

# OFFICIAL PROCEEDINGS OF THE CITY COMMISSION

Monday, January 12, 1970

A Regular Meeting of the Marquette City Commission was duly called and held Monday, January 12, 1970 at 4:00 o'clock, P.M.

Present: Mayor Price. Commissioners LaFreniere, Lowney, Rydholm.

Absent: Commissioner Downey.

Commissioner Lowney moved, supported by Commissioner LaFreniere and carried, the absence of Commissioner Downey be excused, he being away from the City.

Commissioner LaFreniere moved, supported by Commissioner Lowney and carried, the reading of the minutes of the previous meeting be waived.

Commissioner Lowney moved, supported by Commissioner LaFreniere and carried that the bills payable in the sum of \$162,009.10, now on file with the City Clerk, be allowed and ordered paid.

Commissioner Lowney moved, supported by Commissioner LaFreniere and carried that a delegation of City officials be authorized to attend the Legislative Workshop to be held by the Michigan Municipal League in Lansing, Michigan on February 26, 1970.

Commissioner LaFreniere moved, supported by Commissioner Lowney and carried, that upon recommendation of the City Manager, the City Attorney be authorized to draw quit claim deeds on certain City-owned lots deeding them to the Department of Natural Resources for disposition.

Commissioner Lowney moved, supported by Commissioner LaFreniere and carried, that the City enter into a lease and agreement with the Downtown Improvement Corporation for the use of certain parcels of land lying west of Front Street and south of Spring Street for Municipal Parking purposes.

City Manager T. R. McNabb was authorized to write a letter to Richard L. Marlow regarding a special assessment for curbing in front of his Lot in Evergreen Acres Subdivision.

Commissioner Lowney moved, supported by Commissioner LaFreniere and carried, that the following resolution be adopted:

WHEREAS, the City Commission of the City of Marquette, County of Marquette, Michigan, intends to issue Electric Utility Revenue Bonds, pursuant to Act 94, Public Acts of Michigan, 1933, as amended in an amount not to exceed Three Million Nine Hundred Fifty Thousand (\$3,950,000.00) Dollars; for the purpose of paying the cost of acquiring and constructing additions and improvements to the Electric Utility System of the City; and

WHEREAS, notice of Intent to issue bonds must be published at least thirty (30) days before issuance of the same in order to comply with the requirements of Section 33 of Act 94, Public Acts of Michigan, 1933, as amended.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT:

1. The City Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to publish a notice of In-

tent to issue bonds in The Mining Journal, Marquette, Michigan, a newspaper of general circulation in the City of Marquette.

2. Said notice of Intent so published shall be in substantially the following form:

PLEASE TAKE NOTICE that the City Commission of the City of Marquette intends to issue electric revenue bonds of the City, pursuant to Act 94, Public Acts of Michigan, 1933, as amended, in an amount not to exceed \$3,950,000.00 for the purpose of paying the cost of acquiring and constructing additions and improvements to the Electric Utility System of the City.

Said bonds shall be payable solely from the net revenues of the Electric Utility System of the City.

THIS NOTICE is given pursuant to the requirements of Section 33, of Act 94, Public Acts of Michigan, 1933, as amended.

Commissioner LaFreniere moved, supported by Commissioner Rydholm and carried, that the following Ordinance be brought on for public hearing and adoption.

ORDINANCE NO. ....

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND SECTIONS 3 AND 8 OF ORDINANCE NO. 243, DULY ADOPTED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF MARQUETTE, COUNTY OF MARQUETTE, MICHIGAN, ON MARCH 10, 1969, ENTITLED:

"AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING AND PROVIDING FOR THE ISSUANCE OF REVENUE BONDS OF EQUAL STANDING AND PRIORITY OF LIEN WITH OUTSTANDING REVENUE BONDS ISSUED UNDER THE PROVISIONS OF ACT 94, PUBLIC ACTS OF MICHIGAN, 1933, AS AMENDED, AND ORDINANCE NO. 186 AND NO. 217 OF THE CITY OF MARQUETTE, FOR THE PURPOSE OF ACQUIRING AND CONSTRUCTING ADDITIONS AND IMPROVEMENTS TO THE EXISTING ELECTRIC UTILITY SYSTEM OF THE CITY OF MARQUETTE."

THE CITY OF MARQUETTE ORDAINS:

Section 1. Sections 3 and 8 of Ordinance No. 243, adopted by the City Commission of the City of Marquette, County of Marquette, Michigan, on March 10, 1969, are hereby amended to provide as follows:

Section 3. Said additional issue of bonds shall be designated "Electric Utility Revenue Bonds, Series III, and shall be, not general obligations of the City of Marquette, Michigan, but revenue bonds, payable out of the net revenues of the System after provision has been made for the payment of expenses of operation and maintenance, and shall consist of seven hundred ninety (790) coupon bonds of the denomination of \$5,000.00 each, numbered in direct order of maturity from 1 to 790, inclusive. Said bonds shall be dated April 1, 1970, and shall be payable:

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\$ 75,000.00 July 1st of each of the years 1972 and 1973;  
 \$100,000.00 July 1st of each of the years 1974 and 1975;  
 \$125,000.00 July 1st of each of the years 1976 and 1977;  
 \$150,000.00 July 1st of each of the years 1978 and 1979;  
 \$175,000.00 July 1st of each of the years 1980 and 1981;  
 \$200,000.00 July 1st of each of the years 1982 and 1983;  
 \$225,000.00 July 1, 1984;  
 \$150,000.00 July 1st of each of the years 1985 and 1986;  
 \$175,000.00 July 1, 1987;  
 \$500,000.00 July 1, 1988;  
 \$550,000.00 July 1st of each of the years 1989 and 1990.

Said bonds shall bear interest at a rate or rates not exceeding eight per cent (8%) per annum, payable on January 1, 1971, and semi-annually thereafter on July 1st and January 1st of each year, both principal and interest to be payable at The Detroit Bank and Trust Company, Detroit, Michigan.

Bonds maturing in the years 1972 to 1980, inclusive, shall not be subject to redemption prior to maturity.

Bonds maturing in the years 1981 to 1990, inclusive, shall be subject to redemption prior to maturity at the option of the City, in inverse numerical order, on any interest payment date on or after July 1, 1980.

Bonds called for redemption in accordance with the foregoing provisions shall be redeemable at par and accrued interest, plus a premium as follows:

- 5% of the principal on each bond called for redemption on or after July 1, 1980, but prior to July 1, 1982;
- 4% of the principal on each bond called for redemption on or after July 1, 1982, but prior to July 1, 1984;
- 3% of the principal on each bond called for redemption on or after July 1, 1984, but prior to July 1, 1986;
- 2% of the principal on each bond called for redemption on or after July 1, 1986, but prior to July 1, 1988;
- 1% of the principal on each bond called for redemption on or after July 1, 1988, but prior to maturity.

Thirty days' notice of the call of any bonds for redemption shall be given by publication in a paper circulated in the State of Michigan which carries, as part of its regular service, notices of sale of municipal bonds, and in case of registered bonds, thirty days' notice shall be given by mail to the registered address. Bonds so called for redemption shall not bear interest after the date fixed for redemption, provided funds are on hand with the paying agent to redeem said bonds.

Said bonds may be registered as to principal only in the manner and with the effect set forth on the face thereof, as hereinafter provided.

Said bonds shall be signed by the Mayor and countersigned by the City Clerk and shall have interest coupons attached bearing the facsimile signatures of said Mayor and City Clerk, and said officials by the execution of said bonds, shall adopt as and for their own proper signatures the respective facsimile signatures on said coupons.

Section 8. The bonds authorized by this Ordinance shall be in substantially the following form:

 KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS that the CITY OF MARQUETTE, County of Marquette, State of Michigan, for value received, hereby promises to pay to the bearer, or if registered, to the registered holder hereof, but only out of the revenues of the Electric Utility System of the City of Marquette, including all appurtenances, extensions and improvements thereto, the sum of  
 FIVE THOUSAND DOLLARS

on the first day of July, A.D., 19....., with interest thereon from the date hereof until paid at the rate of ..... per cent ( %) per annum, payable on January 1, 1971, and semi-annually thereafter on the first day of July and January of each year, upon presentation and surrender of the proper interest coupons hereto annexed as they severally become due. Both principal of and interest on this bond are payable in lawful money of the United States of America, at The Detroit Bank and Trust Company, Detroit, Michigan, and for the prompt payment, the gross revenues of said Electric Utility System of the City of Marquette, including all appurtenances, extensions and improvements thereto, after provision has been made for reasonable and necessary expenses of operation, administration and maintenance, are hereby irrevocably pledged and a statutory first lien thereon is hereby created.

This bond is one of a series of bonds of even date and like tenor except as to rate of interest and date of maturity, aggregating the sum of \$3,950,000.00, issued pursuant to Ordinance No. 243, as amended, and under and in full compliance with the Constitution and Statutes of the State of Michigan, including specifically Act 94, Public Acts of Michigan, 1933, as amended, for the purpose of paying the cost of acquiring and constructing of extensions and improvements to the Electric Utility System of the City. The bonds of this issue have equal standing and priority and are equally secured with Electric Utility Revenue Bonds, in the original principal amount of \$2,250,000.00, dated May 1, 1956, issued under the provisions of Ordinance No. 186, and with Electric Utility Revenue Bonds, Series II, in the original principal amount of \$3,775,000.00, dated May 1, 1963, issued under the provisions of Ordinance No. 217.

For a complete statement of the revenues from which and the conditions under which this bond is payable, a statement of the conditions under which additional bonds of equal standing may hereafter be issued, and the general covenants and provisions pursuant to which this bond is issued, reference is made to the above-described Ordinances.

Bonds of this issue maturing in the

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years 1972 to 1980, inclusive, are not subject to prior redemption.

The right is reserved of redeeming bonds maturing in the years 1981 to 1990, inclusive, at the option of the City, in inverse numerical order, on any interest payment date on or after July 1, 1980, upon payment of par and accrued interest, plus premiums as follows:

- 5% of the principal on each bond called for redemption on or after July 1, 1980, but prior to July 1, 1982;
- 4% of the principal on each bond called for redemption on or after July 1, 1982, but prior to July 1, 1984;
- 3% of the principal on each bond called for redemption on or after July 1, 1984, but prior to July 1, 1986;
- 2% of the principal on each bond called for redemption on or after July 1, 1986, but prior to July 1, 1988;
- 1% of the principal on each bond called for redemption on or after July 1, 1988, but prior to maturity.

Thirty days' notice of the call of any bonds for redemption shall be given by publication in a paper circulated in the State of Michigan, which carries, as part of its regular service, notices of sale of municipal bonds, and in case of registered bonds, thirty days' notice shall be given by mail to the registered address. Bonds so called for redemption shall not bear interest after the date fixed for redemption, provided funds are on hand with the paying agent to redeem said bonds.

This bond is a self-liquidating bond, and is not a general obligation of the City of Marquette, and does not constitute an indebtedness of the City of Marquette within any constitutional or statutory limitation, and is payable, both as to principal and interest, solely from the revenues of the Electric Utility System of the City. The principal and interest on this bond are secured by the statutory lien hereinbefore mentioned.

The City of Marquette hereby covenants and agrees to fix and maintain at all times while any of the bonds shall be outstanding, such rates for service furnished by said Electric Utility System as shall be sufficient to provide for payment of the interest upon and the principal of all such bonds as and when the same become due and payable, to create a Bond and Interest Redemption Fund (including a Bond Reserve Account) therefor and a Replacement Fund, to provide for the payment of expenses of administration and operation and such expenses for maintenance of said Electric Utility System as are necessary to preserve the same in good repair and working order, and to provide for such other expenditures and funds for said System as are required by said Ordinance.

This bond and the interest thereon are exempt from any and all taxation whatsoever by the State of Michigan or by any taxing authority within said state.

This bond may be registered as to principal only on the books of the City Treasurer in the name of the holder, and such registration noted on the back hereof by the City Treasurer, after which

no transfer shall be valid unless made on the books and noted hereon in like manner, but transferability by delivery may be restored by registration to bearer. Such registration shall not affect the negotiability of the interest coupons.

It is hereby certified and recited that all acts, conditions and things required by law precedent to and in the issue of this bond and the series of which this is one have been done and performed in regular and due time and form as required by law.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, the City of Marquette, County of Marquette, State of Michigan, by its City Commission, has caused this bond to be signed in the name of said city by its Mayor and countersigned by its City Clerk and the corporate seal of the City to be affixed hereto, and the coupons hereto attached to be signed by the facsimile signatures of said Mayor and City Clerk, all as of the first day of April, A.D., 1970.

**Section 3.** All ordinances, resolutions or orders, or parts thereof, in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance are to the extent of such conflict hereby repealed.

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**Section 4.** This Ordinance shall be published in full in The Mining Journal, a newspaper of general circulation in the City of Marquette, qualified under State law to publish legal notices within one (1) week of its adoption, and the same shall be recorded in the Ordinance Book and such recording shall be authenticated by the signatures of the Mayor and City Clerk.

**Section 5.** This Ordinance is declared to be effective immediately upon its adoption.

### RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING NOTICE OF SALE

WHEREAS, By Ordinance No. 243, adopted, as amended, by the City Commission on March 10, 1969, the City of Marquette has authorized the Issue of \$3,950,000.00 Electric Utility Revenue Bonds, Series III, dated April 1, 1970, being additional bonds authorized by Ordinance No. 186, adopted by the City Commission on March 12, 1956 and Act No. 94, Public Acts of Michigan, 1933, as amended.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED:

1. That the City Clerk cause Notice of Sale of said bonds to be published in The Bond Buyer of New York, New York, as soon as the form of said Notice is approved by the Municipal Finance

Commission, setting the date of sale for a regular or special meeting of the City Commission occurring more than fourteen (14) days after such publication;

2. That said Notice be in substantially the following form subject to any changes which may be required by the Municipal Finance Commission:

Said bonds shall be coupon bonds, registrable as to principal only, of the denomination of \$5,000.00 each, numbered consecutively in the direct order of maturity from 1 to 790, both inclusive, and shall bear interest from their date at a rate of rates not exceeding eight (8%) per cent per annum, expressed in multiples of  $\frac{1}{8}$  or  $\frac{1}{20}$  of 1%. Said interest shall be payable on January 1, 1971, and semi-annually thereafter on July 1st and January 1st of each year, both principal and interest to be payable at The Detroit Bank and Trust Company, Detroit, Michigan, which paying agent qualifies as such under the statutes of State of Michigan or of the Federal Government. Accrued interest to the date of delivery of said bonds must be paid by the purchaser at the time of delivery. The interest rate for each coupon period on any one bond shall be at one rate only and represented by one interest coupon.

Bonds maturing in the years 1972 to 1980, both inclusive, shall not be subject to redemption prior to maturity.

Bonds maturing in the years 1981 to 1990, both inclusive, shall be subject to redemption prior to maturity at the option of the City, in inverse numerical order, on any interest payment date on or after July 1, 1980.

Bonds called for redemption in accordance with the foregoing provisions shall be redeemable at par and accrued interest plus a premium, as follows:

- 5% per bond if called on or after July 1, 1980, but prior to July 1, 1982;

- 3% per bond if called on or after July 1, 1984, but prior to July 1, 1986;
- 2% per bond if called on or after July 1, 1986, but prior to July 1, 1988;
- 1% per bond if called on or after July 1, 1988, but prior to maturity.

Thirty days notice of the call of any bonds for redemption shall be given by publication in a paper circulated in the State of Michigan which carries, as part of its regular service, notices of sale of municipal bonds, and in case of registered bonds, thirty days notice shall be given by mail to the registered address. Bonds so called for redemption shall not bear interest after the date fixed for redemption, provided funds are on hand with the paying agent to redeem said bonds.

No proposal for the purchase of less than all of the bonds or less than their par value will be considered.

Said bonds are to be issued under Act 94, Public Acts of Michigan, 1933, as amended, and Ordinance No. 243 of the City, as amended, for the purpose of paying the cost of extending, enlarging and improving the existing Electric Utility System of the City of Marquette, by the construction of a new steam electric generating plant.

Said bonds are not a general obligation of the City but are payable solely from the revenues of the Electric Utility System of the City, subject only to payment of expenses of administration, operation and maintenance and a statutory first lien thereon has been created. Said bonds are of equal standing and priority with outstanding Electric Utility Revenue Bonds of the City dated May 1, 1956 authorized by Ordinance No. 186 in the original principal amount of \$2,250,000.00 and outstanding Electric Utility Revenue Bonds, Series II, of the City dated May 1, 1963, authorized by Ordinance No. 217, in the original amount of \$3,775,000.00.

For the purpose of awarding the bonds, the interest cost of each bid will be computed by determining, at the rate or rates specified therein, the total dollar value of all interest on the bonds from their maturity to their maturity and deducting there from any premium. The bonds will be awarded to the bidder whose bid on the above computation produces the lowest interest cost to the City of Marquette.

A certified or cashier's check in the amount of \$79,000.00, drawn upon an incorporated bank or trust company and payable to the order of the Treasurer of the City of Marquette must accompany each bid as a guaranty of good faith on the part of the bidder, to be forfeited as liquidated damages if such bid is accepted and the bidder fails to take up and pay for the bonds. No interest shall be allowed on the good faith checks and checks of unsuccessful bidders will be

promptly returned to each bidder's representative or by registered mail.

Bids shall be conditioned upon the unqualified approving opinion of Miller, Canfield, Paddock and Stone, attorneys of Detroit, Michigan, which opinion will be printed on each bond and will be furnished without expense to the purchaser of the bonds at the delivery thereof. The City shall furnish bonds ready for execution at its expense. Bonds will be delivered without expense to the purchaser at Chicago, Illinois or New York, New York. The usual closing documents, including a certificate that no litigation is pending affecting the issuance of said bonds, will be delivered at the time of the delivery of the bonds.

Additional bonds of equal standing with the bonds of this issue may be issued, but only for the purposes and on the terms and conditions expressed in the authorizing Ordinance and said Ordinance No. 186.

The right is reserved to reject any and all bids.

Envelopes containing the bids should be plainly marked "Proposal for Bonds."

Monday, January 26, 1970

A Regular Meeting of the Marquette City Commission was duly called and held Monday, January 26, 1970 at 7:00 o'clock, P.M.

Present: Mayor Price, Commissioners Downey, LaFreniere, Rydholm.

Absent: Commissioner Lowney.

Commissioner Downey moved, supported by Commissioner Rydholm and carried, that the absence of Commissioner Lowney be excused, he being ill.

Commissioner Rydholm moved, supported by Commissioner LaFreniere and carried, that the reading of the minutes of the previous meeting be waived.

Commissioner Downey moved, supported by Commissioner LaFreniere and carried, that the bills payable now on file with the City Clerk in the sum of \$125,474.85, be allowed and ordered paid.

Mayor Price announced that this was the date and time set for a public hearing on the adoption of an Ordinance to repeal an Ordinance granting a franchise to Delmas Eastman, Red Arrow Bus Line, to operate a bus line in the City of Marquette. He then declared the public hearing open. There being no interested citizen present wishing to be heard on said subject, the public hearing was declared closed.

Commissioner Downey moved, supported by Commissioner LaFreniere and carried, that the following Ordinance be adopted: "An Ordinance repealing an Ordinance granting a franchise to Delmas Eastman, doing business as Red Arrow Line in the City of Marquette, Michigan."

Mayor Price announced that this was the date and time set for a public hearing on the adoption of an Ordinance granting a franchise to Peggy Braamse doing business as Marquette Bus Line, to operate a bus line in the City of Marquette, Michigan. He then declared the public hearing open. There being no interested person present wishing to be heard on this subject, the public hearing was declared closed.

On motion of Commissioner Rydholm, supported by Commissioner Downey and carried, the following Ordinance be adopted: **X**

Mayor Price announced that this was the date and time set for a public hearing on the adoption of an Ordinance to amend sections 3 and 8 of Ordinance No. 243, duly adopted by the City of Marquette, County of Marquette, Michigan, on March 10, 1969, entitled:

"An Ordinance Authorizing the Issuance of Revenue Bonds of Equal Standing and Priority of Lien With Outstanding Revenue Bonds Issued Under the Provisions of Act 94, Public Acts of Michigan 1933, As Amended, and Ordinance No. 186 and No. 217 of The City of Marquette, For the Purpose Of Acquiring and Constructing Additions and Improvements to the Existing Electric Utility System of the City of Marquette." He then declared the hearing open, there being no interested Citizen present wish-

ing to be heard on said subject, the hearing was declared closed.

Commissioner Rydholm moved, supported by Commissioner LaFreniere and carried that the following Ordinance be adopted.

ORDINANCE NO. 250

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND SECTIONS 3 AND 8 OF ORDINANCE NO. 243, DULY ADOPTED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF MARQUETTE, COUNTY OF MARQUETTE, MICHIGAN, ON MARCH 10, 1969, ENTITLED:

"AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING AND PROVIDING FOR THE ISSUANCE OF REVENUE BONDS OF EQUAL STANDING AND PRIORITY OF LIEN WITH OUTSTANDING REVENUE BONDS ISSUED UNDER THE PROVISIONS OF ACT 94, PUBLIC ACTS OF MICHIGAN, 1933, AS AMENDED, AND ORDINANCE NO. 186 AND NO. 217 OF THE CITY OF MARQUETTE, FOR THE PURPOSE OF ACQUIRING AND CONSTRUCTING ADDITIONS AND IMPROVEMENTS TO THE EXISTING ELECTRIC UTILITY SYSTEM OF THE CITY OF MARQUETTE."

THE CITY OF MARQUETTE ORDINAINS:

Section 1.. Sections 3 and 8 of Ordinance No. 243, adopted by the City Commission of the City of Marquette, County of Marquette, Michigan, on March 10, 1969, are hereby amended to provide as follows:

Section 3. Said additional issue of bonds shall be designated "Electric Utility Revenue Bonds, Series III, and shall be, not general obligations of the City of Marquette, Michigan, but revenue bonds, payable out of the net revenues of the System after provision has been made for the payment of expenses of operation and maintenance, and shall consist of seven hundred ninety (790) coupon bonds of the denomination of \$5,000.00 each, numbered in direct order of maturity from 1 to 790, inclusive. Said bonds shall be dated April 1, 1970, and shall be payable:

\$ 75,000.00	July 1st of each of the years 1972 and 1973;
\$100,000.00	July 1st of each of the years 1974 and 1975;
\$125,000.00	July 1st of each of the years 1976 and 1977;
\$150,000.00	July 1st of each of the years 1978 and 1979;
\$175,000.00	July 1st of each of the years 1980 and 1981;
\$200,000.00	July 1st of each of the years 1982 and 1983;
\$225,000.00	July 1, 1984;
\$150,000.00	July 1st of each of the years 1985 and 1986;
\$175,000.00	July 1, 1987;
\$500,000.00	July 1, 1988;
\$550,000.00	July 1st of each of the years 1989 and 1990.

Said bonds shall bear interest at a rate or rates not exceeding eight per cent (8%) per annum, payable on January 1, 1971, and semi-annually thereafter on July 1st and January 1st of each year, both principal and interest to be

payable at The Detroit Bank and Trust Company, Detroit, Michigan.

Bonds maturing in the years 1972 to 1980, inclusive, shall not be subject to redemption prior to maturity.

Bonds maturing in the years 1981 to 1990, inclusive, shall be subject to redemption prior to maturity at the option of the City, in inverse numerical order, or any interest payment date on or after July 1, 1980.

Bonds called for redemption in accordance with the foregoing provisions shall be redeemable at par and accrued interest, plus a premium as follows:

- 5% of the principal on each bond called for redemption on or after July 1, 1980, but prior to July 1, 1982;
- 4% of the principal on each bond called for redemption on or after July 1, 1982, but prior to July 1, 1984;
- 3% of the principal on each bond called for redemption on or after July 1, 1984, but prior to July 1, 1986;
- 2% of the principal on each bond called for redemption on or after July 1, 1986, but prior to July 1, 1988;
- 1% of the principal on each bond called for redemption on or after July 1, 1988, but prior to maturity.

Thirty days' notice of the call of any bonds for redemption shall be given by publication in a paper circulated in the State of Michigan which carries, as part of its regular service, notices of sale of municipal bonds, and in case of registered bonds, thirty days' notice shall be given by mail to the registered address. This bond is a self-liquidating bond, and is not a general obligation of the City of Marquette, and does not constitute an indebtedness of the City of Marquette within any constitutional or statutory limitation, and is payable, both as to principal and interest, solely from the revenues of the Electric Utility System of the City. The principal and interest on this bond are secured by the statutory lien hereinbefore mentioned.

The City of Marquette hereby covenants and agrees to fix and maintain at all times while any of the bonds shall be outstanding, such rates for service furnished by said Electric Utility System as shall be sufficient to provide for payment of the interest upon and the principal of all such bonds as and when the same become due and payable, to create a Bond and Interest Redemption Fund (including a Bond Reserve Account) therefor and a Replacement Fund, to provide for the payment of expenses of administration and operation and such expenses for maintenance of said Electric Utility System as are necessary to preserve the same in good repair and working order, and to provide for such other expenditures and funds for said System as are required by said Ordinance.

This bond and the interest thereon are exempt from any and all taxation whatsoever by the State of Michigan or by any taxing authority within said state.

This bond may be registered as to principal only on the books of the City Treasurer in the name of the holder, and such registration noted on the back hereof by the City Treasurer, after which no transfer shall be valid unless made on the books and noted hereon in like manner, but transferability by delivery may be restored by registration to bearer. ORDINANCE GRANTING FRANCHISE  
TO PEGGY BRAAMSE, D/B/A  
MARQUETTE BUS LINE TO OPERATE  
A BUS LINE IN THE CITY OF  
MARQUETTE, MICHIGAN

THE CITY OF MARQUETTE ORDAINS:

1. The City of Marquette, Michigan does hereby grant to Peggy Braamse, d/b/a Marquette Bus Line, hereinafter referred to as the "Company", the right, privilege and Franchise to operate a bus transit company upon, along and over the public streets and alleys of the City of Marquette, but subject to the terms and conditions herein.

2. If Peggy Braamse, d/b/a Marquette Bus Line, shall hereinafter become incorporated, the rights and privileges granted to her by virtue of this ordinance shall extend to such corporation for the time and on the conditions herein set forth, and when such act of incorporation shall have been obtained, such corporation as the successor, shall have all the rights and privileges as hereby granted, without further action of the City Commission.

3. This Franchise shall expire two (2) years from the date of adoption of this ordinance. demption, provided funds are on hand with the paying agent to redeem said bonds.

No proposal for the purchase of less than all of the bonds or less than their par value will be considered.

Said bonds are to be issued under Act 94, Public Acts of Michigan, 1933, as amended, and Ordinance No. 243 of the City, as amended, for the purpose of paying the cost of extending, enlarging and improving the existing Electric Utility System of the City of Marquette, by the construction of a new steam electric generating plant.

Said bonds are not a general obligation of the City but are payable solely from the revenues of the Electric Utility System of the City, subject only to payment of expenses of administration, operation and maintenance and a statutory first lien thereon has been created. Additional bonds of equal standing with the bonds of this issue may be issued, but only for the purposes and on the terms and conditions expressed in the authorizing Ordinance and said Ordinance No. 186.

ORDINANCE GRANTING FRANCHISE  
TO PEGGY BRAAMSE, D/B/A  
MARQUETTE BUS LINE TO OPERATE  
A BUS LINE IN THE CITY OF  
MARQUETTE, MICHIGAN

THE CITY OF MARQUETTE ORDAINS:

1. The City of Marquette, Michigan does hereby grant to Peggy Braamse, d/b/a Marquette Bus Line, hereinafter referred to as the "Company", the right, privilege and Franchise to operate a bus transit company upon, along and over the public streets and alleys of the City of Marquette, but subject to the terms and conditions herein.

2. If Peggy Braamse, d/b/a Marquette Bus Line, shall hereinafter become incorporated, the rights and privileges granted to her by virtue of this ordinance shall extend to such corporation for the time and on the conditions herein set forth, and when such act of incorporation shall have been obtained, such corporation as the successor, shall have all the rights and privileges as hereby granted, without further action of the City Commission.

3. This Franchise shall expire two (2) years from the date of adoption of this ordinance. In the event that neither party to the Franchise gives the other party written notice of its intent to terminate this Franchise prior to sixty (60) days of the termination date, said Franchise shall automatically renew for an additional two (2) year period.

4. The Franchise hereby granted is non-exclusive and is subject to all the laws of the City of Marquette and State of Michigan that may hereafter become effective and applicable to this matter.

5. The City further reserves the right to terminate and end all the rights and privileges granted under this Franchise at will.

6. The Company agrees that it shall keep its buses and equipment in proper repair and establish reasonable standards of service to the public and prevent unjust discrimination as to service or rates.

The Company shall be solely responsible for all physical injuries to persons and property occurring on account of, and during the performance and operation of, said transit bus service and shall indemnify and save harmless the City from any and all liabilities and claims for damages on account of injury to persons or property and from all costs and expenses in defending any action which may be brought against the City for such injuries to persons or property.

10. The Company shall keep in effect throughout the entire life of the Franchise and any renewal period thereof, liability insurance on personal injury and property damage in amounts approved in writing by the City Commission.

11. This Ordinance shall become effective ten (10) days after its adoption and after its full text thereof has been on file in the office of the Clerk for public inspection for at least four (4) weeks after publication of the notice that such Ordinance is on file.

A Regular Meeting of the Marquette City Commission was duly called and held Monday, February 9, 1970 at 7:00 o'clock, P. M.

Present: Mayor Price. Commissioners Downey, LaFreniere, Rydholm.

Absent: Commissioner Lowney.

Commissioner Downey moved, supported by Commissioner Rydholm and carried, that the absence of Commissioner Lowney be excused, he being away from the City.

Commissioner Rydholm moved, supported by Commissioner Downey and carried, that the bills payable now on file with the City Clerk in the sum of \$108,620.55 be allowed and ordered paid.

Commissioner Downey offered the following resolution and moved its adoption.

WHEREAS, Section 13 (e) of Act 51, Public Acts of 1951 provides that each incorporated city and village to which funds are returned under the provisions of this section, that "the responsibility for all street improvement, maintenance and traffic operation work shall be coordinated by a single administrator to be designed by the governing body who shall be responsible for and shall represent the municipality in all transactions with the State Highway Commission pursuant to the provisions of this Act"

Therefore, be it resolved, that this Honorable Body designates Mr. James Palmer as the single (Street) administrator for the City of Marquette in all transactions with the State Highway Commission as provided in Section 13 of this Act.

Supported by Commissioner LaFreniere. Yeas: Mayor Price. Commissioners Downey, LaFreniere, Rydholm.

Nays: None.

A report from City Manager T. R. McNabb was read wherein he tabulated bids received for the sale of the Community Center building, commonly known as the Soo Line Depot. Following a discussion on the matter of bids it was moved by Commissioner LaFreniere, supported by Commissioner Rydholm and carried, that this Commission authorize the sale of the Community Center building to Lasco Development Corporation at the price of \$60,000.00 and that the proceeds from the sale, along with any revenue derived from earnings of said proceeds, be utilized for Recreational purposes in accordance with the City's agreement with the Shiras Institute who had given the property to the City.

On motion of Commissioner Downey, supported by Commissioner Rydholm and carried, the following resolution be adopted:

WHEREAS, the CITY OF MARQUETTE, MICHIGAN (herein called the "Local Issuing Agency") has previously adopted a resolution titled "RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE SALE, ISSUANCE AND DELIVERY OF PROJECT NOTES AND THE EXECUTION OF REQUISITION AGREEMENTS" (hereinafter called the "Master Resolution") on the 10th day of March, 1969; and

WHEREAS, The Local Issuing Agency and the United States of America (herein called the "Government") recognize the desirability of the Local

Issuing Agency obtaining funds for the purpose described in the aforementioned Resolution from sources other than the Government despite the existence of abnormally high interest rates which presently prevail in the private money markets; and

WHEREAS, the Government proposes to enable the Local Issuing Agency to continue to obtain Loan funds from sources other than the Government by the Government making payment of a placement fee, where necessary, to the purchaser or purchasers of the Local Issuing Agency's Project Notes; and

WHEREAS, when deemed necessary in the light of prevailing market conditions, the Government and the Local Issuing Agency shall initiate the placement fee procedure in connection with a Project Note sale by causing to be inserted, as part of the Notice of Sale published in the Daily Bond Buyer, a financial newspaper published in the City of New York, New York, an authorization to prospective bidders to include a placement fee as part of the bidder's proposal.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Local Issuing Agency as follows:

Section 1. The official designated in the Master Resolution to award the Project Notes, after receiving Government approval of a recommended award of the Project Notes, is hereby authorized and directed on behalf of the Local Issuing Agency to award the Project Notes at the lowest interest rate or rates, not in excess of six percent (6%) per annum, offered in the proposals, without reference to premiums: Provided, however, that as among proposals specifying the

same lowest interest rate and specifying a premium, the award shall be made on the basis of the highest premium per dollar principal amount of the Project Notes specified in such proposals: Provided further, that when the Notice of Sale published in the Daily Bond Buyer authorizes a placement fee as part of the bid proposal and in the event that every proposal relating to all or any part of the Project Notes specifies a placement fee to be received by the purchaser as compensation for the placement of such Notes, then the award of the Project Notes to which such proposals relate shall be made on the basis of the lowest placement fee specified per dollar amount of such Notes.

Section 2. Each proposal submitted for all or a part of the Project Notes shall be substantially in the form of HUD-9402 which is incorporated herein by reference, and which is hereby approved by the Local Issuing Agency.

Section 3. The Local Issuing Agency hereby authorized the Government to pay to any purchaser of the Project Notes a placement fee as compensation for services required in placing such Notes.

Section 4. Any and all prior resolutions of the Local Issuing Agency are hereby amended to the extent necessary to enable the carrying out of the actions authorized herein.

Section 5. This Resolution shall take effect immediately.

A communication from Mrs. Holly Greer, Marquette Youth Services, Inc. was read regarding the Ski Area at Mt. Mesnard. The Mayor and City Commission called on Mr. Engle, Recreation Director, for information regarding the revenues received from Booster buttons

ment fee as part of the bid proposal and in the event that every proposal relating to all or any part of the Project Notes specifies a placement fee to be received by the purchaser as compensation for the placement of such Notes, then the award of the Project Notes to which such proposals relate shall be made on the basis of the lowest placement fee specified per dollar amount of such Notes.

Section 2. Each proposal submitted for all or a part of the Project Notes shall be substantially in the form of HUD-9402 which is incorporated herein by reference, and which is hereby approved by the Local Issuing Agency.

Section 3. The Local Issuing Agency hereby authorizes the Government to pay to any purchaser of the Project Notes a placement fee as compensation for services required in placing such Notes.

Section 4. Any and all prior resolutions of the Local Issuing Agency are hereby amended to the extent necessary to enable the carrying out of the actions authorized herein.

Section 5. This Resolution shall take effect immediately.

Mayor Price announced his appointment of Lesley J. Cory to a three year term on the Marquette City Planning Board. Commissioner Rydholm moved, supported by Commissioner Lowney and carried, that the Commission unanimously confirm Mr. Cory's appointment.

WHEREAS, the Northern Michigan University offers to provide to this City the following described services:

Five 130-hour Basic Law Enforcement Training Programs to serve a total of 125 officers from Upper Michigan during the next 18 months.

Two 40-hour workshops for supervisory personnel to serve 40 persons during the next 18 months.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the City of Marquette hereby authorizes the Northern Michigan University to seek on its behalf, funds from the Michigan Commission on Law Enforcement and Criminal Justice to implement programming described herein offered in the program area titled Upper Peninsula Comprehensive Plan for Law Enforcement Training, as found in the current comprehensive plan for law enforcement.

This City waives its own right to apply to the Commission for federal funds to provide the same above described programming within its own jurisdiction.

This City reserves the right to apply to the Commission for federal funds offered for the fiscal year 1970 in program areas other than that described above, or for any program area offered by the Commission for subsequent fiscal years.

I hereby certify that this Resolution was adopted by the city Commission on March 9, 1970, and was made part of the laws and/or ordinances of the City of Marquette.

WHEREAS, the City of Marquette, Michigan, (herein called the "Borrower" and/or the "Local Governing Body") acting by and through the Marquette Housing Commission, (herein called the "Local Authority") proposes (1) to enter into an Annual Contributions Contract (herein called the "Contract") with the States of America (herein called the "Government"); and (2) to authorize the issuance of its notes as evidence of advances to be made to the Local Authority pursuant to the Contract; all with respect to any "Project" as defined in the Contract; and which at any time now or hereafter is incorporated un-

der the terms of such Contract.  
BE IT RESOLVED AS FOLLOWS:

**Section 1. Annual Contributions Contract.** The Contract, substantially in the form of contract hereto attached and marked "Exhibit A", is hereby approved and accepted both as to form and substance and the President of the Housing Commission is hereby authorized and directed to execute said Contract in quadruplicate on behalf of the Local Authority and the Clerk of the Local Governing Body is hereby authorized and directed to impress attest the official seal of the Local Governing Body on each such counterpart and to forward said executed counterparts, or any of them, to the Government together with such other documents evidencing the approval and authorizing the execution thereof as may be required by the Government.

The Contract is hereby declared to be a part of this Resolution and all applicable provisions thereof shall be deemed incorporated herein to the same extent as if the provisions thereof were expressly set forth in full herein.

**Section 2.** The President or Vice-President or Director of the Housing Commission is hereby authorized to file with the Government from time to time, as monies are required, requisitions together with the necessary supporting documents requesting advances to be made on account of the loan provided in the Contract, and the proper officers of the Local Authority shall prepare, execute and deliver to the Government Notes hereinafter authorized and shall accept payment therefor from the Government in cash and/or exchange for other Notes of the Local Authority, and such persons are authorized to do and perform all other things and acts required to be done or performed in order to obtain such advances. Cash proceeds from the sale of all Notes shall be deposited and disbursed only in accordance with the provisions of the Contract.

**Section 3.** (A) In order to provide monies to finance the Development Cost of each Project and to refund, renew, extend or substitute for any Project Loan Notes (in the Contract called "Advance Notes") by this Resolution authorized to be issued (or any such Notes by any other resolution authorized to be issued and which are outstanding, or on deposit for delivery pending payment therefor, as of the date this Resolution becomes effective), or for any Project Notes (in the Contract called "Temporary Notes") issued by the Borrower in anticipation of the delivery of Project Loan Notes, there are hereby authorized to be issued, from time to time, Project Loan Notes of the Borrower in an aggregate principal amount outstanding at any one time (whether authorized by this Resolution or any other resolution authorizing the issuance of Project Loan Notes) equal to the Maximum Development Cost of all such Projects.

(B) Each such Note shall bear interest and be payable in the form and manner prescribed by the Contract and this Resolution; shall be signed in the name of the Borrower by the authorized officials of the Local Governing Body; shall have the official seal of the Borrower impressed thereon and attested by the Clerk of the Local Governing Body. Each Project Loan Note shall be in substantially the form of Form No. HUD-9204-MICH., which form is incorporated herein by reference and made a part hereof. Project Loan Notes shall be issued to finance the Development Cost of Non-Permanently Financed Projects.

(C) Each Note with respect to any Project shall be secured by (1) a first pledge of the annual contributions payable to the Local Authority and authorized to be pledged to such payment pursuant to the Contract and (2) by a pledge of and lien on the Residual Receipts of such Project.

(D) As additional security for the equal and ratable payment of the principal of and interest on each Note issued with respect to

any Project, which is not permanently financed together with each other Note issued with respect to such Project, the Borrower, to the fullest extent permitted by the Laws of the State, hereby pledges, mortgages, conveys and grants unto the Government all property described in the Contract constituting such Project, including the certain real property relating to each such Project and more particularly described in the trust instrument or any amendment thereto as executed and recorded by the Borrower pursuant to the Contract. If the preceding sentence shall be adjudged by a court or competent jurisdiction to be invalid or ineffective it is the intention of the Local Authority to be fully obligated under the other provisions of this Resolution and that such judgment shall not impair or invalidate the obligation of the Local Authority to pay the principal of and interest on each Note from other funds of the Local Authority as herein provided.

**Section 4.** Whenever the following terms, or any of them, are used in this Resolution, the same, unless the context shall indicate another or different meaning of intent, shall be construed, and are intended to have meanings as follows:

- (1) the term "Resolution" shall mean this Resolution.
- (2) All other terms used in this Resolution and which are defined in the Contract shall have the respective meanings ascribed thereto in the Contract.

**Section 5.** All resolutions or parts of resolutions heretofore adopted by the Borrower which authorize the issuance and/or delivery of Advance or Project Loan Notes pursuant to the Contract are hereby repealed: **Provided, however,** That such repeal shall in no way affect the validity of Advance or Project Loan Notes issued pursuant to said resolutions which are outstanding or on deposit for delivery pending payment therefor on the date this Resolution becomes effective: **Provided, further,** That

the Project Loan Notes authorized by this Resolution shall be exchanged for any Advance Notes heretofore issued pursuant to any previous resolution.

**Section 6.** This Resolution shall take effect immediately.

Commissioner LaFreniere moved, supported by Commissioner Rydholm and carried, that the firm of Hubbard and Wendt be invited to conduct an audit of the municipal accounts for the current year.

On motion made by Commissioner Rydholm, supported by Commissioner LaFreniere, the following resolution was adopted:

"Resolved, that the City of Marquette, Michigan, does hereby accept the terms of the Agreement as received from the Michigan State Waterways Commission, and that the City does hereby specifically agree, but not by way of limitation, as follows:

1. To appropriate the sum of Seven Hundred Seventy-Three (\$773.00) Dollars to match the grant authorized by the Waterways Commission.

2. To use the restricted fund previously created for deposit of funds of the State of Michigan and to deposit therein all funds received from the Waterways Commission and all funds required of the City.

3. To comply with any and all terms of said Agreement including all terms not specifically set forth in the foregoing portions of this Resolution."

The following Aye votes were recorded:

The following nay votes were recorded: None.

A report from City Manager T. R. McNabb was read wherein he tabulated bids received for the right to operate the P. I. Concession for the ensuing year. Commissioner LaFreniere moved supported by Commissioner Rydholm and carried, that upon recommendation of the City Manager and the Superintendent of the Parks Department the high bid of Mr. Charles Coyne in the sum of \$106.75 per month for the

Concession Stand at Presque Isle be accepted.

Commissioner LaFreniere moved, supported by Commissioner Rydholm and carried, that a special Commission meeting be held Monday, May 4, 1970, at 4:00 o'clock P.M.

The Mayor and City Commission unanimously agreed that the summer schedule of meetings be observed, in that the first meeting of the month be a night meeting and the last regular meeting be called in the afternoon.
