

OFFICIAL PROCEEDINGS OF THE CITY COMMISSION.

MAY 1, 1950

Regular meeting at the City Hall, May 1, 1950, 7:00 o'clock p. m.

Present — Mayor O'Neil, Commissioners Brumm, Raish, Schneider and Tuominen.

A communication signed by seven local truckers requesting that the licensing of rubbish-garbage collectors be limited to seven truckers, was read. Moved by Commissioner Schneider, supported by Commissioner Raish and adopted that the limitation to the number of rubbish-garbage collectors provided in the Rubbish - Garbage Collectors Ordinance be removed and that licenses be issued to all who have equipment which meets the requirements of the ordinance.

Yeas — Mayor O'Neil, Commissioners Raish, Schneider and Tuominen.

Nays — Commissioner Brumm.

Moved by Commissioner Raish, supported by Commissioner Tuominen and adopted, that complaint of Wilfred E. Croisetiere relative to water running from an alley over his property at 828 Bluff Street, be referred to the City Manager and Superintendent of Public Works for investigation and report to the City Commission.

MAY 4, 1950

An adjourned meeting of the City Commission was duly called and held at the City Hall, May 4, 1950 at 7:00 o'clock p. m. for the purpose of continuing the public hearing on the proposed zoning ordinance.

Moved by Commissioner Schneider, supported by Commissioner Brumm and adopted, that the neighborhood shopping district on Presque Isle Avenue be extended south as far as Summit Street.

1. It is the main link, for residents of Big Bay, summer residents and tourists, between Marquette and the Big Bay area.

2. The road, in its present condition, is not only destructive to expensive and hard to acquire motor equipment, but also, because of the dust which blankets the road as soon as it becomes dry, presents an actual hazard to life and limb.

3. Its improvement would substantially compensate for and tend to overcome the loss which Big Bay suffered when the Ford industries moved therefrom, since it would encourage the development of that area as a summer recreational and winter sports area.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that a copy of this resolution be forwarded to the Marquette County Road Commission and the Marquette County Board of Supervisors.
