

OFFICIAL PROCEEDINGS OF THE CITY COMMISSION

SEPTEMBER 13, 1954

Regular meeting of the City Commission held at the City Hall, September 13, 1954 at 7:00 o'clock p. m.

Present, Mayor Brumm, Commissioners Alholm, Halverson and Hammerschmidt.

Moved by Commissioner Halverson, supported by Commissioner Hammerschmidt that the following resolution be and the same is hereby unanimously adopted:

WHEREAS, Mrs. Helen D. McGuire, of Marquette, Michigan, on March 23, 1953 conveyed to the City of Marquette the west 100 feet of lot 5, in Moore and Sang's Addition to the City of Marquette, subject to the terms and conditions and trusts set forth in said deed, to which reference is hereby made; and

WHEREAS, The said Mrs. Helen D. McGuire has paid to the City of Marquette an amount equal to all taxes exclusive of interest, penalties and collection fees, which would have been levied by the City against said property had a tax exemption not been granted, and has requested a reconveyance of such property;

NOW, THEREFORE In consideration of the payment of such taxes and such request, it is RESOLVED and ORDERED that the Mayor and City Clerk be and they are hereby authorized, in behalf of the City of Marquette, to reconvey said property to the said Mrs. Helen D. McGuire.

Moved by Commissioner Hammerschmidt, supported by Commissioner Alholm and unanimously adopted that upon recommendation of the City Manager the bid of Champion Inc. in the sum of \$16,821.88 for the construction of two sheet aluminum buildings be accepted.

Moved by Commissioner Alholm, supported by Commissioner Hammerschmidt and unanimously adopted that upon recommendation of the City Manager of the bid of Morton Salt Co. in the sum of \$22.40 per ton for a quantity of sodium chloride to be used in the Pub-

lic Works Department be accepted.

Moved by Commissioner Halverson, supported by Commissioner Alholm and unanimously adopted that upon recommendation of the City Manager the City Assessor be authorized to prepare a special assessment roll for the grading, curbing and paving of Michigan Street from Oak Street west to Sixth Street.

Moved by Commissioner Halverson, supported by Commissioner Hammerschmidt and unanimously adopted that upon recommendation of the City Manager, the request of George C. Quinnell, Attorney for the owners of certain property located in the SE $\frac{1}{4}$ of the NE $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 15, Township 48 North, Range 25 West, for permission to divide said lands between the several owners and to dedicate streets rights-of-way without complying with the provisions of an ordinance of the City of Marquette Relative to the Subdivision of Land, be denied.

Moved by Commissioner Hammerschmidt, supported by Commissioner Halverson and unanimously adopted that upon recommendation of the Marquette Planning Board the preliminary plat plan of Pinecrest Subdivision as submitted by Mr. and Mrs. Wilbert Keskey be accepted.

Moved by Commissioner Alholm, supported by Commissioner Halverson and unanimously adopted that the claim filed by Mrs. John Takalouma and Mr. Theodore Normand be referred to the City Attorney for legal opinion.

SEPTEMBER 27, 1954

Regular meeting of the Marquette City Commission held at the City Hall, September 27, 1954, at 7:00 o'clock p. m.

Present — Mayor Brumm, Commissioners Alholm, Hammerschmidt and Tuominen.

Moved by Commissioner Tuominen, supported by Commissioner Alholm and unanimously adopted that the reading of the minutes of the previous regular meeting be omitted.

Moved by Commissioner Alholm, supported by Commissioner Tuominen and unanimously adopted that the petition of seven residents on Granite Street for the hard surfacing of Granite Street from Wright Street north to Dead River be referred to the City Manager for study and report.

Moved by Commissioner Hammerschmidt, supported by Commissioner Alholm and unanimously adopted that the petition of seven property owners on Kaye Avenue for the paving of Kaye Avenue between Pine Street and Russell Street be referred to the City Manager for study and report.

Moved by Commissioner Tuominen, supported by Commissioner Hammerschmidt and unanimously adopted that the petition of twenty-eight residents in the area of the Palestra and the Memorial Field, pertaining to the parking of cars in restricted areas, be referred to the City Manager for study and report to the City Commission.

Moved by Commissioner Tuominen, supported by Commissioner Alholm and unanimously adopted that the request of R. E. Muck for permission to connect to the sewer outlet serving the City Hall, be referred to the City Manager for study and report.

Moved by Commissioner Hammerschmidt, supported by Commissioner Alholm and unanimously adopted, that the American Veterans of World War II be granted permission to sell White Clovers on the Streets of Marquette on Fri-

day and Saturday, October 8th and 9th, 1954.

Moved by Commissioner Tuominen, supported by Commissioner Alholm and unanimously adopted that the request of H. A. Tape, President of Northern Michigan College, to line both sides of Kaye Avenue from Presque Isle Avenue westward to the drive into Lee and Carey Halls for angle parking, be granted.

Moved by Commissioner Hammerschmidt, supported by Commissioner Alholm and unanimously adopted that upon recommendation of the City Manager, the Munsing Wood Products Company Incorporated be given approval to sell six lots in Asire's Addition on Lincoln Avenue, between Garfield and Piqua Streets.

Moved by Commissioner Alholm, supported by Commissioner Tuominen and unanimously adopted that upon recommendation of the City Manager the low bid of H. L. Welch in the sum of \$9,450.00 for the construction of footings, floors and floor drains for two 40' x 100' metal buildings, be accepted.

Moved by Commissioner Hammerschmidt, supported by Commissioner Tuominen and unanimously adopted that upon recommendation of the City Attorney, no refund be made on the claim filed with this Commission September 13, 1954 by Mrs. Sophia Takaluoma and Mr. Theodore Normand.

Moved by Commissioner Tuominen, supported by Commissioner Hammerschmidt that the following resolution be and the same is hereby unanimously adopted:

WHEREAS, State Trunkline Highways US-41 and M-28 on Washington Street in the City of Marquette is in need of improvement between Third and Front Streets, in order to serve traffic in a safe and expeditious manner and to reduce maintenance costs, such improvement to consist of grading, drainage structures and concrete pavement, and

WHEREAS, The City is to

participate in the cost of such improvement in accordance with the provisions of Michigan Law (See Compiled Laws, 1948, Sections 250.31 to 250.41, and Act 53 of 1951).

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, (1) That the City hereby requests the State Highway Commissioner to proceed with such improvement.

(2) That the City's share of the estimated cost of such improvement will be paid to the State Highway Commissioner for deposit with the State Treasurer for credit to the State Trunkline Fund when the improvement is placed under contract, from Weight and Gasoline Tax funds made available to the City by Acts 51, 54, and 55, Public Acts of 1951; or from other funds provided by the City and that if the City fails to make payment of its share of the cost when due, the City hereby authorizes the Auditor General to withhold a sufficient amount from funds becoming available to the City from the Acts named above to cover the City's indebtedness to the State Highway Commissioner, and the City expressly consents to such withholding. Withholding shall begin with the first distribution after the indebtedness becomes delinquent and shall continue from succeeding distributions until the indebtedness is paid in full.

(3) That upon determination of the actual cost of the improvement, any adjustment necessary to reconcile the estimated cost with actual cost will be made.

Present — Mayor Brumm, Commissioners Alholm, Halverson, Hammerschmidt and Tuominen.

Moved by Commissioner Tuominen, supported by Commissioner Hammerschmidt and unanimously adopted that the reading of the minutes of the previous meeting be omitted.

Moved by Commissioner Alholm, supported by Commissioner Halverson and unanimously adopted that the City of Marquette enter into an agreement with the State Highway Department, State of Michigan, for the maintenance of Highway US 41 within the City of Marquette, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1954 and that the Mayor and City Clerk be authorized to execute said agreement in behalf of the City of Marquette.

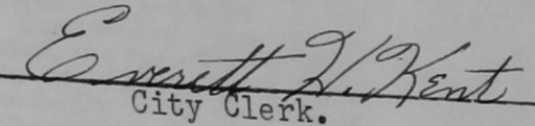
