

Offer of S. B. Kimber of \$3 for the old sash taken from the marshal's house referred to the committee on parks, public buildings and grounds.

Communication from secretary of board of fire and water commissioner to which was referred the petition of property holders on McMillan street, asking that said street be graded and macadamized and water mains laid thereon—stating that the board had no funds on hand for said purpose, and that said board will lay the pipe, providing the council will grade the street and appropriate the necessary amount, about nine hundred dollars was presented and on motion referred to the street committee.

Petition of John F. Mack Sr. and 140 others asking that John C. Brooks be appointed janitor of the city hall, also petition of Swan A. Strong and M. J. Bielenberg for same position, were presented and on motion laid on the table.

Petition of O. D. Jones for permission to connect his sewer on East Ohio street with the Spruce street sewer, referred to the street committee.

The following communication was on motion referred to the water power and electric lighting committee.
