Marquette, Mich., July 2nd, 1900.

A regular session of the common council was called to order by the mayor, the Hon. Joseph F. Neidhart.

Present: Aldermen Asire, Bush, Delf, Donovan, Ekstrom, Fleury, Gorman, Gustafson, Jacobs, Shea, Ward and Werner.

On motion of Alderman Ward, the following resolution was unanimously adopted.

Resolved, That the record of the resolution adopted at the session held on June 11th, 1900, relative to the opening of Crescent street between Third and Fourth streets, be amended and corrected by striking therefrom the words "Number One" wherever the same occur in said resolution following the words "Adams' Addition".

The record of the session of June 11th, 1900, as <sup>above</sup> amended and corrected, was, on motion of Alderman Jacobs, approved.

The petition of the Light and Power Commission, asking permission to hang a transformer of 1000 lights capacity upon the hose house lot, said transformer to be used to serve the private takers of electric current at the lower end of Front street, was, on motion of Alderman Donovan, referred to the committee on public buildings with power to act.

The petition of J.W. Stone and eight others, asking that the city sprinkler be used on Spruce street, was referred to the committee on streets and sewers.

The petition of the Marquette County Agricultural Society, asking that the road leading to the Fair Grounds, from the Powder Mill road (so called) to the west line of the Fair Grounds, be repaired with rock or other material, and placed in fairly good condition for driving over, was, on motion of Alderman Shea, referred to the committee on streets and sewers.

The petition of Joseph Hoffenberg, in regard to peddler's license, was, on motion of Alderman Ward, referred to the committee on licenses and trade regulations.

The petition of William Fassbender and twenty-five others, for the grading and macadamizing of Fisher street between Seventh and Ward streets, in the Homestead Addition, was referred to the committee on streets and sewers.

The petition of Harriet R. Adams, requesting the privilege of making 130 feet of sidewalk, abutting her property on Lake street, of machine shop and foundry cinders, was, on motion of Alderman Shea, referred to the committee on streets and sewers.

The monthly reports of all the justices of the peace were presented, and, on motion of Alderman Asire, ordered placed on file.

The following was presented and read:

To the Honorable Mayor and Common Council of the City of Marquette, Mich.

Gentlemen:- I hereby propose and agree to do all street sprinkling for the City of Marquette, Mich., during ten hours of each day that sprinkling is needed to be done, by the use of my own and the city sprinkler in performing the work, at seven dollars and fifty cents (\$7.50) per day.

I also agree to take care of said city sprinkler by keeping the same under cover when not in use during the summer and coming winter.

On motion of Alderman Donovan, bid was accepted and Geo. E. French was awarded the contract for street sprinkling for the season of 1900.

On motion of Alderman Asire, the following was unanimously adopted:

Resolved, That the mayor and controller be authorized to co-operate with the committee on finance and taxation in regard to the Grace Furnace delinquent taxes, and ~~said~~ <sup>the</sup> mayor, ~~and~~ <sup>and, recorder</sup> controller are hereby authorized to draw and sign any order necessary to effect a settlement of taxes with the owners of the Grace Furnace property.

On motion of Alderman Ward, the following was unanimously adopted:

Resolved, That the street commissioner is hereby directed to make or cause to be made a profile for the Genessee Street Trunk Sewer improvement, changing the route heretofore proposed so that said sewer shall discharge into the creek in Lake street and be constructed in Lake and Garden streets to Marble street; thence as heretofore proposed; and that the city attorney be authorized to negotiate for and procure the right to discharge sewage in the creek, and the right of way for such sewer from Lake street into Lake Superior.

The committee on purchases and claims reported that they had paid Mrs. Ellen Crow \$10.00, for settlement in full for her claim for injuries received from fall on sidewalk in Fourth street, and had received her receipt for same.

The committee on purchases and claims to whom had been referred the bill of W.E. Pettis, \$20.00, for generator for Health Officer, recommended that same be allowed and ordered paid.

The committee on purchases and claims reported that they could purchase suitable badges for the mayor and aldermen at \$3.00 each.

On motion of Alderman Shea, the committee on purchases and claims were authorized to purchase seventeen stars at a cost not to exceed \$4.00 each.

Alderman Asire moved that five thousand dollars be transferred from the general fund to the highway fund and twenty-five hundred dollars from the general fund to the park and cemetery fund. Carried.

Amend Section 2 so as to read as follows;

Said permission and authority is granted upon the following express conditions, viz;

1st. That as soon as practicable, and within ninety days from the date hereof, a corporation shall be organized and incorporated under the railway laws of this state, to construct and operate a freight and passenger railway from some point north of Dead River to a crossing or connection with the tracks of the Munising Railway Company in the county of Alger, or farther, and that the rights herein granted shall be assigned to such corporation.

2nd. That the construction of said railway between said points shall be commenced within six months from the passage of this ordinance, and shall be diligently prosecuted and be completed, and regular train service thereon throughout its whole distance be commenced within eighteen months from the date of the passage of this ordinance .

3rd and 4th same as in ordinance already voted upon.

5th. That the railroad constructed under the provisions of this ordinance shall be constructed upon such grade as shall be approved by the common council of the city of Marquette, and so as not to destroy the street or road along or across which it shall pass, or materially impair the usefulness of such street or road for the passage of vehicles and pedestrians.

6th. The necessity for the laying of all switch and side tracks to reach the yards, depot grounds and wharves of the corporation constructing the said railroad, shall be determined solely by the common council of the city of Marquette, and all such switch and side tracks, when their necessity has been determined, shall be constructed upon plans and specifications to be approved by the said common council, and so as not to materially impair the usefulness, for the passage of vehicles and pedestrians, of any street or road across or along which such switch or side tracks shall be constructed.

7th. Before any rights under this ordinance shall vest in said George C. Fry, or his assigns, and before any possession of the streets or roads covered by this ordinance shall be taken for any other purpose than the surveying of a route, the railroad corporation contemplated by this ordinance to be organized, shall be in fact organized, and it shall have been determined by the common council of the city of Marquette that the corporation has the necessary means to construct the entire road contemplated by this ordinance to be built, which determination shall be by the vote of a majority of all the members elect.

8th. Time is made of the essence of this ordinance, and if any of the things required by this ordinance to be done shall not be done at the time or times herein stipulated, then the right to take possession of the said streets and roads shall cease and determine, and if any possession has been taken, the same shall, upon the demand of the said common council, at once be abandoned, the tracks laid therein removed, and such streets and roads restored to their original usefulness.

9th. Within ten days after the final passage of this ordinance the said George C. Fry shall file his acceptance of the terms of the ordinance in writing with the City Recorder, accompanied by a bond in the penal sum of Fifty thousand Dollars (\$50,000.00) executed by the said George C. Fry and at least two sureties, who shall justify in a sum not less than twice the penal sum named in said bond, which bond shall be approved by the Mayor of the City of Marquette, both as to its form and as to the sufficiency of the sureties, and until such written acceptance and bond approved as aforesaid are filed, no rights shall be acquired by said Fry under this ordinance, and if they shall not be filed within the time specified, this ordinance shall be and become void and of no effect.

The conditions of the said bond shall be that the Railroad Company contemplated by the terms of this ordinance shall be organized and that it shall construct and have in operation within the time specified the entire railroad contemplated to be built from a point north of Dead River at least to a connection with the Munising Railroad in the county of Alger. //
