Gentlemen:- Your committee to whom was referred the claim of Frank Dollar for damages for an alleged injury claimed to have been sustained by reason of a defective sidewalk, beg leave to report that they have had the claim under consideration and have made such investigation thereof as they were able in the time at their disposal, from which you committee are of the opinion that there is such a grave question as to whether the claimant is or has been suffering from any injury as to whether as matter of fact any injury which he may have received is or was through or in consequence of any fault on the part of the city, that in the opinion of your committee testimony bearing thereon should be formally taken and submitted to the council for its consideration in acting upon this claim.

We therefore recommend that this committee or a special committee of the common council be appointed and empowered to employ a stenographer and such other assistance as may be deemed necessary, and instructed to take proofs respecting the claim, with power to summon and swear witnesses; and report such proofs to the council at an early date.

Gentlemen:- Your committee to whom it was referred to prepare and submit such rules and regulations for the conduct of suburban express business in the day time by the Marquette City and Presque Isle Railway Company, as in our judgment the safety and convenience of the public demands; beg leave to report that they have had the same under consideration and submit and recommend the adoption of the following:

Resolved, by the Common Council of the City of Marquette, That in the conduct of suburban express business in the daytime between 8 o' clock in the morning and 8 o'clock in the evening, the Marquette City and Presque Isle Railway Company shall observe and enforce the following rules and regulations, and such further rules and regulations as the common council shall prescribe; viz,

(1) No car used for express business shall be or be allowed to remain standing on any tracks of said company north of Fisher street and south of Fair avenue, except in Front street at or near the north line of Superior street, and there only for the purpose of being loaded or unloaded, and for a period of not to exceed thirty minutes at any one trip or time.

(2) Cars used for express business, not being motor cars, shall not be allowed to precede or be in front of the motor car propelling the same while descending either of the hills in Front street and while going north on Third street.

(3) In case cars used for express business are propelled by a motor car in the rear thereof, such express car while being so propelled shall have securely attached to the front or forward end thereof a good and efficient fender capable of preventing such car from running over pedestrians or animals; and such car shall be provided

on such forward end with a platform or place for brakeman, and while
being so propelled a competent brakeman shall be and remain on the

outside and at the front or forward end of such car, which shall be

provided with an efficient brake ^{and gong} to be operated by such brakeman,

and in the evening the car shall be
provided with an efficient head light


