A special meeting of the Marquette City Commission was duly called and held at the City Hall, Friday, September 2, 1955, at 4:00 o'clock p. m.

Present: Mayor Alholm, Commissioners Bur, Halverson, Hammerschmidt.

Absent: Commissioner Clark.

A communication from J. H. Warden, President of the U. P. Power Company, was read wherein he submitted a schedule of standard wholesale power rates. It was then moved by Commissioner Hammerschmidt, supported by Commissioner Halverson and unanimously adopted, that C. L. Mosher be authorized to negotiate a contract for the purchase of power from the U. P. Power Company with a change of duration over that proposed by the Power Company; the contract to be submitted to the Commission for final approval.

Moved by Commissioner Hammerschmidt, supported by Commissioner Bur and unanimously adopted, that the City of Marquette enter into an agreement with Rudolph K. Heikkala and C. Lorraine Heikkala for the leasing of a designated

piece of City owned property described as follows:

The Southwest quarter of the Northwest quarter (SW $\frac{1}{4}$ of NW $\frac{1}{4}$) and that part of the Northwest quarter of the Southwest quarter (NW $\frac{1}{4}$ of SW $\frac{1}{4}$) that lies north of Pioneer Road, all in Section twenty-six (26), township forty-eight (48) north, range twenty-five (25) west, being approximately forty (40) acres.

For the purpose of conducting a trailer court and that the Mayor and City Clerk be authorized to sign said agreement in behalf of the City.

Moved by Commissioner Halverson, supported by Commissioner Hammerschmidt and unanimously adopted, that the City furnish the labor and equipment to assist in the laying of the final coat of bituminous aggregate on the parking lot at St. Mary's Hospital.

Mayor Alholm then announced that a special meeting would be held Wednesday, September 7, 1955, at 4:00 o'clock p.m.

OFFICIAL PROCEEDINGS OF THE CITY COMMISSION

SEPTEMBER 12, 1955

A regular meeting of the Marquette City Commission was duly called and held at the City Hall, Monday, September 12, 1955, at 7:00 o'clock p. m.

Present: Mayor Alholm, Commissioners Bur, Halverson, Hammerschmidt.

Absent: Commissioner Clark.

Moved by Commissioner Hammerschmidt, supported by Commissioner Halverson and unanimously adopted that the reading of the minutes of the last regular meeting be omitted.

A communication from George E. Bishop, Secretary-Manager of the Upper Peninsula Development Bureau was read, wherein he thanked the City Commission for their co-operation with the Development Bureau and for their office space used by that Bureau while housed in the City Hall. It was then moved by Commissioner Halverson, supported by Commissioner Bur and unanimously adopted that this communication be received and placed on file.

A communication from Theo. A. Veight, President of the Skeet Club was read wherein he requested permission for various members of the Skeet Club to address the Commission. Moved by Commissioner Bur, supported by Commissioner Halverson and unanimously adopted that permission be granted the members of the Skeet Club to address the Commission. Dr. D. P. Hornbogen then addressed the Commission, Dr. W. J. Saari also addressed the Commission with regard to the installation of electricity at the Skeet Field. The Commission then requested that the Skeet Club make a formal request in writing for the installation of electricity at their field.

Moved by Commissioner Bur, supported by Commissioner Hammerschmidt and unanimously adopted that the request of John R. Inch and Frank P. L'Huillier for a transfer of ownership for a 1955 Tavern and SDM licenses, located at 201 S. Front Street, Marquette, from Clarence and Helen L'Huillier be granted.

A petition from the Marquette Golf and Country Club for assistance in constructing a road from

Grove Street into the Club House was read. It was then moved by Commissioner Hammerschmidt, supported by Commissioner Halverson and unanimously adopted, that this petition be received and placed on file for future reference and that a letter be written to the Marquette Golf and Country Club explaining to them that at the present time there has been no funds set up in the budget to cover an expenditure of this nature.

A petition signed by 55 residents living in the vicinity of the J. H. Green Company Scrap Yard requesting that something be done about this situation was read. It was then moved by Commissioner Halverson, supported by Commissioner Bur and unanimously adopted that this petition be referred to the City Manager for study and report back to the Commission.

A report from Acting City Manager W. E. Miller with regard to the Taxicab Companies in the City of Marquette was read and received by the Commission.

A report from C. L. Mosher, superintendent of Light & Power Department, was read with regard to the Hawley Street storm sewer. After some discussion, it was decided that this matter be set aside until such time as the matter of a City Manager can be settled.

A progress report from Acting City Manager W. E. Miller was read regarding the lighting of Island Beach Road, (this work will be completed this fall) the electrical ordinance, the sewer at Shiras Hills, the paving of the 400 block on East Prospect Street between Spruce and Cedar Streets, the surfacing and curbing of the 400 block on Blemhuber Avenue and the paving of the 500 block on East Michigan Street, indicating that these projects are being deferred until after the first of the coming year because of the lack of time to complete this work.

Moved by Commissioner Hammerschmidt, supported by Commissioner Halverson that the following resolution be and the same is hereby unanimously adopted:

WHEREAS, The Assessor has made and duly certified to the Com-

mission a special assessment roll for the following improvements:

The paving of Cedar Street between Prospect Street and Hewitt Avenue.

RESOLVED, That such assessment roll is hereby approved and that the same be filed with the City Clerk who is hereby directed to give notice to the property owners liable to such assessment, in conformity with the provisions of the City Charter, of the filing of said assessment roll and appointing Monday, September 26, 1955 at 7:00 o'clock p. m. when the Commission and Assessor will meet to review said assessment.

A communication from R. Raymond Anderson requesting that the City execute a quitclaim deed covering the 12 lots which have reverted to him that had formerly been used for recreational purposes was read. Moved by Commissioner Halverson, supported by Commissioner Bur and unanimously adopted that this matter be referred to the City Manager and to the City Attorney for study and report.

Moved by Commissioner Hammerschmidt, supported by Commissioner Halverson and unanimously adopted that the low bid of Wayne Balmes in the sum of \$5,889.70 for paint work at the Palestra Building be accepted.

Moved by Commissioner Halverson, supported by Commissioner Bur and unanimously adopted that the low bid of Wayne Balmes in the sum of \$415.95 for paint work at the Water Works Building be accepted.

Bids were opened on the purchase of a low boy trailer. Moved by Commissioner Bur, supported by Commissioner Halverson and unanimously adopted that action on these bids be deferred until C. L. Mosher, superintendent of Light & Power Department, and V. E. Swan, Superintendent of Public Works Department have an opportunity to tabulate and report on these bids.

Moved by Commissioner Hammerschmidt, supported by Commissioner Halverson and unanimously adopted that an item listed on the bills payable for the City Employees Picnic be deleted from the bills payable until further explanation of same can be had.

SEPTEMBER 26, 1955

A regular meeting of the Marquette City Commission was duly called and held at the City Hall, Monday, September 26, 1955, at 7:00 o'clock p. m.

Present: Mayor Alholm, Commissioners Bur, Clark, Halverson, and Hammerschmidt.

Moved by Commissioner Halverson, supported by Commissioner Bur and unanimously adopted that George E. Meholic, Jr., be appointed City Manager to assume duties in that capacity, November 1, 1955.

Moved by Commissioner Clark, supported by Commissioner Hammerschmidt, and unanimously adopted that Commissioner Halverson, and Commissioner Bur be commended for the excellent work done by them in securing applications for the new City Manager.

A communication from L. B. Frazier of the Marquette Dock, Yacht, and Harbor Association was read, wherein he stated that the Duluth, South Shore and Atlantic Railroad Company would enter into an agreement allowing the use and improvement of the old iron ore dock at the foot of Main Street for municipal boat dockage. Moved by Commissioner Halverson, supported by Commissioner Bur and unanimously adopted, that this communication be received and placed on file.

Moved by Commissioner Bur, supported by Commissioner Clark and unanimously adopted, that upon the request of Roscoe A. Baldwin, attorney for the Belmore Taxi Company and the Blackstone Taxi Company, license No. 2540, now held by the Blackstone Taxicab Company be cancelled.

Moved by Commissioner Hammerschmidt, supported by Commissioner Clark and adopted that Mr. Eugene Belmore be licensed to operate 16 cabs in the City of Marquette.

Yeas: Mayor Alholm, Commissioners Bur, Clark, Hammerschmidt.

Nay: Commissioner Halverson.

Moved by Commissioner Bur, supported by Commissioner Hammerschmidt and unanimously adopted, that the request for the installation of electrical power to

be installed at City expense at the Marquette Skeet Range be denied.

Moved by Commissioner Bur, supported by Commissioner Clark, and unanimously adopted, that the communication from the president of the Board of Education be received and placed on file.

Moved by Commissioner Bur, supported by Mayor Alholm, and adopted that the request of the Loyal Order of Moose No. 1059, located at 308 S. Front Street, Marquette, for a Dance permit to be in conjunction with their '55 Club license be granted.

Yeas: Mayor Alholm, Commissioners Bur, Clark, Hammerschmidt.

Nay: Commissioner Halverson.

Moved by Commissioner Halverson, supported by Commissioner Bur and unanimously adopted, that upon recommendation of the City Manager and the City Attorney, the Mayor and the City Clerk be authorized to execute a quitclaim deed to Mr. Ray Anderson covering the 12 lots in Caroline Burt's Addition No. 2 which have reverted to him because this property had ceased to be used for recreational purposes for a period of three years.

Moved by Commissioner Clark, supported by Commissioner Hammerschmidt and unanimously adopted that upon recommendation of the City Manager the low bid of Charles Dresseler and Son in the amount of \$1,710.80 for plumbing work and fixtures at the Palestra Building be accepted.

Moved by Commissioner Hammerschmidt, supported by Commissioner Clark, and unanimously adopted, that upon recommendation of the Planning Board the tentative street layout in the SE $\frac{1}{4}$ of the NE $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 15, T 48 N, R 25 W, referred to as the proposed Mountain View Subdivision as submitted by Irene Johnson and 15 others be accepted.

Moved by Commissioner Clark, supported by Commissioner Halverson, and unanimously adopted, that upon recommendation of C. L. Mosher, superintendent of the Light and Power Department, for a quantity of fuel oil (approximately 30 cars) be contracted for at

the present time at the price of 9.65¢ per gallon.

A public hearing was then held on the adoption of Special Assessment Roll No. 269. No suggestions or objections were heard by the Commission. It was then moved by Commissioner Hamerschmidt, supported by Commissioner Bur that the following resolution be, and the same is hereby unanimously adopted:

WHEREAS, It appears by affidavit on file with the City Clerk that due publication has been made of notice, as required by the City Charter, of the filing with the City Clerk of the Special Assessment Roll for the following improvement:

The paving of Cedar Street between Prospect Street and Hewitt Avenue, in the City of Marquette, and appointing this day and time when the Commission and Assessor would meet to review said Special Assessment Roll and the assessments therein, and

WHEREAS, No suggestions or objections having been made to said improvements and to said assessment roll and the respective assessment therein, and

WHEREAS, Said assessment roll and the assessments therein having been reviewed by the Commission and the Assessor and all needful corrections of the same having been made;

RESOLVED, That said assessment roll, to-wit: Special Assessment Roll No. 269, and the respective assessments therein, are hereby confirmed.

A public hearing was then held upon the proposed amendment to the zoning ordinance relative to the rezoning of an area from "single family residence district" to "general family residence district" of that part of the City of Marquette, Michigan, described as follows:

Lots No. 95, 96, 97, 98, 99, 100, 101, 102, and 103, in Asire's Addition fronting on Norway Street between Fair Avenue and Waldo Street.

Which amendment was introduced at the September 12, 1955 regular meeting of this Commission. No persons in attendance offered objections or suggestions in the matter. Mayor Alholm declared the public hearing closed and it was moved by Commissioner Bur,

supported by Commissioner Halverson that an ordinance entitled,

"An ordinance to amend an ordinance entitled, 'An ordinance to establish districts or zones within the City of Marquette, Marquette County, Michigan, within which districts or zones the use of land, the height, number of stories and size of buildings and other structures, the percentage of lot which may be occupied, the size of yards, courts and other open spaces, the density of population, the location and use of buildings, structures and land for trade, industry, residence and other purposes may be regulated; and to provide a method for its administration and enforcement, and to provide penalties for its violation.' be, and the same is hereby adopted."

Commissioner Bur asked that a report be given with regard to a petition received at the September 12th meeting of the Commission. Acting City Manager, W. E. Miller gave an oral report of his findings with regard to an area on Grove Street. The business representative of the industry located in this area spoke to the Commission and confirmed the findings of the City Manager.

Commissioner Halverson suggested the removal of the excess stone on N. Fourth Street and also that a survey be made of a certain portion of Lee Street to determine what could be done about the situation of the lack of traffic control concerning both pedestrians and automobile traffic.

A regular meeting of the Marquette City Commission was duly called and held at the City Hall, Monday, October 10, 1955, at 7:00 o'clock p. m.

Present: Mayor Alholm, Commissioners Halverson and Hammerschmidt.

Absent: Commissioners Bur and Clark.

Moved by Commissioner Halverson, supported by Commissioner Hammerschmidt and unanimously adopted, that the reading of the minutes of the last regular meeting be omitted.

A communication from the Gladstone City Commission was read requesting the presence of the Marquette City Commission at the dedication ceremony of the Gladstone Municipal Power Plant on Sunday, October 16, 1955. It was then moved by Commissioner Halverson, supported by Commissioner Hammerschmidt and unanimously adopted, that a letter be written the Gladstone Commission explaining that previous commitments have been made for that day by the Marquette City Commission.

A communication from the Marquette Kiwanis Club thanking the Commission for permission to sell peanuts on the downtown streets of Marquette was read and ordered placed on file.

Moved by Commissioner Hammerschmidt, supported by Commissioner Halverson and unanimously adopted that the communication from Claude Ver Duin announcing the annual convention of the Great Lakes Harbors Association be received and placed on file.

Moved by Commissioner Hammerschmidt, supported by Commissioner Halverson and unanimously adopted that upon recommendation of C. L. Mosher, Superintendent of Light and Power Department, and Mr. V. E. Swan, Superintendent of Public Works Department, the bid of Brebner Machinery Company in the sum of \$5,983.87 for a trailer to be used in the Public Works Department be accepted.

Mayor Alholm introduced and welcomed our new City Manager George E. Meholic, Jr. and announced that he would take office November 1, 1955.

A communication from Claude VerDuin, Executive Secretary, Great Lakes Harbor Association, was read including an attached statement for the City of Marquette annual dues. It was moved by Commissioner Hammerschmidt supported by Commissioner Bur and unanimously adopted that the matter be referred to the City Manager for study with the Harbor Committee to determine if this membership be of value to the City of Marquette.

Moved by Commissioner Bur, supported by Commissioner Clark and unanimously adopted, that the communication containing an annual report of the Veterans Building be received and placed on file.

A communication from Dr. Walter J. Norris, representative, Marquette Junior Chamber of Commerce, was read wherein he asked permission for that organization to sell Hutchenson Wax on the downtown streets of Marquette. On motion of Commissioner Halverson, supported by Commissioner Bur and unanimously adopted, permission as requested be granted.

A communication from William Havican was read wherein he asked to buy or lease City owned property on the west side of US-41 and M-28 between Fisher and Jackson Streets in the City of Marquette. On motion of Commissioner Halverson, supported by Commissioner Clark and unanimously adopted this matter was referred to the City Manager for study and report.

Moved by Commissioner Hammerschmidt, supported by Commissioner Bur and unanimously adopted, that the communication received by the Commission from Lloyd H. Price in regard to zon-

ing regulations concerning Lot No. 19 in Harlow's Addition No. 6 be referred to the City Manager and City Attorney for study and report to the Commission.

On motion of Commissioner Halverson, supported by Commissioner Hammerschmidt, the following resolution passed by the City Commission, March 8, 1954, regarding the recording of vacation time, sick leave, leaves of absence or other types of absenteeism on the part of the City Manager with the exception of the paragraph referring to the City Code, be and the same is hereby unanimously rescinded.

WHEREAS, It appears that neither the city charter or the city code makes any provision for the recording of vacation time, sick leave, leaves of absence or other types of absenteeism on the part of the City Manager, such as is provided for all other city employees; and

WHEREAS, It being common practice in private industry that such records be maintained from top management down through all the levels of employees; and

WHEREAS, Under charter provisions, the city manager is directly responsible to the City Commission for the proper conduct of his office.

BE IT RESOLVED, That the City Commission hereby authorizes the mayor as its representative to require a continuous and complete record from the City Manager covering his attendance upon his duties as chief administrator of city affairs as employed by the City Commission, and that said record shall be kept by the Clerk of the Commission from data furnished by the Mayor, and to be a matter of public record; and further, that all vacation dates, convention dates, or absence from the city on official business be first approved by the Mayor and City Commission before becoming final.

Mayor Alholm announced his appointment of C. T. DeHaas to a five year term as trustee of the Peter White Public Library, subject to the approval of the City Commission. Moved by Commissioner Clark, supported by Commissioner

Hammerschmidt, and unanimously adopted, that the appointment of C. T. DeHaas as trustee of the Peter White Public Library be confirmed.

Mosher, and Acting City attorney George C. Quinnell, the City enter into an agreement with the Upper Peninsula Power Company to purchase power from that Company and that the Mayor and City Clerk be authorized to sign said agreement in behalf of the City of Marquette.

Swan, Superintendent of Public Works, the City of Marquette enter into a Municipal Maintenance Contract between the City of Marquette and the Michigan State Highway Department for the maintenance of various streets carrying US-41 and M-28 through the City and that the Mayor and City Clerk be authorized to sign said agreement in behalf of the City of Marquette.

OFFICIAL PROCEEDINGS OF THE CITY COMMISSION

DECEMBER 14, 1955

A special meeting of the Marquette City Commission was duly called and held at the City Hall, Wednesday, December 14, 1955, at 4:00 o'clock p. m.

Present: Mayor Alholm, Commissioners Bur, Clark, Halverson, and Hammerschmidt.

Mayor Alholm stated the reason for this meeting was to discuss the report of Mr. George E. Ackerman of Vogt, Ivers, Seaman and Associates on the increase of generating capacity of the power system of the City of Marquette.

Mayor Alholm then asked City Manager, George E. Meholick, Jr., to outline the purposes of the aforementioned report.

Following Mr. Meholick's remarks, he introduced Mr. Ackerman of Vogt, Ivers, Seaman and Associates, who presented his formal report on the generating capacity of the Marquette electrical power system.

A lengthy discussion was had on all phases of the detailed report.

The pros and cons of other methods of generating power were also thoroughly discussed.

Mr. Ackerman then presented two (2) tentative proposals as per Plan Number 1 and Plan Number 2 of his report.

The City Commission felt that before any further action was to be taken on Mr. Ackerman's report that the report of the Upper Peninsula Power Company should now be considered.

The City Manager then presented a telegram which was received from the Upper Peninsula Power Company wherein they stated that their report is not available and that they plan to start the necessary study and research on January 1, and to have the report in the hands of the Commission as soon as possible.

After considerable discussion, the following resolution was made:

Moved by Commissioner Halverson, supported by Commissioner Clark and unanimously adopted, that the following telegram from the Upper Peninsula Power Com-

pany be accepted and placed on file and its contents spread upon the minutes of this meeting:

"As stated on December 13 to City Manager we will extend October 31, 1955 power contract with Marquette for period equal to time between contract execution date and date our study commences.

Signed: Upper Peninsula Power Company."

And that the City Manager be authorized to write the Power Company for more specific commitments with regard to rates and other items necessary for the good of the City, and to request the Upper Peninsula Power Company to have their independent report available to the City by January 16, 1956.

The City Commission then proceeded to consider the report and tentative proposals of 3640 KW units in accordance with the recommendations of the consulting engineer.

Since complete information was not available in regard to the overall power question, the following resolution then was adopted:

Moved by Commissioner Clark, supported by Commissioner Halverson and unanimously adopted that the City Manager, Superintendent of Light and Power Department, Mr. Ackerman, the Mayor, and a Commissioner appointed by the Mayor be authorized to go to Milwaukee and negotiate with the Nordberg Manufacturing Company, Milwaukee, Wisconsin, for a firm price on 3640 KW diesel electric unit and to authorize the City Manager to place a tentative order for same, in order to protect the City on price and delivery. This resolution is being made as an emergency measure to protect the best interests of the City of Marquette, it is further understood that this will be a sixty (60) day cancelable order pending further information and study by the Commission.

WHEREAS, The Charter of the City provides that this Commission may by resolution transfer annually not over fifty (50) percent of the net income of the Light and Power Utility to the general fund of the City for budgeted Municipal purposes; and

WHEREAS, Such transfers must be based on the net income earned in the fiscal year immediately preceding the transfer and must be made only after the com-

pletion of the audit of such year; and

WHEREAS, The budget adopted for the fiscal year 1955-56 contemplated such a transfer of funds for the final balance; and

WHEREAS, The annual audit report determines that the net income for the Light and Power Utility for the fiscal year 1954-55 was \$242,762.99:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED AND ORDERED, That the sum of \$121,381.49 be transferred from the Light and Power fund to the general fund of the City.

City Manager, George E. Meholick, Jr., reported to the Commission on the condition of compressor No. 1 at the Palestra Building. In his report, he gave an estimated cost of the repair to this machine. The repair included the replacement of a cylinder and piston. Following a short discussion on this report, it was moved by Commissioner Halverson, supported by Commissioner Hammerschmidt and unanimously adopted, that the City Manager be authorized to place an order for the cylinder and piston needed in the repair of this compressor.

Moved by Commissioner Hammerschmidt, supported by Commissioner Clark that the following resolution be, and same is hereby unanimously adopted:

The petition of Morris Vadnais dated November 26, 1955, having been examined by this Commission and by the acting City Attorney of this City and approved by him in his letter to the City dated November 30, 1955, and it appearing to be for the best interests of the City of Marquette that the recommendation of the Acting City Attorney be followed and that the prayer of the petition be granted.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED: That the prayer of said petition be granted and approved; that George C. Quinnell, Acting City Attorney, be authorized to execute and approve said petition and agreement for and on behalf of the City of Marquette and that the proper officers of the City be and they hereby are authorized and

directed to fulfill and comply with the terms and conditions of said petition and agreement.

City Manager, George E. Meholick, Jr., read a report on the trip to the Nordberg Manufacturing Company at Milwaukee, Wisconsin, on December 19-20, 1955, which was prepared by Mayor Harold W. Alholm, Commissioner Richard Bur, City Manager George E. Meholick, Jr., and Superintendent of Light and Power Department, Claude L. Mosher. After a lengthy discussion covering the five (5) main points of this report, the following motion was made:

Moved by Commissioner Clark, supported by Commissioner Halverson and unanimously adopted, that the motion made by the Commission on December 14, 1955, authorizing the placement of a sixty (60) day cancelable order for a 3640 KW diesel generating unit be amended to include two (2) engines instead of one (1).

Commissioner Halverson suggested that something be done about the narrowness of Second Street due to the snow plowed up in that area and cars parked on both sides of that street during activities at the Palestra Building.

On motion of Commissioner Bur, supported by Mayor Alholm and unanimously adopted, that the City of Negaunee be thanked for the courtesy shown the officials of the City of Marquette on December 19-20, 1955, in taking care of the Marquette City Car left in that city during the time officials of the Marquette City were in Milwaukee on business.
