JANUARY 3, 1950

Regular meeting at the City Hall, January 3, 1950, 7:00 o'clock p. m.

Present — Mayor O'Neil, Commissioners Brumm, Raish, Schneider and Tuominen.

Moved by Commissioner Tuominen, supported by Commissioner Brumm and adopted, that action on the petition of 88 persons for the installation of a flood light system at Hurley Field, be deferred for one week.

Yeas — Mayor O'Neil, Commissioners Brumm, Raish, Schneider and Tuominen.

Moved by Commissioner Schneider, supported by Commissioner Raish and adopted, that the request of the Employees Committee for changes in the Employment Code be received for consideration at the meeting to be held between the City Commission and a committee of city employees.

Yeas — Mayor O'Neil, Commissioners Brumm, Raish, Schneider and Tuominen.

Moved by Commissioner Schneider, supported by Commissioner Raish and adopted, that the invitation to the members of the City Commission to participate in the official welcome to Marquette of Harold Russell, National Commander of AMVETS, by the Marquette Amvets Post No. 124, be received and placed on file and that the invitation be accepted by the members of the City Commission.

WHEREAS, all suggestions and objections made to said improvement and to said assessment roll and the respective assessments therein, having been heard and considered; and

WHEREAS, said assessment roll and the assessments therein having been reviewed by the Commission and the Assessor, and all needful correction of the same having been made;

RESOLVED, That said assessment roll, to-wit Special Assessment Roll Number 234, and the respective assessments therein, are hereby confirmed.

JANUARY 16, 1950

Regular meeting at the City Hall, January 16, 1950, 7:00 o'clock p. m.

Present — Mayor O'Neil, Commissioners Brumm, Schneider and Tuominen.

Moved by Commissioner Brumm, supported by Commissioner Schneider and adopted, that the invitation received by the city commission to attend the annual dinner meeting of the Chamber of Commerce, be received and placed on file.

Yeas — Mayor O'Neil, Commissioners Brumm, Schneider and Tuominen.

Moved by Commissioner Brumm, supported by Commissioner Schneider and adopted, that request of the Chateau Wines Corporation that the city commission reconsider the denial of their claim for damages done to wines by flood waters on July 28, 1949, be taken under advisement by the city commission for another week.

Yeas — Mayor O'Neil, Commissioners Brumm, Schneider and Tuominen.

Moved by Commissioner Brumm, supported by Commissioner Schneider and adopted, that table of estimated receipts and tentative budget for 1950 received from the Peter White Public Library be placed on file.

Moved by Commissioner Brumm, supported by Commissioner Schneider and adopted, that the City of Marquette enter into an agreement with the Alger Delta Cooperative Electric Association as read by the City Clerk for the purchase of electrical power by the Alger Delta Cooperative Electric Association for distribution to its customers and that the Mayor and City Clerk be authorized and directed to sign said agreement in behalf of the City of Marquette.

Yeas — Mayor O'Neil, Commissioners Brumm, Schneider and Tuominen.

Moved by Commissioner Schneider, supported by Commissioner Tuominen that the following resolution be, and the same is hereby adopted.

RESOLVED, That the City Commission of the City of Marquette, Michigan, in its capacity as the legislative body of said city, does hereby declare for an election on the general revision of the charter of said city as provided and permitted by Section 18 of Act 279 of the Public Acts of 1909 as amended; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the question of having a general charter revision shall be submitted to the electors of said city for adoption or rejection at a special election to be held in said city on the 4th day of April, 1950; that at such election the polls shall be opened at seven o'clock a. m. of said day and continued up until the hour of eight o'clock p. m. of said day; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the question of such revision shall be submitted to the voters in the following form:

Shall there be a general revision of the charter of the City of Marquette?

Yes ()

No ()

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That at such election there shall be elected from the city at large a charter commission, consisting of nine electors of said city having the qualifications set forth in Section 18 of said Act No. 279 of the Public Acts of 1909; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That in order to provide adequate time for the preparation and printing of the ballots of said election, the final time for receiving nomination petitions for candidates for the office of charter commissioner shall be 5:00 o'clock p. m. on Monday, the 13th day of March, 1950; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the members of the charter commission elected at said election shall be compensated at the rate of

three dollars for each meeting actually attended; that said charter commission shall be entitled to incur necessary expenses in connection with the work of said commission; that they shall hold their first meeting on the 18th day of April, 1950 at the hour of 7:30 o'clock p. m. in the city commission chamber in the City Hall in said City of Marquette.

Yeas — Mayor O'Neil, Commissioners Brumm, Schneider and Tuominen.

Moved by Commissioner Brumm, supported by Commissioner Schneider that the following amendments to the "Employment Code" be adopted:

Section 11-1 of the "Employment Code" shall be amended to read as follows:

An Employes Committee shall be created and shall consist of five City Employes who shall be elected annually by a majority vote of employes present at a meeting to be held on the second Tuesday in December. No two members of the committee shall be employed in the same City's department.

Section 8-7 of the "Employment Code" shall be amended to read as follows:

In cases of employes classified as fire and ambulance protection employes, who are called back to duty, or shall perform work in excess of his regular work period, shall receive wages at the rate of one dollar (\$1.00) per hour.

Section 12-1 of the "Employment Code" shall be amended to read as follows:

The following shall be considered as regular holidays: New Year's Day, Washington's Birthday, Memorial Day, Independence Day, Labor Day, Armistice Day, Thanksgiving Day and Christmas Day. Special holidays or temporary suspension of business may be declared from time to time by the city commission. Employes who are required to work on any of the holidays listed above will be paid double time for time actually worked on the holidays.

Moved by Commissioner Schnei-

der, supported by Commissioner Brumm and adopted, that on the five requested adjustments in the "Employment Code" submitted on December 12, 1949 by Local 293, Marquette City Employes and Local 643, Marquette Fire Fighters, the first four be denied and requested adjustment number five that voluntary payroll deductions be made for all union dues, be allowed.

Yeas—Mayor O'Neill, Commissioners Brumm, Raish, Schneider and Tuominen.

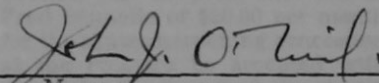

We respect Ray O'Neil's rights to his opinions but wish it to be regarded as such.

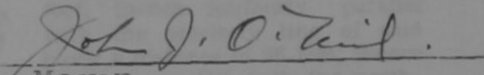
