

A regular session of the common council was called to order at 8 o'clock p.m. by the mayor, the Hon. Rush Culver.

Present-Aldermen Asire, Bush, Cadarette, Campbell, Corbett, Donovan, Ekstrom, Godwin, Gray, Gustafson, Jenks, McCarthy, Shea and Siegel-14. The record of the session of July 25th, approved.

A communication from John L. Zoberlein offering the city \$300.00 for the strip of land 16 feet in width adjoining Lot 56 in Adams' Addition, at the corner of Third and Park streets, was presented and referred to the committee on finance and taxation.

The petition of Wm. Dorais and 14 others, requesting that the price paid for team work by the city be increased to 50 cents per hour was presented and referred to the committee on purchases, salaries and wages.

The petition of James Beaudry requesting that a sewer be constructed in Fourth street, from the sewer in Rock street to a point 50 feet north of the north line of Fisher street, was presented and referred to the committee on streets and sewers.

The complaint of J. H. Godwin and M. E. Asire relative to the absence of the recorder from his office, and the communication from William Dorais and John Siegel relative to the official bond of the recorder, were presented, and on motion of Alderman Shea, supported by Alderman Ekstrom, the same were referred to a special committee appointed by the mayor as follows: Alderman Shea, Siegel and Jenks.

Moved by Alderman Asire, supported by Alderman Bush, and carried, that August 16th, 1906, at 9 o'clock a.m., at the mayor's office, be fixed as the time and place of meeting of the above special committee, and that at least four days notice thereof, with copy of the complaint be served on the recorder.

The committee on streets and sewers, to whom had been referred the petition of Wm. O'Meara and others, requesting that Sixth street graded and macadamized, from the intersection of Spring street to the intersection of Rock street, recommended that the prayer of the petitioners be granted and that the city engineer prepare profile for same.

On motion of Alderman Shea, supported by Alderman Donovan, the following was adopted:

Resolved, That the warrants for the collection of the following special assessment rolls are hereby extended sixty days from July 26th, 1906, viz: No. 85 for grading and macadamizing Center street and No. 86, for a sewer in Champion street.
