Marquette, Mich., July 2nd, 1906.

A regular session of the common council was called to order at 8 o'clock p.m. by the president of the council, the Hon. James E. Ball.

Present-Aldermen Asire, Ball, Bush, Cadarette, Campbell, Corbett, Ekstrom, Godwin, Gray, Gustafson, Jenks, McCarthy, Shea and Siegel-14.

The record of the session of June 25th, approved.

The petition of James Anderson requesting that he be granted permission to connect his property on Lee street with the sewer in Morton street was presented and referred to the committee on streets and sewers.

The petition of M. L. Little requesting that she be relieved from the payment of taxes ~~assessed~~ against her property for the year 1906 was presented and referred to the committee on finance and taxation.

The monthly reports of all the justices of the peace were presented and ordered placed on file.

The committee on finance and taxation to whom had been referred the petition of Mrs. Cora Erickson, requesting that she be relieved from ^{the} payment of deficiency assessment for constructing sewer in front of her property on Ridge street, amount \$11.48, recommended that same be allowed, and a warrant drawn on the general fund, in favor of Robert P. Byrne, Treas., for payment of said amount.

On motion of Alderman Asire, supported by Alderman Bush, said recommendation was adopted.

The committee on streets and sewers, to whom had been referred the petition of Nick Johnson and 13 others, requesting that the ditches in Union street be deepened and connected with the ditches along the Marquette & Southeastern Railway track, recommended that the prayer of the petitioners be granted.

On motion of Alderman Shea, supported by Alderman Godwin, said recommendation was adopted:

On motion of Alderman Shea, supported by Alderman Asire, the committee on streets and sewers was directed to make an estimate of the cost of repairing Hawley street and putting it in good condition, and to report on same at next session of the council.

Moved by Alderman Asire, supported and carried, that when the council adjourns it be until Monday, the 16th day of July, 1906, at 8 o'clock p.m.

The committee on claims and litigation reported on claim of James Moloney, amount \$90.00, for services as marshal, and recommended that same be allowed and paid. Said recommendation was adopted by the following vote:

On motion of Alderman Jenks, supported by Alderman Asire, the action of the common council at its last session on the bill of Clarence Coleman was rescinded. Moved by Alderman Jenks, supported by Alderman Asire, that the bill be allowed and ordered paid. Lost by the following vote:

Yeas-Aldermen Asire, Ball, Bush, Godwin, Jenks and McCarthy-6.

Nays-Aldermen Cadarette, Campbell, Corbett and Siegel-4.

Aldermen Ekstrom, Gray and Shea, present, not voting.

The controller presented one bid for the boiler and engine formerly used at city quarry, and on motion of Alderman Godwin, supported by Alderman Jenks, said bid was ordered returned and the controller directed to readvertise for bids.

The controller presented the reports of the market keeper and poundmaster, which were accepted and ordered placed on file.

Moved by Alderman Siegel, supported by Alderman Bush, and carried, that the city attorney prepare and have published a supplement to the "City Charter" containing all amendments to said charter and ordinances that have been adopted since January 1st, 1900.

The committee on ordinances and rules presented for adoption an ordinance entitled, "An ordinance relative to the construction of concrete sidewalks and the collection of the expense thereof."

Moved by Alderman Corbett, supported by Alderman Cadarette, and carried unanimously, that the rules be suspended and that said ordinance be put upon its immediate passage. Said ordinance was, on motion of Alderman Siegel, supported by Alderman McCarthy, adopted by the following vote:

Yeas-Aldermen Asire, Ball, Bush, Cadarette, Campbell, Corbett, Ekstrom, Godwin, Gray, Jenks, McCarthy, Shea and Siegel-13.

Nays-None.

Moved by Alderman Shea, supported by Alderman Cadarette, and carried, that a committee of three be appointed to conduct an informal election on

Monday, the 16th day of June, 1906, to determine by ballot the will of the people as to whether the city shall spend \$5,000 this year for the improvement and protection of Lakeshore boulevard, at which election the residents of the city whose names appear on the current tax roll shall be permitted to vote.

President of the Council Ball thereupon appointed as such committee Aldermen Shea, Jenks and Ekstrom.

On motion of Alderman Siegel, supported by Alderman Corbett, the controller was directed to decorate the City Hall for the Fourth of July.

On motion of Alderman Gray, supported by Alderman Siegel, the marshal was directed to collect \$25 from the management of Sun Bros. circus for the use the city streets for their parade.

The council then, on motion, adjourned.
