A regular session of the common council was called to order by the mayor, the Hon. Walter T. Ward.

Present-Aldermen Ball, Cadarette, Corbett, Donovan, Ekstrom, Godwin, Gorman, Gray, Gustafson, Jones, Reichel, Shea, Whitman and Williams-14.

The record of the session of August 7th, approved.

The petition of Patrick Lawler requesting relief from the payment of city taxes assessed against his property for the year 1905, amount \$8.47, Lot 7, Block 9, of Replat of Blocks 8, 9, 11, 12 and 13 of Cleveland Iron Min-Co.'s Sub-Div., was presented and referred to the committee on finance and taxation.

The protest of John Brant and 14 other property owners in the Blemhuber Addition, against having any part of their property assessed for the opening of Sixth street, between Fisher and McMillan streets, was presented, and, on motion of Alderman Shea, received and ordered placed on file.

The following was presented:

#1.

On motion of Alderman Ball, supported by Alderman Shea, said petition and blue print were referred to the committee on streets and sewers and said ordinance to the committee on ordinances and rules.

The monthly reports of all the justices of the peace were presented, and, on motion of Alderman Jones, ordered placed on file.

The city treasurer's quarterly report was presented, and, on motion of Alderman Shea, received and ordered placed on file.

The recorder presented proof of publication of notice for grading and macadamizing Altamont street, from south line of McMillan street to Garden street, and Sixth street, from Garden street to the south line of Fisher street.

Moved by Alderman Gorman that three thousand dollars be transferred from the general fund to the highway fund and one thousand dollars from the general fund to the park and cemetery fund. Carried.

The committee on finance and taxation presented the following:
Resolved, That a warrant be drawn on the general fund in favor of the Mar-

quette National Bank, for payment of demand note for \$5,000 with accrued interest.

Yeas-Aldermen Ball, Cadarette, Corbett, Donovan, Ekstrom, Godwin, Gorman, Gray, Gustafson, Jones, Reichel, Shea, Whitman and Williams-14.

Moved by Alderman, supported by Alderman Jones, and carried, that the additional sum of \$2,500 be appropriated for the completion of the work now under way for the repair and protection of Presque Isle Drive, and that said sum be embraced in the tax estimates for next year.

The committee on streets and sewers, to whom had been referred the petition of the Duluth, South Shore & Atlantic Railway Company, relative to bridge across Front street, recommended that the prayer of the petitioner be granted.

On motion of Alderman Ball, supported by Alderman Jones, said recommendation was adopted.

On recommendation of the committee on streets and sewers the council accepted the following sewers: Crescent street from manhole in Pine street to the center of High street; Ohio street from a point 30 feet east of the east line of Oak street to a point 400 feet west of the west line of Oak street.

The committee on ordinances and rules presented the following ordinance and recommended its adoption:

Moved by Alderman Jones, supported by Alderman Ball, and carried unanimously, that the rules be suspended and that said ordinance be put upon its immediate passage for first adoption. The controller presented the special assessment roll for the grading and macadamizing of Adams street, from Genessee street to Craig street, for confirmation.

Moved by Alderman Shea, supported by Alderman Ball, and carried, that the consideration of said roll be postponed until Wednesday, September 20th, 1905, at 8 o'clock p.m., and that the controller prepare estimates of the cost of grading Adams street, from Genessee street to Craig street, and prepare and submit a special assessment roll covering the estimated cost of said improvement.

The controller presented the special assessment roll for the grading and macadamizing of Altamont street from south line of McMillan street to Garden street, and Sixth street, from Garden street to the south line of Fisher street, for confirmation.

Alderman Gorman offered a resolution in the usual form for the confirmation of said special assessment roll, which was supported by Alderman Reichel, pending the adoption of which Alderman Shea moved that the subject be laid on the table, which motion was supported by Alderman Donovan and lost by the following vote:

The construction of an eight-inch tile sewer, with four-inch "Ys", in Oak street, from manhole in Michigan street to a point 67 feet north of the north line of Ridge street, with lampholes shown in the profile for said sewer heretofore adopted; and

Resolved, That the controller prepare a special assessment roll for the collection of the total estimated cost of said improvement and submit the same to the council for approval.

On motion of Alderman Reichel, supported by Alderman Jones, the following resolution was adopted:

Resolved, That the controller be, and he is hereby directed to prepare specifications and estimates of the cost of the following proposed improvement, to-wit:

The construction of an eight-inch tile sewer, with four-inch "Ys", in Ridge street, from manhole in Fourth street to a point 17 feet west of the east line of Oak street, with lamphole shown in the profile for said sewer heretofore adopted; and

Resolved, That the controller prepare a special assessment roll for the collection of the total estimated cost of said improvement and submit the same to the council for approval.

On motion of Alderman Gorman, supported by Alderman Whitman, the follow- ing resolution was adopted:

Resolved, That the controller be, and he is hereby directed to prepare specifications and estimates of the cost of the following proposed improvement, to-wit:

The grading of White street, from east line of North Marquette Addition to the east line of Wilkinson avenue, 16 feet in width in the center thereof according to the grade heretofore established therefor; and

Resolved, That the controller is hereby directed to establish and define a local assessment district embracing all the lots and parcels of land deemed to be benefitted by said improvement, and an assessment roll as provided by the charter of the city, assessing thereon the estimated cost of said improvement and submit the same to the council.

On motion of Alderman Shea, supported by Alderman Gorman, the controller was directed to advertise for bids for grading, curbing and macadamizing Blemhuber avenue, from west line of Champion street to west line of Division street.

Moved by Alderman Ball, supported and carried, that when the council adjourns, it be until Wednesday, September 20th, 1905, at 8 o'clock p.m. The council then, on motion, adjourned.
