Marquette, Mich., January 2nd, 1906.

A regular session of the common council was called to order at 8 o'clock p.m. by the mayor, the Hon. Walter T. Ward.

Present-Aldermen Bush, Cadarette, Corbett, Donovan, Ekstrom, Gorman, Gustafson, Jenks, Reichel, Shea, Van Cleve, Whitman and Williams-13.

The record of the session of December 4th, 1905, approved.

Hon. Peter White, President of the Park and Cemetery Commission, addressed the council in behalf of the commission, which he stated was desirous of improving the entertainment and amusement features of Presque Isle Park involving an outlay of about \$10,000 and that the commission thought it practicable to induce private persons to advance the moneys, the same to be reimbursed out of the net revenues of leases and privileges, the buildings and improvements to be in the possession and control of the commission and to become the property of the city when the investment and interest has been repaid, and requested that the commission be authorized to make such arrangements.

A resolution prepared by the city attorney authorizing the park and cemetery commission to enter into such an arrangement as desired was presented and referred to the committee on parks and cemeteries.

The petition of the Consolidated Fuel & Lumber Co., and 70 others, requesting that the Washington street car line be kept open all winter, was presented, and, on motion of Alderman Bush, supported by Alderman Ekstrom, referred to the committee on railways and public conveyances.

The petition of R. McKenzie and 60 others, requesting that the Marquette City & Presque Isle Railway Company be allowed to discontinue its Washington street line from Jan. 1st to May 1st, 1906, was presented, and, on motion of Alderman Bush, supported by Alderman Ekstrom, referred to the committee on railways and public conveyances.

The petition of Mary H. Longyear, Peter White and W.A. Ross requesting the amendment of Sec. 2 of an ordinance relative to public entertainments was presented, and, on motion of Alderman Van Cleve, supported by Alderman Donovan, referred to the committees on ordinances and rules and licenses and trade regulations.

The mayor presented the following:

On motion of Alderman Bush, supported by Alderman Whitman, the appointment of John H. Lewis as member of the Light and Power Commission, was duly confirmed by the following vote:

Yeas-Aldermen Bush, Cadarette, Corbett, Donovan, Ekstrom, Gorman, Gustafson, Jenks, Reichel, Shea, Van Cleve, Whitman and Williams-13.

Nays-None.

The mayor presented the appointment in writing of William Henry for the office of market keeper and no action being taken thereon withdrew said appointment and presented the following:

Moved by Alderman Gorman, supported by Alderman Williams, and carried unanimously by yeas and nays, that the vote on the confirmation of Timothy T. Hurley as market keeper be taken at this session.

On motion of Alderman Gorman, supported by Alderman Ekstrom, the nomination of Timothy T. Hurley as market keeper was confirmed.

Yeas-Aldermen Bush, Cadarette, Corbett, Donovan, Ekstrom, Gorman, Gustafson, Jenks, Reichel, Shea, Van Cleve, Whitman and Williams-13.

Nays-None.

The monthly reports of all the justices of the peace were presented and ordered placed on file.

On recommendation of the committee on streets and sewers the following resolution was adopted:

Resolved, That the profile for a sewer in Ridge street, from Third street to Fourth street, adopted July 10th, 1905, be, and the same is, hereby rescinded.

Moved by Alderman Shea, supported by Alderman Jenks, and carried, that Christ Peterson be allowed and paid the amount of his contract for the construction of a sewer in Park street; less 10 per cent to be retained until said sewer is accepted by the council.

On recommendation of the committee on streets and sewers the controller was directed to advertise for bids for 350 cedar piles, 13 feet long and not less than 8 inches in diameter at the small end, to be straight and of good sound timber, said piles to be used in protection of Lakeshore boulevard.

The committee on streets and sewers recommended that the work of getting out rock near Dead river for Lakeshore boulevard be done during the winter.

On motion of Alderman Gustafson, supported by Alderman Ekstrom, said recommendation was adopted.

Yeas-Aldermen Bush, Cadarette, Corbett, Ekstrom, Gorman, Gustafson, Jenks, Reichel, Van Cleve and Whitman-10.

Nays-Aldermen Donovan, Shea and Williams-3.

On recommendation of the committee on public buildings the controller was directed to advertise for bids for ^{and repairing} painting walls and wood work on first and second floors of City Hall.

The controller presented and read the reports of the street commissioner, marshal and poundmaster, which were accepted and ordered placed on file.

Whereas, The Park and Cemetery Commission is desirous of having a creditable casino, and boat liveries and amusement features established and maintained at Presque Isle Park: and

Whereas, No public funds are available for such purposes, and said commission deems it practicable to procure the advance by private parties of the moneys necessary to make such improvements, the same to be repaid out of the earnings of such investments and the privileges incident thereto:

Resolved, That the Park and Cemetery Commission is hereby authorized to enter into an agreement with any private person or persons to furnish the money for and to erect and equip in Presque Isle Park a casino and boat livery and amusement features, at a total expense of not more than ten thousand dollars: Provided, That the possession, use management and control of the same and all revenues derived therefrom shall be in and belong to said commission: and Provided, That for the possession and use by said commission, or its lessees, it may be agreed that the annual net revenues of such casino, boat liveries and amusement features and the privileges incident thereto, shall be paid by said commission to to the person or persons erecting and equipping the same; and that when the total amount so advanced, with interest, has been so repaid, as use, all such casino, boat liveries and amusement features and the equipment thereof ^{shall} to become the property of the city appurtenant to Presque Isle Park. And provided that no liability on the part of the City shall be incurred in pursuance of this resolution.


