OFFICIAL PROCEEDINGS OF THE CITY COMMISSION

SEPTEMBER 17, 1953

An adjourned meeting of the City Commission was duly called and held at the City Hall, September 17, 1953, 7:00 o'clock p. m.

Present—Mayor York, Commissioners Brumm, Halverson and Raish.

Moved by Commissioner Brumm, supported by Commissioner Raish and unanimously adopted that petition of five property holders requesting that the owners of property on the north side of Blemhuber Avenue, 150 feet west from Altamont Street install sidewalks, be referred to the City Manager for study and report.

Moved by Commissioner Raish, supported by Commissioner Halverson and unanimously adopted that petition of W. A. Zerbel for the installation of sewer main and water lines to service lots 27, 28 and 29 in Cochran's Addition, be referred to the City Manager for study and report.

Moved by Commissioner Brumm, supported by Commissioner Raish and unanimously adopted that request of the Marquette Kiwanis Club for permission to sell packaged peanuts on the city streets on September 25 and 26, 1953 for the benefit of the National Kids' Day Foundation be granted.

Moved by Commissioner Raish, supported by Commissioner Halverson and unanimously adopted that upon recommendation of the Marquette Planning Board, the final plat of Kildahl's Subdivision Number 1 be approved, subject to the filing of surety bond to guarantee the completion of improvements in this subdivision by the subdivider, as required by the provisions of the Ordinance of the City of Marquette relative to the Subdivision of Land.

Moved by Commissioner Brumm, supported by Commissioner Halverson that the following resolution be, and the same is

hereby unanimously adopted:

RESOLVED, That Bond No. 53 63 888 on behalf of Glen B. Wilson as City Treasurer, in the amount of \$10,000,000, executed by the Fidelity and Deposit Company of Maryland, effective August 17, 1953, be approved and filed, and that former Bond No. 375629-K on behalf of Glen B. Wilson, Treasurer, in the amount of \$10,000,000, effective August 17, 1938 and issued by the American Surety Company of New York be cancelled as to all future liability from and after August 17, 1953.

Moved by Commissioner Halverson, supported by Commissioner Raish, that the following resolution be, and the same is hereby unanimously adopted:

WHEREAS, The City of Marquette will need approximately 10 cubic yards of concrete in construction work at the Mt. Mesnard Ski Tow area, and

WHEREAS, L. W. Brumm, a member of this Commission is engaged in the business of selling Ready-Mix Concrete in this city; and

WHEREAS, This Commission finds and determines that competitive bids are not feasible in this particular case and that the best interests of the city will be served by waiving the prohibitions found in Section 5.10 of the City Charter.

NOW, THEREFORE, It is hereby resolved and ordered that the Purchasing Agent be directed to purchase 10 cubic yards of concrete from the said L. W. Brumm for use in the particular instance above mentioned.

Moved by Commissioner Raish, supported by Commissioner Brumm that the following resolution be, and the same is hereby unanimously adopted:

WHEREAS, On the 30th day of June, 1952, pursuant to the provisions of Section 16.7 of the City Charter, this Commission, by motion, established the hours for sessions of the Municipal Court, and;

WHEREAS, This commission desires to promote public convenience by insuring the regularity of sessions of the Municipal Court;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, That the Municipal Court be in session with the Municipal Judge presiding between the hours of 8:30 o'clock A. M. and 10:00 o'clock A. M. each week day and as long thereafter as the business of the court demands; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That a session of the Municipal Court be held whenever special circumstances require the arraignment of a prisoner or trial of a case during hours other than regular court hours, such arraignments or trials to be held during regular working hours at the City Hall; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the City Clerk cause a record to be kept of the hours in which the Municipal Court is in session with the Municipal Judge presiding.

The City Manager's report on petition previously filed for the vacating of a portion of Park Street between the Lake Superior and Ishpeming Railroad Company right-of-way and Lake Shore Boulevard was read. It was then moved by Commissioner Brumm, supported by Commissioner Raish and unanimously adopted that the petition for vacating this portion of Park Street be denied.

A communication from the City Manager relative to the request of the Marquette Board of Education for the installation of sewer mains and the improvement of a roadway to service the proposed Northwest School was read. Moved by Commissioner Halverson, supported by Commissioner Brumm that the following resolution be, and the same is hereby unanimously adopted:

WHEREAS, The Board of Education for the City of Marquette has requested the City of Marquette to install a sewer main and improve a roadway from Lincoln Avenue to the site of the proposed Northwest School on the SW $\frac{1}{4}$ of the SE $\frac{1}{4}$ of the NE $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 15, T 48 N, R 25 W, and

WHEREAS, The owners of prop-

erty abutting on the right-of-way for said proposed sewer and roadway have been contacted by the City of Marquette and are not agreeable to paying a special assessment for said improvements for the reason that the value of the lots involved would not warrant such expenditure and for the further reason that some of the properties involved have been assessed for and are now paying proportionate shares of the cost of the Lincoln Avenue Sewer; and

WHEREAS, The City of Marquette has not allocated funds for these requested improvements, the request for same having been made by the Board of Education after the adoption of the current budget by the City of Marquette; and

WHEREAS, The Board of Education has been authorized by the electorate to issue bonds to cover the cost of constructing the proposed new school, together with whatever improvements are necessary for its operation;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, That this Commission go on record to require the cost of said sewer installation and the improvements to the roadway to service said proposed new school to be borne by the Board of Education for the City of Marquette.

Mayor York appointed Commissioner Halverson to O. K. bills of the Light and Power Department during the temporary absence of Commissioner Tuominen.

Moved by Mayor York, supported by Commissioner Halverson and unanimously adopted that the City Manager inquire into the present status of the Nester Building as to its safety and to determine to what extent the city might be liable for any claim which might arise from the unsafe condition of this building.

OFFICIAL PROCEEDINGS OF THE CITY COMMISSION

SEPTEMBER 28, 1953

Regular meeting at the City Hall September 28, 1953, 7:00 o'clock p. m.

Present — Mayor York, Commissioners Brumm, Halverson, Raish and Tuominen.

Moved by Commissioner Halverson, supported by Commissioner Raish and unanimously adopted that petition by eight property owners for the installation of a 6 inch water main in Van Evera Avenue from approximately 135 feet south of Norwood Street to Center Street, be referred to the City Manager for study and action if he deems it feasible to make this extension before the close of this construction season.

The City Manager's report on the petition previously presented requesting the Commission to cause a sidewalk to be built on the North side of Blemhuber Avenue one hundred and fifty feet west from Altamont Street was read. It was then moved by Commissioner Brumm, supported by Commissioner Tuominen and unanimously adopted that action on this request be postponed for at least the present construction season.

Moved by Commissioner Raish, supported by Commissioner Halverson and unanimously adopted that upon recommendation of the City Manager, low bid of Riopelle and Peterson in the sum of \$1,492.00 for changing the west entrance to the Police Station and constructing an Inquiry Room in the basement be accepted.

Moved by Commissioner Tuominen, supported by Commissioner Raish and unanimously adopted that the City Manager be authorized to contact the Chamber of Commerce and Marquette Tourist Association to discuss the possibility of erecting an informational sign and guide for tourists near the south entrance to the city on U. S. Highway 41.

Moved by Commissioner Tuominen, supported by Commissioner

Brumm that the following resolution be, and the same is hereby unanimously adopted:

WHEREAS, During past decades, the City of Marquette Light and Power Department has extended power lines into the townships surrounding the City of Marquette in order to supply electric energy to those people who would otherwise be without service; and

WHEREAS, Most of the lines extending outside of the City of Marquette are now in need of extensive repairs; and

WHEREAS, The primary purpose of the Light and Power Department is to provide electrical energy to the citizens of the City of Marquette; and

WHEREAS, Private suppliers of such power in rural areas are now in a position to service some of the areas now being served by the City of Marquette and in the future, more of these areas may be accommodated by private suppliers of power.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, That a policy be established for the Light and Power Department of the City of Marquette to discontinue those lines extending outside of the City of Marquette, when the income from such lines is insufficient to cover cost of operation and maintenance, and when power can be made available to the properties involved by other organized suppliers of electrical energy, and

Be IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That future extensions of transmission lines of the Light and Power Department outside of the corporate limits of the city be kept at a minimum and that such extensions be made, subject to present regulations of the Light and Power Department, only when there is no other supplier of power in the area.

OCTOBER 12, 1953

Regular meeting at the City Hall, October 12, 1953, 7:00 o'clock p.m.

Present — Mayor York, Commissioners Brumm, Halverson and Tuominen.

Moved by Commissioner Brumm, supported by Commissioner Tuominen, and unanimously adopted that Audit Report of the accounts of the City of Marquette for the period between January 1, 1952 and June 30, 1953, prepared and submitted by Lawrence Scudder and Company, be accepted and placed on file.

At this point, Commissioner Raish joined the meeting and was seated.

Moved by Commissioner Brumm, supported by Commissioner Halverson and unanimously adopted that request of the Marquette Association of the Blind to have the activities of Blind entertainers on city streets regulated by ordinance be referred to the City Manager to obtain samples of such ordinances for study by the Commission.

Moved by Commissioner Halverson, supported by Commissioner Raish and unanimously adopted that communication from the Marquette Chamber of Commerce requesting the adoption of a peddler's ordinance be referred to the City Manager for study and report.

Moved by Commissioner Raish, supported by Commissioner Halverson and unanimously adopted that communication from the Marquette Chamber of Commerce requesting the Commission to authorize the use of courtesy parking tickets to visitors of the city who violate the parking meter ordinance, be referred to the City Manager for study and recommendation as to the steps necessary to permit the use of such courtesy parking tickets.

Moved by Commissioner Raish, supported by Commissioner Tuominen that the following resolution be, and the same is hereby unanimously adopted:

WHEREAS, The City of Marquette will need approximately 10 yards of ready-mix concrete in construction work at Park Cemetery and Mount Mesnard Ski Hill, and,





Regular meeting at the City Hall, November 30, 1953, 7:00 o'clock p. m.

Present — Mayor York, Commissioners Brumm, Halverson, Raish and Tuominen.

Moved by Commissioner Halverson, supported by Commissioner Tuominen and unanimously adopted that request of AMVETS for permission to sell White Clovers on the city streets on December 4 and 5, 1953 be granted.

Moved by Commissioner Raish, supported by Commissioner Brumm, and unanimously adopted that request of Raymond J. Flink to the State of Michigan Liquor Control Commission for transfer of location on 1953 SDM license from Lincoln and College Avenue to Lincoln & College Avenue, be approved.

Communication from the Upper Peninsula Development Bureau relative to the petition filed by the Duluth South Shore and Atlantic Railroad with the Michigan Public Service Commission for authority to discontinue passenger service in the Upper Peninsula was read. It was then moved by Commissioner Raish, supported by Commissioner Tuominen that the following resolution be, and the same is hereby unanimously adopted:

"Whereas, the Duluth South Shore and Atlantic Railroad Company has filed petition with the Michigan Public Service Commission for authority to discontinue the operation of trains handling passenger service between St. Ignace and Marquette and between Marquette and Montreal; and

WHEREAS, The passenger service provided by the Duluth South Shore and Atlantic Railroad Company is the only railroad passenger service connecting Marquette with the Lower Peninsula, with the Copper Country and the western part of the Upper Peninsula of Michigan; and

WHEREAS, This Commission believes that despite loss to the company in operating this passenger service, the service should be con-

tinued for the convenience of the public.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, That this Commission go on record to oppose the granting of the petition of the Duluth South Shore and Atlantic Railroad Company by the Michigan Public Service Commission to discontinue the operation of passenger trains now being scheduled between Marquette and St. Ignace and between Marquette and Montreal; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That when hearing on this petition is held before the Michigan Public Service Commission, on December 15, 1953 at the Marquette County Court House, the City Attorney be directed to enter an appearance and objection in behalf of the City of Marquette.

The City Manager's report on bids received for the purchase of 500,000 gallons of diesel fuel oil was read. Moved by Commissioner Tuominen, supported by Commissioner Brumm and unanimously adopted that the recommendation of the City Manager be accepted.

Regular meeting at the City Hall, December 14, 1953, 7:00 p.m.

Present — Mayor York, Commissioners Brumm, Halverson, Raish and Tuominen.

Moved by Commissioner Raish, supported by Commissioner Halverson and unanimously adopted that petition of 4 property owners for the installation of sewer in High Street between Park and Crescent Street to replace the present sewer, be referred to the City Manager for study and report.

Moved by Commissioner Brumm, supported by Commissioner Tuominen and unanimously adopted that request of Ernest Williams, Jr., to the Liquor Control Commission for a new SDM license at 246 W. Hewitt Avenue be approved.

Moved by Commissioner Brumm, supported by Commissioner Tuominen and unanimously adopted that notice from the Roscoe Corporation to terminate the lease now held by the City on an area used for parking purposes at the intersection of Lake Street and Washington Street, be received and placed on file.

Moved by Commissioner Tuominen, supported by Commissioner Halverson and unanimously adopted that communication from the Chamber of Commerce withdrawing their request of October 7, 1953 for the adoption of a Peddlers' Ordinance but requesting the Commission to give further thought and consideration to some further control of door to door salesmen be received and placed on file and that the previous request of the Chamber of Commerce for the adoption of a Peddlers' Ordinance be rescinded.

Communication from the Northern Michigan College of Education was read wherein the vacating of a portion of Wilkinson Avenue was requested. Commissioner Brumm then introduced the following resolution:

RESOLVED, That all that por-

tion of Wilkinson Avenue lying south of the south line projected of lot 132 of Ayer's Addition in the City of Marquette be vacated. It was then moved by Commissioner Brumm, supported by Commissioner Tuominen and unanimously adopted that a public hearing be held before this commission on this vacating proceedings on Monday, December 28, 1953 at 7:00 o'clock p.m. Eastern Standard Time in the Commission Chamber of the City Hall, after which public hearing the Commission shall consider for final adoption the resolution previously introduced at this meeting to vacate said portion of Wilkinson Avenue.

The City Manager's report relative to insurance coverage on the electric generating plants of the city was read. Moved by Commissioner Halverson, supported by Commissioner Brumm and unanimously adopted that coverage be obtained on Plants No. 2, No. 3 and No. 4, and the steel fuel oil storage tank, as outlined in the City Manager's report.

Report from the City Manager existing violations of the Land Subdivision Ordinance was read. AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE OPERATION AND MAINTENANCE IN THE CITY OF MARQUETTE, MICHIGAN OF ELECTRIC TRANSMISSION LINES

The City of Marquette ordains:

SECTION I

That authority and permission are hereby given to and duly vested in the Cliffs Power & Light Company, a Michigan corporation, its successors and assigns, for the term of thirty (30) years to operate and maintain within the City of Marquette electric transmission lines consisting of poles or posts of wood or other suitable material with suitable lines of wire or other conductors of electricity and with the necessary facilities therefor, and to make local sales to the public therefrom, at the locations and to the extent that said Company now operates and maintains such electric transmission lines pursuant to an ordinance of this City adopted and approved on August 21, 1911, as amended by an ordinance adopted and approved by this City on August 14, 1934, in addition to the right to construct, operate and maintain electric transmission lines to any electrical generating plant or plants which may hereafter be constructed within the City of Marquette; subject, however, to the conditions hereinafter contained and provided that nothing herein contained be so construed as to give The Cliffs Power & Light Company, its successors or assigns, any exclusive right or franchise in respect to any of the privileges herein granted.

SECTION II

The conditions of the foregoing grant are as follows:

A. The said poles, posts, wires and other conductors of electricity upon, above, under or over any public street, alley or public way shall be maintained under the direction and subject to the supervision of the City Commission, but without expense of any kind to the said Commission, and in such manner as not to interfere with the ordinary use of the streets, alleys or public grounds of the City.

B. Said The Cliffs Power & Light Company shall save the City harmless from any judgement that may be recovered against the City and from any legal and litigation

expenses incurred by the City in connection therewith, by reason of the wrong doing or negligence of The Cliffs Power & Light Company in the operation, maintenance, replacement or removal of said transmission lines and facilities.

SECTION III

The City Commission expressly reserves the right to revoke and annul at will the privileges herein granted at any time during the

term hereof.

SECTION IV

This ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its adoption and approval.


