JANUARY 12, 1959

A regular meeting of the Marquette City Commission was duly called and held in the Commission Chambers at the City Hall Monday, January 12, 1959 at 7:00 o'clock P. M.

Present: Mayor Bur, Commissioners Alholm, Hammerschmidt, Rydholm and Smith.

Moved by Commissioner Hammerschmidt, supported by Commissioner Smith and unanimously adopted, that the reading of the corrected minutes of the previous meetings be omitted.

A communication from James A. Smith, Chairman, Future Nurses Club of Graveraet High School, was read wherein that Organization requested permission to conduct their annual Blue Crutch Sale. It was moved by Commissioner Rydholm, supported by Commissioner Alholm and unanimously adopted, that the request of the Future Nurses Club of Graveraet High School to conduct their annual Blue Crutch Sale on January 23, 1959 be granted.

A report from City Manager George T. Meholick was read wherein he informed the Commission of the close of a ninety (90) day trial period for certain traffic control measures throughout the City. It was moved by Commissioner Alholm, supported by Commissioner Smith and unanimously adopted, that the following traffic control measure be made permanent:

"No Parking" signs on the north side of East Ohio Street between Front and High Streets.

"Yield Right of Way" sign at the intersection of Lincoln Avenue and Wright Street to be placed on Lincoln Avenue.

"Yield Right of Way" signs at the east and west intersection of the following streets where they intersect with Lincoln Avenue:

Jefferson Street, west side; Sherman Street, west side; Cleveland Avenue, west side; Magnetic Street, east side; College Avenue, east and west sides; Kaye Avenue, east side; Fair Avenue, east and

west sides; Waldo Street, east and west sides.

The installation of "Two Hour Parking" signs on Third Street between Arch Street and Michigan Street.

A communication from Steve Johnson, Chairman, Marquette City Planning Board, was read wherein that Board recommends to the City Commission the rezoning of the north 150' of Lots 182 and 183 in Hewitts Addition from "General Residence District" to "General Business District." It was moved by Commissioner Hammerschmidt, supported by Commissioner Alholm and unanimously adopted, that upon recommendation of the Marquette City Planning Board, the City Commission consider the rezoning of this area and set the date of January 28, 1959 as the day for a public hearing on this matter; and that the Clerk give legal notice of this public hearing date.

Moved by Commissioner Alholm, supported by Commissioner Rydholm, that the following resolution be, and the same is hereby unanimously adopted:

RESOLVED, That the following places be designated as polling places in the respective precincts for the Biennial Spring Primary Election to be held in the City of Marquette, Michigan on Monday, February 16, 1959, and for the Biennial Spring Election to be held in the City of Marquette, Michigan, on Monday, April 6, 1959; the polls to be open on said days from 7:00 o'clock a. m. until 8:00 o'clock p. m. Eastern Standard Time:

Precinct 3—Bishop Baraga High School
Precinct 4—City Hall
Precinct 5—City Hall

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Mayor Bur announced that this was the time set for consideration of the adoption of the PROPOSED EMPLOYMENT CODE ORDINANCE. Following considerable discussion on this matter, it was moved by Commissioner Hammer-schmidt, supported by Commissioner Rydholm and unanimously adopted, that the PROPOSED EMPLOYMENT CODE ORDINANCE as read and published, be amended in several particulars, the full text of such amendments being on file in the offices of the City Clerk, City Manager, and the City Accountant for inspection by and distribution to the public. It was moved by Commissioner Rydholm, supported by Commissioner Smith and unanimously adopted, that the consideration of the adoption of the PROPOSED EMPLOYMENT CODE ORDINANCE, as amended, be adjourned to the next regular meeting of the City Commission, to afford further study of same, and that a public hearing be held thereon as to such amendments at such time.

City Manager George T. Meholick read his report to the Commission regarding the highlights of the meeting of the Board of Trustees of the Michigan Municipal League held at Ann Arbor, Michigan, January 9, 1959. Mayor Bur commended Mr. Meholick on his fine report on this meeting and asked that Mr. Meholick keep the Commission posted as to new developments regarding the proposed state income tax.

Two members of the Non-Commissioned Officers Club of Company "B," Michigan National Guard, were present and asked permission to address the Commission. Mayor Bur granted the request whereupon Sergeant Carl Malmgren introduced himself and Sergeant Richard Caron, and announced that tentative plans are being formulated for a Fourth of July Celebration. Following several comments on this matter, Mayor Bur informed these gentlemen that the National Guard has the tentative approval of the Commission to continue their plan as stated.

It was then moved by Commis-

sioner Alholm, supported by Commissioner Smith and unanimously adopted, that the next regular meeting of the City Commission be held Wednesday, January 28, 1959 at 7:00 o'clock p. m.

A special meeting of the Marquette City Commission was duly called and held at the City Hall, Wednesday, January 21, 1959 at 4:00 o'clock P. M.

Present: Mayor Bur, Commissioners Alholm, Hammerschmidt, Rydholm and Smith.

Mayor Bur announced the purpose of this meeting was to discuss the change of meeting date and other legal matters before the City Commission at the present time.

Following a lengthy discussion regarding the matter of the suit of Toupin vs. City of Marquette, it was moved by Commissioner Hammerschmidt, supported by Commissioner Smith and unanimously adopted, that in accordance with Section 4.11 (b) of the Charter, the City Attorney is requested and directed to appear and defend the suit of Amiel J. Toupin and wife

vs. the City of Marquette in the Circuit Court for Marquette County, and that in accordance with Section 4.12 of the Charter, it is agreed that the City Attorney shall be paid special compensation for such services consistent with the Bar Association rates for services rendered, and that the sum of Two Hundred (\$200) Dollars is hereby budgeted to cover such compensation and other costs and expenses of the defense, subject to adjustment in the event same shall be more than that sum; and further that the City Attorney explore the possibility of commencing action against Amiel J. Toupin and wife for malicious, vexatious or unfounded prosecution arising because of such suit against the City.

OFFICIAL PROCEEDINGS OF THE CITY COMMISSION

JANUARY 28, 1959

A regular meeting of the Marquette City Commission was duly called and held at the City Hall, Wednesday, January 28, 1959 at 7:00 o'clock P.M.

Present: Mayor Bur, Commissioners Alholm, Hammerschmidt, Rydholm and Smith.

Moved by Commissioner Rydholm, supported by Commissioner Smith and unanimously adopted, that the reading of the minutes of the previous meetings be omitted.

The Clerk announced that this was the time set for consideration for adoption of an Ordinance as amended, known as the Employment Code, the title of which is as follows: AN ORDINANCE TO PROVIDE FOR A MERIT SYSTEM OF PERSONNEL MANAGEMENT WHICH PROVIDES FOR AN EMPLOYMENT CODE THAT INCLUDES AMONG OTHER ITEMS, SENIORITY RIGHTS, HOURS OF EMPLOYMENT, CLASSIFICATION PLAN, OVERTIME, WAGE ADJUSTMENTS, GRIEVANCE AND APPEAL PROCEDURES, SICK LEAVE, VACATION TIME, HOLIDAYS, LEAVES OF ABSENCE, AND ACTIVITIES INCOMPATIBLE WITH CITY EMPLOYMENT. Following considerable discussion regarding certain sections of the Employment Code, it was moved by Commissioner Hammerschmidt that Sections 10.1 and 10.2 of the Code be amended. This motion was lost for lack of support. It was then moved by Commissioner Rydholm, supported by Commissioner Smith and adopted, that the Employment Code Ordinance as amended be adopted. Yeas: Mayor Bur, Commissioner Alholm, Commissioner Rydholm, Commissioner Smith. Nays: Commissioner Hammerschmidt.

Mayor Bur announced that this was the date set for a public hearing on the request for rezoning of the north 150' of Lots 182

and 183 in Hewitt's Addition south and west of the L.S.&I. Railroad right-of-way. A petition signed by eighty-eight (88) residents affected by this change of zoning was read in protest to this change. After the hearing was declared open, interested citizens in attendance addressed the Commission regarding the effect of rezoning in this neighborhood. After all interested citizens in attendance were heard, Mayor Bur declared the public hearing closed. It was then moved by Commissioner Smith, supported by Commissioner Hammerschmidt and unanimously adopted, that this request for rezoning be denied.

It was moved by Commissioner Hammerschmidt, supported by Commissioner Alholm and unanimously adopted, that the City enter into a lease agreement with Mt. Marquette Incorporated for the leasing of certain City owned property as follows:

1. The south one half (S $\frac{1}{2}$) of the southeast quarter (SE $\frac{1}{4}$) of the northeast quarter (NE $\frac{1}{4}$) of Section 34, in T48N, R25W; and
2. The south one half (S $\frac{1}{2}$) of the southwest quarter (SW $\frac{1}{4}$) of the northwest quarter (NW $\frac{1}{4}$) of Section 35, in T48N, R25W.

and that the Mayor and City Clerk be authorized to sign said lease agreement in behalf of the City of Marquette.

FEBRUARY 3, 1959

A special meeting of the Marquette City Commission was duly called and held at the City Hall Tuesday, February 3, 1959 at 4:30 o'clock p. m.

Present: Mayor Bur, Commissioners Alholm, Hammerschmidt, Rydholm and Smith.

Mayor Bur opened the meeting by proclaiming February 7th. to 13th, "Boy Scout Week" urging all citizenry to observe this week in honor of our scouts. The scouts, representing the various troops throughout the City, proceeded to present the Mayor and City Commissioners with scout pins requesting same to be worn during "Boy Scout Week." The Commission unanimously agreed that adults affiliated with scouting should be commended for their fine work and their time and efforts spent in scouting.

A communication from City Manager George T. Meholick was read wherein he informed the Commission of certain traffic control measures being established by the State Highway Department, namely: US-41, M-28 is being designated a four-lane undivided highway between Fisher and Hampton Streets in the City of Marquette and that this area be designated as a "No Parking" area. It was then moved by Commissioner Alholm, supported by Commissioner Rydholm and unanimously adopted, that the City of Marquette, Michigan is in favor of the proposed traffic control order of the Michigan State Highway Department classifying US-41, M-28 a four-lane undivided highway between Fisher Street and Hampton Street in the City of Marquette and that this area be classified as a "No Parking" area to be enforced by the City of Marquette.

A communication from City Manager George T. Meholick was read wherein he informs the Commission that bids received on the firemen uniforms do not comply with the specifications as stated in the

bid notice and recommends that all bids received be rejected and that new bids be called for in order that all bidders might then bid on a new style and quality of material. It was then moved by Commissioner Hammerschmidt, supported by Commissioner Smith and unanimously adopted, that upon recommendation of the City Manager, all bids received on firemen uniforms be rejected.

A communication from Steve Johnson, Chairman, Marquette City Planning Board, was read wherein that Board recommends that the City Commission accept the final plat plan of Lakeview Heights Subdivision as presented. Moved by Commissioner Hammerschmidt, supported by Commissioner Rydholm and unanimously adopted, that upon recommendation of the Marquette City Planning Board, the final plat plan of Lakeview Heights Subdivision be accepted as presented and that a performance bond be posted by the subdivider in a sufficient amount to cover the cost of the unfinished street surfacing as required by ordinance.

Mayor Bur requested and directed the Clerk to read a resolution regarding the attitude of the City toward further action to be taken by the Water Resources Commission regarding industrial waste effluent of the Cliffs Dow Chemical Company. Moved by Commissioner Rydholm, supported by Commissioner Smith, that the following resolution be adopted:

WHEREAS, on May 23, 1957 at a meeting of the Water Resources Commission held in Traverse City, Michigan a trial testing period was arranged whereby the City of Marquette would treat the industrial wastes of the Cliffs Dow Chemical Company, and

WHEREAS, if this arrangement was not satisfactory the Water Resources Commission would then be so informed and look at the facts of the situation as they developed and

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determine what further action would be taken, and

WHEREAS, this trial testing period has ended and has not proven to be a satisfactory method of treatment of the industrial wastes of the Cliffs Dow Chemical Company, and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Public Acts of 1949 — No. 117, as amended, the City of Marquette is desirous of seeing that a satisfactory solution for all concerned is had,

take any further action necessary to determine an adequate method of treatment of the industrial waste effluents of the Cliffs Dow Chemical Company in order to safeguard the city's water supply against any taste or odor producing substances discharged by the Cliffs Dow Chemical Company into Lake Superior.

A special meeting of the Marquette City Commission was duly called and held at the City Hall, Monday, February 16, 1959 at 4:30 o'clock P.M.

Present: Mayor Bur, Commissioners Alholm, Hammerschmidt, Rydholm and Smith.

Mayor Bur announced the purpose of this meeting is to adopt necessary resolutions to place the Water Improvement and Expansion Program before the people at the Biennial Spring Election and to attend to unfinished business.

The following preamble and resolution was offered by Commissioner Alholm, and supported by Commissioner Rydholm:

WHEREAS, the City Commission deems it necessary for the public welfare of said City to expand and improve the water supply and sewage disposal distribution system of the City of Marquette by providing a ground level elevated storage tank, improvements in the water distribution system and water works pumping station;

AND WHEREAS, plans and specifications for said capital improvements have been prepared by McNamee, Porter and Seeley, Consulting Engineers of the City of Ann Arbor, Michigan, who have estimated the cost thereof at not exceeding Four Hundred Fifty Thousand (\$450,000.00) dollars;

AND WHEREAS, it will be necessary to borrow the sum of not to exceed Four Hundred Fifty Thousand (\$450,000.00) dollars to pay for the costs of said capital improvement and to issue bonds of the City therefor;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT:

1. The City Commission deems it necessary to borrow the sum of not to exceed Four Hundred Fifty Thousand (\$450,000.00) dollars, and issue General Obliga-

tion Bonds of the City pledging the full faith and credit of the City therefor, for the purpose of paying the cost of expanding and improving the water supply and sewage disposal distribution system of the City of Marquette by providing a ground level elevated storage tank, improvements in the water distribution system, and water works pumping station;

2. The report on said capital improvements as prepared by McNamee, Porter and Seeley of the City of Ann Arbor are hereby approved and ordered filed with the City Clerk for public examination;

3. The City Commission determines the period of usefulness of said capital improvements to be not less than thirty years;

4. There be submitted to the electors of the City at the Biennial Spring Election to be held in the said City on Monday, April 6, 1959, between the hours of 7:00 A.M. and 8:00 P.M. EST, the following proposition:

"Shall the City of Marquette, Michigan, borrow the sum, not to exceed Four Hundred Fifty Thousand (\$450,000.00) dollars and issue General Obligation Bonds of the City pledging the full faith and credit of the City therefor, for the purpose of paying the cost of expanding and improving the water supply and sewage disposal distribution system of the City of Marquette by providing a ground level elevated storage tank, improvements in the distribution system and water works pumping station?"

5. Said proposition shall be stated on a separate ballot in substantially the form set forth in the preceding paragraph;

6. The City Clerk shall cause notice of the submission of said special proposition to be published and posted as part of the election notice of the said Biennial Spring Election in manner required by law;

7. The notice of the submission of said special proposition to be included in the notice of election shall be in substantially the following form:

"TO THE QUALIFIED ELECTORS OF THE CITY OF MARQUETTE:

"PLEASE TAKE NOTICE that at the Biennial Spring Election to be held in the City of Marquette, County of Marquette, Michigan, on Monday, the 6th. day of April, 1959, from 7:00 o'clock A.M. to 8:00 o'clock P.M., Eastern Standard Time, the following proposition will be submitted to the electors of the City;

the City Commission signed by C. E. Weeson and Dale J. Lundeen was read wherein they requested that a spokesmen representing a group of citizens in the College Heights Area be given the privilege of addressing the Commission. Mayor Bur asked that Mr. Weesen have his spokesmen address the Commission. Whereupon Mr. K. A. Wahtera addressed the Commission regarding an air pollution situation in the area of College Heights. Mr. Wahtera also recommends that a change be made in the membership of the Air Pollution Committee. He also recommends that this Committee investigate and not wait for formal complaints to be filed. One other request was that Mr. John McKichan of the Michigan Department of Health be made a member on this Committee, and not to act as an Ex-officio member to the Committee. Mr. Michael DeFant, a resident of this area, also addressed the Commission regarding this situation. In his address Mr. DeFant pointed out three major questions that this group of citizens are vitally interested in: 1. Where does this dirt come from? 2. Can this dirt be stopped? 3. What will it cost?

Mrs. Peter Martel submitted a sample of this dirt as it collects in and about her home.

Mayor Bur advised these people present that he is requesting a detailed report on this matter from the Air Pollution Committee.

Mayor Bur read a communication from N. G. DaMoose, City Manager, Traverse City, Michigan, wherein Mr. DaMoose cites the amount of water being diverted from Lake Michigan at Chicago and gives great detail on other effects this will have on the level of Lake Michigan. Following the reading of this letter Commissioner Rydholm informed the Commission that the level of that Lake would only be lowered a difference of $\frac{5}{8}$ inch and that it will lower the surface no further. Commissioner Hammer-schmidt reminded the Commission that as a Governing Body they are on record as having been opposed to this water diversion. Commissioner Rydholm stated that if the

Lake Michigan level could be lowered through water diversion it would mean a great saving of property along the shores of that Lake.

MARCH 16, 1959

A special meeting of the Marquette City Commission was duly called and held at the City Hall, Monday, March 16, 1959 at 4:30 o'clock p. m.

Present: Mayor Bur, Commissioners Alholm, Hammerschmidt, Rydholm and Smith. George C. Quinnell, Attorney in behalf of the Chamber of Commerce and interested Chamber of Commerce officials.

Mayor Bur announced the purpose of this meeting was to discuss the Water Expansion Program and other pending business.

Mayor Bur then directed the City Attorney to read a proposed lease agreement between the Chamber of Commerce and the City of Marquette. Following the reading of this lease, Mr. George C. Quinnell, Attorney for the Chamber of Commerce, addressed the Commission regarding the wording of the forementioned lease. After a round table discussion on this matter, it was unanimously agreed that the City Attorney Waldo McCrea and Attorney George C. Quinnell be excused from the meeting to rewrite certain sections of the forementioned agreement. Mayor Bur then directed that the meeting continue.

A communication from Russell Robertson, Commander, Richard M. Jopling Post No. 44, The American Legion, was read wherein he requested permission for that Organization to sell poppies in the City of Marquette on Friday and Saturday, May 22 and 23, 1959. It was moved by Commissioner Alholm, supported by Commissioner Smith and unanimously adopted, that permission as requested be granted.

Mayor Bur asked City Manager George T. Meholick if he wished to

At this point in the meeting, City Attorney Waldo A. McCrea and Attorney George C. Quinnell returned to the meeting. APRIL 7, 1959

A special meeting of the Marquette City Commission was duly called and held at the City Hall, Tuesday, April 7, 1959 at 7:00 o'clock P. M.

Present: Mayor Bur, Commissioners Alholm, Hammerschmidt, Rydholm and Smith. Members of the Marquette City Air Pollution Committee. Also in attendance were interested citizens of the West College Area.

Mayor Bur announced the purpose of the meeting was to hold an informal discussion with the Air Pollution Committee present, on the matter of alleged air pollution in the West College Avenue Area. A round table discussion followed regarding various meetings held on this matter. The several residents of that area interested in this matter expressed their viewpoints regarding the progress towards the solution of this problem.

Mayor Bur announced that he would like to see the Air Pollution Committee continue its study on the complaint and try to resolve some of the problems involved. It was suggested that a smoke ordinance might be an answer to the air pollution problem of the City. City Attorney Waldo McCrea commented that cities having smoke ordinances have experienced difficulty in enforcement due to the lack of definite proof of the exact source of the pollution, and the latitude afforded in such ordinances for smoke or dust content in the air for allowable periods of time. He called attention to the nuisance ordinance which protects the public against conduct which may be detrimental to the public comfort, health and safety, which in a general way would apply to air pollution. Commissioner Rydholm suggested that it might be well to study the community as a whole in the matter of smoke, soot and other air pollution problems.

Acting Chairman Allen Olson was asked to what point the complaint made had progressed with the committee, and he stated that the complaint was now at Step 5 in the outline of procedure of the Air Pollution Committee. Commissioner Smith stated that he felt that if the Citizens Committee would meet with the Air Pollution Committee and complete the nine steps of procedure as outlined, this problem could be solved and that in utilizing the nuisance ordinance it would be possible to reduce a considerable amount of pollution throughout the city.

Mayor Bur then asked Acting Chairman Olson to continue the study of the complaint. Mr. Olson said that the Air Pollution Committee would be glad to continue this study with the assistance of the City Manager and the City Attorney and a committee of residents representing the northwest area of the City of Marquette. Mayor Bur then asked a spokesman for the Citizens Committee to inform the Chairman of the Air Pollution Committee who would represent the citizens at the forthcoming meeting with the Air Pollution Committee. It was then moved by Commissioner Rydholm, supported by Commissioner Hammerschmidt and unanimously adopted, that the Air Pollution Committee continue with the step-by-step procedure in handling a complaint of this nature. It was mutually agreed that the Citizens Committee and the Air Pollution Committee would meet in the very near future, date and time of meeting to depend upon the convenience of both groups.

Following considerable round table discussions, the meeting was adjourned.

Moved by Commissioner Alholm, supported by Commissioner Smith, that the following resolution be, and the same is hereby unanimously adopted:

WHEREAS, A petition has been received and filed requesting the following improvement: The installation of curbing and street lights on Pine Street from Kaye Avenue to Fair Avenue in the City of Marquette;

RESOLVED, That the City Manager is directed to prepare plans, specifications and estimate of costs of such improvement, and attach thereto his recommendation as to the proportion of the costs to be paid by special assessment and of the proportion, if any, to be paid as the general obligation of the City; the number of installments for payment; the interest rate thereon; and the land to be included in the special assessment district;

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the City Manager file same with the City Clerk who shall make same available for public examination;

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the City Clerk shall fix a day for a public hearing on the determination of the necessity for such improvement by the City Commission, and shall cause notice of the time and place of same to be published once in the official newspaper of the City not less than 10 days prior to such date of hearing, such notice to state also that the

report of the City Manager, and the plans, specifications and estimate of costs, are on file in his office for public examination, and that he shall also serve a like notice upon each owner of property subject to assessments for such improvement, by United States Mail, at least 10 days prior to such hearing; and that he shall further make proof of such publication and service by affidavit.

The Clerk read a communication from Ellwood Mattson, President, Marquette Chamber of Commerce, requesting an amendment of the lease agreement between the City of Marquette and the Chamber of Commerce of Marquette changing the description of the parcel leased to another parcel adjacent thereto. Upon direction of the Mayor, the Clerk then read a petition signed by 78 citizens of the City protesting such amendment. Mayor Rydholm then referred to Section 12.3 of the City Charter relating to the right of referendum by the electorate of the granting of an amendment lease by the City. Interested citizens and officials of the Chamber of Commerce were then heard and presented their views for and against the proposition. It was then moved by Commissioner Hammerschmidt, and supported by Commissioner Alholm, that the lease heretofore authorized between the City of Marquette, Michigan and the Chamber of Commerce of Marquette for a building site in Lakeside Park be amended to change the description to read as follows: "Commencing at the intersection of the east side of Front Street and the south side of Fisher Street produced, thence north along the east side of Front Street 173 feet, thence east at right angles 45 feet to southwest corner of parcel of land which will be point of beginning. Beginning at above described SW corner, thence northerly 95 feet parallel to Front Street, thence easterly at right angles 50 feet, thence southerly at right angles 95 feet, thence

westerly at right angles to point of beginning."

A communication from John H. Huss, Director, Michigan Municipal League, was read wherein he informs the Commission of the date and place of the Annual Upper Peninsula Meeting. Following a short discussion, this communication was ordered received and placed on file.

A communication from Steve Johnson, Chairman, Marquette City Planning Board, was read wherein he recommends that the City Commission accept the final plat plan of Woodland Terrace Subdivision as presented. It was moved by Commissioner Smith, supported by Commissioner Bur and unanimously adopted, that upon recommendation of the Marquette City Planning Board, this Commission accept the final plat plan of Woodland Terrace Subdivision as presented.

Mayor Rydholm then announced that this was the date set for a public hearing on the vacation of the Park Area between West Kaye Avenue and West Fair Avenue in the City of Marquette. Mayor Rydholm then declared the public hearing open. Following a short discussion on this matter, Mayor Rydholm then declared the public hearing closed. It was moved by Commissioner Bur, supported by Commissioner Alholm, that the following resolution be, and the same is hereby unanimously adopted:

WHEREAS, it appears by affidavit on file with the City Clerk that notice has been published, that the commission would meet at the City Hall on Monday, April 27, 1959 at 7:00 o'clock p.m. pursuant to the resolution of the commission relative to the vacation of the Park Area between West Kaye Avenue and West Fair Avenue in Spear's Subdivision No. 1, adopted April 13, 1959, which

notice contained a copy of said resolution; and

WHEREAS, opportunity has been given all persons to be heard thereon, and no objection to the vacation of said Park Area had been made, and due consideration having been had by the commission;

RESOLVED, That the Park Area between West Kaye Avenue and West Fair Avenue in Spear's Subdivision No. 1, in said City of Marquette, be and the same is hereby vacated, but subject to a right to an easement therein by the City of Marquette for public utility purposes.

The Clerk then read a sublease agreement between the Veterans' Council and the Visiting Nurse's Association. It was moved by Commissioner Hammerschmidt, supported by Commissioner Smith and unanimously adopted, that the City Commission approve the proposed sublease of a portion of the Veterans' Building by the Veterans' Council to the Visiting Nurse's Association of Marquette, Michigan, and that the Mayor and City Clerk be authorized to sign such approval on the proposed sublease.

The Clerk then read a sublease agreement between the Marquette Veterans' Council and the Family Service Society of Marquette, Michigan. It was then moved by Commissioner Bur, supported by Commissioner Hammerschmidt and unanimously adopted, that the City Commission approve the proposed sublease of a portion of the Veteran's Building by the Veterans' Council to the Family Service Society of Marquette, Michigan, and that the Mayor and City Clerk be authorized to sign such approval on the proposed sublease.
