MAY 10, 1949

Regular meeting at the City Hall, May 10, 1949, 7:00 o'clock p. m.

Present — Mayor O'Neil, Commissioners Bruce, Brumm, Schneider and Tierney.

Moved by Commissioner Bruce, supported by Commissioner Tierney and adopted, that the order received from the State Tax Commission relative to the preparation of the 1949 tax rolls, be received and placed on file.

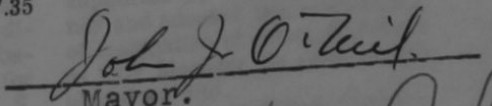
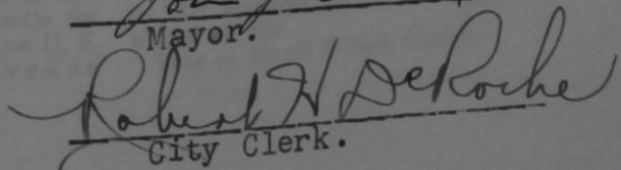
