

OFFICIAL PROCEEDINGS OF THE CITY COMMISSION.

JANUARY 2, 1951

Regular meeting at the City Hall, January 2, 1951, 7:00 o'clock p. m.

Before the meeting was called to order for the transaction of business, ex-Mayor O'Neil addressed the commission and citizens present, welcomed Mayor York and Commissioner Harmon and concluded his remarks by formally turning over to Mayor York the gavel of the presiding officer of the commission. Mayor York thereupon assumed the chair and delivered his inaugural address, after which he called the meeting to order for the transaction of business.

Present—Mayor York, Commissioners Brumm, Harmon, Raish and Tuominen.

The commission proceeded to elect by ballot one of the commissioners to be mayor pro-tem for the ensuing year. Commissioner Brumm received all five votes and was thereupon declared mayor pro-tem for the year 1951.

Moved by Commissioner Raish, supported by Commissioner Tuominen and adopted that Commissioner Brumm be appointed Chairman of the Board of Review for the year 1951.

Yeas — Mayor York, Commissioners Brumm, Harmon, Raish and Tuominen.

Mayor York appointed commission members to approve the expenditures of the various city departments for the ensuing year as follows: Public Affairs Department and Accounts and Finance Department, Mayor York; Public Works Department, Commissioner Brumm; Light and Power Department, Commissioner Tuominen; Police Department and Parks and Recreation Department, Commissioner Raish; Health Department, Fire Department and Water Department, Commissioner Harmon. Moved by Commissioner Raish, supported by Commissioner Brumm and adopted that

said appointments be confirmed.

Yeas — Mayor York, Commissioners Brumm, Harmon, Raish and Tuominen.

Moved by Commissioner Raish, supported by Commissioner Harmon and adopted that the report of the City Manager on the use of outdoor ice rinks in the city be received and placed on file.

Yeas — Mayor York, Commissioners Brumm, Harmon, Raish and Tuominen.

Moved by Commissioner Brumm, supported by Commissioner Raish and adopted that the report of the City Manager relative to preliminary work on the bond issue to finance the construction of a sewage treatment plant be accepted and placed on file and that upon the recommendation of the City Manager, the firm of Miller, Canfield, Paddock and Stone of Detroit, Michigan, be engaged to handle the legal matters incident to the bond issue.

Moved by Commissioner Tuominen, supported by Commissioner Brumm and adopted, that the City Manager's report on the purchase of a voltage regulator for the Light and Power Department from Champion, Inc. for the sum of \$1,466.40, be accepted and placed on file.

Moved by Commissioner Raish, supported by Commissioner Tuominen and adopted that John J. Walsh be reappointed City Attorney for the City of Marquette.

WHEREAS, It would be deemed a great honor to the people of the City of Marquette if this new ferry is named the "City of Marquette", and

WHEREAS, the name "Marquette" is symbolic of courage and leadership, being the name of one of Michigan's early pioneers and leaders.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, That the City Commission of the City of Marquette petition the Michigan State Highway Department to name said new ferry the "City of Marquette."

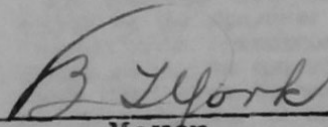

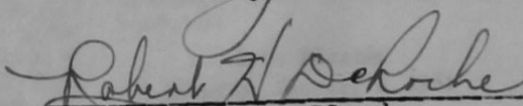

JANUARY 8, 1951

Regular meeting at the City Hall, January 8, 1951, 7:00 o'clock p. m.

Present — Mayor York, Commissioners Brumm, Harmon and Tuominen.

Moved by Commissioner Tuominen, supported by Commissioner Harmon and adopted that upon recommendation of the City Manager and Chief of Police, request of Thomas Swenor to the State of Michigan Liquor Control Commission for transfer of ownership of the 1950 Tavern license located at 922 Washington street from Fred Provost, be approved.

Yeas — Mayor York, Commissioners Brumm, Harmon and Tuominen.

Moved by Commissioner Brumm, supported by Commissioner Harmon and adopted that request of Blackstone Taxi Company and Belmore Taxi Company to revise their rates schedule be granted as follows: Zone No. 1 — 40c for 1 passenger, 10c for each additional passenger; Zone No. 2 — 50c for 1 passenger, 10c for each additional passenger; Negaunee trip, \$3.50 for 1 to 4 passengers, 50c for each additional passenger; Ishpeming trip, \$4.50 for 1 to 4 passengers, 50c for each additional passenger; all other rates in the previous schedule to remain unchanged.

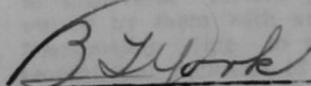

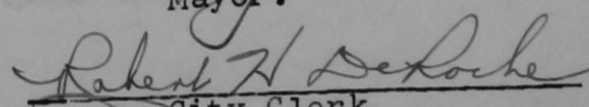

JANUARY 15, 1951

Regular meeting at the City Hall, January 15, 1951, 7:00 o'clock p. m.

Present — Mayor York, Commissioners Harmon, Raish and Tuominen.

Moved by Commissioner Raish, supported by Commissioner Harmon and adopted that petition of Cletus Chenail and twenty-three others for the installation of sanitary sewers in Birch Street and Lynn Street from Fair Avenue to Waldo Street and in Waldo Street from Lincoln Avenue to Garfield Avenue, be placed on file for consideration during the preparation of the 1951 budget.

Yeas — Mayor York, Commissioners Harmon, Raish and Tuominen.

A communication from the Veterans Council was received, requesting the City Commission to meet with them to discuss the dedication of grounds at the Veterans Center for a Memorial. Moved by Commissioner Harmon, supported by Commissioner Tuominen and adopted that the City Commission plan to meet with the Veterans Council to discuss this matter.

Yeas — Mayor York, Commissioners Harmon, Raish and Tuominen.

Request of Justine DesJardins for approval of her application to the State of Michigan Liquor Control Commission for transfer of the 1950 SDM and Living Quarters Permit at 123 Genesee Street from Thomas Swenor was tabled pending receipt of the usual notice from the Liquor Control Commission in transfers of this type.

Moved by Commissioner Tuominen, supported by Commissioner Raish and adopted, that the City of Marquette enter into an agreement with Harlow A. Clark and Martha Bacon Clark Adriance for permission to erect and maintain an electric transmission line across certain properties owned by them for the purpose of supplying electricity to operate

the proposed ski-tow at Kirilin Hill and that the Mayor and City Clerk be authorized and directed to sign said agreement in behalf of the City of Marquette.

Yeas — Mayor York, Commissioners Harmon, Raish and Tuominen.

Moved by Commissioner Raish, supported by Commissioner Harmon and adopted, that the City of Marquette enter into an agreement with Harlow A. Clark and Martha Bacon Clark Adriance for the use of a private roadway and limited parking privileges upon certain lands owned by them, the City to use same in connection with winter sports activities at Kirilin Hill, and that the Mayor and City Clerk be authorized and directed to sign said agreement in behalf of the City of Marquette.

The City Manager's tabulation of the 1951 budget estimates submitted by the various city departments was read and filed.

Kukuk, Recreation Director, effective February 1, 1951, be accepted and placed on file and that the City Clerk be directed to write a letter to Mr. Kukuk expressing to him the regrets of this commission at his resignation.

WHEREAS, Harlow A. Clark and Martha Bacon Clark Adriance have this day tendered to the City of Marquette, by license, the right to transverse certain properties owned by them with an electric transmission line to serve the recreational facilities of the city at Kirilin Hill, together with the

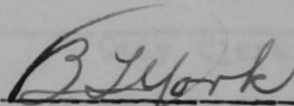

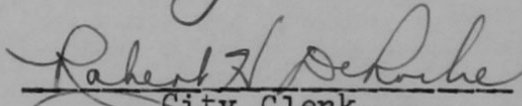

Yeas — Mayor York, Commis-

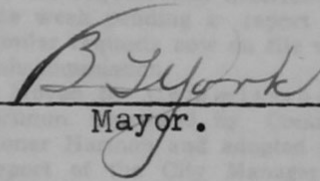

All backfilling of trenches abandoned structures, and other underground work within the limits of the proposed construction area shall be done with bank run sand, gravel, or coarse aggregate placed in horizontal layers not to exceed

12 inches in depth, and thoroughly compacted by tamping, flooding, or other effective means which will produce maximum compaction;

That the Department shall be reimbursed for all future repairs to the pavement included in this project, made necessary on account of faulty materials or workmanship in such underground work by this municipality, on bill rendered by the Department when such repairs are completed:

That it will forthwith adopt and keep in force the proper ordinances to control building construction abutting on this improvement, so that same will correspond with the right of way existing or proposed, as shown on said plans;

That it will at no time hereafter, without the written consent and approval of the State Highway Commissioner, attach any further construction to the improvement so made; nor will it erect, install, or permit to be erected or installed any sign signal, or other device to control traffic or parking, or for advertising purposes, except in conformity with state law and with the rules and regulations of the Michigan State Highway Department for uniform traffic control.
