A special meeting of the Marquette City Commission was duly called and held at the City Hall, September 3, 1957 at 4:00 o'clock p.m.

Present: Mayor Clark, Commissioners Alholm, Bur, Hammerschmidt.

Absent: Commissioner Rydholm.

Mayor Clark announced the reason for this meeting was to award the bid for fifty (50) street lighting standards and for the awarding of the bid to construct reinforced concrete foundations for a new electric substation at the Diesel Power Plant.

A report from City Manager George T. Meholick Jr. was read wherein he tabulated bids for fifty (50) street lighting concrete standards. It was moved by Commissioner Alholm, supported by Commissioner Bur and unanimously adopted, that upon recommendation of the City Manager, the low bid of Westinghouse Electric Sup-

ply Company of Green Bay, Wisconsin in the sum of \$3,898.50 for fifty concrete ornamental light standards be accepted.

A report from City Manager George T. Meholick Jr. was read wherein he tabulated bids received for the construction of a concrete foundation for an electric substation at the Diesel Electric Power Plant of the City of Marquette. It was then moved by Commissioner Hammerschmidt, supported by Commissioner Alholm and unanimously adopted, that upon recommendation of the City Manager, the low bid of L. W. Brumm, Marquette, Michigan, in the sum of \$5,437.80 for the construction of a reinforced concrete foundation for an Electric substation at the Diesel Electric Power Plant be accepted.

SEPTEMBER 9, 1957

A regular meeting of the Marquette City Commission was duly called and held at the City Hall, Monday, September ninth, 1957 at 7:00 o'clock p.m.

Present: Mayor Pro-tem Alholm, Commissioners Bur, Hammerschmidt and Rydholm.

Absent: Mayor Clark.

Moved by Commissioner Hammerschmidt, supported by Commissioner Bur and unanimously adopted, that the absence of Mayor Clark be excused he being away from the City.

Moved by Commissioner Bur, supported by Commissioner Hammerschmidt and unanimously adopted, that the reading of the minutes of the previous meeting be omitted.

A petition signed by twenty-two residents on Jefferson and Sherman Streets was read wherein they petitioned the Commission for the installation of water on those streets this season. Following an oral report from City Manager George T. Meholick Jr., regarding the situation of the installation of water mains in this vicinity it was moved by Commissioner Hammerschmidt, supported by Commissioner Rydholm and unanimously adopted, that this petition be referred to the City Manager and the Superintendent of the Water Department for study and report.

A communication from Walter M. Noack, Director of Enforcement, Liquor Control Commission, was read wherein he informs the Commission of a request for a transfer of ownership of a 1957 tavern license at 1700 Presque Isle Avenue from John Osterberg to Rachel H. Tallio. Moved by Commissioner Bur, supported by Commissioner Rydholm and unanimously adopted, that this request be granted.

A report from City Manager George T. Meholick Jr. was read regarding the rates of grave services at Park Cemetery. This report

was ordered received for a study by the Commission.

A report from C. T. DeHaas, President, Board of Trustees, Peter White Public Library, was read regarding the financial as well as the physical activities of the Peter White Public Library for the fiscal period July 1, 1956 to June 30, 1957. Moved by Commissioner Hammerschmidt, supported by Commissioner Bur and unanimously adopted that the Commission accept this report and commend the Board of Trustees of the Peter White Public Library for submitting such a well detailed report.

Moved by Commissioner Bur, supported by Commissioner Rydholm, that the following resolution be, and the same is hereby unanimously adopted:

The Commission unanimously agreed that the City Manager be commended for his fine annual report.

SEPTEMBER 16, 1957

A special meeting of the Marquette City Commission was duly called and held at the City Hall, Monday, September 16, 1957 at 4:00 o'clock P.M.

Present: Mayor Clark, Commissioners Alholm, Bur, Hammerschmidt and Rydholm.

Mayor Clark announced the purpose of the meeting was to discuss the installation of sidewalks in the Sandy Knoll Elementary School District and to receive a request regarding National Kids Day.

A detailed report from City Manager George T. Meholich, Jr. was read regarding the various aspects of the installation of sidewalks in the Sandy Knoll Elementary School District. Following the reading of Mr. Meholich's report, Commissioner Bur asked to be excused from the discussion and the voting on this question under Section 5.10 of the City Charter. Mayor Clark then asked if any person in attendance wished to address the Commission concerning the installation of sidewalks in this particular area, whereupon several interested citizens addressed the Commission. Following a lengthy discussion, it was moved by Commissioner Rydholm, supported by Commissioner Hammerschmidt and adopted, that the City proceed under Section 4.36, Chap-

ter 23 of the City Code in requiring the installation of sidewalks on Sixth, Ohio and Lee Streets and that the City Manager be directed to contact property owners directly affected by the installation of these sidewalks with the thought in mind that due to the lateness of the construction season that if this entire project could be placed on bids as soon as possible, everyone concerned would benefit and result further in a lower installation costs.

Commissioner Bur abstained voting under Section 5.10 of the City Charter.

A communication from J.D. Moved by Commissioner Bur, supported by Commissioner Alholm and unanimously adopted, that the request be granted.

Moved by Commissioner Rydholm, supported by Commissioner Bur and unanimously adopted, that the reading of the minutes of the previous meetings be omitted.

A communication from Robert Briggs, Commander, Amvets Post No. 124, was read wherein he requested permission for that Organization to sell White Clover on the streets of Marquette on Friday and Saturday, October 4th and 5th. Moved by Commissioner Bur, supported by Commissioner Alholm and unanimously adopted, that permission be granted as requested.

A report from City Manager George T. Meholick, Jr., was read regarding a special assessment roll for the installation of sidewalks in the Sandy Knoll School District, including a tabulation of a bid received for the installation of this sidewalk. Moved by Commissioner Hammerschmidt, supported by Commissioner Alholm, that the following resolution be, and the same is hereby unanimously adopted:

WHEREAS, The Assessor has made and duly certified to the Commission a special assessment roll for the following improvements: The installation of sidewalks in the Sandy Knoll School Area.

RESOLVED, That such assessment roll is hereby approved and that the same be filed with the City Clerk who is hereby directed to give notice to the property owners liable to such assessment, in conformity with the provisions of the City Charter of the filing of said assessment roll and appointing Monday, October 14, 1957, at 7:00 o'clock p.m. when the

Moved by Commissioner Rydholm, supported by Commissioner Bur and unanimously adopted, that upon recommendation of the City Manager, George T. Meholick, Jr., the bid of N. R. Hongisto in the amount of \$3,029.00 for the installation of approximately 1,165 lineal feet of sidewalk in the Sandy Knoll School District be accepted.

A report from City Manager George T. Meholick, Jr. was read wherein he tabulated bids for a ½ yard crawler type shovel. It was moved by Commissioner Alholm, supported by Commissioner Bur and unanimously adopted, that upon recommendation of the City Manager, the low bid of Straits Engineering Company of Sault Ste. Marie, Michigan, in the sum of \$16,380.00 for a ½ yard crawler type shovel as per specifications, be accepted for use in the Public Works Department with the provision that the expense of fitting the City-owned dipperstick and backhoe be borne by the bidder and by actual performance test satisfactory to the City before acceptance. The successful bidder shall also provide a ½ yard clam bucket, which shall be included in the net price of \$16,380.00 F.O.B. Marquette, Michigan.

A report from City Manager George T. Meholick, Jr. was read wherein he tabulated bids for a quantity of Class C-76 sewer pipe.

Moved by Commissioner Hammerschmidt, supported by Commissioner Rydholm and unanimously adopted, that the bid of C. T. DeHaas, Marquette, Michigan, in the sum of \$5.45 per lineal foot for a quantity of Class C-76 sewer pipe be accepted.

missioner Bur, supported by Commissioner Rydholm and unaniously adopted, that the low bid of Joseph Hamel, Champion, Michigan, in the sum of \$5,670.00 for the installation of a quantity of sewer pipe to repair the Eastern Trunk Sewer between East Michigan and East Ohio Streets as per specifications, be accepted.

A report from City Manager George T. Meholick, Jr. was read regarding bids received for curbing and gutter. It was moved by Commissioner Hammerschmidt, supported by Commissioner Alholm and unaniously adopted, that upon recommendation of the City Manager, the bid of N. R. Hongisto in the sum of \$8,246.80 for the installation of 4,640 lineal feet of concrete curbing to be laid in place on Park Street, West College Avenue and West Kaye Avenue and approximately 75 lineal feet of curb and gutter on Newberry Street be accepted.

Present: Mayor Clark, Commissioners Alholm, Bur, Hammerschmidt and Rydholm.

Moved by Commissioner Hammerschmidt, supported by Commissioner Bur and unanimously adopted, that the reading of the minutes of the previous meetings be omitted.

On motion of Commissioner Alholm, supported by Commissioner Bur and unanimously adopted, a petition from 11 residents in the 1900 block on Neidhart Avenue requesting the installation of paving and curbing during the 1958 construction season be referred to the City Manager for study and report.

A communication from George E. Bishop, Secretary-Manager, Upper Peninsula Development Bureau, was read wherein he invited the Mayor, City Commission and all other city officials to attend the 47th Annual Meeting of that Organization to be held at St. Ignace on October 31st and November 1st of this year. It was unanimously agreed that as many of the Commissioners and officials as possible would attend this all important meeting. Mayor Clark ordered this communication received and placed on file.

A communication from Steve Johnson, Chairman, Marquette City Planning Board, was read containing a recommendation to the Commission. It was moved by Commissioner Hammerschmidt, supported by Commissioner Rydholm and unanimously adopted, that upon recommendation of the Marquette City Planning Board, the tentative preliminary plat plan of Lakeview Heights' Subdivision be accepted as presented.

A communication from Ben West,

President, American Municipal Association, was read wherein he invites the governing body of the City of Marquette to attend a congress of that Organization to be held in San Francisco, California, December 1-4, 1957. This communication was ordered received and placed on file.

A communication from Mrs. Lidia Artz Dighera, General Chairman, American Association of University Women, was read wherein a request was made for permission for that organization to conduct a drive in the City of Marquette on October 31, 1957. Moved by Commissioner Rydholm, supported by Commissioner Bur and unanimously adopted, that this request be granted.

Moved by Commissioner Hammerschmidt, supported by Commissioner Alholm that the following resolution be, and the same is hereby unanimously adopted:

WHEREAS, Since the adoption of the gas franchise ordinance granting the gas franchise to Michigan Gas and Electric Company, such company has found it necessary to make repairs to its gas mains lying under certain paved streets in the City of Marquette, resulting in necessary patching of such pavements;

AND WHEREAS, The City of Marquette has planned an extensive program of paving of its streets over a period of years, and it is the desire of the City of Marquette and Michigan Gas and Electric Company to co-operate in the planning of their respective programs;

AND WHEREAS, The Marquette City Code contains the following provisions, as appear in Title IV, streets and sidewalks, Chapter 21:

4.4 Street Openings. No person shall make any excavation or opening in or under any street without first obtaining a written permit and furnishing a bond in a sum of not less than Three Thousand (\$3,000.00) Dollars.

4.5 Emergency Openings. The

City Engineer may, if the public safety requires immediate action, grant permission to make a necessary street opening in an emergency, provided that a permit shall be obtained on the following business day and the provisions of this chapter shall be complied with.

4.9 Prohibited Openings. No permit to make any opening or excavation in or under a paved street shall be granted to any person within a period of three years after the completion of any paving or resurfacing thereof. If a street opening is necessary as a public safety measure, the City Engineer may suspend the operation of this Section, as to such street opening.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, That the following is hereby adopted as the policy of this Commission as the practice and procedure to be followed hereafter in the event of any repairs, extensions, relaying or tapping of any gas mains under any paved streets.

1. The City Manager shall notify the Michigan Gas and Electric Company, not later than November 1st of each year, of all paving projects planned by the City of Marquette for the calendar year following, setting forth in such notice adequate description of streets to be so paved or repaved;

2. Not later than March 1st following each such notice, Michigan Gas and Electric Company shall submit to the City Manager a report as complete as possible describing the conditions of the gas mains in such streets, the repairs, extensions, relaying and/or tapping thereto that may be necessary or may be projected;

3. Upon approval by the City Manager as to location, order of completion of each project and the safety protective measures to be employed, Michigan Gas and Electric Company shall proceed forthwith to complete such projects, and same shall be completed not later than July 1st thereafter;

4. That after such July 1st completion date, and the completion of the paving projects by the City of the streets where such repairs

or extensions shall be so completed, the streets so paved shall not be opened or excavated into or under for a period of three years, except for necessary and unanticipated purposes as a public safety measure, as provided in Section 4.9 of the Marquette City Code.

Mayor Clark then announced that this was the date set for a public hearing on special assessment roll No. 289. Following a short discussion Mayor Clark announced the public hearing closed. It was moved by Commissioner Alholm, supported by Commissioner Rydholm, that the following resolution be, and the same is hereby unanimously adopted:

WHEREAS, It appears by affidavit on file with the City Clerk that due publication has been made of notice, as required by the City Charter, of the filing with the City Clerk of the special assessment roll for the following improvements: The installation of sidewalks in the Sandy Knoll School area in the City of Marquette, and appointing this day and time when the Commission and Assessor would meet to review said special assessment roll and the assessments therein; and

WHEREAS, All suggestions and objections made to said improvements and to said assessment roll and the respective assessment therein, have been heard and considered; and

WHEREAS, Said assessment roll and the assessments therein having been reviewed by the Commission and the Assessor and all needful corrections of the same having been made;

RESOLVED, That said assessment roll, to-wit: Special Assessment Roll No. 289, and the respective assessments therein, are hereby confirmed, provided that such assessments may be paid in 10 equal annual installments, the first of such installments to be due and payable 60 days hereafter and the remaining installments at the time fixed for the payment of regular city taxes, together with interest on such installments at the rate of 4% per annum from

the date of the confirmation of said special assessment roll.

A regular meeting of the Marquette City Commission was duly called and held at the City Hall, Monday, November 25, 1957 at 7:00 o'clock P.M.

Present: Mayor Pro-tem Aholm, Commissioners Bur, Hammerschmidt and Rydholm.

Mayor Pro-tem Alholm read a communication from Mayor James W. Clark wherein the reason for his absence was stated. Moved by Commissioner Hammerschmidt, supported by Commissioner Bur and unanimously adopted, that the Mayor be excused from this meeting, he being away from the City.

Moved by Commissioner Hammerschmidt, supported by Commissioner Bur and unanimously adopted, that the reading of the minutes of the previous meeting be omitted.

A communication from Rothwell C. Stickley, Captain, Salvation Army, was read wherein he requested permission for that Organization to place Christmas kettles on the streets in the City of Marquette. Moved by Commissioner Bur, supported by Commissioner Rydholm and unanimously adopted, that the request of Captain Stickley of the Salvation Army be granted.

A communication from D. L. Hart, Kiwanis Chairman, was read wherein he requested that the City join the Kiwanis Club in carrying on a Christmas Lighting Contest in the City of Marquette. Moved by Commissioner Hammerschmidt, supported by Commissioner Rydholm and unanimously adopted, that the City enter into a joint project with the Kiwanis Club to sponsor the Outdoor Residential Christmas Lighting Contest and to pay \$150.00 towards the prizes of said contest as budgeted.

Moved by Commissioner Hammerschmidt, supported by Commissioner Rydholm and unanimously adopted, that the Assignment of Easement from Max K. Reynolds, Jr. to Duluth South

Shore and Atlantic Railroad Company originally granted by the City of Marquette to Ajax Lumber Company be recognized and approved.

A communication from Russell L. Johnson, Engineer in Charge, Michigan Department of Health, was read wherein he announced the dates of the annual training school for the Upper Peninsula Sewage personnel workers to be held in the City Hall. This communication was ordered received and placed on file.

A communication from City Manager George T. Meholick, Jr. was read wherein he informed the Commission of a Management Development Program for the administrative officers of the City of Marquette, Michigan. This development program to cover approximately 48 hours of class room study and dealing with the subjects—Human Relations, Communications, Organization, Economics and Budgets, Labor Relations, and Group Leadership. Moved by Commissioner Rydholm, supported by Commissioner Hammerschmidt and unanimously adopted, that the City Commission concur with the recommendations of the City Manager in that the City enter into any necessary agreement with the Public Service Division of Northern Michigan College to sponsor this management development course and that the costs of this course which is estimated at \$40.00 per person be authorized and the same to be a part of the individual department budget.

A public hearing was then held upon a petition filed with this Commission on November 12, 1957 for the rezoning of a parcel of land owned by Northern Michigan College from "Single Family Residence District" to "General Residence".
