

OFFICIAL PROCEEDINGS OF THE CITY COMMISSION

SEPTEMBER 8, 1958

A regular meeting of the Marquette City Commission was duly called and held at the City Hall, Monday, September 8, 1958 at 7:00 P.M.

Present: Mayor Bur, Commissioners Alholm, Hammerschmidt and Rydholm.

It was moved by Commissioner Alholm, supported by Commissioner Rydholm and unanimously adopted, that the reading of the minutes of the previous meeting be omitted.

A communication from Glen H. Yoder, Fund Raising Chairman, Kiwanis Club of Marquette, was read wherein he requested permission for that Organization to sponsor the Kiwanis International Kids Day by selling peanuts in the City of Marquette on September 26th. and 27th., 1958. It was moved by Commissioner Hammerschmidt, supported by Commissioner Rydholm and unanimously adopted, that this request be granted.

A communication from City Manager George T. Meholick was read wherein he presented the rules and regulations as have been drawn up by a special committee authorized by the Mayor to study the rate structures for services provided by the Park Cemetery. Following a short discussion on this matter, it was moved by Commissioner Hammerschmidt, supported by Commissioner Alholm and unanimously adopted, that upon recommendation of the City Manager, these rules and regulations regarding Park Cemetery be accepted by the Commission for study and that action be deferred on this matter until the regular meeting of September 29, 1958.

A communication from David R. Calhoun, President, Michigan Municipal League, was read wherein he informs the Commission of the place and dates of the Annual Conference of that Organization. Mayor Bur announced that City Manager George T.

Meholick is appointed the official representative for the City of Marquette and that Mayor Bur be the alternate official.

A communication from Louis J. Rumaggi, Major General, USA Division Engineer, was read wherein he informs the Commission of the place and dates of the meeting to be held regarding the deepening of the Marquette Harbor. This communication was received and placed on file.

A communication from C. T. DeHaas, President, Peter White Public Library Board, was read wherein he presented the Annual Report for the Library. Mayor Bur commended Mr. DeHaas and the other members of the Library staff on the fine Annual Report and ordered same placed on file for public examination.

A communication from J. W. Skolaut, Secretary, Air Coordinating Committee, was read wherein he informs the Commission of the dates and place of the meeting of the Regional Airspace Subcommittee. This communication was ordered received and placed on file.

Mayor Bur then made the following appointments to the Marquette City Health Council: Dr. Dan P. Hornbogen, Mr. Edward Pearce, Mr. Herman Olson, Dr. Charles P. Drury, Rt. Rev. Msgr. Nolan B. McKeivitt, Rev. Otto Magnuson, Col. Philip N. Loring, Mr. George Summers, Dr. Luther West, Mrs. Alden Clark, Mr. Robert Clark, Mr. Victor Holliday, Mr. Robert apJones and Mrs. Irene Anderson. It was then moved by Commissioner Hammerschmidt, supported by Commissioner Alholm and unanimously adopted, that the foregoing appointments to the Marquette City Health Council be confirmed.

Mayor Bur then announced that in accordance with Section 10, paragraph (5.44) of the Zoning Ordinance of the City of Marquette, Dr. Beatrice Bolan, Health

Officer, be named Chairman of the Board of Appeals for the fiscal year 1958-59.

OFFICIAL PROCEEDINGS OF THE CITY COMMISSION

SEPTEMBER 29, 1958

A regular meeting of the Marquette City Commission was duly called and held in the Commission Chambers at the City Hall Monday, September 29, 1958 at 7:00 o'clock P. M.

Present: Mayor Bur, Commissioners Alholm, Hammerschmidt and Rydholm.

Moved by Commissioner Hammerschmidt, supported by Commissioner Alholm and unanimously adopted, that the reading of the minutes of the previous meeting be omitted.

A communication from Walter M. Noack, Director of Enforcement, Liquor Control Commission, was read wherein he notifies the Commission of a request received by that Commission for a transfer of a 1958 SDM license from Raymond J. Flink, located at the corner of Lincoln and College Avenues to William D. Hockin and James A. Nebel. Moved by Commissioner Rydholm, supported by Commissioner Hammerschmidt and unanimously adopted, that this request be granted.

A communication from Walter M. Noack, Director of Enforcement, Liquor Control Commission, was read wherein he notifies the City Commission of a request received from V. Ford Flanagan to drop James V. Flanagan as a partner on a 1958 Class C license located at 429 Washington Street, Marquette, Michigan. It was then moved by Commissioner Alholm, supported by Commissioner Rydholm and unanimously adopted that this request be granted.

A communication from Adolph M. Turcotte, President, Men's Organization, Saint Christopher's Church, was read wherein that Organization requests permission to sponsor the Skerbeck Shows in the City of Marquette from October 1st to October 5th, 1958. Following a short discussion on this matter, it was moved by Commissioner Alholm, supported by Commissioner Hammerschmidt and unanimously adopted, that permission as re-

quested be granted and that all fees in accordance with the Ordinance be waived in this instance with the exception of the posting of the fifty dollars (\$50.00) to insure proper cleanup of the grounds following the show.

Moved by Commissioner Hammerschmidt, supported by Commissioner Alholm, that the following resolution be, and the same is hereby unanimously adopted:

WHEREAS, a petition has been received and filed requesting the following improvement:

The installation of paving in the 800 block on Clark Street in the City of Marquette.

RESOLVED, that the City Manager is directed to prepare plans, specifications and estimate of costs of such improvement, and attach thereto his recommendation as to the proportion of the costs to be paid by special assessment and of the proportion, if any, to be paid as the general obligation of the City; the number of installments for payment; the interest rate thereon; and the land to be included in the special assessment district;

FURTHER RESOLVED, that the City Manager file same with the City Clerk who shall make same available for public examination;

FURTHER RESOLVED, that the City Clerk shall fix a day for a public hearing on the determination of the necessity for such improvement by the City Commission, and shall cause notice of the time and place of same to be published once in the official newspaper of the City not less than 10 days prior to such date of hearing, such notice to state also that the report of the City Manager, and the plans, specifications and estimate of costs, are on file in his office for public examination, and that he shall also serve a like notice upon each owner of property subject to assessments for such improvement, by United States Mail, at least 10 days prior to such

hearing; and that he shall further make proof of such publication and service by affidavit.

The Clerk then proceeded to read proposed ordinance amendments pertaining to an Ordinance to Amend the Code of the City of Marquette by adding three new sections, which new sections shall be designated as Sections 3.7, 3.8 and 3.9 of Chapter 18, Title III — Parks and Public Grounds, of said Code, creating a Cemetery Board and designating its duties, membership and qualifications of membership. Moved by Commissioner Rydholm, supported by Commissioner Hammerschmidt and unanimously adopted, that the amendments to the Marquette City Code as read be, and same is approved as to form, and that the Clerk is hereby directed to fix a day for a public hearing thereon and for the consideration of such amendment for adoption.

On motion of Commissioner Alholm, supported by Commissioner Hammerschmidt the following resolution be, and the same is hereby unanimously adopted:

WHEREAS, It appears by the affidavit of the City Clerk that due publication has been made of notice, as required by the City Charter, that it is the intention of the City Commission to make certain improvements, and to determine the necessity of such improvements as follows:

An extension of sewer and water mains, approximately 1,000 feet on West Nicolet Boulevard in Shiras Hills Subdivision in the City of Marquette,

and appointing this day and time when the City Commission would meet to determine the necessity of such improvement; and

WHEREAS, It appears further by said affidavit that a like notice has been sent by mail to each owner of property subject to assessment therefore; and

WHEREAS, All suggestions and objections made to said improvements have been heard and considered;

RESOLVED, That the City Commission determines that such

project and improvements are necessary and proper;

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the proportion of the costs of such improvements which shall be defrayed by special assessment upon the property especially benefited thereby and the proportion to be defrayed as the general obligation of the City, if any, shall be as follows:

100 per cent by special assessment

\$4,920.00 for the installation of sewer, and

\$5,390.30 for the installation of water.

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the report of the City Manager, the plans and specifications, and the estimated costs of such improvements, are hereby approved and determined accordingly; that said special assessments may be paid in five installments, at the rate of four per cent per annum thereon; and that a special assessment district to be assessed therefore is hereby designated as follows:

Lot No. 30 through lot No. 47 inclusive in Shiras Hills subdivision No. 1 to the City of Marquette.

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the City Assessor shall forthwith prepare an assessment roll in accordance with this Resolution.

On motion of Commissioner Hammerschmidt, supported by Commissioner Rydholm, the following resolution be, and the same is hereby unanimously adopted:

WHEREAS, It appears by the affidavit of the City Clerk that due publication has been made of notice, as required by the City Charter, that it is the intention of the City Commission to make certain improvements, and to determine the necessity of such improvements as follows:

Sewer and water mains in Lakeview Heights Subdivision in the City of Marquette, and appointing this day and time when the City Commission would meet to determine the necessity of such improvement; and

WHEREAS, It appears further by said affidavit that a like notice

has been sent by mail to each owner of property subject to assessment therefore; and

WHEREAS, All suggestions and objections made to said improvements have been heard and considered;

RESOLVED, That the City Commission determines that such project and improvements are necessary and proper;

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the proportion of the costs of such improvements which shall be defrayed by special assessment upon the property especially benefited thereby and the proportion to be defrayed as the general obligation of the City, if any, shall be as follows:

One hundred per cent by special assessment

\$12,620.00 for the installation of sewers

\$14,065.85 for the installation of water.

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the report of the City Manager, the plans and specifications, and the estimated costs of such improvements, are hereby approved and determined accordingly; that said special assessments may be paid in five installments, at the rate of four per cent per annum thereon; and that a special assessment district to be assessed therefore is hereby designated as follows:

Twenty-two lots and one parcel in Lakeview Heights Subdivision to the City of Marquette.

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the City Assessor shall forthwith prepare an assessment roll in accordance with this Resolution.

Mayor Bur announced that this was the date set for a public hearing on an Ordinance granting a Franchise to Marquette Service Corporation. Following a short discussion, the hearing was closed. It was moved by Commissioner Rydholm, supported by Commissioner Hamerschmidt, that the following Ordinance be, and the same is hereby unanimously adopted:
AN ORDINANCE GRANTING A FRANCHISE TO MARQUETTE SERVICE CORPORATION

The City of Marquette Ordains:

1. That the City of Marquette does hereby grant to Marquette Service Corporation, a Michigan Corporation, the right, privilege and franchise to construct, operate and maintain lines of television co-axial cable, including poles, wires, and fixtures where necessary, upon, along, over and under the public streets and alleys of the City of Marquette, but subject to the terms and conditions herein set out, and provided that such locations as may be approved in writing by the Superintendent of Light and Power of the City of Marquette, or by the City Commission of said city, and the corporation shall file with the City Manager an application in writing for each line, showing in detail the location of same, and shall furnish with the application all such information as may be required by the City Manager.

2. So far as practical the corporation shall use existing poles, such as those erected and maintained by the Michigan Bell Telephone and Telegraph Company and the City of Marquette where satisfactory rental and construction agreements can be reached with the telephone company and the city. New poles will be placed only at locations approved by the City Manager.

3. All streets and sidewalks disturbed or damaged in the construction or maintenance of said cable lines shall be promptly repaired by the corporation, at its expense, and to the satisfaction of the City Engineer.

4. All co-axial cables erected in the City of Marquette by the corporation shall at all times meet with the minimum standards of the city as provided by ordinance or code, and shall be located on the city's poles as directed by the Superintendent of Light and Power.

5. The corporation shall be subject to all ordinances now in force or that may be hereafter enacted relative to the use of the streets and alleys of the City of Marquette.

6. The corporation shall, at all

times, establish and maintain reasonable standards of service and quality of products consistent with those established and maintained generally in the field of providing television transmission to viewers by co-axial cable, and shall not unjustly discriminate in its service or rates among its subscribing viewers.

7. The corporation shall indemnify and hold the City of Marquette harmless from all claims for damages arising out of the construction, maintenance, or operation of said cable lines.

8. The franchise hereby granted is granted for the term of thirty years from the date of this ordinance, but upon the failure of the corporation to start operations in a substantial manner satisfactory to the City of Marquette within one year from the date of this ordinance, or misuse or fail to comply otherwise with the provisions of this franchise, the City may terminate the franchise here granted upon giving to the corporation thirty days' notice of its intention to terminate same.

9. This ordinance shall become effective ten (10) days after the adoption thereof, but not before publication of its adoption and the full text thereof.

10. This ordinance shall be published at the expense of the corporation.

A communication from George T. Meholick, City Manager, was read wherein he informs the Commission of a request made by L. W. Brumm for permission to sub-contract all of the work of his said general contract for the installation of water mains in the City of Marquette. It was then moved by Commissioner Hammerschmidt, supported by Commissioner Alholm and unanimously adopted, that permission to sub-contract this work be granted as requested.

A report from City Manager George T. Meholick was read wherein he tabulated bids received for the installation of a storm sewer in Summit Street. Bids received for this work are as follows:

N. R. Hongisto, Marquette, Michigan, \$5,748.50

Joseph Hamel, Champion, Michigan, \$5,997.00

It was then moved by Commissioner Alholm, supported by Commissioner Rydholm and unanimously adopted, that upon recommendation of the City Manager, the low bid of N. R. Hongisto in the sum of \$5,748.50 be accepted for the installation of a storm sewer in Summit Street.

Mayor Bur read a report on the 60th. Annual Convention of the Michigan Municipal League which he and City Manager George T. Meholick attended in Detroit September 23rd through September 26th, 1958.

A report from City Manager George T. Meholick was read regarding traffic control orders wherein he pointed out various traffic control measures throughout the city. It was then moved by Commissioner Hammerschmidt, supported by Commissioner Alholm and unanimously adopted that two "No Parking on this Side" signs installed on the east side of Champion Street south from Fisher Street to Palm Street be made permanent.

It was then moved by Commissioner Alholm, supported by Commissioner Hammerschmidt and unanimously adopted, that "No Parking" signs be erected on the north side of West Michigan Street between Fourth Street and Front Street for a ninety day trial period.

Mayor Bur announced that he was of the opinion that a special meeting should be called to review the traffic survey study as was conducted this past year.

Mayor Bur read a communication received from the Michigan Health Council wherein they congratulated the City for the organizing of a local Health Council.

Mayor Richard R. Bur appointed City Manager George T. Meholick United Nations Day Chairman of the City of Marquette.

It was then moved by Commissioner Hammerschmidt, supported by Commissioner Rydholm and unanimously adopted, that James R. Smith, 401 Center Street, Marquette, Michigan, be appointed as City Commissioner to serve the remainder of the unexpired term of office of James W. Clark, resigned.

OFFICIAL PROCEEDINGS OF THE CITY COMMISSION

OCTOBER 3, 1958

A special meeting of the Marquette City Commission was duly called and held at the City Hall, Friday, October 3, 1958 at 4:30 o'clock P. M.

Present: Mayor Bur, Commissioners Alholm, Hammerschmidt, Rydholm and Smith.

Mayor Bur introduced the newly appointed Commissioner to fill the vacancy of James W. Cark, resigned. The City Clerk then administered the oath of office of James R. Smith.

A detailed report from City Manager George T. Meholick was read regarding traffic control changes. After considerable discussion on this matter, Mayor Bur directed the City Manager to meet with the Upper Peninsula State Highway Traffic Engineer to discuss the recommended outline for traffic control measures at the intersection of Washington and Fourth Streets. It was then moved by Commissioner Hammerschmidt, supported by Commissioner Rydholm and unanimously adopted, that upon recommendation of the City Manager, the matter of parking meters on Washington Street between Fourth and Fifth Streets be installed for a ninety (90) day trial period.

It was then moved by Commissioner Alholm, supported by Commissioner Hammerschmidt and unanimously adopted, that upon recommendation of the City Manager, a left turn lane on Fair and Presque Isle Avenues be installed.

On motion of Commissioner Alholm, supported by Commissioner Hammerschmidt and unanimously adopted, signs be erected on Third Street notifying the public of two hour parking on both sides of that Street from Arch Street to Michigan Street from 9:00 A. M. to 5:00 P. M. This measure to be on a ninety (90) day trial period.

It was then moved by Commissioner Rydholm, supported by Commissioner Hammerschmidt and unanimously adopted, that at the intersection of College and Lincoln

Avenues there be erected "Yield Right of Way" signs on College Avenue making Lincoln Avenue a through street. This measure to be for a ninety (90) day trial period.

On motion of Commissioner Hammerschmidt, supported by Commissioner Alholm and unanimously adopted, "No Parking" signs be erected on the north side of East Ohio Street between Front and High Streets for a trial period of ninety (90) days.

Commissioner Hammerschmidt recommended that a study be made of the following intersections: College Avenue at Presque Isle Avenue and Kaye Avenue at Presque Isle Avenue in the City of Marquette.

The Commission unanimously agreed that Sarah R. VanCleve and Ernest Hoppe be selected to attend the Michigan Municipal Employees' Retirement System meeting.

A detailed report from City Manager George T. Meholick was read wherein he outlined recommendations regarding the Water Department Expansion Program. Following a lengthy discussion regarding this matter, it was moved by Commissioner Rydholm, supported by Commissioner Smith, that the following resolution be, and the same is hereby unanimously adopted:

WHEREAS, the City Commission deems it necessary for the public welfare of said City to expand and improve the water supply and distribution system of the City of Marquette by providing a ground level elevated storage tank, improvements in the water distribution system and water works pumping station;

AND WHEREAS, plans and specifications for said capital improvements have been prepared by McNamee, Porter and Seeley of the City of Ann Arbor, Michigan who have estimated the cost thereof at not exceeding Five Hundred Thousand (\$500,000.00) dollars;

AND WHEREAS, it will be

necessary to borrow the sum of not to exceed Five Hundred Thousand (\$500,000.00) dollars to pay for the costs of said capital improvement to issue bonds of the City therefore;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT:

1. The City Commission deems it necessary to borrow the sum of not to exceed Five Hundred Thousand (\$500,000.00) dollars, and issue general obligation bonds of the City therefore for the purpose of paying the cost of expanding and improving the water supply and distribution system of the City of Marquette by providing a ground level elevated storage tank, improvements in the water distributions system, and water works pumping station;

2. The report on said capital improvements as prepared by McNamee, Porter and Seeley of the City of Ann Arbor are hereby approved and ordered filed with the City Clerk for public examination;

3. The City Commission determines the period of usefulness of said capital improvements to be not less than twenty-five years;

Resolved that
4. There be submitted to the electors of the City at the General Election to be held in the said City on Tuesday, November 4, 1958 between the hours of 7:00 A. M. and 8:00 P. M. EST, the following proposition:

"Shall the City of Marquette borrow the sum, not to exceed Five-Hundred-Thousand Dollars (\$500,000.00) and issue General Obligation Bonds of the City, therefore, for the purpose of paying the cost of expanding and improving the water supply and distribution system of the City of Marquette by providing a ground level elevated storage tank, improvements in the distribution system and water works pumping station?"

5. Said proposition shall be stated on a separate ballot in substantially the form set forth in the preceding paragraph;

6. The City Clerk shall cause notice of the submission of said special proposition to be published

and posted as part of the election notice of the General Election in manner required by law;

7. The notice of the submission of said special proposition to be included in the notice of election shall be in substantially the following form:

TO THE QUALIFIED ELECTORS OF THE CITY OF MARQUETTE:

PLEASE TAKE NOTICE that at the General Election to be held in the City of Marquette, County of Marquette, Michigan, on Tuesday, the 4th day of November, 1958, from 7:00 o'clock A. M. to 8:00 o'clock P. M. Eastern Standard Time, the following proposition will be submitted to the electors of the City;

"Shall the City of Marquette borrow the sum, not to exceed Five-Hundred-Thousand Dollars (\$500,000.00) and issue General Obligations Bonds of the City, therefore, for the purpose of paying the cost of expanding and improving the water supply and distribution system of the City of Marquette by providing a ground level elevated storage tank, improvements in the distribution system and water works pumping station?"

Only those qualified and registered electors who have property in the City assessed for taxes or the lawful husband or wife of such person are qualified to vote on the foregoing bonding proposition at said election.

The place of election will be the regular voting place in each election precinct.

This Notice is given by authority of the City Commission of the City of Marquette, County of Marquette, Michigan.

8. All resolutions and parts of resolutions insofar as they conflict with the provisions of this resolution be, and they hereby are rescinded.

On motion of Commissioner Alholm, supported by Commissioner Rydholm and unanimously adopted, that the reading of the minutes of the previous meetings be omitted.

It was moved by Commissioner Hammerschmidt, supported by Commissioner Alholm, that the following resolution be, and the same is hereby unanimously adopted:

WHEREAS, in the passing of Pope Pius XII, men of good will, regardless of nationality or creed, have lost one of the greatest Christian leaders, whose exemplary life on earth was one of full devotion to God and service to all mankind, that we might have a better understanding among ourselves and a sense of complete peace on earth; and,

WHEREAS, Pope Pius XII devoted all of his untiring energies to the championship of the rights of man and freedom from tyranny and aggression, to the relief of the oppressed and sorrowing, and to the reconciliation of nation to nation, in the highest tradition of the teachings of Christ to his disciples; and

WHEREAS, his strong voice and able leadership, prompted by his profound vision and broad understanding of the complex problems of the world, have been a constant influence in the defense of free men of all nations against the extension of atheistic and communistic ideologies;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED:

A request from Lidia Artz Dighera, Chairman, U.N.I.C.E.F. Organization, was read. It was moved by Commissioner Rydholm, supported by Commissioner Hammerschmidt and unanimously adopted, that the request to sponsor a finance raising drive by this Organization on October 31, 1958 be granted.

A communication from Luella

WHEREAS, It appears by the affidavit of the City Clerk that due publication has been made of notice, as required by the City Charter, that it is the intention of the City Commission to make certain improvements, and to determine the necessity of such improvements as follows: The paving of West Kaye Avenue between Northrop Street and Park Area in the City of Marquette, and appointing this day and time when the City Commission would meet to determine the necessity of such improvement; and

WHEREAS, It appears further by said affidavit that a like notice has been sent by mail to each owner of property subject to assessment therefore; and

WHEREAS, All suggestions and objections made to said improvements have been heard and considered;

On motion of Commissioner Alholm, supported by Commissioner Rydholm and unanimously adopted, the reading of the minutes of the previous meeting be omitted.

A communication from Joseph F. Kueber, Attorney at law, was read wherein he requested permission to address the Commission regarding the request for an increase in taxi rates in the City of Marquette. It was moved by Commissioner Rydholm, supported by Commissioner Hammerschmidt and unanimously adopted, that this request be granted, whereupon Mr. Kueber addressed the Commission. A regular meeting of the Marquette City Commission was duly called and held at the City Hall, Monday, November 24, 1958 at 7:00 o'clock p. m.

Present: Mayor Bur, Commissioners Alholm, Hammerschmidt, Rydholm and Smith.

On motion of Commissioner Hammerschmidt, supported by Commissioner Alholm and unanimously adopted, the reading of the minutes of the previous meeting be omitted.

A communication from Edward F. Jarvis, Captain, Salvation Army, was read wherein he requested permission for that Organization to start the Christmas Drive November 28, 1958 to raise funds for needy people. Moved by Commissioner Rydholm, supported by Commissioner Smith and unanimously adopted, that this request be granted with the stipulation that the music played be held to subdued tones.

A communication from Clyde W. Hecox, Chairman, Support of Churches Committee, Kiwanis Club, was read wherein he requested that the City participate in the funds for prizes for the Christmas Home Lighting Contest to be staged by that Organization. Moved by Commissioner Alholm supported by Commissioner Hammerschmidt and unanimously adopted, that the request of the Kiwanis Club be granted and that the City participate to the extent of \$135.00 towards this worthwhile cause.

A communication from Stanley E. Moody, Publicity Chairman for the Marquette County Council for Retarded Children, was read wherein he requested permission to address the Commission. Moved by Commissioner Alholm, supported by Commissioner Rydholm and unanimously adopted, that this request be granted, whereupon Mr. Moody proceeded to address the Commission regarding retarded children in Marquette. Mr. Moody

also outlined a drive designed to raise funds to support the present school for retarded children stating that this drive would be by radio, T.V., canisters and through direct mailing. Mr. Bill Evert also addressed the Commission regarding this matter asking that the Commission endorse a fund raising campaign in the City of Marquette. Following a question and answer discussion regarding this matter, it was moved by Commissioner Rydholm, supported by Commissioner Alholm and unanimously adopted, that permission be granted to conduct a fund raising campaign this year only.

A resolution submitted by the Building Committee of the Marquette Chamber of Commerce was read and discussed at some length. Moved by Commissioner Hammerschmidt, supported by Commissioner Alholm and unanimously adopted, that upon recommendation of the Marquette City Planning Board, the City Commission consider the rezoning of the above described parcel of land and that a public hearing on this charge be held before the City Commission on December 8, 1958 at 7:00 o'clock P. M. and that notice be given by publication in the Mining Journal, a daily newspaper published in this City prior to said hearing.

A communication from Steve Johnson, Chairman, Marquette City Planning Board, was read wherein that Board recommends the acceptance of the final plat plan of Rintala Heights Subdivision to the City of Marquette. It was moved by Commissioner Alholm, supported by Commissioner Hammerschmidt and unanimously adopted, that the City Commission approve the final plat plan of Rintala Heights Subdivision to the City of Marquette as presented.

Mayor Bur announced the appointments of the following citizens to the Cemetery Board: Albert Fletcher, Rev. John Adams Alford, and Mrs. Lincoln Frazier.

Commissioner Hammerschmidt inquired if there was any city property that might be turned to capital. City Manager George T. Meholick stated that he would list all city owned property for study by the Commission.

DECEMBER 8, 1958

A regular meeting of the Marquette City Commission was duly called and held at the City Hall, Monday, December 8, 1958 at 7:00 o'clock p. m.

Present: Mayor Bur, Commissioners Alholm, Hammerschmidt, Rydholm and Smith.

Moved by Commissioner Alholm, supported by Commissioner Smith and unanimously adopted, that the reading of the minutes of the previous meeting be omitted.

A communication from Lee McGinley, C.P.A., Lawrence Scudder and Company, was read wherein he submitted the audit for the year beginning July 1, 1957, ending June 30, 1958. Mayor Bur ordered this audit report placed on display in the Clerk's Office.

A communication from City Manager George T. Meholick was read wherein he designated the coasting hills for the City of Marquette as follows:

1. West Ridge Street from the east side of North Fifth Street to the west side of North Fourth Street; stop sign to be on Ridge Street at the east side of North Fifth Street intersection.
2. East Hewitt Avenue from the east side of Spruce Street to the west side of L. S. & I. Railroad tracks; stop sign to be placed at the east side of the intersection of Spruce Street on Hewitt Avenue.
3. High Street from the north side of Crescent Street to the south side of Fair Avenue.
4. Longyear Avenue across Summit Street.
5. Fisher Street from west side of Seventh Street west.
6. Craig Street from Altamont Street to Division Street.

It was then moved by Commissioner Hammerschmidt, supported by Commissioner Rydholm and unanimously adopted, that the Commissioner concur with the recommendations of the City Manager in the matter of coasting hills for the City of Marquette.

A communication from City Manager George T. Meholick was read wherein he submitted the revision of the City Employment Code Book. It was moved by Commissioner Rydholm, supported by Commissioner Smith and unanimously adopted, that "AN ORDINANCE TO PROVIDE FOR A MERIT SYSTEM OF PERSONNEL MANAGEMENT WHICH PROVIDES FOR AN EMPLOYMENT CODE THAT INCLUDES AMONG OTHER ITEMS, SENIORITY RIGHTS, HOURS OF EMPLOYMENT, CLASSIFICATION PLAN, OVERTIME, WAGE ADJUSTMENTS, GRIEVANCE AND APPEAL PROCEDURES, SICK LEAVE, VACATION TIME, HOLIDAYS, LEAVES OF ABSENCE, AND ACTIVITIES INCOMPATIBLE WITH CITY EMPLOYMENT" be adopted as to form and that the City Clerk fix the next regular meeting of this Commission as the date for a public hearing hereon and for consideration of its adoption, and further that the above title be approved as a sufficient digest for publication, and that the Clerk publish a notice of such date of public hearing and consideration, which notice shall contain reference to said digest as so approved, and that the full text of said Ordinance is available for inspection by and distribution to the public at the office of the Clerk and at least two other public places in the City to be specifically designated in such notice.

A communication from City Manager George T. Meholick was read wherein he informed the Commission of the purchase of seventeen (17) parking meters to be used in the City. Mr. Meholick also pointed out the reason under section 12.1 of the City Charter for not calling for bids for these particular meters. Mr. Meholick also recommended that the City enter into an agreement with M. H. Rhodes Inc. for the purchase of seventeen (17) Model "FL" parking meters at a cost of \$84.00 each F.O.B. Mar-

quette, Michigan. It was then moved by Commissioner Alholm, supported by Commissioner Hammerschmidt and unanimously adopted, that upon recommendation of the City Manager, the Mayor and City Clerk be authorized to sign an agreement on behalf of the City to purchase parking meters from M. H. Rhodes Inc.

A communication from City Manager George T. Meholick was read wherein he submitted "AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE CODE OF THE CITY OF MARQUETTE BY ADDING A NEW SECTION, WHICH NEW SECTION SHALL BE DESIGNATED AS SECTION 5.23 OF CHAPTER 24, OF TITLE V - ZONING AND PLANNING - OF SAID CODE, PROVIDING FOR SET BACK LINES FOR ACCESSORY BUILDINGS". It was then moved by Commissioner Alholm, supported by Commissioner Rydholm and unanimously adopted, that "AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE CODE OF THE CITY OF MARQUETTE" introduced at this regular meeting be adopted as read as to form and that the Clerk fix a date for a public hearing thereon and the consideration thereof for adoption.

A communication from Steve Johnson, Chairman, Marquette City Planning Board, was read wherein that Board recommends a change of zoning for the following described land: beginning at a point where the railroad right-of-way intersects with Wright Street, thence east 306.8 feet, thence south 1284.1 feet, thence west to the railroad right-of-way, thence in a northerly direction along a curvilinear line to the point of beginning from "General Residence District" to "General Business District". It was then moved by Commissioner Rydholm, supported by Commissioner Alholm and unanimously adopted, that the Commission concur with the recommendation of the Planning Board and consider the rezoning of the above described parcel of land and that a public hearing on this change be held before the City Commission on December 29, 1958 at 7:00

o'clock p. m. and that notice be given by publication in the Mining Journal, a daily newspaper published in this City prior to said hearing.

Moved by Commissioner Alholm, supported by Commissioner Rydholm and unanimously adopted, that the reading of the minutes of the previous meeting be omitted.

A petition signed by four property owners in the vicinity of East Park Street and Lakeshore Boulevard was read wherein they requested the vacation of Park Street lying between the Easterly right-of-way of the L. S. & I. Railroad tracks and the Westerly line of Lakeshore Boulevard. It was moved by Commissioner Hammerschmidt, supported by Commissioner Alholm and unanimously adopted, that this petition be referred to the City Manager for a study and report.

A communication from City Manager George T. Meholick was read wherein he recommends the transfer of funds from the Electric Utility Surplus Fund to the General Fund for city purposes in accordance with Ordinance No. 186. Mr. Meholick also recommends that certain funds be transferred in accordance with Ordinance No. 165 from the receiving fund of the Water Supply and Sewage Disposal Department.
