

# OFFICIAL PROCEEDINGS OF THE CITY COMMISSION

JANUARY 13, 1958

A regular meeting of the Marquette City Commission was duly called and held at the City Hall, Monday, January 13, 1958 at 7:00 o'clock p. m.

Present: Mayor Clark, Commissioners Alholm, Bur, Hammer-schmidt and Rydholm.

Mayor Clark welcomed the presence of the students of the Graveraet Senior Government Class and extended an invitation to them to attend meetings in the future.

Moved by Commissioner Bur, supported by Commissioner Alholm and unanimously adopted, that the reading of the minutes of the previous meeting be omitted.

A communication from Walter M. Noack, Director of Enforcement, Liquor Control Commission, was read wherein a request was made for the transfer of stock interest in a '57 B Hotel license from Frank J. Russell, President, to Edward Pearce, President, present stockholders to remain the same. Moved by Commissioner Hammer-schmidt, supported by Commissioner Bur and unanimously adopted, that this request be granted.

A communication from Rothwell C. Stickley, Captain, Salvation Army, was read wherein he thanked the Commission for the cooperation in that Organization's request to conduct the Christmas Campaign of that Organization throughout the City. This communication was ordered received and placed on file.

A communication from the Marquette County Humane Society was read and referred to the City Attorney for a study and report.

A detailed report from City Manager George T. Meholick, Jr., was read containing a detailed report prepared by the Administrative Assistant regarding the 1957-58 street paving program. Mayor Clark commended the Manager and the Administrative Assistant for this fine detailed report and

ordered it received and placed on file.

A report from City Manager George T. Meholick, Jr. was read wherein he outlined a tentative program for a series of television programs. This communication was ordered received and placed on file.

A report from Glen B. Wilson, Director, Civil Defense, was read wherein he informs the Commission that the emergency hospital unit for the City of Marquette has been approved by the Federal Civil Defense Administration. The January 21st. meeting on Disaster Plan is to be held at K. I. Sawyer Air Base at which time data concerning the cities and townships of Marquette County will be compiled and definite plans set up as a guide for evacuation purposes in the event of a disaster. Following the meeting of January 21st., the Civil Defense Director will report to the Commission the costs of any insurance and the place of storage of the emergency hospital unit as well as the outline of the January 21st. meeting.

Moved by Commissioner Alholm, supported by Commissioner Rydholm, that the following resolution be, and the same is hereby unanimously adopted:

# OFFICIAL PROCEEDINGS OF THE CITY COMMISSION

JANUARY 27, 1958

A regular meeting of the Marquette City Commission was duly called and held at the City Hall, Monday, January 27, 1958 at 7:00 o'clock p. m.

Present: Mayor Clark, Commissioners Alholm, Bur, Hammerschmidt and Rydholm.

Moved by Commissioner Bur, supported by Commissioner Rydholm and unanimously adopted, that the reading of the minutes of the previous meeting be omitted.

A petition signed by thirty residents on Cleveland, Sheridan, and Jefferson Avenues and Sherman and McClellan Streets was read wherein a request was made for the installation of sewers in those streets and avenues. On motion of Commissioner Bur, supported by Commissioner Alholm and unanimously adopted, this petition be referred to the City Manager for study and report.

A report from City Manager George T. Meholick, Jr. was read wherein he recommended traffic control measures be installed. Moved by Commissioner Hammerschmidt, supported by Commissioner Bur and unanimously adopted, that upon recommendation of City Manager George T. Meholick, Jr., the following traffic control measures be placed in effect on a ninety day trial basis:

1. The posting of "NO PARKING DURING SCHOOL HOURS — 8 A. M. - 4 P.M. SCHOOL LOADING ZONE" signs on both sides of Hebbard Court between College Avenue and Kaye Avenue.

2. The posting of "NO PARKING — HERE TO CORNER" signs on the south side of Fair Avenue and Kaye Avenue between Presque Isle Avenue and Third Street. The signs to be erected 30 feet from the Presque Isle intersections.

3. The erection of "NO PARKING" signs on the north side of College Avenue in front of St. Michael's School. The distance to be 100 feet between the signs and the signs to be directly in front of

the main doors to the school.

4. The erection of HOSPITAL SIGNS on Fourth, Fifth and Fisher Streets to direct traffic to the hospitals in the city.

A communication from Addison B. Aldrich, Great Lakes Cruising Club, was read wherein he requested information regarding the small craft facilities here at Marquette to be published in Michigan Waterway Guide for 1958. Commissioner Hammerschmidt informed the Commission that Mr. Holliday of the Harbor Committee is supplying the requested information. Mayor Clark then directed that this communication be referred to the Planning Board for study and planning.

A communication from Alexander G. Phillips, Mayor, City of St. Ignace, was read wherein he notifies the Commission that the week of June 23-29 is to be declared Homecoming Week by the City of St. Ignace and the Mackinac County Chamber of Commerce. This communication also announced a meeting to be held February 3rd. (Monday) at 2 p. m. at the Municipal Building, St. Ignace. Mayor Clark directed that this letter be forwarded to the Marquette Chamber of Commerce.

On motion of Commissioner Alholm, supported by Commissioner Hammerschmidt and unanimously adopted, the following traffic control measure be placed in effect for a 90 day trial period: Parking on the east side only of Champion Street from Blemhuber Avenue to Genesee Street.

City Manager George T. Meholick, Jr. verbally informed the Commission that the report of the Water Survey for the City of Marquette will be available shortly after the first of February. Moved by Commissioner Alholm, supported by Commissioner Rydholm and unanimously adopted, that a special meeting be held Wednesday, February 12, 1958 at 7:30 p. m. for the purpose of discussing this forthcoming report.

A regular meeting of the Marquette City Commission was duly called and held at the City Hall, Monday, February 10, 1958 at 7:00 o'clock p. m.

Present: Mayor Clark, Commissioners Alholm, Bur, Hammerschmidt and Rydholm.

Mayor Clark welcomed the adult government students attending the meeting and extended a cordial invitation for them to attend future meetings of the City Commission.

Moved by Commissioner Bur, supported by Commissioner Alholm and unanimously adopted, that the reading of the minutes of the previous meeting be omitted.

A communication from James A. Smith, Marquette Public Schools, was read wherein he requested permission for the Future Nurses Club of Graveraet High School to conduct their annual Blue Crutch Sale in downtown Marquette. Moved by Commissioner Hammerschmidt, supported by Commissioner Rydholm and unanimously adopted, that the Commission ratify previous action taken granting permission for that Organization to conduct their Annual Program on the downtown streets of Marquette on January 31, 1958 from 9:30 a. m. to 5:30 p. m.

A communication from Herbert H. Howard, Major, U. S. Army Corps of Engineers, was read wherein he included a notice of application for permit for submarine cables installed prior to 1939 at the Coast Guard Light and Fog Signal structure at the Southeast end of the Presque Isle Harbor breakwater. Mayor Clark referred this communication to the City Manager and the Harbor Committee for study in the event any valid objections to the subject submarine cables are received from interested parties in which event the City Manager and Harbor Committee will make a study and report back to the Commission.

FEBRUARY 12, 1958

A special meeting of the Marquette City Commission was duly called and held at the City Hall, Wednesday, February 12, 1958 at 7:30 o'clock P.M.

Mayor Pro-tem Alholm called the meeting to order and stated that the purpose of this meeting was to receive the report on the Water Survey as conducted by the City's Consulting Engineering firm of McNamee, Porter and Seeley of Ann Arbor, Michigan. Mayor Pro-tem Alholm then asked City Manager George T. Meholick, Jr. to introduce the representative of the firm of McNamee, Porter and Seeley and to review the purpose of this particular survey.

City Manager George T. Meholick, Jr. then introduced Mr. M. R. VanEyck representing the Engineering firm of McNamee, Porter and Seeley and discussed the action taken by the Commission concerning this water survey.

At this point in the meeting Mayor Clark entered and was seated.

Mr. VanEyck then proceeded to explain various recommendations made by his engineering firm regarding the water system of the City of Marquette. Through the use of maps, graphs, and a 29 page written report, Mr. VanEyck explained each step of their recommendations and answered considerable questions made by the Commission and interested citizens.

Mayor Clark then stated that he felt that this program needed considerable study from the standpoint of priority on the in-

stallation of various recommendations as well as the financial program that it will entail. Following considerable discussion regarding this statement, it was unanimously agreed by the Commission that this situation be studied both from the priority standpoint as well as the financial problem it presented.

Mayor Clark then assured Mr. VanEyck that the Commission appreciated his manner of presenting this important problem and the survey made by his firm.

George T. Meholick, Jr., City Manager, stated that he felt that financial consultants should be asked to look at the program along with the Commission and himself to see what could be done about programming certain phases of this project in order to accomplish the over-all picture and still not raise the taxes of the City of Marquette.

Mayor Clark thanked the interested citizens for showing an interest in this vital step in our community.

Meeting adjourned.

The Commission reconvened to meet with the Planning Board's members, Mrs. Gladys Gant, Mrs. Lucille Treado, Mr. Henning Anderson, Mr. Henry Bothwell, Mr. Floyd Bowden, Mr. Steve Johnson and Mr. Franz Menze, to discuss the matter of a by-pass on M-28 and US-41 around the City of Marquette. City Manager George T. Meholick, Jr. announced the next Commission meeting to be held Wednesday, February 18, 1958 at 3:00 o'clock P.M. between the City Commission, Mr. J. Meyers, Mr. Anderson and Mr. Kearnen of the State Highway Department to be held in the Commission Chambers at the City Hall.

A special meeting of the Marquette City Commission was duly called and held at the City Hall Tuesday, February 18, 1958 at 3:00 o'clock p. m.

Present: Mayor Clark, Commissioners Alholm, Bur, Hammerschmidt and Rydholm. Planning Board Members Mrs. Gladys Gant, Mrs. Lucille Treado, Mr. Henry Bothwell and Mr. Franz Menze. Representatives of the State Highway Department Mr. John Meyers, Mr. William Kearnen and Mr. George Neault.

Mayor Clark opened the meeting by requesting that this be considered an informal gathering and that it be a round table discussion. He then asked Mr. George T. Meholick, Jr., City Manager, to address the group present and explain the reason for the meeting.

Mr. Meholick then introduced Mr. Meyers and his staff who addressed those present concerning the study that has been conducted by the State Highway Department regarding the rerouting of US 41 - M 28 in Marquette. Mr. Meyers explained that this study has been of an exploratory nature for nearly 10 years and that this meeting is being held to inform the City as to what has been done by the Highway Department in the planning of this relocation program. Mr. Meyers then presented tentative drawings of the relocation of US 41 - M 28 Highway and stated that this project is in the 1961 State Highway budget. He also stated that in accordance with the drawings that the new relocation is tentatively planned to start near

the Brewery Location crossing under the D. S. S. & A. Railroad tracks at a suitable grade and follow a course along the Whetstone Creek valley through the southerly part of the City joining the present US 41 - M 28 near the outlet of the Whetstone Creek.

Various persons present asked questions of Mr. Meyers regarding the limited access portion of this tentative plan. Following a lengthy discussion on limited access, the advantages of this proposed relocation plan were listed in that the tentative relocation would follow a natural barrier in the City of Marquette and would divert considerable through traffic from Washington and Front Streets which in turn would make it possible to place those streets under city jurisdiction.

Mr. Meyers then requested that letters be written by the Commission and other interested organizations stating the viewpoints of those organizations on this relocation plan. He stated that the Michigan State Highway Department will conduct public hearings on this matter in the near future.

Mayor Clark then stated that the Commission appreciated the efforts of Mr. Meyers and his staff in traveling to Marquette to present to the City the State's viewpoint on the proposed relocating of US 41 - M 28 in the City of Marquette.

AND WHEREAS, Both of said highways carry principal traffic, both passenger and commercial;

AND WHEREAS, The City of Marquette believes that the best interest of the traveling public, as well as the residents of the City would better be served by a relocation of said highways;

AND WHEREAS, The Michigan State Highway Department has presented to the City Commission of the City of Marquette, Michigan a tentative plan for the relocation of said highways, in a most cooperative and informative manner;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED:

1. That the Michigan State Highway Department is hereby commended for its thorough cooperative and sympathetic study and presentation of its tentative plan for the relocation of High-

ways US-41 and M-28 through the City of Marquette, Michigan

2. That the State Highway Commissioner is hereby requested to expedite, as much as possible, the following projects in connection therewith:

- a. The acquiring of right-of-ways and the construction of the relocation of Highways US-41 and M-28 in such a manner as to relieve traffic congestion and hazards in the downtown principal business area of the City of Marquette, Michigan;
- b. The widening of the approach to the west end of such relocated highways so that such approach will be a four-lane highway westward to the present four-lane highway west of the City of Marquette, Michigan;
- c. The paving, widening and improvement of said highways from the south approach of said relocated highways in the City, southward to Green Garden Hill;
- d. The relocating, paving and improving of Highway US-41 southward from Green Garden Hill to the junction of Highway M-94;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That a copy of these resolutions be forwarded to the Honorable John Mackie, State Highway Commissioner, and that he be assured that the City Commission of the City of Marquette, Michigan is desirous of cooperating with the State Highway Department in any manner within its powers for the accomplishment of these projects.

A recommendation from City Manager George T. Meholick, Jr. was read regarding the purchase of a quantity of copper wire to be used in the Light and Power Department. Moved by Commissioner Bur, supported by Commissioner Rydholm and unanimously adopted, that upon recommenda-

tion of the City Manager and the Superintendent of the Light and Power Department, the City purchase 84,700 pounds of copper wire at a total cost of \$31,445.05 from the respective companies submitting low bids as itemized in the City Manager's recommendation. \$9,411.60 of this amount to be purchased during this fiscal year ending June 30, 1958. The remaining amount of \$22,033.45 to be purchased in the following fiscal period beginning July 1, 1958.

City Manager George T. Meholick, Jr. orally reported to the Commission that there had been no valid objections to the application for permit by the U. S. Army Corps of Engineers for submarine cables that have been installed in the past parallel to the breakwater at Presque Isle Harbor. The Commission unanimously agreed that the City Manager write a letter to the U. S. Army Corps of Engineers informing them that there has been no objections to the issuance of this permit.

Corps of Engineers to deepen the harbors of Presque Isle and Marquette, Michigan to sufficient depths to accommodate the new larger deeper draft vessels now in use on the Great Lakes and the larger bulk cargo vessels now under construction.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved that the City Commission

of the City of Marquette, Michigan assure the Federal Government, through the Corps of Engineers of its cooperation whenever and wherever possible, to;

A. Provide without cost to the United States all lands, easements, and rights-of-way owned by or under the jurisdiction of the City of Marquette to so provide, necessary for construction of said project, including areas for spoils disposal, and for subsequent maintenance of such spoils areas, if and when required.

B. Hold and save the United States free from damages that might result from such construction work to the City of Marquette, Michigan.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the City Manager be authorized and directed to negotiate any necessary agreements with the Corps of Engineers and the U. S. Government in order to expedite the deepening of said harbors, such agreements to be subject to the approval of the City Commission of the City of Marquette, Michigan.

AND WHEREAS, the City of Marquette, Michigan is a Home Rule City and would be seriously affected by such legislation if adopted;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED:

1. That the City Commission of the City of Marquette, Michigan go on record as opposing the adoption of the following Bills now pending before the Michigan State Legislature:

(a) House Bill No. 235 introduced by Representatives Williams, E. Fitzpatrick, Sobieski, O'Brien and J. Fitzpatrick;

(b) House Bill No. 160 introduced by Representatives Sanborn, Folks, and McNeeley;

(c) House Bill No. 131 introduced by Representatives Anderson, Brown, Roberts, Nill and Parker; and,

(d) House Bill No. 132 introduced by Representatives Anderson, Brown, Roberts, Nill and Parker;

2. That a copy of these resolutions be forwarded to State Senator Philip Rahoi, State Representative

Dominic Jacobetti, representing the districts in which this City is situated, and to State Representative Roy H. Brigham, Chairman of the House Committee on Towns and Counties and to State Representative Harry Litowich, Chairman of the House Committee on City Corporations, with the recommendation that they respectively oppose the adoption of the above described House Bills.

A communication from Philip Rahoi, State Senator, was read wherein he thanked the Commission for expressing their viewpoints regarding certain legislation before the House. Mayor Clark ordered this communication received and placed on file.

A communication from John A. Mr. Tobin read a well prepared and informative statement which was received and placed on file. It was then moved by Commissioner Alholm, supported by Commissioner Rydholm, that the following resolutions be, and the same is hereby unanimously adopted:

WHEREAS, Proceedings are now pending before the Interstate Commerce Commission arising out of the cancellation of a certain working agreement among New York Central Railroad, Pennsylvania Railroad and Duluth, South Shore and Atlantic Railroad regarding the division among them of the cost and expense of the railroad ferry operated between the Cities of St. Ignace, Michigan and Mackinac City, Michigan; the complaint filed by Duluth, South Shore and Atlantic Railroad against the Mackinac Transportation Company, which operates said ferry, the New York Central Railroad and the Pennsylvania Railroad concerning such cancellation; and the request of the Duluth, South Shore and Atlantic Railroad

that it be relieved from any portion of such operating costs and expenses and that same be handled in the same manner as is now in force and effect in the operation of the railroad ferries across Lake Michigan;

AND WHEREAS, The Duluth, South Shore and Atlantic Railroad operates and maintains in the City of Marquette, Michigan, its car shops, locomotive shops and other repair and maintenance facilities for its railroad equipment and stock; and hundreds of employees, including trainmen, engineers, firemen, mechanics, repair and maintenance men, are employed and reside in the City of Marquette, Michigan, and constitute a substantial part of the population of the City;

AND WHEREAS, to deny the request and petition of the Duluth, South Shore and Atlantic Railroad in such proceedings would result in a serious economic loss to the City of Marquette, Michigan and its residents because of the loss of income to such employees due to the diversion of moneys now allocated by that railroad to the benefit of this City and its residents to the greater costs to said railroad required to be paid by it for the costs and expenses of the operation of such railroad ferry;

AND WHEREAS, Information has been presented which indicates that the evidence produced and to be produced at such proceedings does not justify or require the Duluth, South Shore and Atlantic Railroad to be obliged to contribute or pay so large a share toward the operation of such railroad ferry, but rather that to do so would be inequitable and would work an unreasonable, critical and irreparable economic blow to the economy of the City of Marquette, Michigan and its residents as well as disturb such employees in their homes and the welfare of themselves and their families unnecessarily;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED:

1. That the City of Marquette, Michigan, go on record as supporting the position of the Duluth, South Shore and Atlantic Railroad in its objections and protests and

requests in such proceedings, and that representations be made of the unreasonable and inequitable position of requiring that railroad to allocate additional costs and expenses to the operation of such railroad ferry;

2. That Commissioner Richard R. Bur be, and he is hereby, designated and authorized to represent the City of Marquette, Michigan at the hearing to be held in such proceedings on March 25th, 1958, at Washington, D. C., in support of the objections and protests of Duluth, South Shore and Atlantic Railroad as filed with the Interstate Commerce Commission;

3. That a copy of these Resolutions be filed with the Interstate Commerce Commission to be considered at said hearing.

# OFFICIAL PROCEEDINGS OF THE CITY COMMISSION

MARCH 31, 1958

A regular meeting of the Marquette City Commission was duly called and held at the City Hall, Monday, March 31, 1958 at 7:00 o'clock p. m.

Present: Mayor Clark, Commissioners Alholm, Bur, Hammerschmidt, and Rydholm.

Moved by Commissioner Hammerschmidt, supported by Commissioner Bur and unanimously adopted, that the reading of the minutes of the previous meeting be omitted.

A petition signed by 32 residents of Shiras Hills Subdivision No. 1 was read wherein the petitioners requested the paving of Radisson Drive from its intersection with Highway U. S. 41; Schoolcraft Road; Nicholet Blvd.; East Nicholet Blvd.; and Raymbault Drive all in that Subdivision. Following considerable discussion, it was moved by Commissioner Hammerschmidt, supported by Commissioner Alholm and unanimously adopted, that this petition be referred to the City Manager for a study and report.

A petition signed by four (4) officers of the Marquette Gasoline Dealers Association, was read wherein it is suggested that the Commission makes certain amendments to the Zoning Ordinance of the City of Marquette. Following the reading of this petition, Mayor Clark announced that it was not in order as it does not contain sufficient signatures. After careful consideration and discussion, it was moved by Commissioner Rydholm, supported by Commissioner Alholm and unanimously adopted, that this suggestion be referred to the Planning Board for a study and report to the Commission.

A communication signed by Mrs. Joseph Specker, Secretary, Anti-Fluoridation League, was read wherein permission was requested to address the Commission. Following the reading of this communication, Mayor Clark stated that the purpose of the Fluorida-

tion Program was to alleviate dental cares particularly in our young children at a very low cost and this program was endorsed and recommended by the Michigan Department of Health. Various people who attended the meeting requested to speak and were heard by the Commission. Doctor Drury, former Health Officer of the City of Marquette, addressed the Commission explaining how and why fluoridation was installed in the City drinking water. Mr. John Deere also addressed the Commission regarding the question on the floor. Doctor Andriacchi informed the Commission that the medical and dental profession stood ready and willing to answer any and all questions regarding the addition of fluoride to the drinking water. One of the major questions asked by an interested citizen was, "can the human body store up and become over saturated with fluoride?" Mayor Clark then pointed out that this matter should be completely looked at from all respects. It was then moved by Commissioner Alholm, supported by Commissioner Bur and unanimously adopted, that the matter be referred to the City Manager for a study and report.

A communication from Charles T. Beaudry, Chairman, Marquette City Board of Review, was read wherein he reports the activities of that Board to the Commission. Mayor Clark then stated he felt the Board should be commended for their very efficient and speedy job well done and ordered this communication received and placed on file.

A communication from Don McCormick, Chairman, Police Training Program for the Upper Peninsula, was read wherein he informs the Commission of the dates for the Police Training Program to be held at Northern Michigan College. Moved by Commissioner Hammerschmidt, supported by Commissioner Bur and unanimously adopted, that this communica-
