 20, 1948, September 21, 1948, and September 29, 1948, and at other times since September 1, 1948, all of said meetings of said Commission having been regularly called and held, contracts were entered into with various companies for the purchase and installation of various equipment and the rendering of various services for the electric light plant and distribution system of the City of Marquette Michigan, all in accordance with plans, specifications, and form of contract as prepared by Holland, Ackerman and Holland, Engineers, the same contracts, amendments, and supplements thereto and resolutions adopting same and approving them being by reference made a part hereof as if set forth verbatim herein.

WHEREAS the said contracts provide for payment either upon delivery of the material purchased or on the basis of ninety per cent (90 per cent) of the cost of the work completed during the previous month as certified by Holland, Ackerman, and Holland, Engineers, and

WHEREAS payments are now, or about to become due, said contractors in accordance with the provisions of said contracts,

NOW, THEREFORE, Be It and

It Is Hereby Resolved by the Commissioners of the City of Marquette, Michigan, as follows:

Section 1. That the City Treasurer is hereby authorized to establish a "Electric Light Plant Improvement Fund".

Section 2. That the City Treasurer is hereby authorized and directed to draw city warrants against this fund, in accordance with established procedure, for the purpose of paying amounts due such contractor or contractors referred to herein as certified by the consulting engineers, Holland, Ackerman, and Holland and approved by this Commission.

Moved by Commissioner Bruce, supported by Commissioner Schneider that the following resolution be and the same is hereby adopted:

IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED by the Commissioners of the City of Marquette Michigan that the Mayor and City Clerk be authorized and directed to sign the agreement with Nordberg Manufacturing Company which has been presented to this meeting and which shall constitute a modification of the agreement previously entered into between the City of Marquette and the Nordberg Manufacturing Company, dated September 1, 1948 and that the signatures of the Mayor and City Clerk upon an agreement herein authorized shall conclusively establish the identity of the document so signed as the agreement presented to and approved by the Commissioners at this meeting.

FURTHER RESOLVED, that the agreement with Nordberg Manufacturing Company dated September 1, 1948, as heretofore modified and as modified by the agreement this day approved, be and hereby is ratified, approved and confirmed.

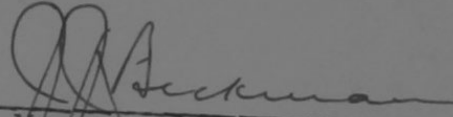

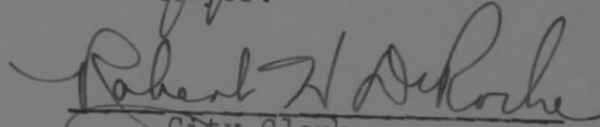
