Mayor Rydholm called the meeting to order and stated that its purpose was to hold a public hearing on the adoption of an Ordinance to designate and establish the district area effected by the City of Marquette Urban Renewal Development Plan — Project No. MICH. R-121.

He then declared the public hearing open.

Interested citizens wishing to be heard on said subject, were heard.

He then declared the public hearing closed.

In summing up the proceedings Mayor Rydholm stated that it is the intent of the City Commission to assist all the people of the City of Marquette, and especially those affected by Urban Renewal. He stated that this hearing was for

the purpose of adopting an Ordinance creating the Urban Renewal District Area. He also stated that the Commission would do anything in its power to aid the business community of the City to assure them they would not be hurt due to the Urban Renewal Program.

On motion of Commissioner Downey, supported by Commissioner Price that "AN ORDINANCE TO DESIGNATE THE DISTRICT AREA AFFECTED BY THE CITY OF MARQUETTE, MICHIGAN, URBAN RENEWAL DEVELOPMENT PLAN FOR PROJECT NO. MICH. R-121; AS REQUIRED UNDER ACT NUMBER 189 OF THE PUBLIC ACTS OF 1968 OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN" be adopted.

A Regular Meeting of the Marquette City Commission was duly called and held Monday, Sept. 9, 1968 at 7:00 o'clock, P.M.

Commissioner St. Cyr moved, supported by Commissioner Price that the reading of the minutes of the previous meeting be waived.

Yeas: Mayor Rydholm. Commissioners Brumm, Downey, Price, St. Cyr.

Nays: None.

Commissioner Price moved, supported by Commissioner Downey that the bills payable now on file with the City Clerk in the sum of \$92,990.08 be allowed and ordered paid.

Nays: None.

Mayor Rydholm announced that this was the date and time set for a public hearing on the adoption of the Ordinance establishing A Citizens District Council for the district area effected by the City of Marquette Urban Renewal Development Plan, Project No. Mich. R-121, and to provide for the method of selection for members thereon and to review appointments to said council as may be made by the Mayor with the approval of the City Commission. He then declared the public hearing open.

Interested citizens present wishing to be heard on this matter were heard. Various Commissioners asked questions and commented on this subject. Mayor Rydholm then declared the public hearing closed. On motion of Commissioner Downey, supported by Commissioner Price the following Ordinance be adopted:

AN ORDINANCE TO ESTABLISH A CITIZENS DISTRICT COUNCIL FOR THE DISTRICT AREA AFFECTED BY THE CITY OF MARQUETTE URBAN RENEWAL DEVELOPMENT PLAN-PROJECT NO. Mich. R-121 AND TO PROVIDE FOR THE METHOD OF SELECTION OF MEMBERS THEREON.

THE CITY OF MARQUETTE ORDAINS:

Section 1. A Citizens District Council to be composed of not less than ten (10) nor more than twenty-five (25) members shall be established for the purpose of consulting and communicating with the City of Marquette its officers and agencies on behalf of the property owners and residents in the District Area affected by the Urban Renewal Development Plan known as Project No. Mich. R-121.

Section 2. The Mayor shall appoint the members of the Citizens District Council with the approval of the City Commission after a public hearing has been held, with public notice of such hearing distributed throughout the district area at least twenty (20) days prior to the hearing.

Section 3. Membership on said Council shall insure representation of the residents of the development area and other persons with a demonstrable and substantial interest in said area.

Section 4. This Ordinance shall become effective ten (10) days after its adoption and publication.

Mayor Rydholm announced that in conjunction with the foregoing Ordinance, the Commission would consider the appointment of the minimum number of members to the Citizens District Council. In answer to

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a request from the floor Mayor Rydholm announced that there would be a five minute recess in order that the Commission might review the list of names of citizens that he wished to recommend to the Council. He then declared the recess.

Following the five minute recess the Commission reconvened to hear Mayor Rydholm's appointments to the Citizens District Council as follows:

A report and recommendation from Russell Chrest, Chairman, Marquette City Planning Board was read wherein the Board recommends the acceptance of the preliminary plat plan of Forest Park Subdivision No. 1.

During the course of the discussion it was pointed out Commissioners St. Cyr and Brumm held financial interest in this subdivision. It was then moved by Commissioner Downey, supported by Commissioner Price that Commissioners Brumm and St. Cyr be excused from voting on the acceptance of the forementioned preliminary plat plan in accordance with Section 5.10 of the City Charter.

He also informed the Commission of a vacancy on that Board created by the resignation of Mr. Jack Davey. Included in his report were names of citizens interested in serving on the Board. Mayor Rydholm appointed Mrs. Doris Campbell to a term expiring January, 1969, Mr. John Farrell, to a term expiring January, 1970, Mr. Patrick Ruecker to a term expiring January, 1969. On motion of Commissioner St. Cyr, supported by Commissioner Price, the Commission concur in the appointments of the forementioned citizens to serve on the Planning Board.

A Regular Meeting of the Marquette City Commission was duly called and held Monday, September 30, 1968 at 7:00 o'clock, p.m.

Present: Mayor Rydholm. Commissioners Brumm, Downey, Price, St. Cyr.

Absent: None:

Commissioner Price moved, supported by St. Cyr that the reading of the minutes of the previous meeting be waived.

Yeas: Mayor Rydholm. Commissioners Brumm, Price, St. Cyr. Nays: None.

Commissioner St. Cyr moved, supported by Commissioner Price that the bills payable now on file with the City Clerk in the sum of \$160,592.94, be allowed and ordered paid. Yeas: Mayor Rydholm. Commissioners Brumm, Price, St. Cyr. Nays: None.

Mayor Rydholm announced that this was the time and date set for a public hearing to determine the necessity for the installation of curbing and paving on the 1000 block of West Bluff Street. He then declared the public hearing open. After all present wishing to be heard were heard, the public hearing was declared closed.

Moved by Commissioner Downey, supported by Commissioner St. Cyr that the following resolution be adopted: Yeas: Mayor Rydholm, Commissioners Brumm, Downey, Price, St. Cyr. Nays: None.

WHEREAS, It appears by the affidavit of the City Clerk that due publication has been made of notice, as required by the City Charter, that it is the intention of the City Commission to make certain improvements, and to determine the necessity of such improvements as follows:

Curbing and Paving on the 1000 Block of West Bluff Street; and appointing this day

and time when the City Commission would meet to determine the necessity of such improvement; and

WHEREAS, It appears further by said affidavit that a like notice has been sent by mail to each owner of property subject to assessment therefore; and

WHEREAS, All suggestions and objections made to said improvements have been heard and considered;

RESOLVED, That the City Commission determines that such project and improvements are necessary and proper;

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the proportion of the costs of such improvements which shall be defrayed by special assessment upon the property especially benefited thereby and the proportion to be defrayed as the general obligation of the City, if any, shall be as follows:

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the report of the City Manager, the plans and specifications, and the estimated costs of such improvements, are hereby approved and determined accordingly; that said special assessments may be paid in five installments, at a rate not exceeding 4% per annum, or the actual cost of such borrowing; and that a special assessment district to be assessed therefor is hereby designated as follows:

1000 Block of West Bluff Street.

FURTHER RESOLVED, that if any curbing, water taps, and/or sewer taps shall be required to effect the above paving, such curbing, or portions of curbing, water taps, and/or sewer taps, shall also be installed and the cost thereof assessed to the property specially benefited thereby, and added to the assessment upon such prop-

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erty for paving, to be payable in the same manner.

A report and recommendation from City Manager T. R. McNabb was read wherein he tabulated bids received for roofing repair to the Public Works building located on Presque Isle Avenue. Following a short discussion on this matter it was moved by Commissioner Price supported by Commissioner Brumm that upon recommendation of the City Manager all bids received for this work be rejected and bids be called for the repair of the existing roof. A report from City Manager T. R. McNabb was read regarding Building Authority. This report was ordered received and placed on file.

An opinion from City Attorney Robert M. Bordeau was read regarding litigation at the Circuit Court level. On motion of Commissioner Downey, supported by Commissioner Price the City Attorney be authorized to appear and defend on behalf of the City that he be compensated on the basis of the minimum Bar Fee schedule of the State of Michigan as adopted by the Marquette County Bar Association, as provided in Section 4.12 of the Charter of the City of Marquette.

Commissioner Brumm abstained voting under Section 5.10 of the City Charter. Yeas: Mayor Rydholm. Commissioners Downey, Price, St. Cyr. Nays: None.

On motion of Commissioner Downey, supported by Commissioner Price the following resolution be adopted. Yeas: Mayor Rydholm. Commissioners Brumm, Downey, Price, St. Cyr. Nays: None.

WHEREAS the City of Marquette, Michigan (herein sometimes called the "Local Public

Agency") has filed or is about to file a requisition, together with the necessary supporting documents, with the United States of America (herein called the "Government") requesting a payment on account of the Project Temporary Loan provided for in the Loan and Grant Contract and numbered Contract No. MICH. R-121 (LG) (which, together with all supplements, amendments, and waivers, is herein called the "Loan and Grant Contract") by and between the Local Public Agency and the Government, said Loan and Grant Contract being in connection with a certain project of the Local Public Agency designated therein; and

WHEREAS the Local Public Agency has determined to issue its Project Temporary Loan Note as security for such payment:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the CITY OF MARQUETTE and the STATE OF MICHIGAN as follows:

1. That pursuant to the provisions of a Resolution entitled: Resolution authorizing the issuance of certain Project Temporary Loan notes in connection with Urban Renewal Project No. MICH. R-121 and providing for the security for the payment thereof, and for other purposes.

Duly adopted by the Local Public Agency on the 26th day of August, 1968, the Mayor and the City Clerk of the Local Public Agency are hereby authorized and directed to prepare and execute a note, authorized by said Resolution, in the principal amount of Two Hundred Seventy Eight Thousand Six Hundred Eighty-Six Dollars (\$278,686.00), or, if the Government shall only approve said requisition for a lesser amount, in the lesser amount so approved by the Government. Such note shall bear interest from

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the date of the acceptance of the Local Agency's delivery thereof and the payment therefor by the Government; shall be dated the 30th day of September, 1968; and shall be designated Project Temporary Loan Note No. 1; shall bear a statement at the foot thereof in substantially the following form:

and shall not be valid until said statement is duly executed on behalf of the Government. The City of Marquette, Michigan is hereby authorized and directed to deliver such note and to accept payment therefor from the Government, and the aforesaid officers are hereby authorized and directed to do all acts and things necessary for the execution, sale and delivery of such note.

2. That the proceeds of such note shall be deposited and disbursed only in accordance with the provisions of the Loan and Grant Contract unless otherwise approved by the Government.

3. That this Resolution shall take effect immediately.

A communication from Thomas Moore, Director, Board of Light and Power, was read wherein he submitted a resolution adopted by that Board concerning a formula by which funds of the Board will be governed.

On motion of Commissioner Downey, supported by Commissioner Price paragraph D, Page 3, be amended by changing gross revenue to electrical revenue and sub-paragraph 4 of paragraph D be amended to

read 'funds for repair and replacement due to major damage or destruction due to disaster, after first using the funds in the replacement fund'. Yeas: Mayor Rydholm. Commissioners Brumm, Downey, Price, St. Cyr. Nays: None.

RESOLUTION

At a regular meeting of the City Commission of the City of Marquette, Michigan, held in the City Hall at 7:30 p.m., on the 30th day of September, 1968, a proposal was received from Spear and Sons, Inc., requesting formal approval of its application for a conveyance as to the hereinafter described premises pursuant to the requirement of Section 4 (b) of Act 247 of the Public Acts of 1955, as amended, known as the Great Lakes Submerged Lands Act.

The lands subject to this request, located in the City of Marquette, Michigan, are described as follows:

That part of Government Lots 1 & 2, Section 23 and Fractional Section 24, T48N-R25W, City of Marquette, Michigan, bounded on the North and West by the Soo Line Railroad and on the South and East by a line described as: Commencing at the intersection of the Center Line of Lake Street and East Washington Street; thence S78°E 200' to the line of Marquette Harbor; thence N10°10'; thence N88°E along the edge of the Marquette Dock Company



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Coal Dock 1000'; thence North 17'; thence N76°30'E 120'; thence S89°E 640'; thence N1°E 22'; thence N89°W 320'; thence N6°W 82'; thence N84°E 405'; thence N2°W 85'; thence S84°W 40'; thence S2°E 65'; thence S84°W 235'; thence N6°W 85'; thence N60°E 335'; thence East 30'; thence South 390'; thence S89°E 40'; thence North 490' more or less to the Soo Line Railroad, containing 17 acres more or less.

It appearing to the Commission that a resolution approving the application of Spear and Sons, Inc., for a conveyance to the Department of Conservation of the State of Michigan is needed and the Commission having been fully advised in the premises, it was moved by Commissioner Downey and supported by Commissioner St. Cyr and unanimously carried by all the members of the Commission that said application by Spear and Sons, Inc., pursuant to the requirements of the foregoing Public Acts, be and is hereby approved.

It was further resolved that the City Clerk enter this approving resolution in the minutes and cause a certified copy thereof to be issued to Spear and Sons, Inc., to accompany its application to the Department of Conservation of the State of Michigan.

RESOLUTION AMENDING RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF CERTAIN PROJECT TEMPORARY LOAN NOTES IN CONNECTION WITH URBAN RENEWAL PROJECT NO. MICH. R-121 AND PROVIDING FOR THE SECURITY FOR THE PAYMENT THEREOF, AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

WHEREAS the City Commission of the City of Marquette, Michigan, did on the 26th day of August, 1968, adopt a Resolution authorizing the issuance of certain project temporary loan notes in connection with Urban Renewal Project No. Mich. R-121 and providing for the security for the payment thereof, and for other purposes; and,

WHEREAS, Section Six (6) of said Resolution stated that:

"That the CITY OF MARQUETTE is hereby authorized to file requisitions, together with necessary supporting documents, with the Government, from time to time as Project Temporary Loan or Project Capital Grant funds are required, requesting payments to be made on account of the Project Temporary Loan or the Project Capital Grant provided for in the said Contract for loan and

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grant, and to do and perform all other things and acts required to be done or performed in order to obtain such payments.”

“That the Urban Renewal Director of the City of Marquette is hereby authorized to file requisitions, together with necessary supporting documents, with the Government, from time to time as Project Temporary Loan or Project Capital Grant funds are required, requesting payments to be made on account of the Project Temporary Loan or the Project Capital Grant provided for in the said Contract for loan and grant, and to do and perform all other things and acts required to be done or performed in order to obtain such payments.”

A petition signed by residents on Elm and Gray Streets was read regarding a Special Assessment for Curbing and Paving. This petition was referred to the City Manager for study.

Mayor Downey announced that this was the date and time set for a public hearing on the adoption of an Ordinance to issue Revenue Bonds of the Light and Power Department. He then announced the ground rules for this hearing and stated that all present would be heard in an orderly manner. He then declared the public

hearing open. Various citizens present wishing to be heard on the subject matter were heard. Members of the Board of Light and Power answered questions pertaining to the distribution system and the generating system of the Power Department. After all persons were heard Mayor Downey declared the public hearing closed.

The Mayor and City Commission in turn asked questions uppermost in their minds regarding the interconnection with other power source, the possibility of purchase power, the interest cost on borrowed money, the feasibility of a rate study, the return to the citizen as a shareholder and other related questions surrounding a bond issue at the present time. Mayor Downey summed up his feelings on this matter by stating that in order to make a decision on this Ordinance, he feels that more information is needed in connection with the forementioned questions. The Mayor and City Commission unanimously agreed to defer action on the adoption of this Ordinance.

On motion of Commissioner Rydholm, supported by Commissioner Price the reading of the minutes of the previous meeting be waived.

Commissioner Lowney moved, supported by Commissioner LaFreniere that the bills payable now on file in the office of the City Clerk in the sum of \$155,728.55, be allowed and ordered paid.

Nays: None.

Mayor Downey presented Judge Edward H. Dembowski with a plaque and certificate of merit for services rendered as Municipal Judge for the City of Marquette for the past 16 years. Following the presentation Judge Dembowski expressed his appreciation of this acknowledgement and commended the City Police Force for the fine work being done in law enforcement.

Mayor Downey then announced that this was the date and time set for a Public Hearing on the confirmation of Special Assessment Roll No. 385, the curbing of Altamont Street from Hampton Street to Fisher Street. A petition signed by four property owners requesting the installation of curbing and blacktop on the 1300 block of Logan Street extending from West Avenue was read, referred to the City Manager for a study and report.

A communication from Donald L. Hansen, President, Marquette City Employees Labor Union, was read wherein he requested the Commission to consider compensating all employees with an equal amount of Insurance. Mayor Downey suggested that this matter be deferred until such time as the Commission commences work on the 1969-70 budget.

A communication from Richard R. Burr, Chairman, Marquette City Board of Light and Power was read wherein he incorporated a schedule of comparison of costs in regards to the Steam Generation Expansion versus Purchased Power. Following considerable discussion on this matter wherein various Commissioners expressed their opinion regarding costs of purchased power and the expansion of the present Steam Generation Plant, it was moved by Commissioner Rydholm, supported by Commissioner Price that the City Commission adopt an Ordinance authorizing and providing for the issuance of rev-

enue bonds for the purpose of acquiring and constructing additions and improvements to the existing electric utility system of the City of Marquette.

Yeas: Commissioner Rydholm. Commissioner Price.

Nays: Mayor Downey. Commissioners LaFreniere, Lowney.

Mayor Downey stated the motion was lost for lack of affirmative votes. He then suggested and the Commission agreed, that the Power Board and City Commission meet to further discuss the expansion problem.

A communication from Alvin W. Weiland, Supervisor, Marquette Township, was read wherein he requested in behalf of the Township, that the City consider the sale of an 18 acre tract of land in Section 9, T48N, R25W, to the Township to be used for water wells for the Township. The Mayor and City Commission unanimously agreed that the City Manager cause a meeting of the two units of Government to better familiarize the new Commissioners with this situation, and to discuss other problems now confronting both units of Government.

A petition signed by 22 residents of the 1600 and 1700 blocks of Elm Avenue and the 1200 block of Gray Street was read wherein reference was made to a special assessment for paving and curbing in that area. Various citizens present were heard regarding this project. City Manager T. R. McNabb traced the Commission action on petitions received requesting these improvements. City Attorney Robert Bordeau quoted sections from the Ordinance governing special assessment procedures. After considerable discussion by the Manager and City Commission it was unanimously agreed that

the City Manager and City Engineer make a study of the special assessment procedure and formulate a recommendation.

Mayor Edward L. Downey announced his appointment of W. H. Treloar, Chairman of the Information Committee to help acquaint the public with all facets of Marquette's proposed Urban Renewal program. He also asked that any interested citizens wishing to serve on the Committee contact City Manager T. R. McNabb so their names can be considered.

On motion of Commissioner LaFreniere, supported by Commissioner Price the Annual Audit as submitted by Hubbard and Wendt, be accepted.

Yeas: All. Nays: None.

Mayor Downey then asked for Oral Communications from the floor. Mr. Donald Hansen, President, Marquette City Employees Labor Union, asked the Commission to re-consider his request to grant \$5000 of Insurance to each employee instead of \$5000 to some and only \$2000 to others. Mayor Downey expressed his feelings that this matter of Insurance should be brought on for consideration at budget time. Various other Commissioners expressed their opinion of a mid-year negotiation with the employees. Following the discussion it was moved by Commissioner Price, supported by Commissioner Rydholm that the Commission meet with the Employees and discuss this matter of Insurance increase from \$2000 to some employees to \$5000 for all employees.
