



OFFICIAL PROCEEDINGS OF THE
MARQUETTE CITY COMMISSION

A Regular Meeting of the Marquette City Commission was duly called and held Monday, January 11, 1971 at 7:00 o'clock, P. M.

Present: Mayor Lowney. Commissioners Downey, LaFreniere, Price,
Rydholm.

Absent: None.

Commissioner Rydholm moved, supported by Commissioner LaFreniere and carried that the reading of the minutes of the previous meeting be waived.

Commissioner Price moved, supported by Commissioner Downey and carried, that the bills payable now on file with the City Clerk in the sum of \$122,247.56, be allowed and ordered paid.

Mayor Lowney called the attention of the City Commission to the Official Notice of the Fifth Annual State Legislative Conference of the Michigan Municipal League which will be held Wednesday and Thursday, February 24 and 25, 1971, in Lansing. Commissioner Downey moved, supported by Commissioner Price and carried that any Commissioner finding time and wishing to do so, be authorized to attend this Legislative Conference.

A report from City Manager T. R. McNabb was read regarding a petition for Curbing of McMillan Street west of Altamont. In his report Mr. McNabb incorporated an Engineers estimate of the cost of this project. Commissioner Downey moved, supported by Commissioner Price and carried, that this report be accepted and the City Clerk be authorized to schedule a public hearing to determine the necessity for this improvement.

Mayor Lowney called the attention of the Commission to the City Manager's Audit Report for the fiscal year 1969-1970. On motion of Commissioner LaFreniere, supported by Commissioner Rydholm and carried, the City Manager was authorized to implement the recommendations as outlined in his letter of January 11, 1971 and the City Clerk was instructed to correct the Appropriation Bill for the 1970-71 fiscal year as follows:

A communication from David H. McClintock, Chairman, Marquette City Planning Board, was discussed regarding the renaming of Park Avenue and Blemhuber Street. On motion of Commissioner Downey, supported by Commissioner Price and carried, Park Avenue be renamed to North Eighth Street and that the house numbers commence at 100. This renaming to take effect ninety days after this date during which time the people living on Park Avenue be so notified.

Commissioner Price then moved, supported by Commissioner Rydholm and carried, that Blemhuber Street be renamed Tierney Street and that the Tierney family be given notice of this change.

Commissioner Downey moved, supported by Commissioner Price and carried, that the City Commission ratify the purchase of Rock Salt through the Michigan State Highway Department to effect a considerable savings to the City based on the bid tabulation as received from the Engineering and Maintenance Department of the Michigan State Highway.

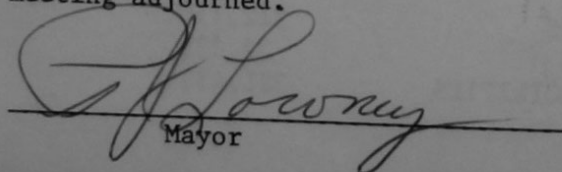
Commissioner Rydholm brought on the subject of sidewalk installation in the various parts of the City where they do not now exist. Following a lengthy discussion on this matter it was moved by Commissioner LaFreniere, supported by Commissioner Rydholm and carried, that the City Commission commit themselves to a program of sidewalk installation and that the City Manager be authorized to include the City's share of these costs in his 1971-72 Budget.

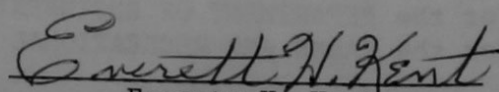

Commissioner Price moved, supported by Commissioner Downey and carried, that the City Manager be authorized to instigate a meeting of the City Commission and the County Board of Commissioners regarding access streets to and from the north part of the City.

Mayor Lowney welcomed Mr. Hall, an interested citizen present at this meeting.

A Regular Meeting of the Marquette City Commission was duly called and held Monday, January 25, 1971 at 7:00 o'clock, P. M.

Present. Mayor Lowney. Commissioners LaFreniere, Price.

Absent: Commissioners Downey, Rydholm.

Commissioner LaFreniere moved, supported by Commissioner Price and carried, that the absence of Commissioners Downey and Rydholm be excused, they being away from the City.

Commissioner Price moved, supported by Commissioner LaFreniere and carried, that the reading of the minutes of the previous meeting be waived.

Commissioner Price moved, supported by Commissioner LaFreniere and carried, that the bills payable now on file with the City Clerk in the sum of \$131,900.85, be allowed and ordered paid.

Mayor Lowney announced that this was the date and time set for a public hearing to determine the necessity for the installation of curbing on McMillan Street from Altamont Street to future Anderson Street. He then declared the public hearing open. All interested citizens present wishing to be heard on this subject were heard. The public hearing was then declared closed. Moved by Commissioner Price, supported by Commissioner LaFreniere and carried that the following Resolution be adopted:

WHEREAS, It appears by the affidavit of the City Clerk that due publication has been made of notice, as required by the City Charter, that it is the intention of the City Commission to make certain improvements, and to determine the necessity of such improvements as follows:

The Installation of Curbing on McMillan Street from
Altamont Street to Future Anderson Street,

and appointing this day and time when the City Commission would meet to determine the necessity of such improvement; and

WHEREAS, It appears further by said affidavit that a like notice has been sent by mail to each owner of property subject to assessment therefore; and

WHEREAS, All suggestions and objections made to said improvements have been heard and considered;

RESOLVED, That the City Commission determines that such project and improvements are necessary and proper;

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the proportion of the costs of such improvements which shall be defrayed by special assessment upon the property especially benefited thereby and the proportion to be defrayed as the general obligation of the City, if any, shall be as follows:

Owners Share \$3,573.60	City - 0
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FURTHER RESOLVED, That the report of the City Manager, the plans and specifications, and the estimated costs of such improvements, are hereby approved and determined accordingly; that said special assessments may be paid in 5 installments, at a rate not exceeding 4% per annum, or the actual cost of such borrowing; and that a special assessment district to be assessed therefor is hereby designated as follows:

McMillan Street from Altamont to Anderson Street.

A communication from Steven R. Vanderburg, Assistant Scout Master, Troop 305, was read inviting the Mayor and City Commission to attend a Court of Honor on February 22 in celebration of the Troops 61st Birthday Party. The Mayor and City Commission unanimously agreed that the City Clerk acknowledge receipt of this invitation and to inform Mr. Vanderburg that all Commissioners who can, will attend.

Mayor Lowney called the attention of the Commission to a communication from Frederick R. Brydges, President, Michigan Municipal League, encouraging all Members of the League to take formal action officially endorsing a Federal Tax Sharing Program. Commissioner Price moved, supported by Commissioner LaFreniere and carried, that the Mayor and City Commission officially endorse a Federal Tax Sharing Program and that a letter be directed to President Nixon, Senators Hart and Griffin and to Congressman Ruppe urging immediate consideration of such a program with an adequate input of new moneys to have a meaningful impact on our fiscal problems.

A communication from Virgil Lattrel, Member of the Marquette Housing Commission was read tendering his resignation from that Commission. Commissioner LaFreniere moved, supported by Commissioner Price and carried, that the resignation of Mr. Lattrel be accepted with regret and that the City Clerk be directed to forward a letter to him thanking him for his services to the Community.

A communication from Robert M. Bordeau, City Attorney, was read wherein he called attention of the City Commission to Public Act No. 12 of the Public Acts of 1969 which changed dates on which certain legal holidays will be observed, effective January 1, 1971. Commissioner Price moved, supported by Commissioner LaFreniere and carried, that the City Commission concur in the change of dates on which certain legal holidays will be observed as set forth in Public Acts of 1969. Washingtons Birthday will be observed on the third Monday in February. Memorial Day will be observed on the last Monday in May. Columbus Day will be observed on the second Monday in October. Veterans Day will be observed on the fourth Monday in October.

Commissioner LaFreniere moved, supported by Commissioner Price and carried, that the Commission unanimously concur in Mayor Lowney's appointments to various Boards and Commissions as follows:

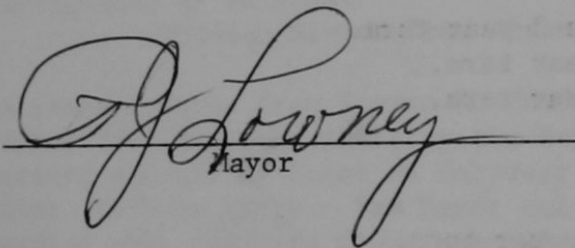

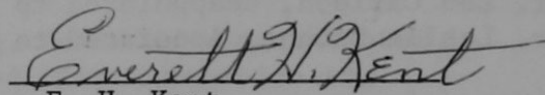

Commissioner LaFreniere moved, supported by Commissioner Price and carried, that the reading of the minutes of the previous meeting be waived.

Commissioner Price moved, supported by Commissioner Rydholm and carried, that the bills payable now on file with the City Clerk in the sum of \$79,140.22 be allowed and ordered paid.

Commissioner Downey moved, supported by Commissioner LaFreniere and carried, that the proposed Ordinance to provide for the operation by the City of Marquette, of the Presque Isle Marina and the establishment of rules and regulations governing its use for the protection of the health and safety of the public and providing penalties for the violation thereof, be accepted as to form and substance and the City Clerk be directed to give notice of and set a date for a public hearing on the adoption of said Ordinance.

Commissioner Price moved, supported by Commissioner Rydholm and carried, that the following list of rates and fees be established at the Presque Isle Marina:

PRESQUE ISLE MARINA RATES AND FEES

Effective May 1, 1971, the following rates and fees shall be charged at the Presque Isle Marina:

1. Seasonal boat well rental at the permanent finger piers
\$3.50 per foot per season.
2. Seasonal boat well rental at the floating finger piers
\$3.00 per foot per season.
3. Transient boaters shall pay the following fee schedule per day or any fraction thereof. These fees include the use of water and electric service:

\$2.00

4. The launching ramp rate per season will be \$15.00. Decals will be issued to all boat owners purchasing a seasonal pass. A charge of \$.50 per launching will be collected from those boat owners making use of the launching ramp on an individual basis.
5. Sewage holding tanks will be pumped out at a charge of \$1.50 per time.
6. Regular gasoline will be sold at the Marina pump at the prevailing gasoline prices in the City of Marquette for major brands of gasoline.
7. A charge of \$2.00 will be made for keys issued to the restrooms and docks. The fee will be returned upon the return of the keys to the Marina office.

Commissioner Downey moved, supported by Commissioner LaFreniere and carried that the proposed Ordinance to amend Chapter 51 of Title IX to the Marquette City Code by changing the administrative procedure for the issuance of Traffic Control Orders be accepted as to form and substance and the City Clerk be directed to set a time and date for a public hearing on the adoption of said Ordinance.

Commissioner Downey moved, supported by Commissioner Rydholm and carried, that upon recommendation of the City Manager, the City waive the formal bidding procedures and in accordance with Section 12.1 of the City Charter, purchase four used voting machines at a cost of \$600.00 each plus transportation charges from Flint, Michigan to Marquette.

Commissioner Price moved, supported by Commissioner Rydholm and carried, that the City enter into a financial agreement with the Shiras Institute for their participation in the construction of a Convention Center - Ice Arena, and that the Mayor and City Clerk be authorized to sign said agreement in behalf of the City of Marquette.

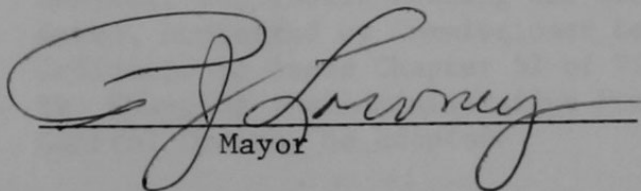
A report and recommendation from David H. McClintock, Chairman, Marquette City Planning Board was read regarding the closing of Westwood Road at the west end. Following a discussion on this

matter, the Mayor and City Commission referred this report and recommendation to the City Manager for a study and report.

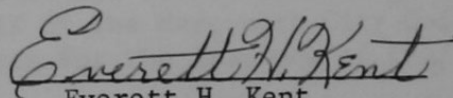

Following a lengthy discussion on these improvements it was moved by Commissioner Downey, supported by Commissioner Price and carried, that the City Clerk be directed to set a date and time for a public hearing to determine the necessity of the forementioned improvements and that said public hearing be held the third Monday in March at a Special Commission Meeting called for this purpose.

Commissioner LaFreniere moved, supported by Commissioner Downey and carried, that James Palmer be appointed State Administrator to act in that capacity in handling all matters with the State Highway Department.

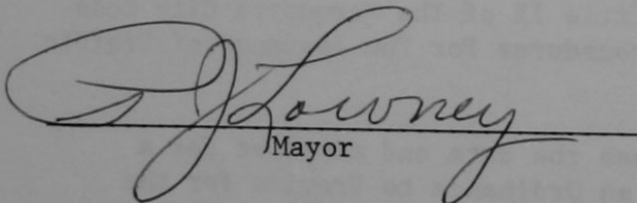

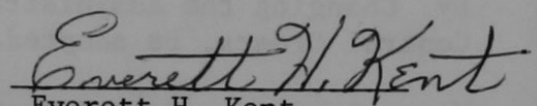
Considera He discussion was held regarding Snow Plowing and Removal.

Commissioner Rydholm moved, supported by Commissioner LaFreniere and carried that the reading of the minutes of the previous meeting be waived.

Commissioner Rydholm moved, supported by Commissioner Price and carried , that the bills payable now on file with the City Clerk in the sum of \$82,930.68 be allowed and ordered paid.

Commissioner Price moved, supported by Commissioner Downey and carried, that the City participate in Mayor Exchange Day of Michigan Week to be held Monday, May 17, 1971.

A communication from Thomas Rynish, Director, Majestics Drum and Bugle Corps was read requesting financial assistance to that Organization. The Mayor and City Commission unanimously agreed that this request be referred to the City Manager for a study at budget time.

Moved by Commissioner Downey, supported by Commissioner Price and carried, the following resolution be adopted.

WHEREAS, A petition has been received and filed requesting the following improvement:

Curbing and Paving of Mildred Av enue East of McClellan Avenue.

RESOLVED, That the City Manager is directed to prepare plans, specifications and estimate of costs of such improvement, and attach thereto his recommendation as to the proportion of the costs to be paid as the general obligation of the City; the number of installments for payment; the interest rate thereon; and the land to be included in the special assessment district;

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the City Manager file same with the City Clerk who shall make same available for public examination;

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the City Clerk shall fix a day for a public hearing on the determination of the necessity for such

improvement by the City Commission, and shall cause notice of the time and place of same to be published once in the official newspaper of the City not less than 10 days prior to such date of hearing, such notice to state also that the report of the City Manager, and the plans, specifications and estimate of costs, are on file in his office for public examination, and that he shall also serve a like notice upon each owner of property subject to assessments for such improvement, by United States Mail, at least 10 days prior to such hearing; and that he shall further make proof of such publication and service by affidavit.

A report and recommendation from City Manager T. R. McNabb was read regarding bids for Fire Department Hose Dryers and accessories. On motion of Commissioner Rydholm, supported by Commissioner Downey and carried, the Commission concur in the recommendation of the City Manager and accept the bid of Mel Servi, Fire Control Service of Pickerel, Wisconsin in the sum of \$4,793.00 for Hose Dryers and Accessories to be used in the Fire Department.

A communication from Mrs. Howard Treado was read expressing her appreciation to the City of Marquette for the fine Ambulance Service available to the citizenry. Mayor Lowney ordered this received and commended the Fire Department for their fine work in rendering Ambulance service.

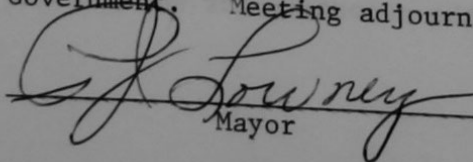

Commissioner Downey moved, supported by Commissioner LaFreniere and carried, that the following Ordinance be accepted as to form and substance and that the City Clerk be directed to set a time and date for a public hearing on the adoption thereof:

ENACTING
AN ORDINANCE /A CODE OF ORDINANCES FOR THE CITY OF MARQUETTE,
MICHIGAN, CODIFYING, RENUMBERING, REVISING AND REARRANGING
EXISTING ORDINANCES OF THE CITY, AND REPEALING VARIOUS
ORDINANCES.

WHEREAS, the present general and permanent ordinances of the City of Marquette are inadequately arranged and classified and are insufficient in form and substance for the complete preservation of the public peace, health, safety and welfare

of the City and for the proper conduct of its affairs, thereby creating a public emergency, now

THEREFORE, The City of Marquette Ordains:

SECTION 1. The Code of Ordinances heretofore approved in manuscript form by this Commission and accurately and completely published in book form be incorporated in this Ordinance and the same be and is hereby adopted and enacted.

SECTION 2. Said Code of Ordinances shall be published in loose leaf form and certified as correct by the Mayor and the City Clerk. The City Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to publish said Code of Ordinances.

SECTION 3. Publication and Distribution of Code. Pursuant to the provisions of Section 7.9 of the Charter and Ordinances of the City of Marquette, publication of the within codification of the Ordinances of the City of Marquette is directed. Copies of the Code shall be published in loose leaf form and shall be distributed as follows:

City Manager 1, Planning Commission 1, City Clerk 4, Attorney 1, Treasurer 1, Assessor 1, Engineer 1, Police Department 2, Fire Department 1, Accountant 1, Board of Light and Power 1, Superintendent of Water Supply and Sewage Disposal 1, Superintendent of Public Works 1, Superintendent of Parks and Recreation 1.

Copies of the original printing of this Code shall be published and made available to the public at a charge of \$2.00 per copy, Additional copies shall be made available if demand therefor shall exhaust the supply within one year from the effective date of this Code. In addition, the Clerk shall keep one of the copies of the Code assigned to him, available for public inspection during office hours.

SECTION 4. Amendment Procedure. This Code shall be amended by Ordinance. The title of each amendatory ordinance, adapted to the particular circumstances and purposes of the amendment, shall be substantially as follows:

(a) To amend any section:

(OR PROPER DESIGNATION IF A CHAPTER OR TITLE IS ADDED) OF SAID CODE.

(c) To repeal a section, title, or chapter:
AN ORDINANCE TO REPEAL SECTION....(SECTIONS ...AND.....,
CHAPTER, TITLE....., AS THE CASE MAY BE OF THE CODE OF THE
CITY OF MARQUETTE.

SECTION 5. Publication and Distribution of Amendments. Amendments to the Code shall be published as required by the Charter of the City of Marquette and not less than seventeen copies of each amendment shall be published in loose leaf form suitable for insertion in the loose leaf copies of this Code. The City Clerk shall distribute such copies to the officers of the city having copies of the Code assigned to them. Each officer assigned a copy of the Code shall be responsible for maintaining the same and for the proper insertion of amendatory pages as received. Each copy of said Code shall remain the property of the city and shall be turned over by each officer having custody thereof upon expiration of his term of office to his successor or to the City Clerk, in case he shall have no successor.

SECTION 6. Contents of Code. This Code contains all ordinances of a general and permanent nature of the City of Marquette and includes ordinances dealing with municipal administration, parks and public grounds, streets and sidewalks, zoning and planning, food and health, business and trades, building, electrical, heating and plumbing regulations, police regulations and traffic regulations, and excludes ordinances granting franchises and special privileges, establishing sewer and other public improvement districts, providing for the construction of particular sewers, streets or sidewalks, or for the improvement thereof, and for the construction and improvement of other public works, authorizing the borrowing of money or the issuance of bonds. With respect to the provisions of any other ordinances of a general and permanent nature in effect on the effective date of this Code, any provision contained in said Code which add to, alter or otherwise change the provisions of such ordinance shall be deemed to repeal said ordinances to the extent of such change or omission. Nothing herein contained shall be deemed to alter, amend or repeal the provisions of any ordinance which are not permanent and general in nature as herein defined. Ordinances hereafter adopted which are not of a general or permanent nature shall be numbered consecutively beginning with number one, authenticated, published and recorded in the book of ordinances, but shall not be prepared for insertion in this Code, nor be deemed a part thereof.

SECTION 7. Short Title. This ordinance shall be known and cited as the "Marquette City Code".

SECTION 8. Headings. No provision of this Code shall be held invalid by reason of deficiency in any chapter, or section heading.

SECTION 9. Definitions.

(a) Person. The word "person" as used in this Code, and in any amendment thereof, hereinafter enacted, shall include an individual, copartnership, corporation, association, club, joint adventure, estate, trust, and any other group or combination acting as a unit and the individuals constituting such groups or unit, and the plural as well as the singular number; and the singular masculine pronoun shall include the feminine, neuter and plural; unless the intention to give a more limited meaning is disclosed by the context.

(b) Public Place. The words "public place" shall include any street, alley, park, public building, or any place or structure which is customarily open to the public or where the public is wont to assemble.

(c) City. The word "City" shall mean the City of Marquette.

SECTION 10. Notice. Notice regarding sidewalk repairs, sewer or water connections, dangerous structures, abating nuisances or any other act, the expense of which if performed by the city, may be assessed against the premises under the provisions of this Code, shall be served:

(a) By delivering the notice to the owner personally or by leaving the same at his residence, office or place of business with some person of suitable age and discretion, or

(b) By mailing said notice by registered mail to such owner at his last known address, or

(c) If the owner is unknown, by posting said notice in some conspicuous place on the premises for five (5) days.

No person shall interfere with, obstruct, mutilate, conceal or tear down any official notice or placard posted by any city officer, unless permission is given by said officer to remove said notice.

SECTION 11. Penalty. Unless another penalty is expressly provided by this ordinance for any particular provision or section, every person convicted of a violation of any provision of this ordinance, or any rule or regulation adopted or issued in pursuance thereof, shall be punished by a fine of not more than One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) and costs of prosecution or by imprisonment for not more than ninety (90) days, or by both such fine and imprisonment. Each act of violation and every day upon which any such violation shall occur shall constitute a separate offense.

The penalty provided by this section, unless another penalty is expressly provided, shall apply to the amendment of any section

of this ordinance whether or not such penalty is re-enacted in the amendatory ordinance.

SECTION 12. Severability. It is the legislative intent of the Commission, in adopting this code, that all provisions and sections of this ordinance be liberally construed to protect and preserve the peace, health, safety and welfare of the inhabitants of the City of Marquette, and should any provision or section of this ordinance be held unconstitutional or invalid, such holding shall not be construed as affecting the validity of any of the remaining provisions or sections, it being the intent that this ordinance shall stand, notwithstanding the invalidity of any provision or section thereof.

The provisions of this section shall apply to the amendment of any section of this ordinance whether or not the wording of this section is set forth in the amendatory ordinance.

SECTION. 13. Effective Date. This ordinance shall take effect ten (10) days after its adoption and publication.

Following a discussion on this matter it was moved by Commissioner Downey, supported by Commissioner Price that all costs over and above the normal tax bill of costs be collected from the Plaintiff.

A report from Allan F. Olson, Chairman, Convention Center - Ice Arena Committee, was read recommending that the City Commission consider the retention of the Architectural Firm of Ralph H. Burke, Inc. of Park Ridge, Illinois, to begin work on the schematic design of the Convention Center-Ice Arena, and that a letter of intent with the Firm be drawn by the City Attorney and City Manager for this work. Following considerable discussion on this matter, it was moved by Commissioner Downey, supported by Commissioner LaFreniere that the City Commission authorize a letter of intent with the Architectural Firm of Ralph H. Burke, Inc. for architectural services in connection with the Convention Center-Ice Arena, said fees not to exceed \$10,000.00.

Nays: Commissioners LaFreniere, Price, Rydholm.

Following considerable discussion it was moved by Commissioner LaFreniere, supported by Commissioner Price and carried, that the City appoint Ralph H. Burke, Inc. of Park Ridge, Illinois, Architect for the Convention Center-Ice Arena.

Commissioner LaFreniere moved, supported by Commissioner Rydholm and carried that the City Commission adopt a Resolution authorizing the execution of an Amendment to the Annual Contributions Contract on Project No. MICH - 70-1,2.

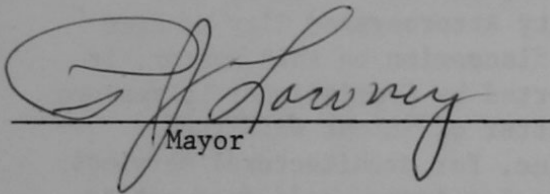

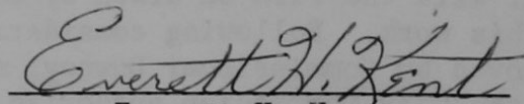
