

OFFICIAL PROCEEDINGS OF THE CITY COMMISSION

September 14, 1959

A regular meeting of the Marquette City Commission was duly called and held in the Commission Chambers at the City Hall Monday, September 14, 1959 at 7:00 p. m.

Present: Mayor Rydholm, Commissioners Alholm, Bur, Hammerschmidt and Smith.

Moved by Commissioner Bur, supported by Commissioner Smith and unanimously adopted that the reading of the minutes of the previous meetings be waived.

A petition signed by fourteen property owners on Tracy Avenue was read wherein they requested the paving of that avenue from Center Street to Wright Street. It was moved by Commissioner Hammerschmidt, supported by Commissioner Smith and unanimously adopted that this petition be referred to the City Manager and the City Engineer for study and report.

A petition signed by two residents on East Furnace Street was read wherein they requested maintenance work be done in that area to prevent silt from washing down on the street. Mayor Rydholm ordered this petition referred to the City Manager for action.

A communication from Clyde W. Hecox, Fund Raising Chairman, Kiwanis Club of Marquette, was read wherein he requested permission for that organization to sell peanuts on the streets of Marquette on Friday, September 25 and Saturday, September 26, 1959. It was moved by Commissioner Alholm, supported by Commissioner Bur and unanimously adopted that permission as requested be granted.

A communication from Walter M. Noack, Director of Enforcement, Liquor Control Commission, was read wherein he notifies the Commission of a request for a transfer of a 1959 SDM license from The Spot, Inc. located at 129 East Hewitt Avenue to Mary A. Johnson. It was then moved by Commissioner Hammerschmidt, supported by

Commissioner Alholm and unanimously adopted that this request be granted.

On motion of Commissioner Bur, supported by Commissioner Alholm, the following resolution be and the same is hereby unanimously adopted,

Upon the recommendation of City Manager, George T. Meholick, and Chief of Police, G. Donald McCormick, that the certificate of the medical advisor of the City of Marquette, signed by Dr. Beatrice Bolan, City Health Officer, and the application for retirement because of permanent disability requested by Humphrey Owens, be approved and that the Michigan Municipal Employees' Retirement System be so notified.

A report from City Manager, George T. Meholick, was read wherein he informs the City Commission that the property owners on the south side of Ohio Street between Oak and Sixth Streets have indicated that they will install the sidewalk and curbing on their street without the assistance of a Special Assessment Roll. The Commission expressed their gratitude that citizens of our City would assume these responsibilities in doing this type of improvement. Mayor Rydholm then ordered this report placed on file.

A report from City Manager, George T. Meholick, was read regarding Special Assessment Bond Issue. After the reading of this report and a resolution, it was moved by Commissioner Bur, supported by Commissioner Smith that the following resolution and Notice of Intent to Issue Bonds be and the same are hereby unanimously adopted,

WHEREAS, the City Commission of the City of Marquette, County of Marquette, Michigan, intends to adopt a resolution authorizing issuance and sale of not to exceed One Hundred-Ten Thousand Dollars (\$110,000.00) for paving and curbing

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special assessment bonds; One-Hundred-Thirty-Five Thousand Dollars (\$135,000.00) for sanitary sewer special assessment bonds; and Thirty Thousand Dollars (\$30,000.00) for water special assessment bonds;

AND WHEREAS, it is necessary to publish a notice of intent to issue bonds in order to comply with the requirement of Section 5 (g), Act 279, Public Acts of Michigan, 1909, as amended:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT:

1. The City Clerk shall cause a notice of intent to issue bonds to be published in The Mining Journal, Marquette, Michigan, which said notice of intent shall be in substantially the following form:

Said bonds shall be payable from special assessments and will also pledge the full faith and credit of the City of Marquette.

A report from the City Manager, George T. Meholick, regarding Kildahl's Subdivision No. 4 was had. Moved by Commissioner Hamerschmidt, supported by Commissioner Bur, that the following resolution be, and the same is hereby unanimously adopted:

The installation of water main on West Avenue from Mildred Avenue south to Elm Avenue then west on Elm Avenue to Grey Street then north on Grey Street to Mildred Avenue, in the City of Marquette.

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the City Manager file same with the City Clerk who shall make same available for public examination;

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the City Clerk shall fix a day for a public hearing on the determination of the necessity for such improvement by the City Commission, and shall cause notice of the time and place of same to be published once in the official newspaper of the City not less than 10 days prior to such date of hearing, such notice to state also that the report of the City Manager, and the plans, specifications and estimate of costs, are on file in his office for public examination, and that he shall also serve a like notice upon each owner of property subject to assessments for such improvement, by United States Mail, at least 10 days prior to such hearing; and that he shall further make proof of such publication and service by affidavit.

OFFICIAL PROCEEDINGS OF THE CITY COMMISSION

September 21, 1959

A special meeting of the Marquette City Commission was duly called and held in the Commission Chambers at the City Hall Monday, September 21, 1959 at 8:00 o'clock P. M.

Present: Mayor Pro-Tem Smith, Commissioners Bur and Hammerschmidt.

Absent: Mayor Rydholm and Commissioner Alholm.

The following written statement by Commissioner Alholm was read:

"I hereby waive notice of special meeting of the City Commission of the City of Marquette to be held Monday, September 21, 1959 and hereby consent and hereby affirm the action to be taken at said meeting. I am unable to be present at said meeting. Signed, Commissioner Alholm."

Mayor Pro-Tem Smith called the meeting to order and announced that the purpose of this meeting was to accept and consider bids for the \$450,000.00 Bond Issue for the General Obligation Water System Bonds.

At this time, Mayor Rydholm

entered and was seated and indicated that Mayor Pro-Tem Smith should continue to preside.

Mr. Julius Pochelon of Kenower, MacArthur & Company, Financial Advisors, proceeded to open the bids with the assistance of the City Clerk. Following the opening and the tabulation of the various bids, it was noted that eight bids were received representing nineteen firms plus two of the Chicago banks. Mr. Pochelon pointed out that this was a considerable number of bidders in view of the present market.

The following preamble and resolution was offered by Commissioner Hammerschmidt and supported by Mayor Rydholm:

WHEREAS, September 21, 1959, at 8:00 o'clock p.m., Eastern Standard Time, has been set for the date of opening bids for the purchase of \$450,000.00 General Obligation Water System Bonds of the City of Marquette, County of Marquette, Michigan;

AND WHEREAS, said bids have been publicly opened and read;

AND WHEREAS, the following bids have been received:

A regular meeting of the Marquette City Commission was duly called and held in the Commission Chambers at the City Hall Monday, September 28, 1959 at 7:00 P. M.

Present: Mayor Rydholm, Commissioners Alholm, Bur, Hammerschmidt and Smith.

Moved by Commissioner Bur, supported by Commissioner Smith and unanimously adopted that the reading of the minutes of the previous meetings be waived.

A petition signed by three property owners on Norwood Street was read wherein they request the paving of the 700 block of that street (Wilkinson Avenue to Van-Evera Avenue). It was moved by Commissioner Alholm, supported by Commissioner Bur and unanimously adopted that this petition be referred to the City Manager for study and report.

Moved by Commissioner Hammerschmidt, supported by Commissioner Alholm, that the following resolution be and the same is hereby unanimously adopted,

WHEREAS, A petition has been received and filed requesting the following improvement: The installation of paving on East Newberry Street in the City of Marquette.

RESOLVED, That the City Manager is directed to prepare plans, specifications and estimate of costs of such improvement, and attach thereto his recommendation as to the proportion of the costs to be paid by special assessment and of the proportion, if any, to be paid as the general obligation of the City; the number of installments for payment; the interest rate thereon; and the land to be included in the special assessment district;

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the City Manager file same with the City Clerk who shall make

same available for public examination;

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the City Clerk shall fix a day for a public hearing on the determination of the necessity for such improvement by the City Commission, and shall cause notice of the time and place of same to be published once in the official newspaper of the City not less than 10 days prior to such date of hearing, such notice to state also that the report of the City Manager, and the plans, specifications and estimate of costs, are on file in his office for public examination, and that he shall also serve a like notice upon each owner of property subject to assessments for such improvement, by United States Mail, at least 10 days prior to such hearing; and that he shall further make proof of such publication and service by affidavit.

A report from City Manager, George T. Meholick, was read wherein he tabulates bids received for the construction of sanitary sewers and water mains. Mr. Meholick also made recommendations as to the awarding of the contracts for the various sections of this project. It was moved by Commissioner Smith, supported by Commissioner Hammerschmidt and unanimously adopted that the City Commission award Section A (Northwest Interceptor Sanitary Sewer) Contract to the L. W. Brumm Company, Marquette, Michigan, in sum of \$85,968.85, contingent upon the sale of the Special Assessment Bonds. It was then moved by Commissioner Hammerschmidt, supported by Commissioner Smith and unanimously adopted that the Commission award Section B (Neidhart, Wetton, Union Sanitary Sewer) Contract to the L. W. Brumm Company, in the sum of \$20,581.90, contingent upon the sale of the Special Assessment Bonds.

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It was then moved by Commissioner Smith, supported by Commissioner Bur and unanimously adopted that the City Commission award the contract for Section C (Water Main) in Kildahl's Subdivision No. 4) to Don Britton, Marquette, Michigan, in the sum of \$1,115.70, contingent upon the sale of the Special Assessment Bonds.

A report from City Manager, George T. Meholick, was read wherein he tabulated bids received for a loader and sweeper to be used on the International Tractor in the Parks Department. It was moved by Commissioner Bur, supported by Commissioner Alholm and unanimously adopted that upon recommendation of the City Manager, George T. Meholick, the low bid of Champion Inc., Iron Mountain, Michigan, in the sum of \$2,054.20 be accepted for 1—Wagner Loader, Model 200 and one 72" palmyra brush complete with hydraulic controls, this equipment to be completely installed on the City's International Tractor, Serial No. 16345 and this equipment to be guaranteed by the International Harvester Company and its Distributor.

A communication from Steve Johnson, Chairman, Marquette City Planning Board, was read wherein that Board recommends the acceptance of the final plat plan of Harlow's Subdivision No. 7. Following an examination of the final plat plan, it was moved by Commissioner Hammerschmidt, supported by Commissioner Bur and unanimously adopted that upon recommendation of the Planning Board, the Commission accept the final plat plan of Harlow's Subdivision No. 7 as presented.

A communication from Steve Johnson, Chairman, Marquette City Planning Board, was read wherein that Board recommends to the City Commission the acceptance of certain parcels of land to be used for street purposes. It was then moved by Commissioner

Alholm, supported by Commissioner Bur and unanimously adopted that upon recommendation of the Marquette City Planning Board, the City Commission accept the dedication of the following property for street purposes:

(1) A strip of land sixty-six (66) feet wide and four hundred seventeen (417) feet long to become a part of McClellan Avenue.

(2) A strip of land forty and four-tenths (40.4) feet wide and five hundred seventy (570) feet long to become a part of McClellan Avenue.

(3) A strip of land sixty-six (66) feet wide and one hundred seventy-nine and six-tenths (179.6) feet long to extend Kildahl Avenue to McClellan Avenue.

(4) A strip of land sixty six (66) feet wide by one hundred seventy-nine and six tenths (179.6) feet long to extend Mildred Avenue to McClellan Avenue.

The dedication of the foregoing parcels of land was accepted with the following proviso: "Provided that if any party who owns the abutting property ever attempts to subdivide, then the streets must conform to the Plat Law at the expense of the subdivider."

A communication from Steve Johnson, Chairman, Marquette City Planning Board, was read wherein that Board unanimously recommends the vacation of Fair Avenue between Seventh and Eighth Streets. Moved by Commissioner Bur, supported by Commissioner Hammerschmidt and unanimously adopted that upon recommendation of the Marquette City Planning Board, the City Clerk be directed to take the necessary steps in the procedure of vacating a portion of Fair Avenue between Seventh Street and Eighth Street in the City of Marquette.

Moved by Commissioner Bur, supported by Commissioner Alholm that the following resolution

WHEREAS, It appears by the affidavit of the City Clerk that due publication has been made of notice, as required by the City Charter, that it is the intention of the City Commission to make certain improvements, and to determine the necessity of such improvements as follows: The installation of water main on West Avenue from Mildred Avenue south to Elm Avenue then West on Elm Avenue to Grey St. then north on Grey St. to Mildred Avenue, in the City of Marquette and appointing this day and time when the City Commission would meet to determine the necessity of such improvement; and

WHEREAS, It appears further by said affidavit that a like notice has been sent by mail to each owner of property subject to assessment therefore; and

WHEREAS, All suggestions and objections made to said improvements have been heard and considered;

RESOLVED, That the City Commission determines that such project and improvements are necessary and proper;

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the proportion of the costs of such improvements which shall be defrayed by special assessment upon the property especially benefited thereby and the proportion to be defrayed as the general obligation of the City, if any, shall be as follows: Property owners, 75%; City, 25%;

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the report of the City Manager, the plans and specifications, and the estimated costs of such improvements, are hereby approved and determined accordingly; that said special assessments may be paid in 5 installments, at the rate of 4 per cent per annum thereon; and that a special assessment district to be assessed therefore is hereby designated as follows:

Kildahl's Subdivision No. 4;
FURTHER RESOLVED, That the City Assessor shall forthwith prepare an assessment roll in accordance with this Resolution.

RESOLVED, That the City Manager is directed to prepare plans, specifications and estimate of costs of such improvement, and attach thereto his recommendation as to the proportion of the costs to be paid by special assessment and of the proportion, if any, to be paid as the general obligation of the City; the number of installments for payment; the interest rate thereon; and the land to be included in the special assessment district;

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the City Manager file same with the City Clerk who shall make same available for public examination;

OFFICIAL PROCEEDINGS OF THE CITY COMMISSION

September 30, 1959

A special meeting of the Marquette City Commission was duly called and held in the Commission Chambers at the City Hall Wednesday, September 30, 1959 at 7:00 p. m.

Present: Mayor Rydholm, Commissioners Bur, Hammerschmidt and Smith.

Absent: Commissioner Alholm.

It was moved by Commissioner Bur, supported by Commissioner Smith and unanimously adopted that the absence of Commissioner Alholm be excused, he being away from the city.

Mayor Rydholm announced that the purpose of the meeting was to hold a hearing on an alleged nuisance at 545 West Spring Street, Marquette, Michigan. Mayor Rydholm then asked if the complaining parties were present, an affirmative answer was received. Mayor Rydholm then asked if the owner or his representative was present. The owner was not present and had no representative present. One of the occupants of the building at 545 West Spring Street was present. Mayor Rydholm then asked that the Clerk read the complaint in full as well as the affidavit of service of said complaint, which included a notice of this hearing including the date and time. The owner not being present, a letter received by the Clerk from the owner was ordered read indicating the reason that the owner could not be present.

At this point in the meeting, a tape recording of the evidence presented regarding the nuisance at 545 West Spring Street was made. Following the tape recording of questions and answers of Doctor Beatrice Bolan, Health Officer, and Frank P. Sciotto, Sanitarian, the Commission, on motion of Commissioner Hammerschmidt, supported by Commissioner Bur, unanimously agreed to recess to consider the problem of this nuisance.

The Commission reconvened and it was moved by Commissioner Bur, supported by Commissioner Hammerschmidt that the following resolution be, and the same is hereby unanimously adopted,

WHEREAS, a complaint has been made of the existence of a nuisance affecting the public health and welfare within the meaning of Section 8.1 of Chapter 44, Title VIII, Police Regulations, of the Marquette City Code at the following described premises:

Lot No. 48, of Harlow Addition No. 5 of the City of Marquette, Michigan; 545 West Spring Street

"Owned by George Yshinski and occupied by Mr. and Mrs. Harvey Rabitailli and Mr. John Yshemiskey."

AND WHEREAS, After the service of due notice of a public hearing thereon upon the owner and all persons affected thereby has been had fixing this as the date of such public hearing, and a public hearing has been had thereon, and the complaining parties and the owner given an opportunity to be heard;

AND WHEREAS, the City Commission of the City of Marquette, Michigan, has heard the proofs in support of such complaint and in answer thereto and the argument of the parties thereto, and being fully advised in the premises:

IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED:

(1) That it is the finding of this City Commission that a nuisance exists at said premises within the meaning of the said ordinance, which affects the public health and welfare, for the following reasons:

(A) The building thereon being used for dwelling purposes is substandard, and not fit and proper for occupancy as a dwelling in that said building is no longer adequately constructed to properly withstand weather conditions with respect to doors, windows, roof materials and outside covering;

(B) The walls and ceilings on the inside of the said structure are in very poor state of repair in that much of the wallboard and plaster is cracked and broken and that the part which remains intact is unclean and unsanitary;

(C) The floors throughout the entire building are constructed of a soft wood type of material and are in very poor condition and dangerous and most of the floor area is uncovered;

(D) Only one toilet bowl is furnished which is situated in a clothes closet permitting no ventilation and much odor is cast off and retained in the dwelling. This, to supply at least two families;

(E) There are piles of garbage and refuse in and about the said premises and in the yard thereof, and scraps of old lumber and wood, tin cans, tires, bedsprings, unused and discarded furniture, old rags and discarded clothing and other debris;

(2) It is the Order of this City Commission that the owner shall, within 60 days from the date of this resolution, abate such nuisance by performing the following corrective action:

THAT THIS BUILDING BE
TORN DOWN AND REMOVED
FROM THE PREMISES;

(3) It is the further Order of this City Commission that such corrective action shall be begun not later than December 1, 1959;

(4) It is the further Order of this City Commission that if, at the expiration of the time limits provided in this Resolution, the owner of said premises shall fail or neglect to perform the corrective action provided herein, the City Manager shall carry out the requirements of same, and the cost of such action shall be charged against the premises and the owner thereof in accordance with the provisions of Section 1,189 of the Marquette City Code.

(5) A certified copy of this Resolution to be handed by personal messenger to the owner of the premises of 545 West Spring Street.

There being no further business at hand, Mayor Rydholm declared the meeting adjourned.

He also pointed out the necessity of raising funds to establish such a clinic that would later be taken over and supported by the State. The Commission reconvened to consider the following matters:

Moved by Commissioner Hammerschmidt, supported by Commissioner Bur, that the following resolution be, and the same is hereby unanimously adopted:

WHEREAS, The Lake States Forest Experimental Station, Forest Service, U. S. Department of Agriculture, has been carrying on a forest research program in the Upper Peninsula of Michigan for over thirty years, and the results of this station's work to date are the basis for many improved forestry practices; and annually foresters come from all over Michigan and adjoining states to witness the results of forest research projects in the vicinity of the City of Marquette;

WHEREAS, In recognition of the need to continue and to expand this forest research effort, as well as to provide adequate laboratory and office facilities, the Forest Service earlier this year recommended to Congress that (1) the funds for forest research in Michigan be increased by \$430,000, and (2) that \$154,000 be appropriated for a laboratory - office structure; and

WHEREAS, Much of this research program is being planned to be carried out in Upper Michigan, and present facilities at the experimental forest near Marquette being twenty-five years old are grossly inadequate for modern research work; and,

WHEREAS, The City of Marquette feels strongly that the proposed forest research program, as well as office-laboratory facilities, should be initiated immediately, as the research center presently located in the Federal Building is greatly overcrowded and without

any kind of adequate laboratory facilities.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED:

1. That the City of Marquette offers to make available the necessary land for a laboratory-office building at no cost to the Federal Government, to be located in the City of Marquette at a very desirable location and adjacent to Northern Michigan College.

2. That the Congress assist in its forthcoming session by granting \$154,000 for the construction of such forest research laboratory for the State of Michigan on such land, and to provide the program funds consistent with the use of such building, the land for such purpose being provided at no cost to the Federal Government, and that such funds for such building and program be forthcoming and available soon;

3. That copies of these resolutions be forwarded to the entire Congressional Delegation from the State of Michigan.

Moved by Commissioner Smith, supported by Commissioner Alholm and unanimously adopted, that the City Manager and the City Attorney be authorized to prepare all engineering and legal papers and all other material necessary to transfer an appropriate acreage of City property to the United States Department of Agriculture for a laboratory, office building, and other necessary buildings to carry out forest research projects, said transfer to provide a reverter clause in the event the United States Department of Agriculture does not use this land.

Mayor Rydholm then appointed Howard Morrison to fill a vacancy as City Supervisor to the Marquette County Board of Supervisors. The Commission unanimously confirmed this appointment.

A special meeting of the Marquette City Commission was duly called and held in the Commission Chambers at the City Hall on Tuesday, December 8, 1959, at 7:00 o'clock P. M.

Present, Mayor Rydholm, Commissioners Alholm, Bur, Hammerschmidt and Smith.

Mayor Rydholm called the meeting to order and stated that this would be an informal meeting and invited all present to participate.

The Mayor then directed the Clerk to read City Manager George T. Meholick's report on downtown parking and traffic movement.

Following the reading of Mr. Meholick's report and recommendations the Mayor opened the meeting for round table discussion. Mr. Meholick explained to the Commission in detail the work done by the representatives of the Chamber of Commerce as well as the Parking and Traffic Committee. A round table discussion by those present concerning various methods of financing and other pertinent points regarding off-street parking was had.

It was then moved by Commissioner Hammerschmidt, supported by Commissioner Alholm and unanimously adopted that the Com-

mission authorize Kenower, MacArthur and Co., finance consultants, to study the matter of financing of a parking meter utility for the City of Marquette, and submit their recommendations. City Manager George T. Meholick recommended a traffic control measure on Fisher Street between Third Street and Champion Street. It was then moved by Commissioner Smith, supported by Commissioner Hammerschmidt and unanimously adopted that the following traffic control measure be placed into effect on a ninety (90) day trial basis:

OFFICIAL PROCEEDINGS OF THE CITY COMMISSION

December 14, 1959

A regular meeting of the Marquette City Commission was duly called and held in the Commission Chambers at the City Hall, Monday, December 14, 1959, at 4:15 o'clock P. M.

Present: Mayor Rydholm, Commissioners Alholm, Bur, Hammerschmidt and Smith.

On a motion of Commissioner Bur, supported by Commissioner Hammerschmidt and unanimously adopted, the reading of the minutes of the previous meetings were waived.

A communication from Steve Johnson, Chairman of the Marquette City Planning Board was read wherein he presented the final plat plan of Shiras Hills Subdivision No. 2 recommending that this plat plan be accepted as presented. Following considerable discussion on this matter, it was then moved by Commissioner Hammerschmidt, supported by Commissioner Alholm and unanimously adopted that upon recommendation of the Marquette City Planning Board the final plat plan of Shiras Hills Subdivision No. 2 be accepted as presented.

Moved by Commissioner Smith, supported by Commissioner Bur and unanimously adopted that the City enter into an easement agreement with the Shiras Hills Development Company for a seventy-foot (70') right-of-way across Lot No. 155 of the final plat plan of Shiras Hills Subdivision No. 2 and that the Mayor and City Clerk be authorized to sign said easement agreement in behalf of the City of Marquette.

Mayor Rydholm then directed the secretary to write a letter to the members of the Marquette City Air Pollution Committee thanking them for the work done by that committee and informing them that two members of their committee will be replaced in accordance with their request.

Following a short discussion, it was moved by Commissioner Bur, supported by Commissioner Alholm and unanimously adopted that the next regular meeting of the City Commission on December 28, 1959, be held at 4:00 o'clock P. M. instead of 7:00 o'clock P. M.

It was moved by Commissioner Hammerschmidt, supported by Commissioner Bur and unanimously adopted that the City Manager and the City Attorney be authorized to sign a release on a damage claim involving a city-owned vehicle.

OFFICIAL PROCEEDINGS OF THE CITY COMMISSION

December 28, 1959

A regular meeting of the Marquette City Commission was duly called and held in the Commission Chambers at the City Hall Monday, December 28, 1959 at 4:00 o'clock P. M.

Present: Mayor Rydholm, Commissioners Alholm, Bur, Hammerschmidt and Smith.

It was moved by Commissioner Bur, supported by Commissioner Smith and unanimously adopted, that the reading of the minutes of the previous meetings be waived.

A communication from City Manager George T. Meholick and Sarah R. VanCleve, City Accountant, was read wherein the Commission is informed of recommendations for the transfer of funds from the Electric Utility Surplus Fund to the General Fund for city purposes in accordance with Ordinance No. 186. It was also recommended that certain funds be transferred in accordance with Ordinance No. 165 from the Receiving Fund of the Water Supply and Sewage Disposal Department. It was moved by Commissioner Hammerschmidt, supported by Commissioner Alholm and unanimously adopted, that upon recommendation of Lawrence Scudder and Company, Auditor's for the City, City Manager George T. Meholick and City Accountant Sarah R. VanCleve, a transfer of \$4,007.95 be made from the Electric Utility Surplus Fund to the General Fund of the City to be specifically used for payment on Electric Utility corporate taxes.

It was then moved by Commissioner Hammerschmidt, supported by Commissioner Bur and unanimously adopted, that the City Commission concur with the recommendations of Lawrence Scudder and Company, City Manager George T. Meholick and Sarah R. VanCleve, City Accountant, for a transfer of funds to be made from the Water Supply and Sewage Disposal Receiving Fund

in accordance with Ordinance No. 165 (the allowable 40%) and that this transfer of \$23,773.28 be specifically used for payment of Water Supply and Sewage Disposal System Corporate taxes, and the balance be transferred to the Improvement Fund for use in the current 1959-1960 Water Supply and Sewage Disposal System Budget.

A report from the secretary of the Commission was read wherein the Governing Body was informed that certain traffic control measures have been in effect for 90 days. Moved by Commissioner Smith, supported by Commissioner Bur and unanimously adopted, that the following traffic control measures be made permanent:

1. West College Avenue speed control, Seventh Street to Lincoln.
2. Yield right-of-way at the intersections of Spring Street, Baraga Avenue and Rock Street at Fifth Street.
3. Yield rightof-way on Center Street at Fitch Avenue, Longyear Avenue and Wilkinson Avenue.
4. Yield right-of-way on Summit Street at Fitch Avenue, Longyear Avenue and Wilkinson Avenue.

Various communications from senators and representatives were read wherein they thanked the Marquette City Commission for resolutions forwarded to them expressing the feelings of the Governing Body pertaining to the establishing of a forest research laboratory for the State of Michigan.
