~~I have been informed~~ that a criminal warrant
was recently issued out of the office of Leonard P. Caray, justice of
the peace, involving as defendant, one Carrie Willard, an alleged
keeper of a house of prostitution on Lake street; that the said warrant
was placed in the hands of the city marshal for service, and that the
said marshal deputized one Dennis Hogan, an officer, to proceed to said
house on Lake street and acquaint said Carrie Willard of the fact that
such a warrant was issued; that said Dennis Hogan received from said
Willard's agent or representative the sum of \$20 cash for the purpose of
"settling" such case, and that said \$20 cash was by said Officer Hogan
turned over to Marshal Moloney. ^{P.} I have examined the docket of the jus-
tice of the peace, and find no record there of any such case, although
the justice ~~states~~ ^{states} ~~that a warrant was issued to the marshal,~~ ^{confirms was made and} that
the complaint made in the case was ^{afterwards} withdrawn by the complaining witness, *and the same will never be used.*
In the interest of good government, and as a citizen of the community
desiring to see the laws enforced and not prostituted for the purposes
of mulcting innocent people, or allowing guilty violators to escape
unpunished, I respectfully call your attention to this matter to be
dealt with by you as you may deem best. If the marshal knows of the
existence of houses of this character, and being furnished with a
warrant does not do his duty, the public should know it. ~~either~~ ² the
defendant in the case was ^{either} innocent or ^{guilty} guilty--if ~~innocent~~ she should
be brought into court--and if ~~gu~~ innocent she should not be mulcted
of the \$20.

Marquette, Mich., April 28th, 1906.

A special session of the common council was called to order at 8 o'clock p.m. by the mayor, the Hon. Rush Culver.

Present-Aldermen [REDACTED] Ball, Bush, Cadarette, Campbell, Corbett, Donovan, Ekstrom, Godwin, Gray, Gustafson, Jenks, McCarthy, Reichel, Shea and Siegel -15.

The call for this session, signed by the mayor, together with the affidavit attached, showing proper service of the notice of the same on all the aldermen of the city, was read, the object of the session as stated in the call being, "For the purpose of considering and acting upon the suspension of the marshal and street commissioner and also considering and acting upon such bonds as may be presented at said meeting or any adjournment thereof."

The mayor announced that he had suspended the marshal and street commissioner; and, in pursuance of the charter requirement that his reasons therefor be presented to the council at the next session, stated that the marshal had been suspended because, in the opinion of the mayor, he was not faithfully performing the duties of his office; and also because he had not attended any of the meetings of the council since the present mayor assumed the duties of his office, thereby showing his contempt for the mayor and council; and also because said marshal had spent much of his time in stirring up contentions over the present unsettled state of city affairs; and also because of the matter in regard to which a report by a special committee of the council is still undisposed of.

And the mayor requested an expression of the council in reference to such suspension of the marshal.

Moved by Alderman Godwin, supported by Alderman Shea, and carried, that the said action of the mayor be approved.

Yeas-Aldermen Ball, Bush, Cadarette, Campbell, Corbett, Donovan, Ekstrom, Godwin, Gray, Gustafson, Jenks, McCarthy, Shea and Siegel -14.

Nays-Alderman Reichel -1.

The mayor then stated that the street commissioner had been suspended by him at the request of and in consequence of the action of the common council at its last session, and because said officer in at least one instance, in relation to the disposal of the street scrapings, had wilfully disobeyed

the order of the common council.

And the mayor requested an expression of the council in reference to such suspension of the street commissioner.

Moved by Alderman Shea, supported by Alderman Donovan, and carried, that the said action of the mayor be approved.
